## CONSTITUTION

(As Amended at 1933, 1943, 1948, 1950, 1951, 1953, 1954 and 1956 Sessions.)

### ARTICLE I—NAME

The name of this body shall be the Pulaski County Baptist Association, Incorporated.

### ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this Association shall be to awaken and stimulate among the churches of the Association, the greatest possible activity in Evangelism, Christian Education, Missions and Benevolences, throughout the bounds of the Association; to cultivate closer co-operation among the churches and to promote concert of action in advancing all the interest of the Kingdom of God.

### ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of Messengers from regular co-operating churches, which are in sympathy with the principles and purposes of this Constitution and desire to co-operate with this Association, who shall be entitled to seats upon presentation of letters from their churches or other satisfactory evidence of their appointment.

Section 2. Each church shall be entitled to a minimum of three messengers. One additional messenger shall be allowed for every 50 resident church members above 100. No church, however, may have more than 10 messengers.

Section 3. Messengers from churches desiring to affiliate with this Association shall present to the Association in Annual Meeting, Petitionary Letters or evidence, setting forth the Articles of Faith on which the church was organized, together with satisfactory evidence of the regularity of their organization. They shall be received into the Association by receiving two-thirds of the votes cast.

### ARTICLE IV—AUTHORITY

This Association shall never exercise any authority, legislative or ecclesiastical, over any church. Nor shall it in any way interfere with the rights and absolute independence of any church.

### ARTICLE V—OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be elected the first session of the second day and who shall take office the closing

session of the last day of the annual Associational meeting. Said officers to be elected by a majority vote cast at such meeting. The Moderator shall not be eligible to serve more than two successive terms. The Clerk and the Treasurer may be the same person.

Section 2. The Moderator shall preside at all sessions of the Association; or request the Vice-Moderator to preside. The Vice-Moderator will also preside in the absence of the Moderator. The Moderator shall exercise the same privilege of discussion as any other member of the body.

Section 3. The Clerk shall keep a correct record of the Proceedings of the Association in annual meeting, the Executive Board in regular or called meetings, and the Missions Committee in regular or called meetings. He shall be responsible for the printing and distribution of the proceedings of the annual meeting; the taking and preserving of the minutes of all Executive Board and Missions Committee meetings as the Association may direct.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of every kind entrusted to him and shall disburse the same upon the order of the Executive Board and shall make an itemized statement of receipts and disbursements monthly to the Executive Board and an annual statement to the Association in annual session. The Treasurer shall be bonded by the Association, at the Association's expense. An annual audit shall be made of his books by a reputable accountant. This fee shall be paid by the Association.

#### ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of one lay member, elected by each co-operating church, together with the pastor of each co-operating church and the officers of the Association. FIFTEEN members of said Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall meet one time each month in regular meeting, time and place to be determined by the Board. In case of special meetings written notice must be given to each Board member. The Moderator and Clerk of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Board.

Section 3. The Executive Board shall receive reports, in the monthly meetings, from the following:

Treasurer's Report.

Associational Missionary.

Superintendent of Associational Sunday School.

Director of Associational Training Union.

President of the Associational Brotherhood.  
Superintendent of the Associational W.M.U.  
Director of Associational Music Program.  
Director of Student Union Work in the Association.  
Rescue Mission Superintendent's Report.  
Recommendations of the Missions Committee.

Section 4. The Executive Board shall be constituted and empowered by the Association as its legal agent to administer all business committed to it by the Association and to employ such paid agents as it may deem necessary in carrying on the Missionary, Education, Benevolent and Financial work of the Association.

Section 5. The Executive Board shall render to the Association in Annual meeting a summary statement of all the business for the year. Same to be printed in the minutes.

## ARTICLE VII—STANDING COMMITTEES

### I. Missions Committee

Section 1. The Association in Annual meeting, through the Nominating Committee, shall elect a standing committee known as the Missions Committee. This committee shall be composed of twelve members. Members of the Missions Committee shall serve for a term of three years. Each year four members shall complete their terms and shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of at least one year.

