

CONSTITUTION

(As Amended at 1933, 1943, 1948, 1950, 1951, 1953 and 1954 Sessions.)

ARTICLE I-NAME

The name of this body shall be the Pulaski County Baptist Association, Incorporated.

ARTICLE II-PURPOSE

The purpose of this Association shall be to awaken and stimulate among the churches of the Association, the greatest possible activity in Evangelism, Christian Education, Missions and Benevolences, throughout the bounds of the Association; to cultivate closer cooperation among the churches and to promote concert of action in advancing all the interest of the Kingdom of God.

ARTICLE III-MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of Messengers from regular co-operating churches, which are in sympathy with the principles and purposes of this Constitution and desire to co-operate with this Association, who shall be entitled to seats upon presentation of letters from their churches or other satisfactory evidence of their appointment.

Section 2. Each church shall be entitled to a minimum of three messengers. One additional messenger shall be allowed for every 50 resident church members above 100. No church, however, may have more than 10 messengers.

Section 3. Messengers from churches desiring to affiliate with this Association shall present to the Association in Annual Meeting, Petitionary Letters or evidence, setting forth the Articles of Faith on which the church was organized, together with satisfactory evidence of the regularity of their organization. They shall be received into the Association by receiving two-thirds of the votes cast.

ARTICLE IV-AUTHORITY

This Association shall never exercise any authority, legislative or ecclesiastical, over any church. Nor shall it in any way interfere with the rights and absolute independence of any church.

ARTICLE V-OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be elected the first session of the second day and who shall take office the closing session of the last day of the annual Associational meeting. Said officers to be elected by a majority vote cast at such meeting. The Moderator shall not be eligible to serve more than two successive terms. The Clerk and the Treasurer may be the same person.

Section 2. The Moderator shall preside at all sessions of the Association; or request the Vice-Moderator to preside. The Vice-Moderator will also preside in the absence of the Moderator. The Moderator shall exercise the same privilege of discussion as any other member of the body.

Section 3. The Clerk shall keep a correct record of the Proceedings of the Association in annual meeting, the Executive Board in regular or called meetings, and the Missions Committee in regular or called meetings. He shall be responsible for the printing and distribution of the proceedings of the annual meeting; the taking and preserving of the minutes of all Executive Board and Missions Committee meetings as the Association may direct.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of every kind entrusted to him and shall disburse the same upon the order of the Executive Board and shall make an itemized statement of receipts and disbursements monthly to the Executive Board and an annual statement to the Association in annual session. The Treasurer shall be bonded by the Association, at the Association's expense. An annual audit shall be made of his books by a reputable accountant. This fee shall be paid by the Association.

ARTICLE VI-EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of one lay member, elected by each co-operating church, together with the pastor of each co-operating church and the officers of the Association. FIFTEEN members of said Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall meet one time each month in regular meeting, time and place to be determined by the Board. In case of special meetings written notice must be given to each Board member. The Moderator and Clerk of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Board.

Section 3. The Executive Board shall receive reports, in the monthly meetings, from the following:

Treasurer's Report.

Associational Missionary.

Superintendent of Associational Sunday School.

Director of Associational Training Union.

President of the Associational Brotherhood. Superintendent of the Associational W.M.U. Director of Associational Music Program. Director of Student Union Work in the Association. Rescue Mission Superintendent's Report. Recommendations of the Missions Committee.

Section 4. The Executive Board shall be constituted and empowered by the Association as its legal agent to administer all business committed to it by the Association and to employ such paid agents as it may deem necessary in carrying on the Missionary, Education, Benevolent and Financial work of the Association.

Section 5. The Executive Board shall render to the Association in Annual meeting a summary statement of all the business for the year. Same to be printed in the minutes.

ARTICLE VII—STANDING COMMITTEES

1. Missions Committee

Section 1. The Association in Annual meeting, through the Nominating Committee, shall elect a standing committee known as the Missions Committee. This committee shall be composed of twelve members. Members of the Missions Committee shall serve for a term of three years. Each year four members shall complete their terms and shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of at least one year.

Section 2. The Officers of the Association and the elected Associational Organization leaders, shall be ex-officio members of the Committee with all rights of discussion and voting.

Section 3. The Missions Committee shall have the responsibility of selecting and nominating the Associational Missionary or any other paid agents of the Association, and to recommend their employment to the Executive Board in regular meetings, or properly called special meetings.

