CONSTITUTION

As Amended at 1933, 1943, 1948, 1950, and 1951 Sessions

Article I.—NAME

The name of this body shall be Pulaski County Baptist Association.

Article II.—OBJECT

The object of this Association shall be to aid the churches in their divinely appointed work of spreading the Kingdom of God throughout the whole world by every Scriptural means.

Article III.—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of messengers from regular Baptist churches, which are in sympathy with the principles and purposes of this Constitution and desire to co-operate with this Association, who shall be entitled to seats upon the presentation of letters from their churches or other satisfactory evidence of their appointment.

Section 2. Each church shall be entitled to three messengers, with one additional member for every fifty members or major fraction thereof above one hundred.

Section 3. Messengers from churches desiring to affiliate with this Association shall present to the Association petitionary letters or other evidence setting forth the Articles of Faith on which the churches were organized together with satisfactory evidence of the regularity of their organization. They shall be received into the Association only by unanimous vote as cast by the body.

Article IV.—AUTHORITY

This Association shall never exercise any legislative or ecclesiastical authority over any church, nor shall it in any way interfere with the rights and absolute independence of the churches of Christ.

Article V.—OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be elected at the last session of each Annual Meeting by a majority of all the votes cast at such meeting. Provided, however, that the Moderator shall not be eligible to serve more than two terms.

Section 2. The Moderator shall preside at all sessions of the Association or call some one to occupy the chair temporarily in his

absence, and may exercise the same privilege of discussion as any other member of the Association.

Section 3. The Clerk shall keep a correct record of all the proceedings of the Association and shall superintend the printing and distribution of the Minutes of each session as he may be directed by the Association.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of every kind entrusted to his care, and shall disburse the same upon order of the Association and shall make an itemized report of all such funds to the Association before the close of each annual session.

Article VI.—ASSOCIATIONAL BOARD

Section 1. The Associational Board shall be composed of one lay member, elected by each co-operating church, together with the pastors of such churches, and the officers of the Association and the Superintendents of W. M. U. work. Seven members of said Board shall constitute a quorum to transact business, after notice has been given all members of the Board of such meeting.

Section 2. This Board shall co-operate with the churches in this Association in informing and arousing the churches in gathering and disbursing of funds for all of the causes fostered by this Association and shall transact all of the business of the Association in the interim of the annual meeting of the Association.

Article VII.—MISSION COMMITTEE

The Mission Committee shall be elected by the Association in three groups, as follows: Group 3, to serve for three years; Group 2, to serve for two years; and Group 1, to serve for one year, thus retaining six members of the committee each year and only electing three new ones to take the place of the Group retiring.

The Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer of the Association and the five elected officers of the associational organizations known as the Sunday School, Training Union, Brotherhood, W. M. U., and Music become ex-officio members of that committee, thus making the total membership seventeen and this committee shall provide the program and calendar of activities for the Association.

The Mission Committee shall elect its own chairman, who shall be required to report monthly to the meeting of the Associational Board and an annual report to the annual meeting of the Association.

The Mission Committee shall have the responsibility of the selection of the Superintendent of Associational Missions, subject to the approval of the Executive Board of the Association, and shall have

as its duty in co-operation with that officer the planning and practical promotion of the Program of Associational Missions for Pulaski County Baptist Association.

ARTICLE VIII—MEETING

This Association shall meet annually on Monday night after the first Sunday in October at 7:00 o'clock, and day session Tuesday, adjourning Tuesday night. That four sermons be placed on the program, consisting of the Annual Sermon; the Annual Doctrinal Sermon; a sermon on Stewardship; and a sermon on Missions.

Article IX.

This Constitution may be amended at any annual session of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present at any annual meeting, provided that the substance of Article IV shall never be abrogated.

RULES OF ORDER

(BY-LAWS)

As Amended at 1933 and 1947 Sessions

I. The following committees shall be appointed six weeks in advance of the Associational meeting:

(1) Associational Missions; (2) State Missions; (3) Home Missions; (4) Foreign Missions; (5) Colleges and Schools; (6) Religious Literature; (7) Bible (Sunday) Schools; (8) Ministerial Education; (9) Orphan's Homes; (10) Christian Stewardship; (11) Hospitals; (12) Woman's Work; (13) Young People's Work; (14) Digest of Letters; (15) Obituaries; (16) Resolutions; (17) Finance; (18) Temperance; (19) Nominations.

II. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.

III. The following shall be the order of business:

1. The Body called to order by the Moderator, or, in his absence, by brethren in the following order of precedence: Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Pastor of entertaining church.
2. Devotional Service.
3. Presentation of letters and enrollment of Messengers.
4. Permanent organization.
5. Introductory Sermon.
6. Petitionary Letters.
7. Reception of visitors, corresponding messengers from other bodies and introduction of new pastors.

8. Appointment of program committee which shall recommend a schedule for all reports and other matters to come before the body, subject to the Association's approval.

IV. Every speaker shall rise and address the Moderator. In discussion all personalities shall be avoided. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject, without special permission from the Association.

V. Mell's Parliamentary Law shall be the standard in deciding questions of parliamentary practice.

VI. The minutes of the preceding session shall be read and approved at the meeting of each session and at close of the Association meeting.

VII. Such offerings may be taken at the annual meeting of the Association as the body may direct.

VIII. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present, or suspended by a unanimous vote.

IX. The Associational Board shall meet monthly at such time and place as the Board itself may determine.

X. A doctrinal sermon shall be preached during each annual session at such an hour as each program committee shall provide.

W. H. Hicks spoke briefly to the report and commended the Executive Board's action in recommending an increase in the Missionary's salary.

13. The written report on the Orphans Home was accepted without reading and all the time was given to Bro. W. A. Herring who was present to represent the Home.

BOTTOMS BAPTIST ORPHANAGE

The Bottoms Baptist Orphanage located in Monticello, Arkansas, since June 1, 1951 has taken in 28 new children and 19 have been placed in homes, and into the Service, etc. The capacity of the Home is still 72.

Seven of the children have accepted Jesus as their Saviour, several have united with the Church by letter, and several have rededicated their lives.

Arkansas Baptists made it possible for twenty-three boys and girls to attend the Siloam Springs Assembly last year, which resulted in the conversion of several. Four of the girls were privileged to attend G. A. Camp and four older girls attended the Y. W. A. House Party. One of the older girls was recognized as outstanding in the F. H. A. Program of the State. Fourteen boys and girls are studying piano.

How the Orphanage Has Been Remembered

The Orphanage has been remembered in several Wills and Estates. The McWilliams Estate in El Dorado is going to be of considerable help when settled. We have also received smaller amounts in Memorials and Trusts. Memorials set up in the passing of Loved ones and Friends have proven of great value. Instead of sending flowers the Memorial is sent to the Orphanage and we provide suitable Cards to the loved ones.

Needs of the Home

The needs of the Home would include calves, cows and pigs that can be butchered for meat, hay, cow feed, canned goods, rice, lard, soap, sugar, flour, jellies, preserves and anything else that may be needed in any home. Dish towels, bath towels and linens are always acceptable.

"More room for more children" is considered the greatest need of the Home just now. We are grateful of course for the support received through the Cooperative Program, but we remind you that only about one-fourth of our support

comes from that source. More and more of our people are recognizing the Thanksgiving Offerings as a part of our Arkansas Baptist Program. Last year enough came in through this offering and other offerings to enable us to operate within our income, connect with city sewer, install a pasteurizer, build a barn, make repairs and put some aside looking forward to building additional buildings.

We are hoping that next year the Executive Board will put the Orphanage in the State Budget for \$36,000 for operation, urging all of the churches to get behind the Thanksgiving Offering as a part of our program, with the understanding that any amount received, over and above what is necessary to operate, be applied on capital needs. And, that since the Executive Board did not want to recommend a special campaign to raise funds for the Orphanage, the Orphanage be included in a capital needs budget for say \$50,000 to be used in building additional buildings. We need another building for boys, another for girls and one for the four-five year old children. These units on the cottage plan caring for sixteen children to a cottage, can be built for approximately \$50,000 each. This would allow a gradual growth with the same number of boys and girls, in keeping with our present population and anticipated needs.

14. The Moderator recognized our General Secretary, B. L. Bridges, and asked him to report to us briefly on the state of affairs as regards Baptist work in Arkansas. He gave a very encouraging report on the past year's work and the outlook for the future.