Section 2. The Officers of the Association and the elected Associational Organization leaders, shall be ex-officio members of the Committee with all rights of discussion and voting.

Section 3. The Missions Committee shall have the responsibility of selecting and nominating the Associational Missionary or any other paid agents of the Association, and to recommend their employment to the Executive Board in regular meetings, or properly called special meetings.

Section 4. The duties of the Missions Committee shall be as follows:

1. To serve as a nominating committee for any paid officer or worker of the Association. These nominations are to be brought to the Executive Board.
2. To plan a program of mission work for the Association. This is to be an active and aggressive program of planning. This committee should present a challenging and progressive program of work.



3. To see that the plans for Associational work are promoted effectively.
4. To plan a program of benevolences. This should be a well thought out program including all such needs. Plans for promoting the activities should be initiated by this committee.
5. To plan a comprehensive program with regard to Christian Education. This committee should ascertain the needed projects, set the emphases, and actively promote the work.
6. To correlate the activities and projects of the Association with the adopted cooperative program. This committee should actively work toward the end of keeping all of our Baptist program under direct supervision in co-operation with the cooperative program plan. These projects should be clearly thought through and planned in connection with the budget committee each year.
7. To work toward the establishment of new units of mission work in the Association. To facilitate this phase of the work the Chairman of the Missions Committee shall appoint a special committee of three from the membership of the Missions Committee. This shall be known as the Missions and Survey Committee. The duties of the committee shall be:
  - (1) To survey the entire Association to determine the areas where new churches or missions should be established, and to locate property in such areas suitable for building sites.
  - (2) To recommend to the Missions Committee expenditures from the Missions Expansion Fund toward securing such property. The Mission Committee will then study their findings and recommendations and bring to the Executive Board for final action those projects they endorse.
  - (3) To solicit the assistance of sponsoring churches in establishing work in areas which have been approved by the Executive Board.
  - (4) To assist and advise all groups desiring to establish Baptist Churches and Missions in the territorial limits of Pulaski County to the end that all such works may secure the most desirable and strategic locations to serve the people of this association.
  - (5) To survey the areas to be served by each proposed new work and recommend to the Missions Committee the nature and extent of any assistance that the Association should provide in each case. The Missions Committee would in turn study their recommendation and

submit to the Executive Board a final recommendation in each instance.

- (6) To recommend to the Missions Committee all salary supplements to pastor's of missions and needy churches. Commitments for supplements shall be made for periods not to exceed one year. They may be renewed by recommendation of the Committee in deserving cases.
8. This Committee shall never exercise any authority over the churches. Its sole function shall be that of advising the local congregation, desiring to establish a new work, in the matter of securing the most strategic location and assist them in securing the sponsorship of a mother church, if desirable. Any group desiring associational assistance in securing property and for pastor's salary supplements would be expected to counsel with this committee in locating their work. If a church forms spontaneously or a local church establishes a new mission without counselling with the Missions and Survey Committee, no attempt will be made to tell them they cannot do so. The Association must then decide whether or not to welcome the new church into the fellowship.
9. The Missions Committee should correlate the activity of the Associational organizations. Plans should be made together so as to avoid conflicts.
10. The Chairman of the Missions Committee will appoint committees within the committee when such are needed to carry out the duties of the Missions Committee with regard to the above items.

## II. Nominating Committee

Section 1. This committee shall be composed of five members elected by the messengers during the first day's session of the annual Associational meeting. This committee shall be elected as follows:

1. The chairman of the Executive Board of the Association shall appoint a committee of five executive board members to serve as a special nominating committee to nominate members of the standing nominating committee.
2. This duly appointed special nominating committee will present nominations for the five members of the standing nominating committee during the first days session of the annual Associational meeting.
3. The right of nominations from the floor shall not be abridged.
4. The messengers shall vote by standing.



