# Proceedings.

---

ROVER, YELL COUNTY, ARK., Sept. 17, 1898.

The Dardanelle Baptist Association met with Bethlehem church No. 1, in its forty-fourth annual session, at 10 a. m.

Eld. W. E. Logan led devotional exercises for thirty minutes.

Intermission of twenty minutes Eld. C. C. Hogan preached the introductory sermon from Matt. 5: 14: "Ye are the light of the world." Adjourned to 1:30 p. m.

Reconvened at 1:30.

Devotional exercises led by the moderator.

The moderator appointed the messengers from New Bethel church together with the deacons of Bethlehem church a committee on divine service. On motion, Eld. Richardson was added to the above committee.

Read the letters from the churches and enrolled the messengers.

Elds. J. G. Doyle and J. P. Weaver were appointed tellers to hold an election for permanent officers. After taking the ballot the tellers reported that Eld. J. W. Richardson was re-elected moderator and Ira A. Huckaby, clerk and treasurer.

The committee on Divine Service announced that Eld. T. P. Manning would preach in this house at 7:30 p. m. and Eld. J. P. Weaver at the Methodist church at 11 a. m., on Sunday.

A petitionary letter was presented by Delaware church which was received and the messengers welcomed to seats with us.

Eld. J. G. Doyle was enrolled as corresponding secretary of the Sunday School Board of the Arkansas State Convention.

Eld. J. P. Weaver as a visitor from Cumberland Association, Tenn.

J. G. Lile, of Greenbrier Association, Conway church, representing the interest of Central College.

The order of business was suspended on motion of T. P. Manning and correspondence called for.

Eld. J. A. Sossamon was enrolled as corresponding messenger from Fourche Valley Association. J. I. Green and J. W. Crawford from Buckville Association.

On motion Bro. J. G. Lile was invited to address the Association in regard to the work of the Central College

On motion, Bro. Doyle was invited to speak in regard to the work of the Sunday School Board of the Arkansas Baptist Convention

On motion, the two members of the Mission Board present the moderator and clerk were instructed to act for the whole board and complete their work

By request of Bro. Richardson the body excused him from preaching the Missionary Sermon on tomorrow and invited Bro. J. G. Doyle to preach.

On motion adjourned to 7 30 p. m

Reassembled at 7:30 p. m.

Eld. T. P. Manning preached from 4th chapter Romans. Theme: "The plan of salvation." Adjourned to 8 a. m Monday.

## SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 18

Sunday school meeting at 9:30 was addressed by Eld. J. G. Doyle and Prof. J. G. Lile. At 11 o'clock Eld. Doyle preached the Missionary Sermon from Deut 1-22. Collection for Asso-



ciational Missions, \$12.67 Eld. J. P. Weaver preached at the Methodist church and took a collection for the same purpose, amounting to \$5.12. At 3 p m. Eld. W. N. Womack preached from Romans 1-16. At 7:30 Eld. E. H. Stafford preached from Luke 15-22.

### MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 19.

Devotional exercises led by Eld. M. P. Blair.

Bro. J. M. Gray informed the body that illness in Bro. Richardson's family would prevent his attendance at the meeting this morning. Bro. M. P. Blair was chosen moderator pro. tem.

The minutes of Saturday's meeting were read and approved.

The election of a Mission Board being in order the moderator called for nominations.

Eld. Logan moved that Bros. R. H. Dacus, J. G. Jackson, R. E. Cole, Thos. Henderson and G. T. Hunter be elected as a Mission Board. On motion of Bro. Puckett the name of H. H. Street was substituted for that of R. E. Cole.

Bro. T. P. Manning moved that the further consideration of the question in its present form be indefinitely postponed. The motion was sustained by a rising vote.

Bro. Manning then moved that the body now proceed to elect a Mission Board one by one which motion was carried.

Bros. M. P. Henry, T. P. Manning and W. E. Valentine were placed in nomination for member from the Second district. Bro. Manning was elected.

Bro. W. W. Brooks was elected from the Fourth district, and Bro. D. M. Ballenger from the Third.

Bro. M. P. Blair was elected from the First district and Bro. W. E. Logan as member at large.

Bro. T. P. Manning read the report of the committee on  
 Domestic or Associational Missions as follows:

Your committee to which was referred this subject would respectfully  
 submit; that, The fundamental scriptural principle of missions is admitted  
 by all classes of religionists; that this principle is so abundantly enforced  
 by the Master and his apostles as to leave no room for quibbling nor hesi-  
 tation.

The whole question remaining open for solution relates to methods  
 and means.

The duty to occupy every foot of the territory within the bounds of the  
 Dardanelle Association is confessedly, primal and imperative. The method  
 of conducting this work looking to the accomplishment of this sacred trust  
 has been adopted.

The means—the man and the money—the questions with which we are  
 confronted are of such importance we can scarcely approach them with  
 sufficient deliberation and zeal. The destitution is great. The Lord com-  
 mands. Will we obey?