15. The report on Temperance was read by V. E. Yarbrough and a brief address was made by him on the report. By motion the report was adopted.

REPORT ON TEMPERANCE

Thirteen for one! What a price Arkansas is paying for liquor "revenue". According to the research service of the Temperance League of Arkansas, in a ten year period—1942-1951—the liquor traffic cost Arkansas \$759,856,469.00. Each \$1.00 of liquor "revenue", over the ten-year period, cost above \$13.00!

Even if the money cost of crime and automobile accidents and deaths caused by liquors should be omitted, (which of course, we will not do), and only the money spent for liquors counted, and then if we should deduct from that the amount of all the "revenue" received by the State and by the towns from the Liquor Traffic, (which is not paid by the dealers, but by the drinkers), there would still be a net loss for the ten-year period of \$377,286,726.00! When we include, as we must, the cost of crime and of automobile accidents and deaths caused by liquors, the net loss for the ten-year period is \$705,236,726.00!

"HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS AND DEATHS:

During the period, 1942-1951, there were three thousand, four hundred, fifty-two, (3,452), traffic deaths in Arkansas. At the lowest estimate, (20%), six hundred, ninety (690), of them were caused by liquors. Some authorities across the nation state that 40% to 60% of traffic fatalities are caused by liquors.

Arkansas has 75 counties—39 DRY and 36 WET, during the year 1951—and 3,712 auto ACCIDENTS, as follows:

In 36 WET Counties.....	2,411

In 36 WET Counties.....	294
Total.....	431

Baptists, throughout the ages, have striven worthily to follow the example of our Saviour from whom we receive our marching orders, and to whom we look for guidance in all of our work. In the great and glorious task of enthroning the Prince of Peace in the hearts of all men, evil must be overcome. We find strength for our task in John's statement as recorded in I John 3:8, "To this end was the Son of God manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil."

The stupendous task of stamping out the evil of strong drink has been, and still is, a challenge to every Christian man and woman. It is a great goal toward which we strive, and one worthy of the best that we can give. Let us not be impatient, but keep constantly at the job. Great moves are

brought about slowly, so we should work steadily, vigorously, and untiringly in our efforts to rid our state and country of the evil of strong drink, remembering when we would be discouraged we can well claim for ourselves the statement of Paul as recorded in Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me."

THE COOPERATIVE PROGRAM IN PULASKI COUNTY AND IN ARKANSAS

We Southern Baptists are committed to the Cooperative Program. Here in Pulaski County we delight to magnify this program. We believe that God directed Southern Baptists in the beginning and in the promotion of this program. Through the Cooperative Program we are able more and more to accomplish big things for God. The Cooperative Program is

made up of the following items: non-distributive—Administration, W. M. U., and Retirement; distributive—Music, T. U., B. S. U., Sunday School, Brotherhood, State Missions, Arkansas Baptist, Promotion and Convention, Reserve, Evangelism, Ministerial Education, Orphanage, Hospital (charity and School of Nursing), Memorial Hospital Memphis, Arkansas Baptist Association, Southern Baptist College, and Ouachita. In this report we wish to give the total figures of Cooperative Program gifts as these gifts have been received in our office at headquarters. Here are those figures: From 73 churches in the Association a total of \$170,678.31 was given to the Cooperative Program. \$7,495.32 was given to Associational Missions. \$270.72 was given as a designated amount for State Missions. In the special drive for our revolving loan fund a total of \$11,030.32 has been given. The special offering for Rescue Mission work was \$619.09. Every church in the Association has given to the Cooperative Program, which includes one church that designated their gifts to Home and Foreign Missions. All the churches have given to Associational Missions, which includes the three new churches coming into the Association.

Other gifts by the churches of Pulaski County are as follows:

Lottie Moon offering for Foreign Missions, \$23,219.01.

Annie Armstrong Offering for Home Missions, \$3,069.56.

Dixie Jackson offering for State Missions was observed in September and the reports are not available.

Designated to the Baptist Hospital, \$828.14.

Designated to Ouachita College, \$3,620.00.

Designated to the Orphans Home, \$2,367.29.

Special to Storm Relief, \$3,592.80.