**Section 2.**

1. The Standing Nomination Committee shall nominate the chairman of all standing committees of the Association.
2. The Standing Nominating Committee shall make any necessary nominations to fill vacancies during the year. These nominations shall be voted upon by the Executive Board in regular or called meetings.

**III. Standing Committees for Associational Reports**

1. Committee on Associational Missions.
2. Committee on Associational Organization.
3. Committee on Missions and the Cooperative Program.
4. Committee on Christian Education and Religious Literature.
5. Committee on Benevolences and Benevolent Institutions.
6. Committee on Temperance and Social Service.
7. Committee on Budget and Finance.

Section 1. These Standing Committees to be enlarged to three members to each Committee before the next Annual meeting. The Moderator, after conference with the Chairman of the Respective Committee, will make the appointments.

Section 2. The duty of these committees is to compile and present a report of the year's work of the committee or agency it represents.

**ARTICLE VIII—MEETINGS**

Section 1. The Association shall meet annually on a date designated at each Annual meeting. If no date is set, the Executive Board will designate one.

Section 2. The Moderator of the Association shall appoint the following committees to report during the session at which they were appointed (annual):

Committee on Audits.

Committee on Time, Place, Preachers for Next Annual Meeting.

Committee on Resolutions.

Committee on Obituaries.

These appointments shall be made during the first day of the Annual meeting.

**ARTICLE IX—ASSOCIATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS**

Section 1. The leaders of the Associational Organizations, Superintendent of Sunday School, Superintendent of Woman's Missionary Union, Director of Training Union, Director of Music, President of the Brotherhood and Director of Student Union Work or others, shall be nominated by the Standing Nominating Committee.

Section 2. The Associational Organizations shall correlate their activities through the Missions Committee. A Calendar of Activities shall be planned and followed. Said organizations, through their leaders, will make monthly reports to the Executive Board of work done and work proposed.

**ARTICLE X—HOW AMENDED**

This Constitution may be amended at any Annual meeting of the Association by a TWO-THIRDS VOTE of the Messengers present and voting, provided that the substance of ARTICLE IV shall not be abrogated.

**RULES OF ORDER**

1. ORDER OF BUSINESS: The Order of Business shall be made flexible to meet the needs as they arise. A committee on ORDER OF BUSINESS shall publish a Tentative Order of Business for distribution at the First Session of the Annual meeting. Said committee to consist of the Mederator, Clerk, Host Pastor, and Associational Missionary together with the SIX elected Associational Organization Leaders.

2. ROBERTS RULES OF ORDER shall be the standard in deciding questions of parliamentary practice.

3. The Committee on Order of Business shall be charged with making the Annual meetings as spiritual, inspirational and informational as is possible to make them. Preaching shall have a prominent place in the Annual meetings.

9. The Report on the Cooperative Program was prepared by Nolan P. Howington but was presented by W. Dawson King. General Secretary, Ben L. Bridges, spoke to the report. A motion carried to adopt it.

#### REPORT OF THE COOPERATIVE PROGRAM

Jesus commissioned the church which He had founded to "go into all the world and make disciples." Without our modern means of rapid transportation those early Christians moved across the face of their world to witness in His Name. The marching orders of Jesus for His churches have never been revoked. Obedience to the Master's command demands the co-operation of all those churches.

In our time God has guided Southern Baptists into a plan whereby an individual, belonging and serving in a local church can participate in the total gospel ministry around the world. Through the Cooperative Program each Baptist Church member may have a share in preaching the gospel, educating the ignorant and ministering to the sick. Hence, the Cooperative Program is a unified, systematic, equitable plan whereby the local church helps carry out the Great Commission.

This is possible only when the local church has a part in the Cooperative Program. During the associational year ending September 31, 1955, the churches of this association received a total of \$1,652,960.00 from their members. Of this amount \$246,490.51 was given through the Cooperative Program to world missions. This represents an average of fifteen cents (.15) out of every dollar contributed. During the year each member gave \$47.93 to the local church, of which \$7.15 was given through the Cooperative Program to world missions.

