Reverend Leroy Carson Tedford

L. C. Tedford was born near Lonoke, Arkansas, on August 7, 1897. He was converted and baptized at the age of 16 years. He entered Ouachita College and was graduated in 1924, and then received the ThM Degree from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1927. Shortly thereafter, in 1928, he was married to Miss Leila E. Thomas, and they became the parents of two sons.

Most of his ministry was with Arkansas churches including the First Baptist Churches of Clarendon, Clarksville, Marion, Corning, Bentonville, and the Grace Baptist Church, North Little Rock. From 1949-51 he served as Dean of Men and Instructor in Bible, Ouachita College.

His denominational service included the offices of Moderator and Clerk of several Arkansas Associations, the Arkansas member of the Historical Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention, and Vice President of the Arkansas Baptist State Convention 1957-58. He served as clerk of the Pulaski County Baptist Association from 1951 until his death on July 25, 1959.

## CONSTITUTION

(As Amended at 1933, 1943, 1948, 1950, 1951, 1953, 1954,  
1956 and 1957 Sessions)

### ARTICLE I—NAME

The name of this body shall be the Pulaski County Baptist Association, Incorporated.

### ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this Association shall be to awaken and stimulate among the churches of the Association, the greatest possible activity in Evangelism, Christian Education, Missions and Benevolences, throughout the bounds of the Association; to cultivate closer co-operation among the churches and to promote concert of action in advancing all the interest of the Kingdom of God.

### ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of Messengers from regular co-operating churches, which are in sympathy with the principles and purposes of this Constitution and desire to co-operate with this Association, who shall be entitled to seats upon presentation of letters from their churches or other satisfactory evidence of their appointment.

Section 2. Each church shall be entitled to a minimum of three messengers. One additional messenger shall be allowed for every 50 resident church members above 100. No church, however, may have more than 10 messengers.

Section 3. Messengers from churches desiring to affiliate with this Association shall present to the Association in Annual Meeting, Petitionary Letters or evidence, setting forth the Articles of Faith on which the church was organized, together with satisfactory evidence of the regularity of their organization. They shall be received into the Association by receiving two-thirds of the votes cast.

### ARTICLE IV—AUTHORITY

This Association shall never exercise any authority, legislative or ecclesiastical, over any church. Nor shall it in any way interfere with the rights and absolute independence of any church.

### ARTICLE V—OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be elected the first session of the second day and who shall take office the closing



session of the last day of the annual Associational meeting. Said officers to be elected by a majority vote cast at such meeting. The Moderator shall not be eligible to serve more than two successive terms. The Clerk and the Treasurer may be the same person.

Section 2. The Moderator shall preside at all sessions of the Association; or request the Vice-Moderator to preside. The Vice-Moderator will also preside in the absence of the Moderator. The Moderator shall exercise the same privilege of discussion as any other member of the body.

Section 3. The Clerk shall keep a correct record of the Proceedings of the Association in annual meeting, the Executive Board in regular or called meetings, and the Missions Committee in regular or called meetings. He shall be responsible for the printing and distribution of the proceedings of the annual meeting; the taking and preserving of the minutes of all Executive Board and Missions Committee meetings as the Association may direct.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of every kind entrusted to him and shall disburse the same upon the order of the Executive Board and shall make an itemized statement of receipts and disbursements monthly to the Executive Board and an annual statement to the Association in annual session. The Treasurer shall be bonded by the Association, at the Association's expense. An annual audit shall be made of his books by a reputable accountant. This fee shall be paid by the Association.

#### ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of one lay member, elected by each co-operating church, together with the pastor of each co-operating church and the officers of the Association. FIFTEEN members of said Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall meet one time each month in regular meeting, time and place to be determined by the Board. In case of special meetings written notice must be given to each Board member. The Moderator and Clerk of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Board.

Section 3. The Executive Board shall receive reports, in the monthly meetings, from the following:

Treasurer's Report.

Associational Missionary.

Superintendent of Associational Sunday School.

Director of Associational Training Union.

Chairman of Evangelism.

