Report on Orphans Home.

Your committee on Orphans' Home beg leave to report;

If we have a denominational work "our pet" it should be Orphans' Home. There is a great work being done for our Master through this channel and there is yet a great work to be done.

We have within our ranks two Orphanages, one at Texarkana, which is doing a great work and needs our support; there are 22 children in this Home; another is at Monticello, we have 110 children here. A year ago we had 65 children. Twenty have been adopted into religious homes and yet we have 110 children left. The last year we had 32 conversions in the Monticello Home, 27 baptisms.

The Sunbeam Society gave last year \$100 for missions. We commend these Homes to you and recommend, a collection for them be taken at this time, allowing each Church or person to make this pledge to the Home he desires it to go. May God put it into the hearts of His people to do more for the work this year than ever before. We earnestly ask that each delegate pledge his church for one or both.

Report on Foreign Mission.

Your committee on Foreign Mission would respectfully make the following report and also offer a few suggestions which we feel are very important. Just at this time, we have only to call to mind the Blessed command of our Savior, when he made a Commissionary officer (so to speak) out of every one of his faithful Disciples and authorized them most impressively to not only just stay at home, but to reach out into the whole world that every soul might hear the Blessed tidings of Salvation. We find that the demand for the Gospel in Foreign fields is far beyond the ability to supply and yet every follower of Jesus Christ has great reason to be thankful for the great results attending these efforts. Collected as follows.

\$460,797.62 and 2905 baptisms, and in order to be more able and ready to meet the increasing demands from the Foreign field we recommend that every Baptist Church in Grand Prairie Baptist Association make an especial effort at least once every quarter to receive contributions for this purpose and forward the same to the Secretary of our Foreign Mission Board at Richmond, Va.

Report of Executive Board.

We the Executive Board beg leave to report, that we at the first meeting after the last Association employed Bro. H. Y. Morris as missionary for all his time at \$75.00 per month and he to do all collecting on the field he could and he to report to this Board, which he did at each 5th Sunday Meeting, and same were adopted. His final report to the Board at this Association shows, there were 81 additions to the several churches in this Association under his preaching and that he had organized 7 Sunday Schools and had collected on the field the sum of \$511.90, and has received from Treasurer and in collections this meeting the sum of \$257.53, leaving due him for 11 months the sum of \$55.57. — At our meeting with Stuttgart church, the matter of buying a Gospel Tent for the use of our Missionary was brought up and discussed and the Moderator and Bro. Stranberg were instructed to buy same for the Association, which they did at a cost of \$98.00, which amount they borrowed on their own note and am sorry to report very little paid on same and suggest that collection be taken up and pay off the note.

Report on State Missions.

In some sense the most important subject that will be considered by this Association is that of State Missions. The question touches our denominational life in more than one point and furnishes an outlet for more of the energies generated in our churches than any other phase of our great work. To Christ belongs all of the glory and to the Churches belong all the credit for the work done in saving the lost and training the saved. But State Missions is the militant force sent out by these churches beyond their borders to reach the lost and plant or strengthen other churches. Realizing then that State Mission is of the very first importance, We recommend heroic effort in placing the work above want. Our State Mission Board is now employing 72 men paying them as a rule about as much as the churches would pay them, were they engaged as pastors. About 50 churches are being helped to sustain their pastor on the field and seven general Evangelists helping as the churches or field may require. Last year State Mission's force reported more than five thousand professions or conversions and baptised 3411 persons, or a little more than nine baptisms for every day in the year.
