PIKE COUNTY, ARK., Sept. 9th, A. D. 1893.

The body being assembled and the appointed ministers, W. W. Carson and H. L. Wasson were present to preach the introductory sermon. The eighteenth Psalm was read by W. W. Carson and after singing, prayer was offered by Elder J. A. Shackelford. The sermon was preached from the 35th and B6th verses of the 4th chapter of St. John. Closing prayer by Elder J. J. Hughes. The body then adjourned until 2 P. M. At 2 P. M. the body came together by singing, after a beautiful repast. The body being called to order, the former moderator (Elder H. L. Wasson,) read the 95th Psalm. The body then pung the hymn, "A Charge to Keep I Have," etc.

The moderator then offered prayer after which he declared the body ready for business. 1st. Called for the letters from the various churches. The response was as follows: (A. F. Wilson, J. N. 2nd. Called for petitionary letters. None.

3rd. The body elected officer as follows: A. R. Chit wood, John Welch and A. F. Wilson held the ballot respect tively for moderator, clerk and treasurer. Result: J. J. Hughes was elected moderator, E. Wright clerk and John Welch, treasurer.

4th. S. T. Moran, J. B. Echols, A. R. Chitwood and W. H. Guthery were appointed a preaching committee.

5th. Invited visiting members to seats with us.

6th. Called for correspondence. Response Elder J. E. Harris and Elder J. R. Hardy from Red River Association. Also letters from Ouachita Association, Big Fork Association with A. J. Strickling and A. A. Bates as delegates, Buckville Association with C. C. Fuqua a delegate.

7th. The appointment of committees. The body enacted that the moderator and clerk have time until next morning to appoint the committees which will be named with the reports of the same. The appointments will be known in the report of the preaching committee. Adjourned until 8 o'clock A. M. next Monday. Closing prayer by Elder John Smith.

Monday at 8 A. M. the moderator read the 7th chapter of Mutthew, and hymn, "On Jordan's Stormy Banks I Stand," etc. we sung. Prayer was offered by Elder J. R. Hardy.

The Caddo River Baptist Sunday School Convention met with Bethel church in Pike county, Ark., on Friday, at 11 o'clock A. M., before the second Sunday in August. The introductory sermon was preached by Elder J. J. Hughes. Text, 2nd Tim., 4th chap. 2nd verse. Then the committee adjourned until 3 P. M.

THREE O'CLOCK P. M.

The convention was opened by President W. F. Willis reading the 2nd chapter of 2nd Timothy, and he offered prayer.

1st. Read the constitution of the convention.

2nd. Called for the letters from churches and schools.

Elder J. M. Smith and W. W. Mclain were appointed to read the letters. The letters were read and the messengers' names enrolled.

On motion elected officers by acclamation as follows:

W. F. Willis, president; Elder J. M. Smith, vice president; W. W. Smith, secretary and W. W. Mclain, Treasurer.

Brethren George Welch, W. W. Mclain and A. J. Black

were appointed a preaching committee.

Elder J. J. Hughes, Brother George Welch and Sisters S. A. Mclain, M. E. Smith and E. T. Smith were appointed a musical class.

Adjourned until 9 o'clock A. M., Saturday morning.

SATURDAY, 9 O'CLOCK A. M.

The convention was opened by the president reading the 3rd chapter of Hebrews and prayer by W. W. Smith.

1st. Appointed a committee to arrange a programme to the next session as follows: George Welch, W. W. McLain and Elder J. M. Smith.

2nd. Called roll and marked absentees.

3rd. Called for the reports of superintendants of schools. Reports very favorable.

4th. Called for essays, when Sister Mattie E. Smith presented an essay on "Sabbath Schools."

On motion the convention adjourned until 3 o'clock P. M

ELEVEN O'CLOCK A. M.

Elder J. J. Hughes preached from the 6th verse, 2nd chapter of Hebrews.

THREE O'CLOCK P. M.

The president read the 3rd chapter of John and offered prayer and resumed busines.

The next essay was read by Sister Docia Hollingshead on "Woman's Work in the Church." Also one by W. W. Smith on the "Origin of Sunday Schools." And one by Elder A. Nelson on "Christian Piety." And one by Elder J. M. Smith on the "Relationship Between Church and Sunday Schools." One by G. T. Howell and T. A. Hollingshead, on "Prayer." We next had an address by our worthy president on the "Importance of the Early Cultivation of the Mind." And one by Elders J. P. Welch, J. J. Hughes and Brother G. T. Howell, severally.