President of the Associational Brotherhood.  
Superintendent of the Associational W.M.U.  
Director of Associational Music Program.  
Director of Student Union Work in the Association.  
Library Committee.  
Recommendations of the Missions Committee.

Section 4. The Executive Board shall be constituted and empowered by the Association as its legal agent to administer all business committed to it by the Association and to employ such paid agents as it may deem necessary in carrying on the Missionary, Education, Benevolent and Financial work of the Association.

Section 5. The Executive Board shall render to the Association in Annual meeting a summary statement of all the business for the year. Same to be printed in the minutes.

## ARTICLE VII—STANDING COMMITTEES

### I. Missions Committee

Section 1. The Association in Annual meeting, through the Nominating Committee, shall elect a standing committee known as the Missions Committee. This committee shall be composed of twelve members. Members of the Missions Committee shall serve for a term of three years. Each year four members shall complete their terms and shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of at least one year.

Section 2. The Officers of the Association and the elected Associational Organization leaders, shall be ex-officio members of the Committee with all rights of discussion and voting.

Section 3. The Missions Committee shall have the responsibility of selecting and nominating the Associational Missionary or any other paid agents of the Association, and to recommend their employment to the Executive Board in regular meetings, or properly called special meetings.

Section 4. The duties of the Missions Committee shall be as follows:

- (1.) To serve as a nominating committee for any paid officer or worker of the Association. These nominations are to be brought to the Executive Board.
- (2.) To plan a program of mission work for the Association. This is to be an active and aggressive program of planning. This committee should present a challenging and progressive program of work.



- (3.) To see that the plans for Associational work are promoted effectively.
- (4.) To plan a program of benevolences. This should be a well thought out program including all such needs. Plans for promoting the activities should be initiated by this committee.
- (5.) To plan a comprehensive program with regard to Christian Education. This committee should ascertain the needed projects, set the emphases, and actively promote the work.
- (6.) To correlate the activities and projects of the Association with the adopted cooperative program. This committee should actively work toward the end of keeping all of our Baptist program under direct supervision in co-operation with the cooperative program plan. These projects should be clearly thought through and planned in connection with the budget committee each year.
- (7.) To work toward the establishment of new units of mission work in the Association. To facilitate this phase of the work the Chairman of the Missions Committee shall appoint a special committee of three from the membership of the Missions Committee. This shall be known as the Missions and Survey Committee. The duties of the committee shall be:
  - (a) To survey the entire Association to determine the areas where new churches or missions should be established, and to locate property in such areas suitable for building sites.
  - (b) To recommend to the Missions Committee expenditures from the Missions Expansion Fund toward securing such property. The Mission Committee will then study their findings and recommendations and bring to the Executive Board for final action those projects they endorse.
  - (c) To solicit the assistance of sponsoring churches in establishing work in areas which have been approved by the Executive Board.
  - (d) To assist and advise all groups desiring to establish Baptist Churches and Missions in the territorial limits of Pulaski County to the end that all such works may secure the most desirable and strategic locations to serve the people of this association.
  - (e) To survey the areas to be served by each proposed new work and recommend to the Missions Committee the nature and extent of any assistance that the Association should provide in each case. The Missions Committee would in turn study their recommendation and



submit to the Executive Board a final recommendation in each instance.

- (f) To recommend to the Missions Committee all salary supplements to pastor's of missions and needy churches. Commitments for supplements shall be made for periods not to exceed one year. They may be renewed by recommendation of the Committee in deserving cases.
- (8.) This Committee shall never exercise any authority over the churches. Its sole function shall be that of advising the local congregation, desiring to establish a new work, in the matter of securing the most strategic location and assist them in securing the sponsorship of a mother church, if desirable. Any group desiring associational assistance in securing property and for pastor's salary supplements would be expected to counsel with this committee in locating their work. If a church forms spontaneously or a local church establishes a new mission without counselling with the Missions and Survey Committee, no attempt will be made to tell them they cannot do so. The Association must then decide whether or not to welcome the new church into the fellowship.
- (9.) The Missions Committee should correlate the activity of the Associational organizations. Plans should be made together so as to avoid conflicts.
- (10.) The Chairman of the Missions Committee will appoint committees within the committee when such are needed to carry out the duties of the Missions Committee with regard to the above items.

