PROCEEDINGS.

The Big Creek Missionary Baptist Association convened its 13th annual session with Liberty Church, Fulton courty, Ark. Sept. 10th, 1887. Introductory sermon preached by Eld. M. A. Chadwick—Text, 18th verse of the 16th Chapter of Matthew. After an hour's intermission, the Messengers reassembled, the former clerk being absent J. F. Barnes was appointed clerk pro tem. Names of Churches were called, letters read and Messengers' names enrolled.

On motion the Association proceeded to the election of Eld. W. H. Bowling, Moderator, and James F. Barnes, cl'k.

After a few brief remarks by the Moderator, proceeded to business as follows:

1st. Give an invitation to new churches desiring admission into this Association.

2d. Call for corresponding Messengers. Eld. D. W. Epley from Union Association and Bro. Sam Jones from Rocky Bayou Association came forward and were welcomed to a seat by the moderator.

3rd. Invited visiting members to seats with us—whereupon Eld. O. M. Lucus accepted the invitation.

4t. The Moderator appointed the following committees: On arrangements, T. F. Cargill, J. W Dailey, Geo. A. Floyd, on Baptist Literature.

On Foreign Missions, H. B. Clinton, J. D. Cochran, J. E. Cargill.

On Home Missions, W. P. Claxton, S. M. Wren, J. D. Bratcher.

H. B. Clinton, M. A. Chadwick, J. H. McCuiston.

On Sabbath Schools, M. A. Chadwick, J. P. Lovelace, J. H. McCuiston.

On Finance, Jesse Carroll, Z. T. Clay.

On Obituaries, G. C. Jones, S. M. Wren, J. E. Cargill.

It was decided that Eld. D. W. Epley preach to-night, Eld. O. M. Lucus to preach Sunday at 11 o'clock.

Motion for adjournment until Monday morning at 8 o'clock—carried—prayer by Rev. J. H. McCuiston

SATURDAY NIGHT.

Eld. D. W. Epley preached an able discourse to an attentive audiance—Text—15th and 16th verses of the 16th chapter of Mark, followed by Eld. W. H. Bowling.

SUNDAY MORNING.

Sunday at 11 o'clock the stand was taken by Eld. O. M. Lucus—Text--19 verse of 28th chapter of Matthhew; from

this scripture he preached an able sermon to a large au dience, from which we hope much and lasting good wa accomplished and that it may prove a savor of life unta life and not of death unto death.

MONDAY MOBNING.

Monday morning the 13th inst at 8 o'clock the Association met. Messengers names called and absentee marked. Saturday's minutes read and approved.

Committees reported—Reports received, adopted and Committees discharged.

1st. Committee on arrangements same as last year minutes will show.

2d. Committee on Literature recommends the Bible as a volume of Baptist doctrines. Let us read it and be guided by it.

3d. Committee on Foreign Missions report but little doing in regard to this great work and request the churche to report the amount contributed by each church at ou next Association.

4th. Committee on Home Missions recommends that ead church so support their Pastors that they may be able to cultivate the unoccupied grounds within our bounds.

5th. Committee on State Missions request that an earnest effort be made to receive a small contribution from each Baptist for the cause of Mission.

6th. Committee on Sabbath Schools recommend that the Churches take a higher stand in this direction and that each Pastor lecture and organize Sabbath Schools in all of our churches and that the one text book should be the Bible.

7th. Missionary reported. I, J. P. Lovelace being appointed by home Missionary Board have traveled 70 miles preached 34 sermons, made 32 exortations, done 4 and a half days work in all; held three protracted meetings, organized five churches, witnessed seventeen conversions, baptised six, collected \$13.75, balance due, \$40.75

Association payed by subscription, \$32 30. Ballance

8th. Committee on Obituary reported: Eld. T. Lovelace was born in the State of Kentucky, Feb. 4th, 1818, embraced a hope in Christ when about 25 years of age and joined the Baptist church in January 1887 our venerable Brother passed away to his final home; he was an eloquent minister of the Gospel and exerted a good influence over his auditors. But our Brother has left us, our loss is his gain, he has laid aside his armor for a Crown of Life. Servant of God well done,

Eld. H. B. Clinton and Eld J. H. Bowling were appointed Messengers to the State Convention by a vote.

The next annual meeting of this Association will be with New Prospect Church, Izard county, Ark., commencing on Saturday before the 3rd Sabbath in Sept. 1888. Eld. W. H. Bowling to preach the introductory sermon Eld. J. P. Lovelace alternate. Motion that we tender our thanks to the surroundir community of Liberty church for kind hospitality.

Motion for an adjournment-carried.