Out of 75 churches, four gave nothing through the Cooperative Program; and seven others gave one per cent or



less for this purpose. We are appealing to the churches of the association to give \$330,000 through the Cooperative Program this year. In order to do this each church will have to raise its Cooperative Program gifts at least 12½ per cent. Our members have a right to a maximum share in world missions and our church budgets should be adjusted to meet the demands of Jesus in the Great Commission. There are no mythical dollars that carry on God's business in the world. Our prayers for a lost world are empty unless they are backed up by our local gifts. Until God gives us a better plan for implementing the Great Commission in the world we must fully promote the Cooperative Program in His Name.

11. Russell Clearman, Gaines Street Baptist Church, delivered the Annual Sermon. He used for a text Psalm 104:26. He called on Roy Hilton to lead the closing prayer.

### TUESDAY MORNING, OCTOBER 16

12. The Moderator called the meeting to order and Ed Nelson led in singing, "We're Marching to Zion," and "Higher Ground," after which Marvin Faulkner, Zion Baptist Church, read Eph. 2, and led in prayer.

13. The Clerk read the journal of the previous session.

14. L. C. Tedford presented the Report of the Executive Board. Motion to adopt carried.

### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

Eleven regular meetings were held during the past year. A detailed record of all business transacted is in the hands of the Clerk. The most important matters of business transacted by the Board were as follows:

1. Created another Associational office, viz., CHAIRMAN OF EVANGELISM and elected to that office Roy Hilton.

2. Made plans for an associational-wide simultaneous evangelistic crusade to be held April 7-21, 1957, and elected Dr. I. L. Yearby as Director.

3. Made plans for entertaining a southwide TEACHERS' TRAINING CLINIC to be held in Little Rock in March, 1957, and elected Jim Cady as Director.

4. Discontinued the operation of the Twin City Rescue Mission.

5. Elected O. C. Robinson, Jr. as Associational Missionary, provided office space and equipment for him in the Baptist Building.

6. Authorized Missionary Robinson to make plans for a simultaneous SCHOOL OF MISSIONS in 1959.

7. Prepared an amendment to the constitution, and by unanimous vote approved that it be recommended to the Association for consideration at this annual meeting.

Patterson, Assistant Superintendent of the Baptist Hospital spoke to the Hospital Report, and Superintendent Harold Seefeldt spoke to the Orphans Home Report. Pastor Jay D. Tollison of El Dorado also spoke regarding the Orphans Home, urging especially a good Thanksgiving offering for the Home.

#### ARKANSAS BAPTIST HOSPITAL

In the year 1955 the Arkansas Baptist Hospital made tremendous advancement in the opening of its new addition and remodeling of the existing facilities. One hundred thirty-four beds were added making a 425 bed hospital. A therapy unit to the X-ray department including a cobalt unit for the treatment of cancer was added. Around 16 patients per day are being treated in this department.

The School of Nursing also is enlarged to take care of new students, making a total of near 300 students each year.

The opening of our five story new building makes it possible to care for many more people—perhaps 3,000 more this year than last.

Funds for this \$1,500,000.00 expansion were secured by donations of the citizens of Little Rock, and other friends, together with capital needs budget allocated by Arkansas Baptist Convention, and a loan made by the institution.

On October 8th the hospital opened its new psychiatric unit with 20 beds. This is the first such unit in any private



hospital in Arkansas. A recreation hall is being prepared for the convalescent patients of this unit.

Still more expansion is needed. Even now architects are working toward building a surgical pavillion which will include 14 major operating rooms a new X-ray department, a new out-patient clinic which will handle many charity patients, an emergency room and a physical therapy department.

#### REPORT OF BOTTOMS BAPTIST ORPHANAGE

Since our last report in July 1955 we were able to care for 153 children, taking 36 new ones in and returning 25 to re-established homes and other child care programs. Our capacity is 140 children, with a total family, (including Staff members and their children), of 170. Twenty-eight children were accepted into the First Baptist Church for baptism and 9 by letter, during the year. The children attend Sunday school, Training Union and other church organizations in First Baptist Church. They also attend the Public schools of Monticello.