## II. Committee on Order of Business

1. The Committee on Order of Business shall consist of the Moderator and Clerk of the Association, Host Pastor, Associational Missionary and the elected leaders of the Associational Organizations.
2. This committee shall be charged with making the Annual meetings as spiritual, inspirational and informational, as is possible to do so. Preaching shall have a prominent place in the meetings.
3. This committee shall publish a tentative order of business for distribution at the first session of the Annual meeting.

## III. Nominating Committee

1. This committee shall be composed of five members elected by the messengers during the first day's session of the annual Associational meeting. This committee shall be elected as follows:

- a. The chairman of the Executive Board of the Association shall appoint a committee of five executive board members to serve as a special nominating committee to nominate members of the Standing Nominating Committee.
  - b. This duly appointed special nominating committee will present nominations for the five members of the standing nominating committee during the first day's session of the annual Associational meeting.
  - c. The right of nominations from the floor shall not be abridged.
2. The duties of the Standing Nominating Committee shall be as follows:
    - a. They shall name the standing committees of the Association, except those otherwise provided for in this Constitution, and they shall nominate the membership of such committees which shall report at the Annual meeting.
    - b. They shall nominate the leaders of the Associational Organizations.
    - c. They shall nominate the members of the Missions Committee as provided in Article VII, Section 1, paragraph 1.
    - d. This committee shall make any necessary nominations to fill vacancies which occur during the year in these committees or offices. These nominations shall be submitted to the Executive Board in regular or called meetings.

#### ARTICLE VIII—MEETINGS

Section 1. The Association shall meet annually on a date designated at each Annual meeting. If no date is set, the Executive Board will designate one.

#### ARTICLE IX—ASSOCIATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

Section 1. The Associational Organizations shall be: Sunday School, Training Union, Woman's Missionary Union, Baptist Brotherhood, Music, Library, Student Work and Evangelism.

Section 2. Leaders of these organizations shall be elected as provided in Article VII, Section 3 (paragraph (2) b.).

Section 3. The Associational Organizations shall correlate their activities through the Missions Committee. A Calendar of Activities shall be planned and followed. Said organizations, through their

leaders, will make monthly reports to the Executive Board of work done and work proposed.

#### ARTICLE X—HOW AMENDED

This Constitution may be amended at any Annual meeting of the Association by a TWO-THIRDS VOTE of the Messengers present and voting, provided that the substance of Article IV shall not be abrogated.

#### RULES OF ORDER

Roberts Rules of Order shall be the standard in deciding questions of parliamentary practice.

### MISSIONARY REPORT

The report of your Associational Missionary this year will be in two parts; namely, Retrospect and Prospect, with major emphasis being placed upon the latter:

#### RETROSPECT:

In the two months that I have been your Associational Missionary it has been my privilege to preach 16 sermons, advise with 5 pulpit committees, make 5 preliminary church field surveys, attend one church organizational meeting, speak at 2 church building dedications, teach in 2 church officers' clinics, speak to both the Little Rock University and the Medical Center BSU groups, attend one Southern Baptist Convention meeting of missionaries in Nashville, Tennessee, visit 42 church fields, and I have driven by automobile approximately 4,000 miles in the performance of the above.

#### PROSPECTS:

The association offers countless opportunities for consolidation, growth and coordination.

First: Many of our churches need to consolidate their positions in the Baptist witness. Some need additional facilities, some equipment, and several need both to accomplish this. We dare not let anything go undone which would help to make these churches able to reach their potentials. A sharing of our resources can strengthen our work throughout the county.

