PROCEEDINGS.

THE EIGHTH ANNUAL SESSION of the Concord Association met, pursuant to adjournment, on Saturday, the 21st day of September, A. D. 1878, with Macedonia Church, bebastian County, Ark. The introductory sermon was preached by Elder J. J. Holland, from Luke xix, 13, theme, The Church, and Her Responsibilities;" and was followed by Elder J. M. Ledbetter.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Met pursuant to adjournment. Prayer by Elder S. J. Fuller.

Report of Committee on Credentials received and

Petitionary letters were received from Union Hope, Chalybeate Springs, Double Branch, Mill Creek, and Mount Moriah Churches, and were received, and the hand of fellowship extended to their Messengers.

The Association proceeded to ballot for officers, choosing E. L. Compere, Moderator; M. L. Eggleston, Clerk, and

R. H. McConnell, Treasurer.

On motion, the following committees were appointed: On Documents—Elder-A. J. Rippy, B. C. Owen and Lindsey Patterson.

On Finance—Brothers R. H. Cook, Wm. Blalock, J. T.

Mayfield, James H. Smith and G. H. Council.

Adjourned to meet on Monday morning at 9 o'clock.

Preaching at night by Elder J. J. Tate, from Revelations xiv, 13; theme, "Enjoyment of Heaven;" followed by Brother Martin James, Choctaw.

PREAMBLE AND RESOLUTIONS.

WHEREAS, The Western Baptist, published at Little Rock by Elders T. P. Espy and W. A. Forbes, is now owned and controlled by these brethren, and has thereby become our State paper; and having a corresponding editor in each Association, it becomes a medium of Baptist news throughout the State; therefore,

Resolved, That this Association heartily indorse the Western Baptist, and urge upon the brethren to support it by their subscriptions, correspondence

The hour for religious services having arrived. Brother Martin James preached from Acts x, 42; theme, "Jesus, and Him Crucified."

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Met pursuant to adjournment. Prayer by Elder W.V. McNeelv.

On motion, the Moderator appointed the following committee to investigate the Pleasant Grove Church difficulties: J. M. Ledbetter, A. F. Ross, B. C. Owen, A. J. Rippy, Lindsey Patterson, J. M. Clevenger and J. F. Burt.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON DOCUMENTS.

1. We find requests from the following Churches for the meeting of the next session of the Association: Cedar Grove, Booneville and Charleston Churches. We recommend Cedar Grove Church.

2. We find a protest from Mount Zion Church against the reception of

the Messengers from Mount Nebo Church into this body. We recommend that, inasmuch as there is a growing tendency to bring disputes and grievances into this body, when our Constitution only claims to be an advisory council, not a judge, we recommend the Association to withhold any action until the Churches shall prayerfully labor for a reconciliation, and as such would ask the brethren to try and settle their troubles out of this body.

REPORT ON MINISTERIAL EDUCATION.

We, your Committee, beg leave to report that there exists great lack of ministerial education in our Association, which is severely felt, and we earnestly recommend that this body devise some plan to educate our Ministers.

REPORT ON SABBATH SCHOOLS.

We beg leave to report as follows: That, notwithstanding the inestimable value and intrinsic worth of the Sabbath School as a means of teaching our children the Holy Scriptures, we find but comparatively few such organizations in a state of prosperity among our Churches; and as the success of the Sabbath School depends solely on the strict co-operation of parents, teachers and Church, we recommend for the future a more solid and united effort by all in that direction. Furthermore, we recommend that each Pastor in the respective Churches give annually at least one lecture on the importance of the Sabbath School and its influence for good.

We recommend to the Churches Kind Words, published at Macon. Ga., as a valuable assistant in the Sabbath School work. Address. "Kind Words, Macon. Ga."

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MINISTERIAL SUPPORT.

We, your Committee, beg leave to r port as follows: That we, in our judgment, consider the subject of vital importance, and one upon which, in a great measure, depends our tuture success, as it is God's law that they that "Preach the Gospel shall live of the Gospel." We, therefore, recommend that each Church in this Association prayerfully consider this subject, and faithfully discharge their duty in the premises.

While reflecting upon the great evils in society, we conclude that none is greater than intoxication. It strips you of your property, takes from you your reputation, deprives you of your health, and even snatches from you your life, thrusting your immortal soul into torment, as no drunkard shall

enter into the Kingdom of Heaven.

It hurls its destructive blows not only against the world, but against the Church of Christ. Therefore, let us rise up against and endeavor to crush this terrible monster, that it may no longer impede the progress of Christianity and remain as a stigma on our denomination. We, therefore, recommend that Pastors and Churches use every effort to secure among the brethren a total abstinence, as a beverage, from all that intoxicates, and that each. Pastor be requested to preach at least one sermon on this subject annually.

2. That this Association will regard as final the decision of said council.
3. That this Association requests the aforesaid parties to attend strictly the aforesaid meeting, with their witnesses and the record of the Churches. 4. That Cedar Grove Church be the place, and Thursday before the third

REPORT ON NOMINATIONS.

RULES OF DECORUM.

- 1. This Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. An Introductory and Missionary Sermon shall be preached by ministers chosen at the preceding Association—in case of absence or failure, the sermon of either to be preached by an alternate, to be chosen at the sametime and in the same way. Some brother shall also be chosen to deliver a temperance address.
- 3. Visiting brethren in good standing may be invited to seats, but not to vote,
- 4. A member not satisfied with any decision of the Moderator may appeal to the Association on the same day, but at no other time.
- 5. But one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise, address the Moderator, and, on obtaining leave, shall proceed.
- 6. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, unless he depart from the subject or use words of personal reflection, and then by the Moderator.
- 7. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by him who made it. Every case taken up by the Association shall be decided or withdrawn before another is introduced.
- 8. When a question is taken up, after allowing time for debate, the Moderator shall take the voice of the Association by yeas and nays, or otherwise.
- 9. Any member wishing to retire shall obtain permission from the Moderator.
- 10. No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject without permission of the Association.
- 11. The appellation of Brother shall be used in the Association by members in their addresses one to another, and all titles unknown to the Scriptures, such as "Rev.," "D. D.," "Parson," and the like, shall not be employed or appear upon the Minutes.
- 12. The names of members shall be called as often the Association may direct.
- 13. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speaking as any other member, provided he appoint another to his seat during the time but shall not vote on any question unless the Association be equally divided.
- 14. An member violating these rules may be reproved by the Moderator, at discretion, but only on the day the breach shall have been made.
- 15. These rules may be amended or altered at any regular meeting of this body, by a majority vote of the members present.
