PROCEEDINGS.

The Benton County Baptist Association met in its thirty-third annual session, according to previous arrangement, with the Baptist Church at Springtown, on Friday, Oct. 6, 1918.

Singing: "Tis Harvest Time," "Come Thou Fount," and "I Need Thee, Every Hour." Reading of Psalm 116 and prayer by the moderator of the previous session, Eld. T. F. Jones Singing: "I'm Going Home."

Letters from the churches were called for and deposited on the table. Elders J. A. Smith and E. F. Rice were appointed as reading clerks, and the letters were read and messengers enrolled.

The hour having arrived for preaching, Elder T. F. Jones, who was selected at the previous session to preach the introductory sermon, after singing, reading lesson from the third chapter of Colossians, and prayer by Eld. J. A. Smith, preached the sermon from Col. 3:1-2 on "Our Heavenly Aims."

Prayer by Elder L. L. Johnson.

On motion, recess was taken for one and a half hours, being till 2:40 P. M. Goven ment time.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION.

Singing by the congregation; reading of Psalin 34 and prayer by Eld. W. S. Crowley.

Reading of letters completed and roll corrected.

A motion prevailed that we now proceed to elect a moderator and clerk. Eder E. F. Rice and J. A. Smith were appointed to collect and count ballots. Elder T. F. Jones was elected moderator, and Elder J. L. Chastnin clerk.

Petitionary letters were called for, and a letter was presented by messengers of the Church at New Hope in Adair County, Oklahoma. Also a letter was presented by messengers of the church at Mt. Enterprise, Benton County, Ark. On motion and unanimous vote, taken separately, these churches were received into the body. The moderator then extended to the messengers of these churches the hand of fellowship in behalf of the association.

Committee on Divine Service was appointed, consisting of R. Edwards, J. B. Burgin, and the messengers of Springtown Church.

A number of visiting brethren and sisters responded to an invitation to seats and enrolled as visitors. 1918

Committee on Finance was appointed, consisting of R. L. Hurst, J. J. Glover, and D. M. Aaron.

On invitation of the messengers of the church at Southern Grove, a motion prevailed that the next meeting of this association be held with that church.

Election of preacher of the introductory sermon next year resulted in the choice of Eld. L. L. Johnson with Eld. A. N. Sanders as alternate.

On motion and unanimous vote, Article One of the Constitution of this body was amended to read as follows:

Art. 1. This Association shall be composed of churches represented by messengers, who shall be members of the churches they represent, and it shall be styled, "The Benton County Baptist Association." Visiting Baptists may be invited to seats and enrolled as visitors, and may have the privilege of the floor in discussions, but shall not be allowed a vote on any question, nor a place on any committee.

A motion prevailed that the time of meeting tomorrow be 9:00 A. M., Government time.

A motion prevailed to adjourn to meet for preaching at 9300 P. M.

FRIDAY EVENING SESSION.

Sermon by Eld. L. L. Johnson from John 3:3. Adjourned till 9:00 A. M. tomorrow.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION.

Singing by the congregation and reading of Psa. 77 and prayer by James H. Jones.

Appointment of committees was announced by the moderator.

Minutes of yesterday's proceedings were read and adopted.

The Committee on Publications submitted report, which was discussed by Jas. H. Jones, E. M. Bagby, Eld. G. C. Harris, Lee Reed, Eld. W. S. Crowley, O. F. Moss, Eld. C. C. Winters, Eld. J. A. Smith, Eld. J. L. Chastain, and the report was adopted.

The Committee on Ministerial Education and Support submitted report, which was discussed by Eld. John Setser, Eld. G. C. Harris.

The hour for preaching having arrived, a motion prevailed to take recess for preaching, and reassemble for the afternoon session one and a haif hours after dismissal and continue the discussion of this subject at that time.

After singing, reading of Psalm 118, and prayer, Eld. J. A. Smith preached from Psa. 118:25.

Prayer by E. M. Bagby. While "How Firm a Foundation" was being sung, an offering of \$23.06 was placed on the table for State Missions.

Dismissed with prayer at 1:30 P. M.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON SESSION.

Song, "Savior More Than Life to Me."

Reading of scripture lesson by Roy E. Daugherty and prayer by R. Edwards.

The report on Ministerial Education and Support was further discussed by Eld. J. A. Smith, Eld. C. C. Winters, and others and the report was adopted.

The treasurer reporting that \$5.17 remains in the treasury of funds contributed to assist Bro. Roy E. Daugherty to obtain an education, a motion prevailed that the same be given to Bro. Daugherty to be used for the purchase of books.

The Committee on Associational Missions submitted report, which was discussed by Eld A. N. Sanders, Eld. L. L. Johnson, Eld. W S. Crowley, and the report was adopted

The missionary, Eld. W. S. Crowley, submitted a report, which was discussed by Eld. Crowley, Eld. L. Johnson, Eld. G. C. Harris, E. C. Brooks, Eld. C. C. Winters, and the report was adopted.

The treasurer of the association submitted report, which was adopted.

The Committee on Obituaries submitted a report, which was discussed by E. C. Brooks, Eld. G. W. Birkes, Eld. E. J. Adams, W. F. Masters, Eld. W. S. Crowley, Eld. W. B. Collins and report was adopted.

A motion prevailed that the report on State Missions be taken up at the evening session

The moderator being so-situated that he could not be present at the evening session, appointed Eld. A. N. Sanders as moderator, pro-tem.

A motion prevailed to adjourn until 8:30 P. M.

An offering of \$13.05 was taken ror the Texarkana Orphans Home.

Election of Executive Committee and Missionary resulted in the choice of E. C. Brooks, Eld. J. L. Chastain, and Eld T. F. Jones as Committee and Eld W. S. Crowley as Missionary.

A motion prevailed that the report on Sunday Schools be called for next and the report on Temperance following

This Association shall meet annually on Friday before the second Sunday in September, at the place previously appointed; and after public worship and reading of letters from the churches, a Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen from the messengers by ballot, both of whom shall hold their offices until others shall be elected.

Article III. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make an accurate record of the proceedings of each meeting, in a book provided for the purpose. He shall also act as Treasurer.

Article IV. Each church may send three messengers. The messengers shall present letters certifying their appointment, and briefly expressing the state of the churches, their increase and decrease, and their aggregate number. Each church shall send with the letter money for printing the minutes, out of which fund the Clerk shall be allowed ten dollars for his services in preparing manuscripts and superintending the printing and distribution of the minutes.

Article V. Churches wishing to unite with this Association may apply by letters and messengers, and giving satisfactory information of their being sound in doctrine and correct in practice, they may be received by unanimous vote, in token of which the moderator shall give to the messengers the right hand of fellowship in behalf of the Association. Churches may be dismissed upon application.

Article VI. We acknowledge the independence of the particular churches, and that no authority or jurisdiction is to be exercised over them by this Association, nor will the Association decide in any controversy that may arise in any church. Nevertheless they deem it their duty to disown any church belonging to this body which may have essentially departed from the faith.

Article VII. When a church shall neglect making any communication to the Association for three years successively, it shall be considered as having withdrawn from us, and shall be dropped from the minutes of the Association, unless at least two members request their continuance, who shall engage to enquire into their standing, and report at the next meeting of the Association.

Article VIII. This Association shall have the right to open and hold correspondence with Associations, as may be deemed expedient.

Article IX. It shall be the duty of the Association, from time to time, to suggest to the several churches such measures as may be wise and proper to promote the interest of the Master's kingdom and spread the gospel throughout the world.

Article X. This Constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of the Association, by a two-thirds vote of all the members present.