Second: Our urban areas are being rapidly developed to meet the ever increasing population of our area. It behooves us to be in step with this growth. We can do so, however, only if each church shoulders a proportionate share of the leadership and financial load. We can assure ourselves of healthy work in each area if we will select our new locations after having first carefully surveyed the present and proposed population density in the immediate and adjoining communities. Due consideration must be accorded existing work to prevent over-saturation. Once an area is selected, a sponsoring church or churches, should be enlisted to organize and direct the work. This church, or churches, can adequately do so if sufficient trained leadership is provided. Our work on foreign fields is pro-



vided with the finest of our trained young people. We are prospering in our missionary zeal because of this. The same should be true in our own association. Let's give this new work our best! Of course, any new work is more apt to get off to a good start if the facilities are properly planned and begun. We have the financial resources in our association to do this, but, unfortunately there has heretofore been a disproportionate sharing of this responsibility. We long ago adopted the 2% plan, but are still only about half-way to this minimum. Some are above, many are there, and many more are way below. I would ask, with all the urgency of my being, that we see this work together and that we share it together.

Another area of growth that we must not overlook is that of growing stronger churches where we are. Unified programs and budgets in the local churches plus a progressive associational program are major factors which we can consider as vital to this. However, the first, and always the major factor, is the work of the Holy Spirit. Let's covenant together that we will earnestly support each other in prayer as well as in the sharing of our training, finances, and leadership.

Third: Coordination of our work can be a prime mover in our forward march for the cause of Christ. It is my fervent prayer that we will cling together in spirit, in purpose, and in activities. I covet your prayers that I may be able to wisely coordinate our work in the year ahead in the manner most pleasing to Him who has redeemed us.

### EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

November 10, 1958, the Missions Committee elected Rev. Jimmy Watson as Chairman and Rev. J. C. Myers, Vice Chairman.

A Budget Control Committee was authorized as follows: Dr. Erwin McDonald, Chairman, Rev. Morris Young, and Mr. Horace Blount.

December 15, 1958, the Missions Committee named a new Missions and Survey Committee as follows: Rev. R. L. South, Chairman, Mr. Jay Heflin, and Rev. J. C. Myers.

It was recommended that plans for the new University Baptist Church be approved and that the missionary assist the church until the work is well established.

January 19, 1959, an agreement between the Forest Highlands Baptist Church and the Association was approved for recommendation to the Executive Board.

A recommendation was approved for pastoral aid to Woodson Baptist Church in the amount of \$25.00 per month.

February 9, 1959, Chairman Jimmy Watson announced that he was accepting a pastorate in Hot Springs and offered his resignation as chairman. Vice Chairman J. C. Myers was elected to fill this vacancy, and Paul Fox was elected as Vice Chairman.

March 16, 1959, the need for buying a site for a church on East Kiehl in North Little Rock was presented to the Missions and Survey Committee.

A committee was appointed to study the problems in regard to the Broadmoor Baptist Church and to make recommendations as to the best solution of them.

Missionary O. C. Robinson presented his resignation as missionary and treasurer, stating that he had accepted the pastorate of the Shiloh Terrace Baptist Church, Dallas, Texas.

The plans of the Remount Church for building on the site on Camp Robinson Road were approved.

April 20, 1959, the committee to secure a new missionary was named as follows: Rev. R. L. South, Chairman, Rev. Paul Fox, Mr. Jay Heflin, Rev. R. H. Dorris, and Rev. J. C. Myers.

The Remount Church reported that the site on Camp Robinson Road was unacceptable and would cost more than the church could afford to make it useable to them.



The organization of a new church, Barnett Memorial Baptist Church, was reported by Rev. R. H. Dorris.

May 11, 1959, authorized the Missions and Survey Committee to employ an engineer to survey the site on Camp Robinson Road to determine the approximate cost of making this property acceptable as a church site.

June 22, 1959, the clerk was instructed to write a letter to the City Manager urging that the Little Rock Jail be visited on Sundays by Christian workers without hindrance.

July 20, 1959, Dr. Dale Cowling presented a proposition regarding the construction of a building for the BSU on the lot on Elm Street. It was recommended that we provide \$15,000 for construction of this building.

Rev. Paul Fox reported that the committee to nominate a missionary wanted to recommend Rev. Lee I. Dance of Amarillo, Texas.

August 18, 1959, it was recommended that the Association make a contribution of \$100.00 toward the Bible Building Fund at Ouachita in memory of Brother L. C. Tedford, and that suitable resolutions be drawn up concerning him.

