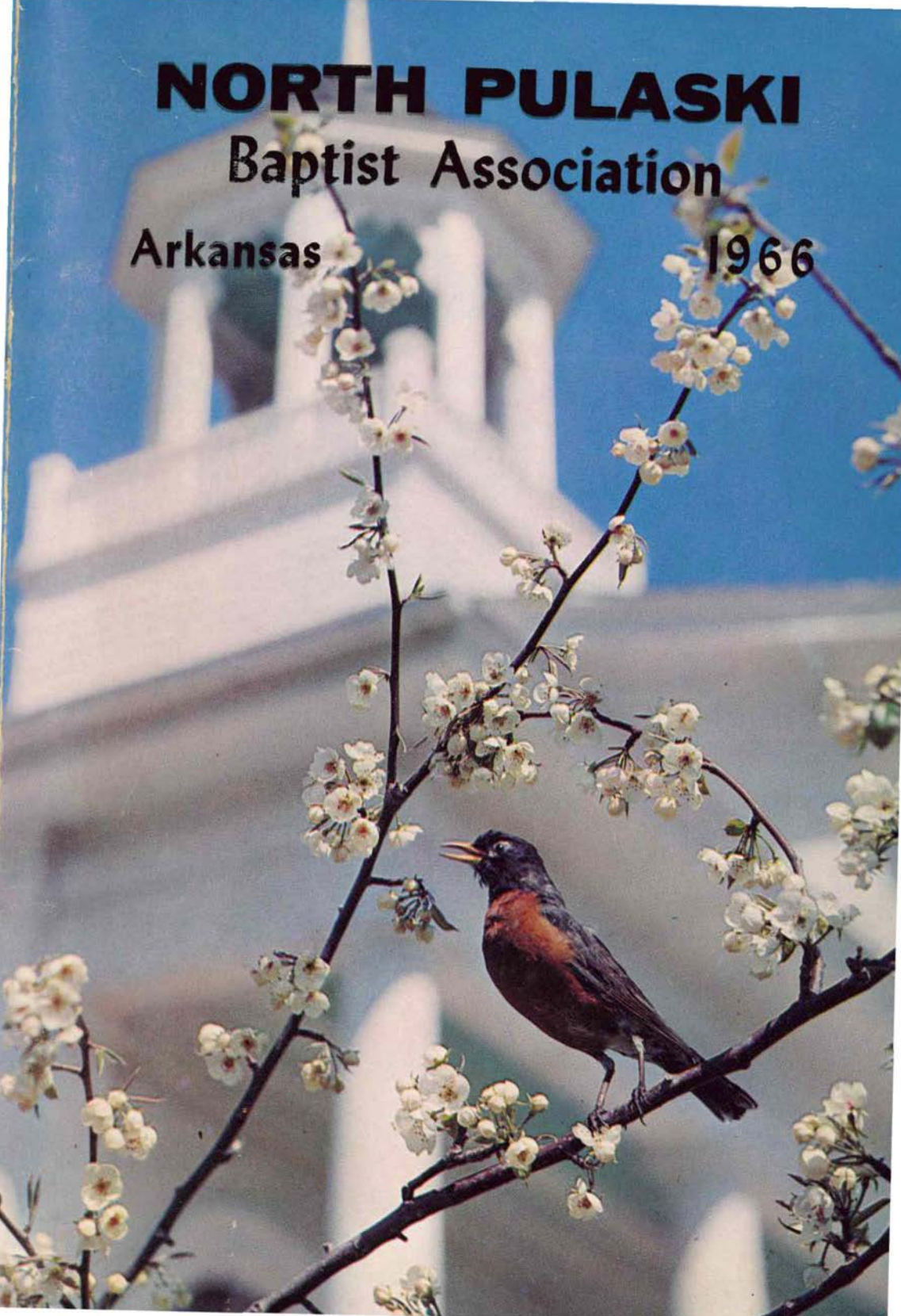

Constitution and By-Laws

(Adopted October 17, 1961)

(Section 8 (a) Amended October 15, 1963)

1. NAME

The name of this association shall be the North Pulaski Baptist Association, co-operating with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this association shall be to promote Christian fellowship and co-operation among the churches affiliated with the association to uphold the doctrines and principles of our Baptist faith and to encourage the churches to be loyal to and practice these doctrines and principles; to promote the preaching and teaching of God's Word, the enlisting and training of all Christians for service; to promote missions, benevolence, stewardship, Christian education, and the winning of all men to Christ to the ends of the earth. To co-operate with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention in a world mission program.

