CHICKALAH, YELL COUNTY, ARK., SEPT. 14, 1895.

The temperance report was taken up and discussed
by Bros. Brice and Autry.

Temperance—We your committee offer the following
report which was adopted by the last Baptist State
Convention:

RESOLVED, *First*. That we will give our influence in
our private circles and in our churches against the use of
all alcoholic beverages.

Second. We believe that it is the duty of all christ-
ians to heartily co-operate in and with the civil authori-
ties in enacting laws to prevent the sale and use of all in-
toxicating drinks.

Third. That we hold the Bible to be a book that
teaches that God's children should not indulge in the use
or sale of intoxicating drinks, nor should they sign peti-
tions for the sale of the same.

Fourth. That it is the duty of all ministers of Christ,
not only to abstain from the use of alcoholic beverages
but to lift up their voices against it in the pulpit and
everywhere, and that we urge our churches throughout
Dardanelle Association, to continue in membership no
person who publicly advocates the license of drinking
saloons, or invests money in the saloon business, or who
suffers his property to be used for it in any way.

Pending the report, Bro. Autry said:

"The liquor traffic is the paramount question of the day," and urged all Baptists and all lovers of domestic peace and prosperity to stand in a solid phalanx at our coming election. "We can cry 16 to 1, for while the government receives \$1.00 the consumer pays \$15.95. The reports of our penitentiaries show that six-sevenths of their inmates are there through liquor," and made calculations of the noble institutions of learning that could be erected with the money spent for liquor.

The command of Christ is to go and preach the gospel and we, as Missionary Baptists, believe in honoring the injunction by sending the gospel to all destitute places,

Whereas, we noticed in the bounds of this Association a few years past many destitute places where they had not the pure gospel preached. Since that time many of these places having had the gospel unmixed with error, begin to illuminate with brilliant churches which revive within us afresh the missionary spirit; also, causing a desire for the continuation of the good begun work that others may unite with us in keeping house for the Lord.

First quarter, foreign. Second quarter, home. Third quarter, state. Fourth quarter, association.

Quite a number of the churches accepted this offer and left their names with the clerk.

Education.—The need of better education is felt more every year, not only of an educated ministry to teach us more perfectly the way of truth, but also an educated laity to detect and combat errors promulgated from alien pulpits.

We have three institutions in the state, viz: Ouachita, Central and Mountain Home Colleges, where well qualified and devoted men and women educate the heart as well as the head, and we recommend these institutions to the favorable consideration of Baptists.