We are happy to report the purchase of a new bus with money provided through Memorials sent in at the death of loved ones and friends. \$1,500.00 came in from one family—others from \$5.00 up. This is to be called our "Memorial Bus."

We have built a building to care for the pasteurizing of the milk and also a shop building. We have started the construction of a Recreation and Assembly building, which will answer a long felt need—a place for various meetings and a place for the children to play on rainy days and in spare time. \$75,000.00 of the cost of this building came from the Bottoms Estate, in January 1956. We have also had to provide several pieces of equipment. . . .

**TEMPERANCE AND SOCIAL SERVICE REPORT****To the Pulaski County Baptist Association, 1956**

All God-fearing people are well aware that in dealing with the liquor traffic today we are dealing with the most vicious, ungodly, soul-destroying aggregate of criminals the world has ever known. Any traffic that contributes to making beasts of men, that breaks up homes, that breaks human hearts, and leaves little children the victims of its dastardly destruction, and that keeps the wills of men enslaved can be assured of the wrath of Almighty God.

The following startling facts should awaken Christian people everywhere to consecrated, diligent, and concentrated action to do everything possible to destroy this monster:

1. There are now 7,000,000 alcoholics in America from a total of 95,000,000 drinkers. In the city of Boston alone last year 30,000 people were treated for alcoholism. One person out of every 25 in America is an alcoholic. In one state one out of every 12 is an alcoholic. Every third teen-ager in America drinks. In one county in New York a survey showed that 90% of all high school students were drinkers.

2. Out of drinking bottles have come 4,600 murders, 11,000 rapes, 150,000 illegitimate children and 260,000 divorces.

3. More than 50% of the major crimes committed in America are solely caused by liquor. Drinking has increased in the past 20 years over 118% and arrest for drunken driving has increased 175 percent.

4. Americans spent \$9,000,000,000 for drink last year. This is \$9.00 per minute for every minute since Christ was born. If put into silver dollars, it would make nine rings around the world and would take one man 550 years to count them.

5. In the State of Arkansas, for each \$1.00 that goes to the state in tax revenue, the cost to the people for the damage done is over \$10.00. It is the height of ignorance or ungodly prejudice to condone the continued legal sale of liquor.



With these facts in mind, we recommend that our churches and pastors continue to be diligently active in every way possible to support any and every move toward stamping out this evil.

29. The report on Radio and Television was read by W. Harry Hunt of the Levy Baptist Church. By motion it was adopted.

### RADIO AND TELEVISION

Southern Baptists began radio work in 1938 when a committee was appointed to study the potential for evangelism which lay in radio. This movement became the Radio Commission in 1946 and was put into the Cooperative Program. In 1954 it was renamed the Radio and Television Commission.

The Baptist Hour is the official radio broadcast of our Convention and has continued fifteen years with 100,000 broadcasts. This program is carried on 400 radio stations in 33 states and several foreign countries. Eleven Arkansas stations carry this program but no Pulaski County station presents it. We recommend that our Association select a committee to work on getting this program on one of our local stations. Dr. Baker James Cauthen is the speaker on this program this Fall.

The Commission launched a thirteen-film series for television on April 1, 1956. The series is called: "This Is the Answer." The series is based on the parables of the Bible and it reached a viewing audience of ten million individuals each week.

Our Baptist Churches in the Association have shared with other denominations in free radio and television time offered by local stations. KARK-TV offers a short four minute devotional period and Baptist Churches receive two week periods four times a year. KTHS offers a Sunday School hour from 9:05 until 9:30 and a preaching hour from eleven until twelve each Sunday and Baptist Churches are given the Sundays in January and July. This station also offers a week day program, "Time for Thought," between 3:20 and 3:30 each day and Baptists have this program in January and July. We express appreciation to these stations for this free time. A few of our Churches purchase time on radio and TV stations and we encourage this practice, believing that it is a fine evangelistic and missionary work for our Lord.

