MINUTES

OF THE

Grand Prairie Baptist Association,

HELD WITH

DeWitt Church, Arkansas County, Ark., Oct. 19, 20 and 21, 1906.

The Association was called to order at 8 o'clock p. m., by the Moderator, Rev. R. F. Routh, after which the congregation joined in singing. "Draw Me Nearer." Scripture reading and prayer by the Moderator. Song, "The Old, Old Story." Prayer by Bro. Gra-

ham, pastor of Methodist Church.

On motion, the Introductory Sermon was postponed until 11 o'clock Saturday morning, and by unanimous vote, Rev. O. T. Finch, representing the Orphans' Home, was selected to preach this night. Prayer by Rev. M. F. Gathright. Song, "Jesus Saves." Rev. O. T. Finch then preached sermon from 1st verse 108th Psalm: "O. God, my Heart is fixed." After sermon, Bro. Finch presented the claims of the Orphans' Home and a collection was taken up, amounting to \$25.41. The Moderator then appointed the Committee on Religious Exercises, consisting of Pastor and Deacons of DeWitt Church and Bro. R. H. Parker and Bro. R. A. Henderson of Stuttrart. Adjourned to meet Saturday, Oct. 20th, 1906. Dismissed by Rev. M. F. Gathright.

REPORT ON SUNDAY SCHOOL.

We, your Committee on Sunday School, offer the following report for your earnest consideration:
