## CONSTITUTION

As amended at 1933, 1943, 1948, 1950 and 1951 Sessions and the present new and revised draft, presented to the Association, in the Annual Meeting of 1953.

### ARTICLE I—NAME

The name of this body shall be the Pulaski County Baptist Association, Incorporated.

### ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this Association shall be to awaken and stimulate among the churches of the Association, the greatest possible activity in evangelism, Christian Education, Missions and Benevolences, throughout the bounds of the Association; To cultivate closer co-operation among the churches and to promote concert of action in advancing all the interest of the Kingdom of God.

### ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of Messengers from regular co-operating churches, which are in sympathy with the principles and purposes of this Constitution and desire to co-operate with this Association, who shall be entitled to seats upon presentation of letters from their churches or other satisfactory evidence of their appointment.

Section 2. Each church shall be entitled to three messengers, with one additional messenger for every 50 members or major fraction thereof, above 100 of their resident church membership. Provided, that no church shall have more than 10 messengers.

Section 3. Messengers from churches desiring to affiliate with this Association shall present to the Association in Annual Meeting, Petitionary Letters or evidence, setting forth the Articles of Faith on which the church was organized, together with satisfactory evidence of the regularity of their organization. They shall be received into the Association ONLY by unanimous vote cast by the body.

### ARTICLE IV—AUTHORITY

This Association shall never exercise any authority—legislative or ecclesiastical—over any church—nor shall it in any way interfere with the rights and absolute independence of any church.

### ARTICLE V—OFFICERS

Section 1. The Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be elected the



First session of the second day and who shall take office the closing session of the last day. Said officers to be elected by a majority vote cast at such meeting. Provided, however, that the Moderator shall not be eligible to serve more than two successive terms.

Section 2. The Moderator shall serve at all sessions of the Association or call the Vice-Moderator to preside. The Moderator shall exercise the same privilege of discussion as any other member of the body.

Section 3. The Clerk shall keep a correct record of the Proceedings of the Association in Annual meeting, The Executive Board in regular or called meetings, and the Missions Committee in regular or called meetings, and shall superintend the printing and distribution of the proceedings of the Annual Meeting, and the substance of Executive Board meetings and the meetings of the Missions Committee, as the Association may direct.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of every kind entrusted to him and shall disburse the same upon the order of the Executive Board and shall make an itemized statement of receipts and disbursements monthly to the Executive Board and an Annual statement to the Association in Annual session.

#### ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of one lay member, elected by each co-operating church, together with the pastor of each co-operating church and the Officers of the Association. FIFTEEN members of said Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall meet one time each month in regular meeting, time and place to be determined by the Board and in case of special meetings written notice must be given to each Board member. The Moderator and Clerk of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Board.

Section 3. The Executive Board shall receive reports, in the monthly meetings, from the following:

Treasurer's Report.

Associational Missionary.

Superintendent of Associational Sunday School.

Director of Associational Training Union.

President of the Associational Brotherhood.

Superintendent of the Associational W. M. U.

Director of Associational Music Program.

Director of Student Union Work in the Association.

Recommendations of the Missions Committee.

Section 4. The Executive Board shall be constituted and empowered by the Association as its legal agent to administer all business committed to it by the Association and to employ such paid agents as it may deem necessary in carrying on the Missionary, Education, Benevolent and Financial work of the Association.

Section 5. The Executive Board shall render to the Association in Annual meeting a complete and detailed statement of all the business for the year.

#### ARTICLE VII—MISSIONS COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Association in Annual meeting, through the Nominating Committee, shall elect a standing Committee known as the MISSIONS COMMITTEE, who shall serve as follows: Group No. Three, for three years; Group No. Two, for two years and Group No. One, for one year, or three members to the group.

Section 2. The Officers of the Association and the Elected Associational Organization leaders, shall be ex-officio members of the Committee.

Section 3. The Missions Committee shall have the responsibility of selecting and nominating the Associational Missionary or any other paid agents of the Association, and to recommend their employment to the Executive Board in regular meetings—or properly called special meetings.

