We feel that God has commanded that we should care for the needy, and we look upon the orphan as the most helpless of all humanity.

God, through one of his inspired writers, makes it the supreme test of our practical Christianity that we care for the widows and the fatherless.

We are glad to report that Landmark Baptists have one of the best Orphans' Homes in the state. The cost of the former and the building of the new home, together with the maintenance of the children up till now, has cost us about \$45,000.00. Our new home has 32 rooms, with a

very satisfactory and has been furnished so that the inmates can be well cared for. We have now all children in the home. During the past year one has married, one died and one has been adopted from the home by her mother. There are also approved applicants who will likely enter the home soon.

We are also glad to report that the children of the home are practically all in school and are doing good work.

The entire indebtedness of the home at the present time is about \$2,500.00. Therefore, we recommend that each of our churches take regular contribution for the support and maintenance of this great work.