Section 4. The duties of the Missions Committee shall be as follows:

- To serve as a nominating committee for any paid officer or worker of the Association. These nominations are to be brought to the Executive Board.
- To plan a program of mission work for the Association. This
 is to be an active and aggressive program of planning. This
 committee should present a challenging and progressive
 program of work.

- To see that the plans for Associational work are promoted effectively.
- To plan a program of benevolences. This should be a well thought out program including all such needs. Plans for promoting the activities should be initiated by this committee.
- To plan a comprehensive program with regard to Christian Education. This committee should ascertain the needed projects, set the emphases, and actively promote the work.
- 6. To correlate the activities and projects of the Association with the adopted cooperative program. This committee should actively work toward the end of keeping all of our Baptist program under direct supervision in cooperation with the cooperative program plan. These projects should be clearly thought through and planned in connection with the budget committee each year.
- 7. To work toward the establishment of new units of mission work when such are Associational projects. If this committee has aggressively planned the program of mission work it will have seen the need of new units of work and thus will plan to sponsor these new places as an Association. If the Associational Missionary discovers the need for a new work he will report such to the Missions Committee. The Missions Committee will then survey the needs, counsel with the nearest churches, and recommend a course of action. This Missions Committee is not to tell a local church whether it can open new work or not. The local churches will follow what they believe is the Lord's leadership in this matter.
- 8. To ascertain the location of new churches when such are Associational projects. If a church forms spontaneously or a local church establishes a new church the Missions Committee has no right to tell them they can or cannot do so. The Association must decide whether to welcome them into fellowship.
- The Missions Committee should correlate the activity of the Associational organizations. Plans should be made together so as to avoid conflicts.
- 10. The Chairman of the Missions Committee will appoint committees within the committee when such are needed to carry out the duties of the Missions Committee with regard to the above items.

II. Nominating Committee

Section 1. This committee shall be composed of five members elected by the messengers during the first day's session of the

annual Associational meeting. This committee shall be elected as follows:

- The chairman of the Executive Board of the Association shall appoint a committee of five executive board members to serve as a special nominating committee to nominate members of the standing nominating committee.
- This duly appointed special nominating committee will present nominations for the five members of the standing nominating committee during the first days session of the annual Associational meeting.
- 3. The right of nominations from the floor shall not be abridged.
- 4. The messengers shall vote by standing.

Section 2.

- 1. The Standing Nomination Committee shall nominate the chairman of all standing committees of the Association.
- The Standing Nominating Committee shall make any necessary nominations to fill vacancies during the year. These nominations shall be voted upon by the Executive Board in regular or called meetings.

III. Standing Committees For Associational Reports

- 1. Committee on Associational Missions.
- 2. Committee on Associational Organization.
- 3. Committee on Missions and the Cooperative Program.
- 4. Committee on Christian Education and Religious Literature.
- 5. Committee on Benevolences and Benevolent Institutions.
- 6. Committee on Temperance and Social Service.
- 7. Committee on Budget and Finance.

Section 1. These Standing Committees to be enlarged to three members to each Committee before the next Annual meeting. The Moderator, after conference with the Chairman of the respective Committee, will make the appointments.

Section 2. The duty of these committees is to compile and present a report of the year's work of the committee or agency it represents.

ARTICLE VIII-MEETINGS

Section 1. The Association shall meet annually on a date designated at each Annual meeting. If no date is set, the Executive Board will designate one.

Section 2. The Moderator of the Association shall appoint the following committees to report during the session at which they were appointed (annual):

Committee on Audits.

Committee on Time, Place, Preachers for Next Annual Meeting.

Committee on Resolutions.

Committee on Obituaries.

These appointments shall be made during the first day of the Annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX-ASSOCIATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

Section 1. The leaders of the Associational Organizations, Superintendent of Sunday School, Superintendent of Woman's Missionary Union, Director of Training Union, Director of Music, President of the Brotherhood and Director of Student Union Work or others, shall be nominated by the Standing Nominating Committee.

Section 2. The Associational Organizations shall correlate their activities through the Missions Committee. A Calendar of Activities shall be planned and followed. Said organizations, through their leaders, will make monthly reports to the Executive Board of work done and work proposed.

ARTICLE X-HOW AMENDED

This Constitution may be amended at any Annual meeting of the Association by a TWO-THIRDS VOTE of the Messengers present and voting, provided that the substance of ARTICLE IV shall not be abrogated.