This makes a grand total to all these mission causes from the churches of Pulaski County of \$226,790.56. (Dixie Jackson Offering not included.)

This Committee begs to suggest the following:

1. Consider This First

In making out the annual budget for 1953 we earnestly ask each church finance committee to give first consideration to the Cooperative Program. All mission causes should be of greatest importance in the making of any church budget. Gifts to the Cooperative Program are like tithers in a church. The man who pays all his obligations first and then expects to have enough left to tithe finds that he has no tithe left. The

man who tithes takes out God's part first, then cares for his other responsibilities out of the nine-tenths left. This is equally true with a church. A church should consider as most important the entire program of the denomination which is included in the Cooperative Program. We, therefore, recommend that each church seriously consider the Cooperative Program as the No. 1 item of the 1953 budget.

2. Increase Our Gifts in 1953

Your committee believes that the people want more of their money to go to Mission causes. This can be done, in a proportionate way, if the gifts to the Cooperative Program are increased. Our proposed state budget, which includes all local, state, and Southwide causes, including Home and Foreign Missions, is for \$1,071,566.67 in 1953. This is an increase of \$195,283.34 over the 1952 budget. We believe the churches of Pulaski County will wish to care for their part of this increase.

3. Guard The Cooperative Program

Your committee would suggest to the pastors and the church leaders that they guard the Cooperative Program by centering the attention of the people upon these main objects of our missionary work. Others will wish to come into your church to take an offering for this cause and that cause. It is the belief of your committee, that though these causes are just and good, that they are not as important as the main causes in our Cooperative Program. Our stated special offerings, including the offerings for missions promoted through the year by the W. M. U. of the church, in addition to the Mother's Day offering for our Baptist Hospital, and the Thanksgiving Offering for our Orphans Home will afford sufficient opportunities for our people to make special offerings in our program.

ASSOCIATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL WORK

It has been a joy to serve as Superintendent of Pulaski County Associational Sunday School work for the past year. We are grateful to the Lord for what we have accomplished and pray that the new year may be the most helpful and most productive in the history of our association.

Records reveal that in 1951 there were 1,040 Sunday Schools in Arkansas with an enrollment of 175,978. These figures do not include Mission Sunday Schools. In Pulaski County we have 71 Sunday Schools with approximate enrollment of 22,000. In our planning meeting on September 22, our churches were challenged to plan an aggressive program for 1952-53. Each church was urged to plan to have:

1. Better teaching in their Sunday School.
2. A good weekly Officers' and Teachers' meeting or Monthly Workers' Conference.
3. A training program for their leaders, through home study, local study courses and through our central training school which is planned for September 14-18, 1953.
4. A Vacation Bible School in every church in our association. City churches were urged to assist rural churches in planning and promoting a study course and a Vacation Bible School in their church during the Sunday School year.
5. A worthy church budget.
6. A Cradle Roll and an Extension Department in every church.

Our Sunday Schools were challenged to adopt a goal of 15% increase in enrollment during the new Sunday School year.

Three associational rallies were held during the year. The first was at Second Church on March 17. The emphasis for this meeting was the simultaneous revivals in all our churches which began on April 13. Rev. Bob McMillan was the speaker at this meeting.

The second meeting was at South Highland Church. We presented the various departments of our Sunday Schools in pantomime in a very effective way and then Rev. W. O. Vaught spoke.

The last meeting of the year was on September 22. This meeting was described earlier in this report.

We plan six associational Sunday School rallies for 1952-53 and pray that this may be the most fruitful year in the history of this association.

ASSOCIATIONAL TRAINING UNION REPORT

By Acting Director Lindsey D. Boyd

The last minutes of this Association reported 60 churches with Training Unions, an increase of 3. With 462 units reported, the enrolment of 8,460 shows an increase of 380.

Activities

We have not kept pace with our progressive beginning since we have not had an Associational Director since February 15, 1952, when Mr. Ed. Markert left for other work. We will continue to build upon the foundations he left, however, and hope for him and his family a very fruitful service in the field of their labors. Our Junior memory work has been emphasized and has stimulated much progress in this field. Miss Lynn Nunnally of Pulaski Heights Baptist Church represented Arkansas at Ridgcrest this summer in the Intermediate Sword Drill. Our Young People have shown a marked increase in interest in the Better Speakers Tournaments and our hope is that interest will manifest itself in more entries from the churches of this Association.

