On motion the minutes were read, gorrected and approved, and after some impressive remarks by the Moderator, and singing the hymn "How firm a foundation ye saints of the Lord," and the parting hand extended amid eyes suffused with tears of brotherly love, the Association adjourned to meet at the Big Creek Church, Arkansas County, on Saturday before the first Sabbath in October. ## Report on Sunday Schools.

vivals during the year than those which have had no schools

The great need now is that every church have one or more men, with greater skill and more experience in this important work, and to affect this we earnestly recommend that we have more Sunday School mass meetings and institutes.

We would recommend that your body appoint the best man for each church, to carry on this educational work, and hope that many

will rise to bless our labors in the Sunday School cause.

#### English on Education.

Your flow itto en Elmention beg leave to report that, while the cause of at in has been generally neglected during the past few years, there a of this time increased interest on the subject : that the effect of the free school system, as now managed, is damaging to the cause; that there is among our people a disposition to encourage denominational schools; we recommend the encouragement of such schools whenever practicable.

We would further recommend the concentration of the educational efforts of our denomination at some one point; that that point be Forrest City; that an agent be appointed by this body to raise funds during the winter and spring months for the founding of such an in-

rtitution.

In order to entry out the suggestion of the report on education

adopted by this hody, be it

Resolved 1, "That the pastors of the different churches appointed local agents to solicit funds for that purpose, and that one general agent be appointed to travel through the bounds of the Association, or elsewhere, to raise funds for the same purpose, and that he receive ten per cent. of all cash collections made by him for his services; that all of these agents report their collections directly to the board hereinafter described."

Resolved 2, "That a board of five be appointed, whose business it shall be to pogotiate and raise funds, upon the notes of the stockholders' and other property; also, to issue stock in shares of twentyfive dollars to stockholders."

Resolved 3, "That said board be further empowered to proceed in the relection and purchase of grounds, and to the erection of buildings, as soon as \$5000 cash has been raised, and make a full report of

their proceedings at the next session of this body." Resolved 4, "That, after the first session of this body after the

erection of the buildings, a permanent board of trustees of the school be appointed."

Resolved 5, "That twenty per cent. of subscription be paid at the

ime of subscription and twenty per cent. annually thereafter."

Resolved 6, "That the Institution be known as the Baptist High School of the Mt. Vernon 'Association."