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. ORDER OF BUSINESS: The Order of Business shall be made flexible to meet the needs as they arise. A committee on ORDER OF BUSINESS shall publish a Tentative Order of Business for distribution at the First Session of the Annual meeting. Said committee to consist of the Moderator, Clerk, Host Pastor, and Associational Missionary together with the SIX elected Associational Organization Leaders.
- 2. ROBERTS RULES OF ORDER shall be the standard in deciding questions of parliamentary practice.
- 3. The Committee on Order of Business shall be charged with making the Annual meetings as spiritual, inspirational and informational as is possible to make them. Preaching shall have a prominent place in the Annual meetings.

PROCEEDINGS

The Thirty-ninth Annual Session of Pulaski County Baptist Association convened October 18, 1954, with the Levy Baptist Church, Moderator Ray Branscum presiding.

MONDAY EVENING, OCTOBER 18

The Moderator called the body to order at 7 o'clock and M. O. Kelley led the singing "Revive Us Again," after which Floyd Emmerling led in prayer and followed with a scripture reading from Phli. 2:5-11.

A brief message of welcome was extended the body by the host pastor, W. Harry Hunt.

A motion made by the clerk passed, that all who know themselves to be messengers be seated and constitute the body for the transaction of business. The messengers were then enrolled.

C. H. Seaton, field representative for the Bottoms Baptist Orphanage, was presented and he spoke on the Orphanage, urging all churches to push the Thanksgiving offering for the Home. Chaplain J. F. Queen of the Baptist Hospital told of the progress being made on the new annex to the hospital, and the need for air-conditioning in the old building.

Condensed reports on these two institutions are printed here.

BOTTOMS BAPTIST ORPHANAGE

Another Dream Being Realized

In our last Associational report we mentioned the fact that a long desired dream was about to be realized in the construction of the two cottages that had already begun. That dream has now come true. Open House was held on April 8, 1954 for the two beautiful new cottages for older boys and older girls. Many friends came that day and many have come since to see them. The cost of these two cottages totaled \$132,843.86 plus furnishings.

ANOTHER DREAM IS BEING REALIZED in the construction of a Duplex-Cottage for four and five year old boys and girls. Low bids on the construction of this building totaled \$91,459.95 — completion to be realized around the first of the year 1955. In the course of the year 1954, we were able to care for 128 children, taking in 49 new ones and

returning 20 to re-established homes. Our present capacity is 113 children, or a total family including staff members of 140. When this new duplex is finished the Home will be able to care for around 140 children, and this number plus the staff and their families will make a total of around 170.

THANKSGIVING OFFERING. We are grateful for the way Arkansas Baptists are standing by the Home, and if "Every Church" in Arkansas will join hands in having a part in the THANKSGIVING OFFERING this year, and work toward making it 100% contributing, all of this will be accomplished. Remember — "ONE DAY'S PAY will help a boy or girl who has no one else to help them. Let's make 1954 the best OFFERING in the history of the Home.

ON HOSPITALS

Your Baptist hospitals are up to date in equipment and personnel and are continuing to do a good work for the areas which they serve.

Arkansas Baptists own one-third interest in the Baptist Memorial Hospital of Memphis, Tennessee, and this hospital is by far the largest Baptist institution in the world so far as property values go.

The Southern Baptist Hospital, located in New Orleans, is owned by the Southern Baptist Convention and has been a distinct blessing to all the South.

The Arkansas Baptist Hospital in Little Rock is one of the outstanding institutions in the state. It is an A-1 hospital and has approximately 300 beds.

There are about 90 applications each month that the hospital cannot accommodate because of its crowded condition. Much charity work is being done by the institution.

In order to treat approximately 5,000 more patients per year, and to give better service to our patients, the Arkansas Baptist Hospital began building its 125 bed addition on July 12, 1954. This new construction will contain the latest

equipment and the most modern rooms. It will be completely air conditioned in order that patients may be more comfortable.

In addition, to the new construction it is our plan to remodel the old building.

The Arkansas Baptist Hospital treated 15,191 patients the past year, and spent \$108,369.43 for charity.

The Report on Temperance and Social Service was made by V. E. Yarborough after which a motion prevailed to adopt it. It was discussed by V. E. Yarborough and W. O. Taylor.