The motion was passed that Betty O'Pry be elected clerk of the Association.

The Associational Officers were authorized to act as trustees in legal agreement for the Association.

The motion was passed that Rev. Dawson King continue as treasurer until October.

September 21, 1959, a motion passed that the Association help provide Christian education for deaf Negro children.

It was recommended that at the end of the year all the unused money in Undesignated Reserve and all other accumulated funds be put in the Expansion Fund and that the Undesignated Reserve item be discontinued.

The date of the Annual Meeting was changed from October 12-13 to October 19-20 due to a conflict with the Regional Sunday School Conference on the 12 and 13.

## WOMAN'S MISSIONARY REPORT

During the first year of the five-year-period of the Baptist Jubilee Advance when the emphasis is on Christian Witnessing, Woman's Missionary Union has used the appropriate watchword from Psalm 96:2: "Sing unto the Lord, bless His name, Shew forth His salvation from day to day."

In cooperation with denominational plans, promotion of the Jubilee Advance goals has claimed precedence in organizational activities. The emphasis for the year has been Christian Witnessing, undergirded by the permanent emphasis . . . Prayer. Some goals have yet to be reached. Others cannot be determined until later in the year; while others have been attained already.

Under the direction of Associational WMU the ladies of the local churches have worked toward the goals of Christian Witnessing through Sunday School lessons they have taught at the Girls' Training School each Sunday, by ministering at the State Hospital through Hymn Sings, Devotionals, and refreshments; at the County Hospital by a program of visitation and teaching the Sunday School lesson; devotionals and refreshments at Fort Roots Hospital, and in addition to supplying copies of "Open Windows" for the patients at McRae Sanitorium, they also carried on a program of visitation and devotionals there.

Victories have been recorded in many areas, but perhaps the greatest was the organization or reactivating of eight new societies, which now brings our total Woman's Missionary Societies to 69. There has been an increase of two Young Women's Auxiliaries to bring that total to 23. There are 31 reported Intermediate Girls' Auxiliaries, and 63 reported Junior Girls' Auxiliaries, with 52 Sunbeam Bands.

Organizational plans have been promoted through quarterly rallies. Four such rallies were held this year: at Park Hill, Levy, Gaines Street, and Little Rock, Second. There were 4 GA and 4

YWA Rallies. There was a Coronation Service at Pulaski Heights in which Junior and Intermediate girls were recognized for the work they had done in Forward Steps.

There were four meetings for instruction for local leaders held, a leadership meeting, a mission study institute, and 2 workshops for young people's workers.

We are grateful for the progress which has been made in WMU work in the Association but we recognize that there is still much work to be done. During this second year of the Jubilee Advance the emphasis will be on Leadership Training again undergirded with the permanent emphasis of Prayer. We shall endeavor to launch a leadership training program among the local church leaders. We shall set worthy goals for increased membership in all the youth organizations and the WMS, as well as promoting a 12% increase in the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering, the Annie Armstrong Offering and the Dixie Jackson Offering. Once again an appropriate watchword has been chosen. One that is very personal and will strengthen us for our task ahead, taken from Zech. 4:6: "Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord God of Hosts."

#### BAPTIST STUDENT UNION REPORT

The Baptist Student Union is the ministry that has been set up to help meet the spiritual needs of our student population. We seek to fill these needs by enlisting the students in the program of some local Baptist church and by providing a spiritual program on the campus. There are many facets to the work of B. S. U. We are concerned with the total student: his evangelism, churchmanship, enlistment, citizenship, devotional life, missions, and his social life.

In Pulaski County there is an organized B. S. U. at Arkansas Baptist Hospital School of Nursing, Little Rock University, and at the University of Arkansas Medical Center with its five different schools: medicine, nursing, pharmacy, X-ray technology, and medical technology.

The Local B. S. U.'s were responsible for planning and promoting a medical missions conference here January 30-31 this year. One hundred seventy-five students and medical personnel attended from Arkansas, Tennessee, Oklahoma, and Missouri.