Your committee feels deeply impressed with the thought that the  
 efforts heretofore put forth were perhaps in some degree experimental.  
 Having sown we seem to have laid limit to the time and measure of har-  
 vest. We shall reap if we faint not. Let us fully trust Him in the dedi-  
 cation of our persons and substance and push forward this work as we  
 have never done before.

Further reporting would refer for details and circumstances, setting  
 forth results heretofore accomplished, to the report of your Mission Board.

Concluding, would recommend that we co-operate with the State Board  
 and that we appoint a member to effectuate this co-operation.

The report of the committee on Sunday Schools was read by G. W. Hunnicutt, as follows:

Whereas, The earliest impressions made upon the mind are the most lasting, be it

Resolved, First. That we organize in each church composing the Dardanelle Association, a Sunday school for the purpose of implanting in the tender minds of youth the precious truths of the Bible.

Second. Whereas, in a few years the dearest interests of the churches will be in the hands of those who are now children, it becomes our duty, as the true followers of the Master, to have them excel us in the vineyard of the Lord.

Third. Should we fail to bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, error will be implanted in their minds and they become followers of men instead of Christ.

Fourth. We believe that it should be the duty of every minister to impress upon each church composing the Dardanelle Association the great need of a Baptist Sunday school until such shall be organized.

Fifth. We believe that in the Sunday school, which is a help to the church of Christ, every child of God has an opportunity to exercise his gift and, therefore, it is not only beneficial to the young but to the aged.

Sixth. Whereas; we know not what opportunities we may have for this all-important work, nor how soon our heads will be pillowed in the

dust of death, and we from our children taken, let each minister and messenger composing this Association, when they shall have returned home, take up this matter at once and be earnestly engaged until there is a Sunday school organized in each of the respective churches.

Eld. C. C. Hogan introduced the following resolution, which was adopted:

Whereas, The Sunday School Convention of the Dardanelle Association asks this body to designate the place for holding the next session of her body. Resolved, That we hold the next annual meeting of the convention with the church at Antioch, embracing the first Sunday in Sept. 1899.

Bro. W. E. Logan read the report of the committee on publications.

Your committee on publications report the following:

First. We would recommend the reading of the Bible as it is the rule to our faith and practice.

Second. That we do earnestly commend to the brotherhood of this Association the Arkansas Baptist, as a religious journal worthy of our support.

Third. For our Sunday schools the literature published by the Southern Baptist Convention and the American Baptist Publication Society.

Bro. Logan spoke on report and moved its adoption

Bro. Street moved that the report be amended to include the Foreign Mission Journal, The Home Field and the American Baptist Flag. The amendment was adopted after which the original motion was adopted.

Bro. W. E. Kimbrough read the following report on Foreign Missions:

Foreign Missions are based on the word of God, The eternal decree of God himself is the basal rock of missions. David used language relative to Christ in the Second Psalm. "I will declare the decree; the Lord hath said unto me, thou art my son, this day have I begotten thee, ask of me and I will give thee the heathen for thine inheritance and the uttermost parts of the earth for thy possession." Christ in his personal ministry fulfilled the prophecies concerning himself. He announced his mission in pre-



phetic language and also declared that "the Son of man has come to seek and to save that which was lost."

The spirit of Christ is the spirit of missions. After his resurrection he appeared to his disciples and gave them the commission, "Go, ye, into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." Mark 16:15. Also, as recorded by Matthew, "Go, ye, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit; teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you, and lo! I am with you always, even unto the end of the world."

We conclude that this commission is binding upon us as upon the early churches. Our responsibility is equally as great, our duty equally as plain. We learn from the epistles of Paul that the early churches obeyed this command. Jerusalem was made the starting point in obedience to the command of Christ, as given by Luke, and from thence it began to spread into countries adjacent to Palestine. Afterwards, through the efforts of God's servants it began to be heard and felt in other fields, and finally reached us in the western world.

We must continue to remember that in order to promulgate this gospel, God still uses human agency, and we even of the Dardanelle Association are as much his agents as were the saints in New Testament times. We would then earnestly ask, "who is there willing to consecrate his service this day unto the Lord?"

The Mission Board held a meeting at New Prospect church in November '97 at which five members were present. At that meeting it was agreed to employ Eld. W. N. Womack at a salary of \$40.00 per month, to begin work March 15. He was instructed to view the field and occupy it to the best of his ability. Following is the report of his work:

Miles traveled, 480.

Sermons preached, 60.

Families visited, 57.

Days of labor, 90.

I could have organized a church at Aikman's Chapel of 8 members but thought best not to do so because I did not think it would last long.

I had regular appointments at Dublin and Spring Creek. The church at Dublin is resuscitated and is now in working order, having called a pastor and subscribed a reasonable amount for his salary. I consider the church at Spring Creek in a hopeless condition.

The church at Springdale requested me to assist Bro. Stafford in a meeting which I did for five or six days.

The heavy rains and high water in the spring hindered me greatly in my work, and at the time when I think I could have done the most good the illness of my wife kept me at home.
