MIMUTES.

FRIDAY-MORNING SESSION,

The several churches composing the Union Association of Baptists met with Shady Grove Church No. 2, Searcy county, Arkansas, Sept. 8, 1893.

Introductory sermon preached by Eld. Louis Long, followed by Eld. J. J. Goodman, Text, 1st Samuel 17:9.

On the moderator's call for letters from churches twelve presented their letters, and incresngers' names were enrolled. See table.

Brethren Jacob King and I. N. Keeling were appointed reading clerk.

The body then went into permanent organization by electing Elder J. J. Goodman moderator and N. N. Sutterfield, clerk.

The moderator called for correspondence, which was accepted by Blue Mountain Association through her messenger, S. T. Cypert; White River Association through her messenger, R. R. Scribner; and Trace Ridge Association through her messenger H. A. McEntire; which brethren were welcomed by the moderator, receiving the hand-of fellowship.

The moderator then proceeded to appoint the various committes:

COMMITTEES APPOINTED.

On devotional exercises; J. W. Payne, W. G. Harness, Jessie L. Baker, with the delegates of Shady

Grove church No. 2.

On arrangements: Elders Jacob King, E. Keeling and E. E. Branscum, with the moderator and clerk of the association.

On finance; Elders T. G. Delk, James Pearce and A. R. Stephenson, Sr.

On distribution; Elders W. M. Lay, Louis Long and T. B. Now-ling.

On Sabbath schools; R. Miller, W. R. Murphy and J. R. Martin, By motion brother D. Hewitt was added to the committee.

By motion Brother Hewitt was enrolled as representative of our State Mission and Sabbath School Boards, also of the Arkansus Baptist and Book House.

By motion, brethren E. Keeling and T. G. Delk were excused from the committee on devotional exercises.

By motion Brother D. Hewitt was given time to address the comnittee on Sabbath Schools and our State Board.

By motion a new committee known as the Associational and State Mission Board was created, on which Elders E. E. Branscum, Jacob King, E. Leeling, Louis Long and J. J. Goodman were appointed.

Adjourned till 8 a. m. Saturday. Prayer by Bro. T. B. Nowling. SECOND DAY-MORNING SESSION.

The association met on time. Prayer by Bro. A. R. Stephenson, Jr.

In the absence of the treasurer J. A. McEntire was elected to the position.

Renewed the call for petitionary

Renewed the call for visiting brethren.

Invited visiting ministers of our faith to seats with ua.

Called for report of committee on arrangement. Report received, amended and adopted. See report. Called for report of committee on destitution. Report received and adopted, and committee discharged. See report.

Called for report of committee on Sabbath schools. Report received and amended so as to read as follows:

We find that most of the churches in the bounds of this association are destitute of Sabbath schools, and we recommend that they constitute Sabbath schools and report at the next meeting of the association. Report adopted and committee discharged. See report.

By motion Lone Church with her messengers was received into this association with the understanding that she administer legal baptism and report at the next session of this body.

Adjourned for preaching at 11 a. m., to meet at 3 p. m. Prayer by R. Mills.

EVENING SESSION.

The association met on time. Prayer by E. Keeling.

By motion the body agreed to furnish Shady Grove Church No. 2 one dollar's worth of minutes.

By motion the subject of Sabbath school was taken up, discussed, and adopted as amended. See report.

Called for report of committee on Associational and State missions. Report received and adopted and committee discharged. See report.

By motion this body put out two missionaries for the year, to begin July '94, and close September 16, to preach to the destitute places in the bounds of this association, who shall have one dollar per day each for their labor. See report.

Adjourned till Monday 8 a, m. MONDAY—MORNING SESSION.

The association met on time. Prayer by Brother H. A. McEntire.

The minutes read, corrected and received.

By motion the association by ballot elected Elders Jacob King and T. B. Nowling as missionaries for this associational year, to be subject to the orders of this body.

Called for report of committee on finance. Report received and committee discharged. See report.

By motion the moderator appointed the following named brotheren to constitute a missionary board, to-wit: N. N. Sutterfield, W. D. Rushing, J. A. McEntire and

Sister V. V. Aderine.

The moderator appointed Elder Jacob King a member of the State Board.

The moderator appointed the following named brethren as a board to correspond with the State Mission Board. Elders E. Keeling, E. E. Branscum, Louis Long, N. N. Sutterfield and T. G. Delk.

By motion agreed to pay our missionaries one dollar in cash per day, or its equivalent in produce.

By motion the finance committee turned over to the treasurer the sum of \$15,60, and took his receipt for the same.

By motion the clerk was ordered to have two hundred copies of the minutes printed, and distributed to the several churches in proportion to contribution.

By motion N. N. Sutterfield was appointed to superintend the printing and the distributing of the minutes. Adjourned till 2 p. m.

EVENING SESSION.

The association met on time. Prayer by Bro. H. A. McEntire.

Called for report of corresponding messengers. The brethren came forward and rendered their excuse with report, which was received, and the brethren excused. CORRESPONDING MESSENGERS TO SIS-

By motion the treasurer turned over to the clerk \$15.60 and took his receipt for the same.

Be it resolved, that this body meet with Bethany church, Stone county, Ark., on Friday before the third Sunday in September, 1894, at 11 a. m., Elder T. G. Delk to preach the introductory sermon, Elder E. Keeling alternate, who was also appointed to preach the Missionary sermon on Sunday at 11 a. m., T. G. Delk alternate.

Brethren T. G. Delk and I. N. Keeling were appointed Auditing committee to audit the Secretary's and Treasurer's books at our next session.

By motion each delegate will write his own letter and sign the names of moderator and clerk.

Adjourned to meet at the time and place above mentioned.
