We have now in our Association three young men who we believe are called to preach the Gospel of our Lord and Saviour, and have been licensed by their church to preach. Report-Believing that the work of caring for the orphans is God's work entrusted to the church and is the duty of each and every member of the church to do what they can. We are taught in the scripture to show our faith by our works. They teach us to take care of the orphans and the first church elected seven men whose duty it was to look after this work. We believe it to be the duty of every church to contribute to this work, and recommend that the pastor preach it and encourage his membership to give liberally to this work. We feel that the membership of each church need to be taught the blessedness of giving, when to give and how to give. There are now something over

one hundred children in the Baptist Orphans' Homes in the State of Arkansas. Sixty or more at Menticelle and forty or more at Texarkana. In the days of the Apostles they were continually collecting money for the poor. Brethren, how important is this work of caring for the orphans. We as Eaptists should get busy in this great work.

The officers and teachers of the Sunday school should be Christians and members of the Baptist church. We feel that there is a lack of interest for the Sunday School on the part of the members of our churches as a whole, and that the work is left for a few of those who are willing to work. Though we are not able to give statistics we feel sure that the work is making progress and doing good in our churches. We recommend that our pastors say more about this work, both in the homes of the members and from the pulpit. We believe that every Baptist Sunday School should use Baptist literature. May the Lord help us brethren to be more in earnest about the salvation of our chil-Signed, dren.