PROHIBITION

From the Research Service of the Temperance League of Arkansas

Arkansas' "legal" liquor bill for 1953, was \$42,692,962.00. Crime and auto accidents and deaths caused by liquor, (at lowest estimate), added \$29,402,455.00, making a total of \$72,095,417.00. That is the money-cost. Far greater, even is that loss of health, character, and the pauperism, wretchedness, destroyed homes and damned souls which liquor causes. Liquor "revenue," \$7,113,000.00 — Liquor traffic's total cost, more than ten times the revenue.

Automobile injured and deaths in Arkansas, 1953, were:

From 20% to 50%, or more, of all these wrecks on the highways — 612 to 1,530 personal injuries, (some crippled for life), and 90 to 227 deaths — were caused by liquor.

The evils of the liquor traffic are so many and so gigantic, that every Christian should be continually alert and active and prayerful against it, and courageously combatting it.

America's "legal" liquor bill in 1953, was \$9,885,-000,000.00, the highest in the nation's history.

Careful estimates now place the number of drinkers, 15 years old and older, in this country, between 65,000,000

and 70,000,000. Of that number, there are 7,000,000 who are already addicted drinkers and chronic alcoholics. Dr. Andrew C. Ivy, Vice-President, University of Illinois, after long, careful research, estimates the liquor traffic is making 250,000 new alcoholics every year.

Liquor and Crime: A report from the warden of San Quentin prison in California some time ago, stated that 78% of the convicts in that prison were there directly or indirectly because of liquor.

On the evening of May 6, 1954, the Temperance League Superintendent visited Indian Bill Jenkins, in his death cell at Tucker prison. Jenkins had murdered a 16-year old girl in Hot Springs, Arkansas. The League Superintendent asked him whether liquor caused him to commit that crime, and he answered, "It sure did. I was drunk at the time."

On another visit, the prison warden told the League Superintendent that he believed 75% to 80% of the convicts in that prison were there directly or indirectly because of liquor. Seven men were interviewed and six of them said that liquor caused their downfall.

V. E. YARBOROUGH W. O. TAYLOR

A visitor, Delbert Garrott of Central Association, was recognized and presented to the body. By motion he was granted ten minutes to present a proposition sponsored by Central Association, viz. that a camp site be purchased at Lonsdale and a Baptist encampment be located there. He proposed that any individual, church or Association could purchase stock in the enterprise.

The time having arrived for the Annual Doctrinal Sermon, the Moderator called for a motion to adjourn following the sermon and it was moved and passed. Mr. B. H. Ball led in singing "How Firm a Foundation," after which D. David Garland, the appointee, preached a sermon on "The Doctrine of Eternal Life."

The closing prayer was led by Ed Stewart.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON, OCTOBER 19

The Moderator called the meeting to order at 1:30 and resumed business. R. J. McMillan led in singing "Draw Me Nearer" and prayer was led by Ben Haney.

The Moderator called for the reading of the Journal. It was approved. Mr. W. A. Jackson, Secretary for the Arkansas Baptist Foundation, reported on the work of the Foundation.

The Report on Obituaries was made by T. S. Cowden. He stated there was a total of 147 deaths during the year, and the list included two of our preachers, H. L. Mowery and L. M. Keeling. As a token of respect for all these loved ones who had passed away during the year the body stood and sang, "Shall We Gather At the River," after which T. S. Cowden led a consoling prayer.

A motion was made by W. Harry Hunt that we publish in the Minutes a suitable memorial to the two pastors who had died during the year. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

In Memoriam



Rev. H. L. Mowery was born in Indiana August 8, 1877. The Halsted Baptist Church ordained him to the ministry April 30, 1930. He served this church as pastor from January 6, 1932 to January 1935. With 33 charter members he organized the Crystal Hill church on September 14, 1933. He served as pastor of Plainview and Holly Springs churches, and at the time of his death was in his second pastorate with Crystal Hill Church. In spite of declining health during his last year he led this church to begin a new building. On December 7, 1953 he passed to his eternal home.

H. L. MOWERY

Rev. Leonard M. Keeling was born in Nevada County, Arkansas, September 16, 1878. Antioch Baptist Church in Hempstead County ordained him to the ministry in 1903. He was a graduate of Ouachita College and attended Southwestern Baptist Seminary. Except for the time he was in Seminary, his life was spent in Arkansas. The churches he has served include Prescott, Nashville, Lewisville, Stamps, Malvern, South Highland, and Judsonia. He served as Moderator of Pulaski County Baptist Association two terms, 1937-1938. Retiring from active pastoral work in 1918, he made his home in Little Rock and served as supply for pastorless churches, held revivals, and taught in Bible conferences.