Section 4. The Missions Committee is further charged with the responsibility of planning and promoting the work of the Association as it relates to Associational Missions, Benevolences, Christian Education, The Cooperative Program, the establishment of new units of Sunday School work, location of new churches.

Section 5. The Missions Committee shall be the "clearing house" of the activity of the Associational organizations in promoting the work of the Association.

#### ARTICLE VIII—MEETINGS

Section 1. The Association shall meet Annually on a day designated at each Annual Meeting. If no date is set, the Executive Board will perform this service.

Section 2. The Moderator of the Association shall appoint during the first day of the Annual meeting the following Committees to report during the session at which they were appointed (Annual)—

Committee on Audits.

Committee on Time, Place, Preacher for Next Annual Meeting.

Committee on Resolutions.

Committee on Obituaries.



Section 3. The Moderator elected for the next annual session shall appoint before the close of the Annual meeting at which he was elected the Chairmen of the following Committees:

- Committee on Associational Missions.
- Committee on Associational Organizations.
- Committee on Missions and the Cooperative Program.
- Committee on Christian Education and Religious Literature.
- Committee on Benevolences and Benevolent Institutions.
- Committee on Temperance and Social Service.
- Committee on Budget and Finance.
- Committee on Nominations.

Section 4. These Standing Committees to be enlarged to three members to each Committee before the next Annual Meeting, by the Moderator after conference with the Chairman of the Committees.

#### ARTICLE IX—ASSOCIATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

Section 1. The Leaders of the Associational Organizations—as Superintendent of Sunday School, Superintendent of Woman's Missionary Union, Director of Training Union, Director of Music, President of the Brotherhood and Director of Student Union Work, or others—shall be nominated by the Committee on Nominations, appointed by the Moderator and elected by the Association in Annual Meeting.

Section 2. In the event no nomination is made for one or more of the Associational Organization Leaders, the Executive Board will perform this service, through the Missions Committee.

Section 3. The Associational Organizations shall co-operate, through the Missions Committee VIA the Calendar of Activities. Said organizations, through their leaders to make monthly reports to the Executive Board of work done and work proposed—or planned.

#### ARTICLE X—HOW AMENDED

This Constitution may be amended at any Annual Meeting of the Association by a TWO-THIRDS VOTE of the Messengers present, provided that the substance of ARTICLE IV shall not be abrogated.

#### RULES OF ORDER

As Amended at 1933 and 1947 Sessions—and the 1953 Session  
as Amended

I. ORDER OF BUSINESS: The Order of Business shall be made flexible to meet the needs as they arise. A Committee on



ORDER OF BUSINESS shall publish a Tentative Order of Business for distribution at the First Session of the Annual Meeting. Said Committee to consist of the Moderator, Clerk, Host Pastor, and Associational Missionary, together with the SIX elected Associational Organization Leaders.

II. Mells Parliamentary Law shall be the standard in deciding questions of parliamentary practice.

III. The Committee on Order of Business shall be charged with making the Annual Meetings as Spiritual, Inspirational and Informational as is possible to make them. Preaching shall have a prominent place in the Annual Meetings.

## PROCEEDINGS

The Pulaski County Baptist Association met in its Thirty-Eighth Annual Session with the First Baptist Church of North Little Rock, Arkansas, October 26 and 27, 1953.

The Association was called to order by the Moderator, W. Harold Hicks at 7:00 P. M. Robert Glenn led in singing, "Showers of Blessings", "Revive Us Again", and "I Am Resolved". A devotional was led by Roy Hilton which consisted of reading Heb. 12:1ff and a prayer.

6. The Moderator called for a report of the Committee on Petitionary Letters, and the Chairman, R. D. Herrington,



presented a petition for membership from Riverside Baptist Church. A motion prevailed that the church be received and the messengers seated.

