MINUTES.

Thursday morning, Sept. 5th, 1889; Association met persuant to adjournment at 11 o'clock, a. m. Eld. Broadaway preached the introductory sermon. The body was then called to order by the Moderator, Clerk being absent, J. C. L. Presson was elected clerk protem. Eld. W. W. Reed and Asa Robertson were appointed to read the letters from the churches. The regular order of business was suspended and petitionary letters called for and the following churches came forward, viz:

Mt. Zion, Centre Ridge and Martinville.

The Moderator extended the right hand of fellowship to the messengers. The body then went into permanent organization by electing J. K. Broadaway Moderator and E. A. Woolverton, Clerk, W. L. Woolverton was elected Treasurer. The Moderator appointed Bros. Horton, Ledbetter and Russell committees on devotional service.

Bros. Reed, Furguson and Robertson were appointed committee on order

of business. Motion carried to adjourn 'till 7:30 o'clock, p. m.

EVENING SESSION.

Body met at 7:30, p. m., a very feeling prayer was offered by Eld. J. Mayall. Bro. Muirhead preached from the text "And I say also unto thee, that thou art Peter and upon this rock I will build my church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it"—Matt. 16-18. After preaching body went into executive session. Bro. John Kimball, J. W. Rambo, S. T. Cypert, T. L. Thompson and J. A. Melton were received as corresponding messengers from Blue Mountain Association.

Bro. J. H. Whisenant came forward as messenger from Union Association, but correspondence was refused on the statement of Eld. J. W. S. Leslie and

others that they were irregular in their organization and baptism.

Bro. J. Mayall was received as agent for the Arkansas Baptist and Baptist Book House, Little Rock. Correspondence with the Union Association was made the special order for 2 o'clock to-morrow.

Adjourned to 8:30 to-morrow morning.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Met at 8:30 o'clock. Committee on order of business read their report which was adopted with some amendments. Eld. T. Moody came forward as messenger from Russellville Association and was received.

The body went into election for time and place of holding next meeting, which resulted in the choice of Cleveland, to meet on Thursday before second Sabbath in Sept. 1890, at 11 o'clock, a. m. Introductory sermon to be preached by Eld. J. W. S. Leslie with Eld. J. Mayall, alternate. The Moderator then appointed the following committees;

ON MINISTERIAL EDUCATION .- J. W. S. Leslie, P. H. Coal, R. F. Muir-

head.

Foreign Mission .- J. Mayall, W. A. Morrison, Andrew Harris.

DESTITUTION .- G. W. Reid, T. H. Mayall, Isaac Horton.

Publication.—J. Mayall, D. H. Honeycutt, J. W. Furguson. On Prohibition.—W. W. Reid, A. A. Noland, E. A. Hicks.

ON FINANCE-John Russell, F. S. Leslie, R. F. Parish.

ON QUERRIES-J. W. S. Leslie, G. W. Wright, David Horton.

ON WOMANS WORK-J. C. L. Presson, W. T. Neal.

Motion to adjourn for dinner carried. Mount Sinai was received by petitionary letter.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Motion carried that Bro. J. Mayall be heard in the interest of our state paper and the Baptist Book House at Little Rock. Bro. Mayall very ably set forth the claims of our state paper. On motion the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED-That we submit the following amendment to the Constitution

f this body

That each church shall contribute for associational purposes as follows:

For printing 2 1-2 cents per member and for missions 10 cts. per member to be sent by messengers hearing the annual letters at each annual meeting. This amendment to be voted on at the next meeting of this association.

The report on Ministerial Education was read and pending the discussion a collection was taken up which resulted as follows in cash: For College debt \$2.50; for education of young ministers \$4.25, and \$6.50 in pledges. It was resolved by the body to put one young minister in school during the present year and assist him to pay his board and tuition. On vote the report on Ministerial Education was adopted. Bro. John Kimball asked that this association take into consideration the legality of his baptism, which had been questioned by some of our preachers. On motion it was made the order of business after preaching at 7:30, p. m.

FRIDAY NIGHT.

Met at 7:30 p. m. Preaching by J. W. S. Leslie. The body then went into consideration of the legality of the baptism of Eld. John Kimball. The testimony showed that the church that baptised Bro. Kimball was a regular organized Baptist church and in order, but the person that baptised him was a little beclouded. On motion the question was tabled. Adjourned to 8:30 tomorrow.

SATURDAY.

Met at 8:30, a. m. Committee on Foreign Missions made their report. On motion the report was re-submitted and the committee be continued till next meeting of this body, at which time they shall make their report. The committee on prohibition made report which was adopted. Committee on destitution made their report which was adopted. Report on destitution was read and adopted. Report on publications read and adopted.

The body then went into election of Executive Board which resulted in the choice of J. M. W. Massengale, E. A. Woolverton, L. F. Daniels and Wm. Noland. M. S. Kirkland was the choice of the body for Missionary

for the next year.

Correspondence were appointed as follows: Blue Mountain Association, M. A. Boyd, J. W. Furguson, J. Mayall; Red River, J. Mayall, J. W. S. Leslie, Asa Robertson; Russellville, M. S. Kirkland, E. A. Woolverton, R. F. Muirhead; Green Briar, G. W. Reid, W. W. Duncan, J. Mayall; State Convention, Asa Robertson, M. S. Kirkland, J. Mayall, E. A. Woolverton, G. W. Wright and J. W. S. Leslie, alternate Southern Baptist Convention, J. Mayall and M. S. Kirkland alternate. A special committee consisting of J. W. Todd. J. K. Broadaway, J. Mayall and M. S. Kirkland was chosen for the purpose of acting with the Executive Board in the appointment of some person as beneficiary of this Association.

New Prospect church was received by petitionary letter.

On motion it was ordered that the clerk superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of this meeting and have \$8.00 for his services. A resolution of thanks offered by J. Mayall to the people of the neighborhood

for their kind entertainment during the sitting of the body on motion was adopted.

MINISTERIAL EDUCATION.

Adjourned to meet at Cleveland on Thursday before the second Sabbath in Sept. 1890.

Report of committee on Ministerial Education. The Pedo-Baptist world are doing all in their power and using every means to educate their preachers. Thereby fitting and qualifying them to diffuse more of their Anti-christian doctrines among the perishing millions of fallen humanity. We think in order to meet these false doctrines that we should have an educated ministry. We would recommend therefore that each church encourage and assist in this work as far as possible. And we would recommend the Ouachita Baptist College as a suitable place to educate our young ministers.