#### REPORT ON CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND LITERATURE

##### I. Literature:

The "Arkansas Baptist," under the capable direction of Editor B. H. Duncan, has reached a circulation of 48,500. The ideal way to get our State Baptist paper in every Baptist home is through the budget of the local churches and 449 churches are using this method. There are also 180 "clubs" of around ten members each and about 1,000 individual subscribers.

This year the Southern Baptist Sunday School Board celebrates its sixty-fifth birthday. Something of the magnitude of its work is realized when we take note of the following:

More than 65 million copies of 79 periodicals were published in 1955.

About 50 new books are published each year, with 3,673,000 copies in 1955.



The Board now owns, debt free five buildings in Nashville.

50 book stores are operated in the Southland and 2 south-wide assemblies are sponsored by the S. S. Board.

## II. Christian Education:

Christian Education should begin in the home, continued in the Church and climaxed in the college. Many, if not most, of the crucial decisions of life are made by young people while of college age. It is still true that the "future belongs to those who prepare for it." Most of the leaders in our world are college trained. If Baptists want their contribution to places of leadership to continue, we must have institutions of higher learning under Christian leaders where capable Baptist youth may prepare themselves for worthy work and service. There is immediate need for Arkansas Baptists to expand their support of its educational program on the college level if we are to meet the need of the calls of Baptist youth for college training.

40. Missionary O. C. Robinson, Jr., read his report as Associational Missionary, and spoke to it with much earnestness. By motion it was adopted.

The form of this Report is somewhat different to that presented by yor Associational Missionary in previous years. This is true because I was only on the field one month of this past Associational year, and because of some major changes in the program of work.

I shall not attempt to report on the very fine work done by my predecessor, Brother E. A. Ingram, nor on that done by your beloved Director of the Rescue Mission, Brother Purl Stockton. That these men have made a notable contribution to the spiritual life of our Association is well known to all of you and we give humble thanks to God for their services.

Brother Ingram officially terminated his service the first of July, but assisted with the publication of the July and August issues of the Bulletin, and gave valuable guidance to me for many weeks after I arrived on the field the first of September.

The Rescue Mission was closed June first and Brother Stockton's service as Director was brought to a close.

We now have a full time secretary and have provided her an office and equipment. She will be on duty eight hours a day Monday through Friday. She is Mrs. Ruth Jordan, a member of Immanuel and a consecrated Christian who is active in her church. She will be a very great asset to all of us as we seek to project a worthy Associational Program.

Since the first of September I have preached in 15 churches, attended services in 14 others and visited the fields of 40 more, making a total of 69 church fields visited.

I have been busy studying the maps of the Twin Cities, the County and the new residential sub-divisions. I have also been carefully scrutinizing the population distribution of the entire County in relation to the location of our churches. Already I have begun to arrive at some conclusions but I will need more time to formulate a wise strategy for the advancement of our witness in the County. But certain general things are sufficiently clear to me that I feel safe in suggesting some broad principles that I believe should guide us in our Associational work this next year.

Including the two churches received during this session we now have 75 churches in Pulaski Association. One church, Holly Springs, ceased to function this last year. One other church, Harmony, has functioned as an arm of Remount this past year, but they have voted to try to carry their own load this next year. Bethel became a Mission of Second Baptist. The Liberty Church has voted to become an arm of one of our stronger churches this year. They have suffered a loss of members due to the new city water works lake which reaches their community.

There are ten (10) missions operated by the churches of the Association. This means there are 85 churches and missions functioning in our County.

The Chamber of Commerce tells me that the population of Pulaski County is now 240,000. If this be true then we have one Baptist Church for every 3,000 persons in our County. This sounds great, but a careful analysis of this picture reveals that 46 of these churches and missions are located outside the Twin Cities area. Which means that they are situated in communities where only 64,000 of our total population live. In these areas then we have one church for every 1,400 persons.