3. MEMBERSHIP

This body shall be composed of messengers elected from the churches and missions affiliated with the body. When such messengers are approved by the association they shall be seated and entitled to participate in the affairs of the body. Each church shall be entitled to three messengers for the first fifty members, and one additional messenger for each fifty members above the first fifty, provided that no church shall be entitled to more than ten messengers.

4. ARTICLES OF FAITH

The Articles of Faith set forth in New Hampshire Confession as the doctrinal beliefs of the churches shall be the doctrines adopted by this body.

5. OFFICERS

The officers of the association shall be moderator, vice-moderator, clerk, treasurer, and historian. These officers shall be nominated and elected by the association, preferably before the last session of the annual meeting. They shall serve until the close of the following annual session of the association or until their successors shall be elected and installed. Election shall be by secret ballot unless another plan is adopted by unanimous consent. The moderator and vice-moderator shall be limited to not more than 2 successive years of service. The duties of these officers shall be those usually incumbent upon such officers.

If the association employs a superintendent of missions and/or an educational director, these workers shall be considered as officers of the association. Such additional officers shall be elected as the association shall deem necessary to its most effective work.

6. AUTHORITY

The association is an autonomous body and therefore reserves the right to determine its own policies and direct its own business; it may refuse to seat messengers who are not in fellowship or doctrinal agreement with the body, or whose churches are not. However, this body shall never exercise any authority over, or give direction to, any church or churches which are affiliated with it or which may have been affiliated with it; but the association will stand ready to lend any assistance or counsel to any church making request for such help.

7. ORGANIZATIONS

This body shall encourage and promote such associational organizations as Sunday School, Training Union, Woman's Missionary Union, Brotherhood, music, library, and other organizations which are in keeping with the purpose of the association, with their full staffs of officers and programs necessary for the promotion of the work. The chief officer of each organization shall be elected, or approved, by the association and shall function as an officer of the association.

8. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The association shall have an executive committee consisting of the pastor of each church (where he is a member of the church) and one lay member from each church. Nominations for membership in the executive committee may be made by the church, but members must be elected by the association. The officers of the association, namely moderator, vice-moderator, clerk, treasurer, and historian, shall be ex officio members of the executive committee and should serve as respective officers of the committee, unless the association directs otherwise. All other officers and chairmen of standing committees are to become ex officio members of the executive committee. Ex officio members will not have the right to vote unless they are also members of the executive committee elected as representatives of their respective churches.

The executive committee shall attend to all matters of the association between sessions; promote all progress authorized by the association; and carry out all directives given by the association. It shall make an annual report to the association

of all work carried on and all finances handled. The executive committee shall not have the power to create or initiate any new work or project not contained in the reports and recommendations of the previous meeting of the association.

The executive committee shall hold regular monthly or quarterly meetings.

The executive committee shall not have power to entitle a church to affiliation with the association or have representation on the executive committee, but may invite a church to sit with it in counsel without vote, pending the seating of the messengers of that church by the association.

8 (a.) The legal title to all property owned by this Association, both real and personal, shall be held in the name of the designated trustees, which shall be vested in them by virtue of their office and which shall be transmitted to their successors. The Trustees shall be three in number and shall be named by the Association to serve for a term of one year or until their successors shall have been named and qualified. In the event a vacancy should occur by reason of the failure of the Association to make such selection, by death, by disability, by removal from the community or otherwise, the Executive Committee may fill the vacancy. By direction of the Association, or of the Executive Committee, the trustees shall be clothed with authority to act on behalf of the Association in the acquisition and disposition of Associational property, and specifically shall have authority to execute notes, bonds, debentures, deeds of conveyance, mortgages, pledges and other security instruments and any and all related documents incidental thereto; and to represent the Association in all legal matters. All persons dealing with said trustees may rely upon any written resolution duly adopted by the Association or the Executive Committee, directing and authorizing the trustee to act in its behalf, and a certified copy of any such resolution duly executed by the Associational moderator and the clerk shall be conclusive evidence thereof.

9. MEETINGS

The association shall hold annual meetings of the body at such time and place as it may determine. The executive committee may have power to change the stated time and/or place of the annual meeting in case of emergency or necessity. The association may hold such quarterly meetings as are deemed wise for the promotion of its work. It shall promote such regular meetings of its worker's council, its promotional organizations, and its standing committees as shall prove most effective for carrying out the total purpose of the association.

10. COMMITTEES

The association shall have the following standing committees named by the moderator and his officers before the close of the annual session to serve until the close of the next annual session, namely, program committee, nominating committee, credentials committee, budget committee, and such additional standing committees as seen needed. All organizations of the association shall name their own committees.

11. AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any regular annual session of the association by a two-thirds majority of the messengers present, provided notice of such change has been given at the previous annual meeting and provided it is read in the first session of the annual meeting and voted on before the last session.

By-Laws

1. In parliamentary procedure the body shall be governed by ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER or Kerfoot's PARLIAMENTARY LAW.

2. The fiscal year for the association shall be from the first day of Jan. to the last day of Dec. inclusive. Annual reports to the association shall cover this period.

3. The annual meeting of the association shall be in the month of Oct. The exact days and place shall be recommended by the nominating committee, or other committee authorized by the association, and approved by the body. The executive committee may be authorized to make such adjustment in the time and place of the annual meeting as may become necessary because of circumstances which develop after the close of the annual meeting of the whole body.

4. All officers of the association must be members of churches within the association, in good standing, and recognized for their knowledge of and loyalty to Southern Baptist doctrines and programs.

5. Duties of the officers shall be as follows:

The MODERATOR shall call to order and preside over the meetings of the association and the executive committee, and direct the affairs of the association in an orderly manner and Christian spirit. (He may for good reason ask other officers or members of the body to preside at times.)

The VICE-MODERATOR may, if the moderator so directs, preside over the sessions of the associational council. He shall preside over other meetings in the absence of the moderator and shall assist the moderator in such ways as he may direct.

The CLERK shall keep a full and accurate record of all business of the association and the executive committee, and of all recommendations of the associational council. At each meeting he shall be prepared to read all minutes of the previous meeting. All records for at least one year shall be on hand at each meeting. They shall be kept in a fireproof safe between meetings.

The TREASURER shall receive all funds of and for the association, not otherwise designated, shall disburse all funds in accordance with the adopted associational budget or the specific instructions of the association and upon receipt of a bill or voucher properly authorized. He shall keep accurate records of all monies received, with sources and designations of same. He shall make reports to the regular meetings of the executive committee and annual meeting of the association and have the same approved. The executive committee shall have the treasurer's reports audited at the close of the fiscal year, and reports the same to the annual association, for approval.

The HISTORIAN shall write in orderly form the events of the association, beginning with its organization. The association should request the churches and individuals who may possess historical information about the association to make it accessible to the historian. He shall make record of current events of each fiscal year and read his annual chapter to the annual meeting of the association for adoption. These records shall be kept in a fireproof safe or vault.

6. The following associational organizations shall be maintained and promoted by the association for the benefit of the work in the churches; associational Sunday School organization, associational Training Union, associational Woman's Missionary Union, associational Brotherhood, associational music organization, associational Church Library Council, and such other as may be deemed wise for the attainment of the objectives of the association. All officers of these organizations shall be members of churches affiliated with the association and in good standing.

Unless the association shall direct otherwise, the chief officers of the organizations shall be chosen by their respective organizations, submitted to the nominating committee of the association, and elected or approved by the association. Their duties shall be understood to be in line with the functions set forth in the promotional literature for their respective organizations, as produced or approved by the state or Convention-wide agencies functioning in a like area.

7. The following committees, other than the standing and special committees, shall be maintained by the association as needed for promotion of its work among the churches: committee on evangelism, missions committee, and such other

committees as may be needed. The chairmen of these committees shall be elected or appointed by the association, and other committee members shall be chosen in number and manner designated by the association and in accord with the needs of the work. The qualifications required for members of such committees shall be the same as for all other officers, and their duties shall be as prescribed by the association.

8. All associational organizations and regular committees shall make reports to the regular meetings of the executive committee and/or to the association. The executive committee shall exercise authority over these organizations and committees only to the extent of determining whether they are working within the bounds of the organizational programs as approved by the association.

9. A place shall be made on the order of business of the association for miscellaneous business at each session of the association.

10. A sermon on doctrines and one on missions shall be provided at each annual meeting. Addresses on assigned topics relating to phases of our Baptist work shall be provided for by the program committee.

11. Messengers to the association shall be accorded equal rights and privileges of the floor, provided each messenger who desires to speak shall rise, address the moderator, and be recognized before he begins to speak. No messenger shall be entitled to speak on any one subject more than twice until other messengers desiring to speak have been heard. Upon request of a messenger, or by consent of the body, the moderator may invite a visitor to speak during a discussion.

12. The bylaws may be amended at any regular session of the association by a majority vote of messengers present, provided such amendment has been read to the body not later than the second session, and is voted on before the last session.