7. The Moderator called for all new pastors and educational directors to come forward and asked E. A. Ingram to introduce them. The following were introduced:

8. The Moderator called for the Report on Cooperative Program, and recognized Ben L. Bridges, General Secretary for Arkansas Baptists. He called for his assistant, Lucien Coleman, to make the report. He made an oral report illustrating his points with a series of small banners on which were printed messages.

9. A motion was passed granting Mr. W. A. Jackson ten minutes to speak on the work of the "Arkansas Baptist Foundation", of which he is Secretary. This was granted to him in order to enable him to make another Association the next day.

10. Special music was rendered by Mr. Robert Glenn with Mrs. Joe Simmons serving as pianist.

11. The time having arrived for the Annual Sermon, the Moderator presented Bro. Raymond Strickland who was chosen at the last meeting to deliver this sermon. He read Habakkuk 1:1-4, and used verse two for his text. He brought an earnest message on "The Burden of Habakkuk", after which he dismissed the body with prayer.

## **TUESDAY MORNING, OCTOBER 27, 9:30**

Moderator W. Harold Hicks called the Association to order at 9:30 A. M.

J. W. Cady led in singing "Send the Light", "Standing on the Promises", and "Jesus Saves". Eugene Webb, Sixteenth Street, read Col. 4:1-6 and led in prayer.

12. A motion prevailed that we hear the report of the Committee on Revision of the Constitution. Taylor Stanfill, chairman, made the report. After a minor change or two which were made by unanimous consent, the report was adopted. The constitution as amended is the one printed in these Minutes.

Bro. Taylor Stanfill announced the death of Mrs. Lucille Bourland Murphy, wife of Pastor Pat W. Murphy, of Tulsa, Oklahoma. (Both are natives of Arkansas.)

13. A motion prevailed that Supt. Harold Seefeldt of the Bottoms Baptist Orphanage be asked to speak on the orphanage. He made an oral report and submitted a written report for the Minutes. It was adopted.

### BOTTOMS BAPTIST ORPHANAGE

The Bottoms Baptist Orphanage is located in Monticello, Arkansas. The overall family, including the Staff members and their children, number between 90 and 100. The capacity of the Home is 36 boys and 36 girls, but by placing 3 boys in the Administration Building and 3 in the Older Boys' Housemother's room, we have been able to care for as many as 78 at one time. The total number cared for during the year was 111. Two girls graduated from High school in May and have entered A. & M. College in Monticello. One of the two did summer work there. Two of the 38 children placed during the year went into Service; 18 of them went into re-established homes; two of the girls married; one boy went to work in Shreveport; one girl went into a foster home; two girls went to live with sisters; and all were placed where it was felt that it was to the best interest of the child.

All of the children attend the First Baptist Church, Sunday school, Training Union and other church organizations regularly. With the exception of those who have come into the Home recently all 9 years of age and older have made a profession of faith in Christ as Saviour and have become members of Monticello First Baptist Church.

The challenge to build has been accepted and construction of the cottage for older girls and one for the older boys, which began June 15th, is progressing nicely, and it is hoped they will be ready for occupancy by at least January 1st, 1954. Low bids on the construction of the two cottages totaled \$132,383.62.

In making our budget request for 1954, although we expect an increase in population of some 50%, we are only



asking for a 25% increase over 1953, and we are grateful that the Executive Committee has favored this request.

We also hope to receive \$40,000 in the Capital Needs Budget. All received above actual operating needs will go into Capital Needs.

15. Report on Temperance was read by C. E. Lawrence. It was discussed by him and L. M. Keeling and then adopted.

#### REPORT ON TEMPERANCE

The famous William Jennings Bryan once said, "God never made a human being who needed alcohol to stimulate his brain or to feed his body."

How true is this statement but how tragic it is that there are now over 65 million drinkers in our nation. Dr. Paul Herrin, School of Medicine, Nantes, France, says, "Alcohol is a social scourge equal in importance to tuberculosis and syphilis, of which it is partly the cause."