The "M" (Mobilization) night in December was a complete success with our attendance being exceeded only by the Liberty Association and that by only four (4). We are not primarily concerned with numbers but this attendance of 1,124 represents only an eighth of our enrollment. In mentioning the success of the Quarterly rallies we would say that they were well attended and that the Baring Cross Church will have to be reckoned with in attendance honors as they set the pace for the Association each time we met.

Awards

A yet incomplete record shows that awards granted as of October 7, to be 2,839, which is indicative of the work done of a study course nature in our Association, and is a good report.

Plans

Our theme for 1953 is in the words of Jesus, "Learn From Me". Since March is the Training Union enlargement month of the Southern Convention and our State Training Union Convention meets the 13th and 14th at Immanuel, we are going all out and have a Central Training Union School at the Second Baptist Church beginning the 16th and going through the 20th. The first night will be divided between the Sunday School and the Training Union, with the Sunday School having the first session for its Associational Rally. This is being done in order not to disrupt the every-other-month meeting of these organizations. Our aim is to sponsor, along with straight Training Union books, the study of books with dual or selective credit in our three organizations. This will necessitate the teaching of around 35 books. We hope to establish this as an annual affair in our program of training.

We would emphasize the important phases of work that have occupied our attention in the past, such as the Junior Memory Work, The Intermediate Sword Drill, The Young People's Better Speakers Tournament, and the latest help to come into our promotion plans, the Adult Better Bible Readers Tournament.

many phases of work and we want to prove tonight that a W. M. S. is worthwhile.

Mrs. R. B. Whitecotton, associational young people's director, gave the following report:

"Lift up your eyes and look on the fields for they are white unto harvest." What are we trying to do about it? We have less than 1,500 young people enlisted in our W. M. U. family in Pulaski County. Looking at the year's work we are proud of the coronation and recognition service held in First Baptist Church, Little Rock in April at which time we had 120 young people receiving recognition. We held summer camps for each auxiliary and all were well attended. Each auxiliary held quarterly rallies with missionaries as speakers when possible.

A step forward will be the first convention-wide congress for R. A., August 18-20 to be held in Atlanta, Ga. Pulaski County is hoping to have a bus load to attend.

Girl's Auxiliary will celebrate her 40th anniversary next year hoping to reach new heights in the following ways:

1. Featuring leadership.
2. Organizing new auxiliaries.
3. Using G. A. Magazine.
4. Reaching the Standard.

The following report was given by Mrs. D. W. Wilson, Associational Community Missions Chairman:

The message of Christ is needed in every community and every christian is called to make that message known. Community Missions is Christ-like living in regard to those around us. It is social service with the gospel as its motive and conversion as its aim. The churches in Pulaski County W. M. U. minister to the following institutions: Girls' Training School, Convalescent Home, Blind Woman's Home, County Hospital, Confederate Home, University Hospital, Florence Crittenton Home, Crippled Children's Home, State Hospital and the Negro T. B. Hospital.

Community Missions promoted some winning visitation and alcohol education among its many activities this year. We have had a large number of people won to Christ in our institutional work this year. This year we will major on "The Christian Home".

May each of us have a conviction to do more for the pro-

motion of community mission work in our communities that more people may be won to Christ.

Mrs. J. H. Cox, Christian Education Chairman, reported that in July, 1950 the Pulaski County W. M. U. voted to sponsor a foreign student in the person of Miss Vhiecko Sato, from Hawaii who desired to come to the states to further her education. Miss Sato is in her last year of work in Ouachita College. The chairman made an appeal for the churches to continue their support so that Miss Sato's need for clothing and books might be taken care of throughout her senior year. She plans to return to the Hawaiian Islands to share the gospel with her own people.

Mrs. J. D. Yerby, Associational Superintendent, reported a printed copy of the report of Mrs. E. A. Ingram, Field Worker for Pulaski County, was available. She also reported 4 new W. M. S. organizations and 15 new auxiliaries.

The announcement was made of a mission study institute to be sponsored by the associations on October 30 at Second Baptist Church, Little Rock.