COMMITTEE BYLAWS

MISSIONS COMMITTEE

It is recommended that the following By-Laws for the Missions Committee be adopted:

1. That all requests for associational mission aid of the North Pulaski Baptist Association be made in writing using a standard form, and be approved by the Missions Committee before presentation to the Executive Committee or Association for action.

2. That all recommendations of the Missions Committee concerning pastoral aid and disposition of property be published one month prior to presentation to the Executive Board on the associational page of the Arkansas Baptist State paper.

3. Due to the limited funds at present in the associational budget for aid, it is recommended that aid be limited to newly constituted missions or churches less than one year old.

4. That associational mission aid be limited to any one mission or church for a period of three years with such aid being decreased 25% each year.

5. Regarding Pioneer Mission work, it is recommended that any approval of aid to Pioneer Missions also have the approval of the Home Mission Board.

Recommendation for associational mission aid:

1. It is recommended that Runyan Baptist Chapel, mission of First Baptist Church, Gravel Ridge, be given pastoral aid in the amount of \$50.00 per month beginning with the call of a pastor. Assistance to be continued for a maximum of three years with a 25% decrease in the amount each year.

SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON STUDY FOR ASSOCIATIONAL MISSIONARY

It is a trying task to define Associational life. Baptist Associations have from their modern beginnings been determined by the needs of the time. In early America, Baptist Associations were formed and extended their influence into many areas, such as, Foreign missions, work among the Negroes and Indians, schismatic movements, beginnings in Christian education and religious publications, the temperance movement, etc. These and other concerns literally compelled church members to express interest and take part. It seems that groups of churches in association formed the organizational pattern for expression of these concerns. These associations became effective units of work. In fact, the basic ideas and structure of associational work became the foundation pattern for the Southern Baptist Convention when it was organized in 1845.

Ironically enough it is the Southern Baptist Convention which has wrought the changes most significantly in Associational life. Although this change has been gradual, it has been definite and irrevocable. "The tight organization of the Southern Baptist Convention - and its cooperating state bodies - has enabled denominational leaders to assume an ever increasing control of goings-on in an association. Thus,

our associations have taken on the image of organizations which exist primarily to get denominational business accomplished on a local level. Admitting the great importance of the business, the association's role is not an exciting one." (Conference on Associational Missions, February, 1963.)

It appears that the changes made will not allow us to return to our old patterns. Matters once dealt with solely by associations can now be more effectively handled by a denominational agency or by influential local churches. This is not to say that the need for associational missions has come to an end. It is rather to point out the need for defining our work and seeking to carry out these stated purposes. Our associational meetings have degenerated into promotional periods for material that is being fed to the church through many other sources. We need a reason for being, a purpose for our fellowship.

The purpose of our association is almost a word for word copy of that which is contained in the study course book on Associational Missions by S.F. Dowis. It is found on page 23 of our Associational year book for 1965. There seems to be a more relative definition to our specific situation found in the Conference of Associational Missions of February, 1965. It is as follows:

"A Baptist Association is a self determining spiritual body of messengers from churches which are in voluntary basic agreement as to faith and practice, providing a program of assistance that will aid co-operating churches desiring to reach their full potential of spiritual growth and service in keeping with the commission of Christ."

In the desire to seek some stated purpose, our committee researched in the minutes of other associations. We found some consisted of one sentence - others took several paragraphs. All of them seemed to fall into three major categories.

1. Strengthening the churches
 - A. Educational assistance
 - B. Financial assistance
 - C. Personal assistance
2. Fellowship among the brethren
 - A. Sister Baptist churches
 - B. Support weaker, smaller churches
 - C. Arbitrator in the affairs of sister congregations
3. Cooperative and simultaneous efforts in world missions.
 - A. New work
 - B. Maintaining existing work
 - C. Specialized mission points - jails, hospitals, etc.

This leads us to make some observations about an association.

1. The Association exists for the churches.
2. Thus, there are certain functions which must be performed by the Association.
3. This means an organization to accomplish these functions.
4. Three primary considerations are involved:
 - A. Organization must be flexible - that is our work and objectives will determine how much organization we have.
 - B. Organization must be simple - no new unit should be created if it can be handled by an existing unit.
 - C. Organization must be economical. It must not become a burden to the purpose which it is seeking to fulfill.

It is in this area that we encountered the most difficult task in our research. For this reason, there seems to be no formula which can be used to project associational expenditures relative to an associational budget. Each association is separate and apart. Each has its own needs and peculiarities. However, according to our figuring, it would take approximately \$13,000 a year to

start off an associational missionary along with his office and maintenance expense. The latter item including such things as office rent, equipment, utilities, and insurance.