The other side of this picture is that we have only 40 churches and missions in the Twin Cities area where 176,500 people live. Here then we have only one church or mission for every 4,500 persons.

According to the 1955 minutes we had 34,483 members of our churches, a gain of approximately 2,000 over 1954. If we now have 36,500 members in our churches, then we have reached 15% of our population.

This compares favorably with the situation in the other cities which I have studied. I also recognize that we have a sizeable number of Negro Baptist and Landmark Baptists



in the County. But I am certain that God expects us to do more than we have done toward reaching the multitudes of lost people in this city. We may safely say that 150,000 people are unevangelized in the shadow of our churches.

God expects Pulaski Baptists to do everything in their power to win these lost souls to Christ.

#### **ASSOCIATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT**

Pulaski County Association had a full corps of officers during the 1955-56 Associational year. The excellence of the departmental leadership has contributed greatly to the increased efficiency of our Sunday School work in our Association.

#### **Associational Rallies Well Attended**

Three Associational rallies were held at Park Hill, Immanuel, and Baptist Tabernacle. The Associational group training schools held in six different churches in October, 1955, took the place of the quarterly Associational Rally for that month.

A total attendance at the quarterly Associational rallies for the year was 1,303. In addition to these quarterly rallies four Associational group rallies were held during the year in each of the five Associational groups. The total attendance at these group rallies was 768.

Attendance at the four Vacation Bible school clinics held in our Association totaled 397.

During the year the total attendance of the Associational officers at the monthly officers' meetings totaled 158.

Pulaski County has moved up in rank among the Associations of the Southern Baptist Convention in training awards for the last three years from 28th to 18th to 13th. During 1954-55 we had a total of six Standard Sunday schools in our Association. During the past year, 1955-56, we have increased that number to 15 Standard schools. There are 23 Standard Sunday schools in Arkansas, and 15 of these are from Pulaski County.

In order for our Association to be Standard during the coming year we must have at least 20 Standard Sunday schools.

#### **REPORT OF ASSOCIATIONAL TRAINING UNION**

### BROTHERHOOD REPORT FOR PULASKI COUNTY 1955-56

The Pulaski County Associational Brotherhood has been functioning at a high level during the past year. The four quarterly meetings have been excellent, attendance has been good, and interest has been high.

The general program of an Associational Brotherhood is to call together the Baptist men of the Association, four times each year, in rallies dedicated to the high purposes of bringing the men closer together in Christian fellowship, of informing them about the affairs of the Kingdom, of pointing them to their privileges and responsibilities as Christians, and of challenging them to a higher level of service to their Lord through their church and denomination.

Three Pulaski County Brotherhood Rallies were held this year, at Levy Baptist Church, Gaines Street, and Pine Grove.

#### **B. S. U. REPORT TO PULASKI COUNTY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION**

Our Baptist student work has had an excellent year of growth and expansion in the state. We are grateful to God and Arkansas Baptists for these blessings.

Arkansas Baptists now have five Baptist Student Centers and seven local directors. This year the new Baptist Student Center at Conway was opened, and the first directors ever employed at Conway and Magnolia are now on the job.



Our student work in Pulaski County has been limited actually to an excellent program at Arkansas Baptist Hospital. The work at the Junior College and at the Medical School has been weak. It has been strengthened somewhat this year with councils elected at each school and regular devotional services held on these campuses. The opportunity for a fully developed Baptist Student program lies ahead. With the Junior College anticipating expanding into a four year college and with the new plant at the University Medical School, we must advance in the Pulaski County area.

It is hoped that next year will see the employment of a full time director in Little Rock and definite plans made for the erection of a Baptist Student Center on the property the Association owns adjoining the Medical School campus.

There were 20 Hymn Sings held in the various zones with an average attendance of 131. We would like to commend Mr. B. H. Ball, leader of the North Zone, for the fine way in which he planned and directed 12 Hymn Sings which had an average attendance of 153. There were eight conferences held with music directors and pastors to promote Hymn Sings and congregational activities.