REPORT OF TWIN CITY RESCUE MISSION

The Twin City Rescue Mission began operations October 1, 1953, in rooms rented from the Glenn Hotel at the foot of Main Street Bridge in North Little Rock. During the 12 months of operation a total of 20,184 attended the mission services. There were 495 religious services held and 471 professions of faith were witnessed. The number of beds furnished totaled 10,011, and the number of meals served was 31,663. The total cost for the groceries during this period was \$1,040.08 — or an average of .0296 cents per meal. This low cost of meals was largely due to much food having been given to the Mission, and reduced prices extended the mission by various merchants. The Mission also distributed 5,966 garments to needy people. The number of families aided reached 365 — one for each day of the year.

We gave away 1,165 loaves of bread.

Aside from what the Association pays on the operation of the Mission we received the following cash donations:

From various churches, \$1,081.72

From men staying at the Mission, \$128.84

Sunday School collections, \$7.36

Miscellaneous, \$151.77

This money was handled as petty cash by the Superintendent and a detailed record of donors and expenditures was filed with the Associational Treasurer.

Arrangements have been made to move the Mission to 115 Maple, North Little Rock, November 1. This new location gives twice the room we now have and in every way will help us in our work.

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION REPORT Mrs. R. B. Whitecotton, Superintendent 1953-1954

Woman's Missionary Union of Pulaski County can look back and praise Him, for there has been marked increase in all of our work. We have 33 new young peoples organizations and 5 new W.M.S., making a total of 269 organizations. We had 16 quarterly rallies with 253 organizations represented.

Our Girls Auxiliary coronation and Royal Ambassador recognition services were outstanding, 220 boys and girls participating. We had a Mission Study Banquet for Intermediate boys and girls with 235 attending. A watermelon social was given for Junior boys and girls and 312 attended.

Our women and young people gave of their time, money and prayers for the Twin City Rescue Mission. Hundreds of garments were given, a Mother's Club was organized, which meets once a week, and a program for children was held each week.

704 services were held in 12 institutions.

Gifts to the Baptist Hospital included money, canned fruit, clothing for crippled children's ward and linens for the hospital. Our Orphanage was helped with 800 bars of soap, linens, coupons, toilet articles, food, clothing and money.

Three seasons of prayer were observed by a large majority with offerings for three causes amounting to \$35,687.49. Our total gifts were \$41,696.85. New tithers reported were 666. Our hope is for a full-graded Woman's Missionary Union in every church.

We covet the prayers and cooperation of the pastors.

BROTHERHOOD REPORT FOR PULASKI COUNTY

"A Brotherhood in Every Church" is both the slogan and the goal of those who are dedicated to the continuing task of enlisting God's men in all the work of their church and denomination.

The Brotherhood movement continues throughout Arkansas. There are now 460 church Brotherhoods in the state, as compared with 408 at this time last year. One more new Associational Brotherhood has been organized during the year, making a total of 39 such organizations in our 45 associations.

The Southern Baptist Convention, in its 1954 meeting in St. Louis, voted to turn Royal Ambassador promotion over to the Brotherhood after a three-year transition period. Arkansas Brotherhoods must be ready when the time arrives to take over full responsibility in all phases of our work with boys. Really, Arkansas is a year-and-a-half ahead of the Southern Baptist Convention in this transition, as the Brotherhood Department has been promoting R.A. work since January, 1953.

There are now, (as of September 1, 1954), 487 Royal Ambassador chapters in Arkansas. This compares with 398 chapters at this time last year.

On October 1, 1954, we had 48 churches in Pulaski County that reported an organized Brotherhood. Last year only 27 Brotherhoods were reported. This gives Pulaski County an increase of 77%. We cannot be satisfied until every church in our Association has a well organized hard working Brotherhood.

The Executive Committee is enlarging the scope of the Brotherhood work during the coming year. Two committees have been appointed to study the possibility of two areas of service within our county. There is a great opportunity for service in the field of Juvenile Delinquency and Institutional service. Our men will join together and support the recommendations of these committees.

God has richly blessed the efforts of our Associational Brotherhood. Let us join hands to make 1955 a greater year for our Lord.

Remount was a mission of Immanuel Church until July 11, 1954, when it was organized as an independent church and called Floyd Simmons as pastor.