How do you fulfill these purposes? As we see it there are three possible solutions.

- A. Individual churches and pastors
- B. Associational committees
- C. An Associational missionary.

A detailed resume of our churches and association was made and sent to the mission departments of each state touching Arkansas. In the replies which we received, there was some unity and diversity of opinion. All agreed that we needed a person to function in an associational capacity, even though each complimented us on our progress without such a person. The diversity appeared as to what sort of a person this should be. The following three choices were representative:

- 1. Associational missionary
- 2. City missionary
- 3. District director - (As set up in Louisiana)

Our committee took note of all this plus a comparison with Pulaski Association and a questionnaire mailed to the local pastors. Regarding the former - since the division of Pulaski County Association into the North Pulaski Association and Pulaski Association, there has been an equal record maintained in establishing new work:

Three mission sites have been secured

Two are being developed by individual churches

One is to be developed.

In regard to the questionnaire, it was equally divided as to those who saw a need for an Associational missionary and those who did not. Fourteen questionnaires were returned.

We feel that the proximity to Baptist headquarters places us in a favorable position for consultation in all phases of associational work. This also includes pulpit supplies when needed.

The cost of a missionary would consume approximately 40 per cent of our associational budget to begin with and would increase over the years. This would place a definite block in the acquiring of new mission sites in the association. This, we feel, is extremely important for us at the present time.

There is a changing concept of associational life and work being evidenced in our denomination. Such change, showing up in conferences such as Ridgecrest and Glorieta, will bring changes in associational programs and personnel.

In light of these findings we recommend the following:

- 1. That the Association postpone any present consideration of an association missionary, yet, continuing in the study of such needs.
- 2. That the Association continue with its committee approach by:
 - a. An intensified participation from the churches,
 - b. An expanded financial outlay for all organizations, and
 - c. Placing a greater emphasis on the promotion of our associational program.
- 3. That the secretarial item in the new budget be expanded to support the second part of the above recommendation.

STEWARDSHIP REPORT

This year we were challenged by our Arkansas Baptist State Convention to increase our contributions to the Cooperative Program by ten per cent. We have promoted this program by periodic progress reports to the Associational Executive Committee. Our Executive Secretary, Dr. S. A. Whitlow, gave a presentation of the needs of our agencies and institutions. He indicated that an emergency existed which could only be met by increased participation by our churches through the Cooperative Program. The following facts show the response of our churches to this challenge:

Gifts of Churches to Cooperative Program for First Eight Months of this Calendar Year

25 Churches and Missions have increased their gifts to missions through the Cooperative Program this year.

19 Churches and Missions have shown an increase of over 10% in Cooperative Program gifts.

The average resident Baptist in North Pulaski gave 21 CENTS PER WEEK to the Cooperative Program. Certainly this should not be the measure of our concern for the world mission causes supported through the Cooperative Program.

In the 1966-67 Associational Year, I would like for us to resolve to achieve the following goals:

- (1) An organized budget analysis and stewardship promotion campaign with a worthy amount included for the Cooperative Program in every Baptist Church in North Pulaski Baptist Association.
- (2) A renewed awareness of our stewardship of life and of the Gospel for the glory of God.

To achieve these goals the Association is planning to offer these opportunities for the churches:

- (1) An Association-wide Stewardship Conference to present our Arkansas Baptist Mission and Education Program and to promote the materials provided by the Stewardship Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention.
- (2) Promotion of Group Stewardship Clinics on the use and adaptation of the FORWARD PROGRAM, GROWTH IN CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP, and other Christian Stewardship ideas and plans.
- (3) We will arrange for consultation and study of individual church budget needs by proven methods. This work will be done at the request of churches desiring assistance. We will enlist workers who are qualified by training, experience and Christian spirit to carry on this work.
- (4) Informal discussion of budget needs with pastors desiring assistance.

If we are to earnestly seek to carry out Christ's Great Commission, we will give ourselves thoughtfully to the need for increased support for Missions wherever a need exists for a missionary to speak Christ's words of salvation and healing.

Dr. Logue started a Friday evening dinner for the med students. WMS's of the local churches in Little Rock provided the meal for the students. The purpose of the meal was for fellowship and to provide a means of reaching new students.

This program has been expanded for the coming year to include a program on Friday evening. Four major programs have been planned.

On May 15, 1966, Doyle Windy Burke assumed the duties of city-wide BSU Director. He will work with both the med school and LRU. Burke is a graduate of Arkansas State College and did his seminary work at Golden Gate Seminary in Mill Valley, California.
