## MINUTES.

The United Association met in its nineteenth annual session, with Pleasant Valley church, on Thursday before the second Sabbath in September, A. D., 1893, at 11 o'clock a. m.

Introductory sermon was preached by Eld. T. Moody, from Matthew 28th chapter and nineteenth verse.

The body was called to order by Eld. T. Moody. On motion the body adjourned to meet at 2 p. m.

## EVENING SESSION.

The body met at 2 p. m. after prayer by Brother Stephens.

The letters from the churches composing the association were called for.

Brethren McReynolds and Loggins were appointed read ing clerks.

The letters were read and messengers names enrolled. (See table.)

The body then went into permanent organization.

Brethren J. W. Rambo and Denney from Trace Ridge Association were appointed tellers.

The result of the vote was for Eld. B. M. Stephens, moderator; Brother Asa Robertson, clerk; and Brother E. A. Woolverton, treasurer.

The moderator called for petitionary letters, when Caney Valley church presented letter for membership.

On motion the letter was received, and Caney Valley church received into the fellowship of this body.

At this point there was a resolution offered by Eld. M. S. Kirkland.

Resolved, That this body meet at 8 a. m., adjourn at 12 m., meet at 2 p. m., adjourn at 5 p. m.

#### FRIDAY.

MORNING SESSION.

Body met at 8 o'clock a. m. Prayer by Elder G. W. Ford.

On motion the regular order of business was suspended to arrange correspondence when the following brethren volunteered to visit sister association's.

Little Red River association. S. A. Neal and Andy Farm.

Russellville association. Eld. M. S. Kirkland, McReynolds and J. Mayall. Meets first Sunday in October.

Pedu association. Brethreh S. B. Barnett, J. R. Pennington. Meets 28th September, 1893.

Trace Ridge association. Brethren J. B. Millsaps and J. R. Rennington.

White River association. Brethren Joe Castley, T. Moody, S. B. Barnett and J. R Pennington.

Fourche Valley ssociation. Eld. J. Mayall, T. Moody and J. B. Loggins.

State Convention. Brethren B. M. Stephens, M. S. Kirk-land, J. Mayall, J. B. Loggins and Asa Robertson.

By motion it was requested that Brother Asa Robertson be made a member of the State Board.

On motion, the rules of order were suspended, and that the body' select the place to hold the next session of this body, which resulted in Springfield, Conway county, Ark., and Eld. J. McGee to preach the introductory sermon, and Eld. M. S. Kirkland, alternate.

The moderator called for reports of committees, when the committee on prohibition made their report.

On motion the regular order of business was suspended when messengers from Desoto church asked for a letter of dismission, which was granted and the clerk requested to write the same. Body adjourned to meet at 2 p. m.

Body met at 2 p. m. Prayer by Eld. J. M. McGee.

Moderator called for corresponding messenger when Eld. Vimo Turner from Green Brier association reported. R. G. Lafferty from Little Red River reported and their names were enrolled.

After preaching, a resolution of thanks was tendered the good people of Damascus and vicinity for their generous hospitality during the sitting of the body.

A hymn was sung—"God be with you till we meet again"—and the parting hand given.

The body then adjourned to meet with Springfield church on Thursday before the second Sunday in September, A. D. 1894, at 11 o'clock,
