Proceedings.

The Buckville Baptist Association met with the White Plains Baptist church, Montgomery county, Arkansas, in its tenth annual session, September 7, 1899.

Called to order at 10 o'clock a. m. Devotional exercises were led by Eld. J. G. Roy. Prayer by Eld. J. A. McCrary. Eld. D. H. Smith preached the introductory sermon. Text, 1 Cor. 15: 58.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Called to order by the moderator at 3 o'clock. Reading of the 51st Psalm, and prayer by the moderator. The moderator appointed Bro. I. G. Neal and Bro. C. C. Barrows as a committee on crededtials, and letters from the following churches were read and delegates' names enrolled, towit:

The rules were suspended and petitionary letters called for. Pleasant Home presented a petitionary letter which was read and the church received, and the following delegates' names enrolled: T. B. McKelroy, A. C. Roper and Oscar Thompson.

The body went into the election of officers. Bro. Mc-Crary and Bro. Palmer acted as tellers. Eld. J. W. Shepard was elected moderator; J. T. Blakely, clerk, and G. W. Thompson, treasurer. The moderator appointed the deacons of White Plains church, J. A. Muse, I. W. Merriott and S. Hatmaker, as a committee on divine service. They made the following report:

Eld. J. W. Shepard to preach at White Plains Thursday

night; Eld. J. A. McCrary to preach at Buckville Thursday night, and Eld. Palmer at White Plains Friday, 11 a. m.

Visiting brethren invited and Eld. J. A. McCrary from the Washita Association, and Eld. Palmer from the Saline Association, were received.

The body adjourned until 8 o'clock, Friday. Bro. Shepard preached to a large congregation Thursday night. Subject, "Regeneration."

FRIDAY MORNING-SEPTEMBER 8.

Called to order by the moderator. Twelfth chapter of Romans read, and Eld. J. M. Crawford led in prayer. Letter from Glazier Poe church received with W. A. Grisham and W. P. Anthony as delegates. The moderator appointed the following correspondents to other associations:

Eld. W. A. Neighbors and Eld. D. H. Smith, correspondents to the Saline Association; Eld. E. P. Chitwood and Bro. D. W. Wallace, correspondents to the Caddo River Association; Eld. J. W. Shepard and Bro. C C. Barrows, correspondents to the Dardanelle Association.

J. T. Blakely was elected a member of the State Board. A collection was taken and \$2.55 contributed to the State Mission Board. The delegates to the Southern Baptist Convention were elected by ballot. Bro. W. H. Osborn acted as teller. Eld. M. C. Melton was elected delegate to the Southern Baptist Convention, and Eld J. W. Shepard was elected alternate.

Report of Committee on Sunday-schools read and after being discussed by Bro. E. P. Chitwood, Bro. M. C. Melton and Bro. J. M. Crawford, was adopted. Eld. W. C. Palmer preached to a large congregation Friday at 11 o'clock.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Called to order by the moderator Prayer by Bro. J. G. McLane. Letter from Washita church received with J. G. McLane as delegate. Report of the Committee on Ministerial Support failed of adoption. Report re-committed and Bro. J. G. McLane added to the committee. Visiting brethren invited and W. A. Clark, D. D., of Little Rock, and Eld. J. W. McDonald, of Hot Springs, accepted the invitation. Letter from Rock Springs received, with Eld. J. L. Lanier as delegate.

Report of the Committee on Foreign Missions read, and pending its adoption \$2.70 was contributed.

Report of the Committee on Associational Missions read and after being discussed by Bro. Clark, Bro. McDonald and Bro. Shepard, was adopted.

Other committees reported. (See reports.)

Committee on Divine Service reported as follows: Eld.

J. A. McCrary to preach at White Plains Friday night; Eld. J. W. McDonald to preach at Buckville Friday night, and Bro. W. A Clark to preach at White Plains Saturday at 11 o'clock a. m. Eld. J. A. McCrary preached to a large congregation Friday night. Text, John 1: 7.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 9.

Called to order at 8 o'clock a. m. by the moderator. Devotional exercises led by Eld. E. P. Chitwood. On motion the clerk was authorized to enter into contract with Bro. W. A. Clark, to have 300 copies of the minutes printed for \$13, and have the minutes distributed in proportion to the minute fund sent by the churches. Adjourned until 2:30 o'clock. Bro. W. A. Clark preached to an attentive audience at 11 o'clock. Text, Acts of the Apostles, 1: 1.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Called to order by the moderator. Prayer by Bro. William Chitwood. Visiting brethren invited, and Eld. William Chitwood, of the Caddo River Association, was received.

The association voted to hold its next session with the Pleasant Hill church, five miles west of Sulphur Springs, Saturday before the fourth Sunday in September, 1900.

The following amendments to the constitution were adopted: To change the time of meeting from Thursday before the second Sunday in September, to Saturday before the fourth Sunday in September.

The body also voted to have the annual missionary sermon preached Sunday at 11 o'clock at each session.

A collection was taken and enough money was raised to relieve the indebtedness of the Mission Board. The missianaries were paid in full for their services.

Bro, S. Hatmaker, Bro, G. W. Thompson and Bro. T. B. McKelroy were elected members of the Missionary Board for the ensuing year. Bro. M. C. Melton was appointed delegate to the State Convention, and Bro. W. S. Lawrance was appointed alternate.

¹ Committee on Divine Service reported as follows: Eld. Wm. Chitwood to preach at White Plains Saturday night; Eld. D. H Smith at Cedar Glades Saturday night, and Eld. J. A. McCrary at White Plains Sunday at 11 o'clock.

On motion the clerk was allowed \$3 for his services.

On motion by Bro. E. P. Chitwood the body decided to hold its next district meeting at Pleasant Home, the fifth Sunday in October. The moderator and clerk were selected to arrange the program.

Eld. McCrary and Eld. Palmer thanked the body for courtesies extended. "We are Passing Away," was sung, the parting hand extended, and the association closed with prayer by Bro. J. W. Shepard, to meet with Pleasant Hill church Saturday before the fourth Sunday in September, 1900.

Brotherly love prevailed throughout the entire session. Eld. Wm. Chitwood preached Saturday night, followed by Bro. Melton. Eld. J. A. McCrary preached Sunday to a large audience. Text, II. Samuel 12: 7.