How ironic is the fact that while we spent millions in "cancer" research, in combating "heart disease", "polio" and other deadly diseases, we legalize the most crime-breeding, home-wrecking, disease-breeding, soul-destroying traffic on earth, liquor. What a disgraceful, criminal thing for America to be guilty of. There is no national menace comparable to the liquor traffic. While there are some 600,000 victims of cancer, 700,000 victims of tuberculosis, there are 4,000,000



victims of alcoholism, in addition to 300,000 other addictive drinkers. Americas liquor bill for the year of 1952 amounted to \$9,570,000,000, or one million dollars for each year since 7,600 years before Jesus was born.

Look at the liquor situation in Arkansas. Since 1933 when beer was legalized, the total liquor bill through 1952 amounted to over 600 millions of dollars. To this sum must be added the unknown amounts spent for bootleg liquor (most of which was spent in wet counties). Then think of the tremendous cost of crime caused by liquor, the automobile accidents and deaths caused by liquor. All of this for the sake of a little revenue. How blind are those who argue thus in the light of the fact that the people of this state pay out of their pockets \$8.05 for each \$1.00 gathered in taxes from this hellish traffic.

Statistics reveal that in three of the leading denominational children's homes in Arkansas in May 1953, there were 165 children and of this number 60% were there from the results of broken homes caused by liquor.

We have much for which to be thankful, however, and which encourages us to press the fight against this ungodly traffic. Since January, 1943, there have been 152 local option elections in Arkansas. The wets have won in only 33 while the dries have won in 119. There are now 39 dry counties, 44 dry townships and 9 dry towns as of June 30, 1953. The wets have made 14 attempts in counties, townships and towns trying to vote these areas back wet but have failed in every one of them.

Let us be thankful to God for these victories. Let us be more determined to use our influence and testimony against the sale of liquor, wine, and beer in any form, legally or illegally. Let us pray to God to help us in the fight to banish the entire liquor traffic.

#### TRAINING UNION REPORT (Abridged)

#### REPORT OF WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION

Mrs. Robert Golden, Associate Superintendent of the Associational W. M. U., introduced Mrs. E. A. Ingram, field worker, who gave the following report:



It gives me great pleasure to report for so fine and dedicated group of women and young people as ours. 4,233 members make up the 59 societies and 186 young people's auxiliaries, which have functioned during the year. They reported 586 mission books taught with 3,423 attending classes. 400 services were held in institutions and 618 visits were made to them.

Cash given for Community Missions was \$2,992.23. Many other visits were made, cottage prayer meetings held, commodities and clothing distributed. \$1,111.77 was given to the Children's Home. Gifts of cash for medicine; clothing and commercial can goods went to the Baptist Hospital. \$98.25 was given to the Narcotic Fund; \$90.00 to a college student; and one hundred percent of the members gave to the Cooperative Program.

The three seasons of prayer were observed by a large majority, with offerings for the three causes amounting to \$25,710.80. New tithers reported were 228.

Four quarterly rallies were held for the women and 21 for the young people where missionary speakers and films presented the mission challenge.

Our hope is for an enlarged membership that will strengthen the cause of missions in the churches, as women and young people get a greater vision. We covet the prayers and cooperation of the pastors.

#### BROTHERHOOD REPORT (Abridged)

The scope of Brotherhood work in Arkansas has been expanded by the assumption of the responsibility of the promotion of the Royal Ambassador program of the Woman's Missionary Union at Brotherhood Department expense. Rev. J. D. Wagnon as an associate to Mr. Nelson Tull, he to give half of his time to Royal Ambassador work and the other half to the promotion of Young Men's Brotherhoods and other regular Brotherhood work.

There are 425 church Brotherhoods in Arkansas, a growth of 52 over last year. 36 of the 45 associations have associational organizations. The W. M. U. report shows 398 Royal Ambassador chapters in the state; a growth of 49 since January 1st. In Pulaski County Association there are 44 Brotherhoods.

God has blessed the Brotherhood movement in Arkansas and throughout the Southland. Brotherhood work is entirely Christ centered, church centered, and denominationally centered.
