The Committee on State Missions made their report and after an amendment by Brother Shepard designating that at the regular meeting day in each church in October a collection for State Missions should be taken, was adoptel.

Young, Brother Maluffey, and Brother Emery were appointed corresponding messengers to the Caddo River Association; Brother Ilms, Brother Nooner, and Brother Jones, to the Dardanelle Association; Brother J. D. Cunningham and Brother Reeves to the Caddo Valley Association; Brother J. T. Newkirk and Brother J. W. Pullen to the Hallne Association.

Report of Committee on Foreign Missions read, and, after being discussed by Brother Shepard, Brother Emery, Brother McLane, and after a collection of \$1.80 was made, was adopted.

Called to order at 1:30 o'clock. Prayer by Brother J. A. Young.

Report of Finance Committee read and adopted.

Committee on Orphans' Home made their report, which was adopted.

Report of the Committee on Obituaries and Condo-

On motion the body adopted the same report on Home Missions that was adopted two years ago.

Report of Committee on Education read and adopted.

A Missionary Board, consisting of J. G. McLane, J. H. McKinzie, and J. T. Blakely, was elected.

The Board, together with the Moderator, were instructed to arrange a program for the Sunday School work in the next Association.

The Treasurer's report was read and adopted.

- On motion the Clerk was instructed to have 300 Minutes printed and distribute them in proportion to the Minute fund of each church.

The Clerk was allowed balance of Minute fund after having them printed, and \$2.25 was raised to supplement

this amount.

On motion the body adjourned to meet with Marble Church, 16 miles north of Hot Springs, Saturday before the fourth Sunday in September, 1916, at 10:00 o'clock a. m.

Resolved, That this Association tender its thanks and appreciation to New Hope Church and community for the splendid manner in which they have cared for this Association.

CONSTITUTION.

- Article I. This union of churches of God shall be known as the Buckville Missionary Baptist Association.
- Art. II. The Association shall be composed of messengers from the churches in this union. Each church shall be entitled to three messengers, who shall have been chosen by the respective church to which they belong.
- Art. III. Messengers, when convened, may organize themselve into a deliberative body, by the appointment of Moderator and Clerk, who shall be chosen by ballot at each annual session, and shall continue in office until their successors are elected.

Art. IV. The Association shall not interfere with the rights

of the churches of which it is composed.

It shall regard them as independent bodies in all matters of internal government, and shall act only as an advisory council, assuming no authority except what is implied by the very nature of the compact.

It nevertheless claims authority over its own members, the messengers from the churches, and in justice and propriety must retain the right to withdraw from all churches which may depart from the faith of this compact by becoming heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.

It should, therefore, regard all churches united under this Constitution with vigilant eye, as its principal object shall be to promote the truth of the Gospel and advance the kingdom of God

in our bounds and to all the ends of the earth.

- Art. V. Newly constituted churches, or churches having letters of dismission from other Associations of like faith and order, may be admitted to membership in this Association at any regular annual session of the body, provided they send messengers with a petitionary letter.
- Art. VI. The churches of this Association shall transmit to each annual session a written or printed communication, signed by the Moderator and Clerk of the church, specifying the names of their messengers and the statistics of the church, showing the progress of the church since the last session of this body, which shall be read and filed with the Clerk of this body accordingly.
- Art. VII. This Association may have a fund supplied by the voluntary contributions of the churches, which shall be paid over through a finance committee to the Treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot and hold office during the pleasure of the Association. He shall present annually to the Association for inspection in the Minutes, a clear statement of all receipts.
- Art. VIII. This Association shall furnish the churches with printed copies of the Minutes of each session.
- Art. IX. This Association shall take cognizance of no query sent up from the churches, unless it appears that the churches sending them have used due diligence to solve them first; and shall not undertake to settle individual differences between the

members of the churches, unless it appears that the individuals, or the churches to which they belong, have taken, or caused to have taken, Gospel steps for the adjustment of the trouble.

Art. X. This Constitution may be altered or amended at any regular meeting of this Association, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, provided, further, that Article IV of this Constitution shall not be altered or amended.

ARTICLES OF FAITH.

- Article I. We believe in one only true and living God, the Pather, the Son, and Holy Spirit.
- At. II. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament is our only rule of faith and practice.
- Art. III. We believe in the doctrine of election as founded in the foreknowledge of God, through the sanctification of the soul unto obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ.
 - Art. IV. We believe in original sin by the fall of Adam.
- Art. V. We believe in man's incapacity, by his own free will and ability, to rescue himself from the fallen state in which is in by nature.
- Art. VI. We believe the saints are justified in the sight of that by the imputed righteousness of Christ only.
- Art. VII. We believe the saints will be preserved in grace and never fall finally away.
- Art. VIII. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper ordinances of Jesus Christ; that believers are the only proper amblects of baptism, and that immersion is the apostolic mode.
- Art. IX. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, and annual judgment, and that the reward of the righteous and punishment of the wicked will be eternal.
- Art. X. We believe that no minister has a right to administhe ordinances of the Gospel but one who has been regularly imported, and that is called and comes under the hands of a scrippresbytery.