Arkansas Baptist Hospital School of Nursing has 189 students enrolled. One hundred eighteen of these are Baptist. Eighty-nine



are at present members of local Baptist churches. Of the new class of 50 students who came in September, 36 have yet to join a local church. During the year three nurses made professions of faith and joined a local church. A student at the hospital won the Arkansas Better Speakers' Tournament and represented the state in the southwide contest at Ridgecrest.

During the past summer, five students attended Student Week at Ridgecrest. Seven students served through the B. S. U. as camp nurses at Siloam Springs.

A student nurse has been granted a leave of absence for next summer to serve as a B. S. U. summer missionary. This is the first time for this to be done in the history of the school.

At Little Rock University there are 1,485 students enrolled. Of this number 458 are Baptist students. Baptist are the largest group at L. R. U. with over 100 more than the next largest group. This year L. R. U. is the fourth largest school in the state. The majority of these Baptist students live at home in Little Rock or surrounding communities and are members of almost every church in the association. The first B. S. U. retreat was held for L. R. U. this fall. Some of the people on program were: Mrs. Frank Leavell, Miss Estelle Slater, Dr. Tom Logue, and Dr. Dale Cowling. There were 25 who attended the retreat. Attendance at the daily devotional service at L. R. U. is the highest ever. The Lord is blessing the work there in a marvelous way. This is the first year for a devotional service to be held each day.

The University of Arkansas Medical Center has 522 students enrolled in its five schools. One hundred sixty of these are Baptist or Baptist preference. Attendance at noonday devotions this year is averaging about 20. This is 12% of all the Baptist preference students at Devotional every day. The average over the state is about 10% of the Baptist students in daily attendance. There are over 7,000 Baptist college students in Arkansas. Last year the average attendance at daily devotional services on 14 campuses was about 700.

During the year the Arkansas Baptist State Convention made available \$15,000 for the construction of a Baptist Student Center at the University of Arkansas Medical Center. The executive board of the association voted to match that sum in order to build a \$30,000 Baptist Student Center on our lot at 4th and Elm Streets, across the street from the Med Center. The association's share of the money is to be borrowed with five local churches acting as guarantors for the loan. The loan will be paid by the association. A building committee was selected consisting of Dr. S. A. Whitlow,

Dr. Tom Logue, Dr. Dale Cowling, and Jim Boyd. Plans are now being considered. Construction should begin soon.

Areas of future need and expansion in the B. S. U. program are as follows:

1. Construction of Baptist Student Center at the Medical Center.
2. The acquisition of property near the Little Rock University campus and the eventual construction of a Baptist Student Center there.
3. Organization of B. S. U. work in two business colleges and St. Vincent's School of Nursing.
4. A ministry to the Negro Baptist students in three Negro colleges in Pulaski County.

The Associational B. S. U. Committee this year has been Dr. W. H. Hicks, Dr. W. O. Vaught, and Dr. Dale Cowling, chairman. Miss Juanita Straubie is B. S. U. Director at Arkansas Baptist Hospital. Jim Boyd is city-wide B. S. U. Director working with Little Rock University and the University of Arkansas Medical Center.

## TRAINING UNION REPORT

### Our Training Union Progress

1. According to the 1958 report, there were 1,151 churches in Arkansas, 960 of these churches reported 93,334 Training Union members. There were 191 churches in Arkansas without Training Union work. In our association, at the close of this associational year, we have 76 churches, with 75 churches with Training Unions, and 1 church without Training Union. These 75 churches with Training Unions reported an enrolment of about 11,840. (These figures gleaned from the letters taken to the 1959 annual meeting).

2. "M" Night was observed on December 1, 1958 with an attendance in Arkansas of 17,609. 783 churches were represented, 580 pastors present, and all except one association had an "M" Night meeting. Our association had 1,641 present. "M" Night will be observed in our association on December 7-8, 1959. Meeting place is Baring Cross, North Little Rock and Baptist Tabernacle, Little Rock.

3. Study course awards have increased in Arkansas. According to the official report from the Sunday School Board from Octo-



ber 1, 1958 to October 1, 1959, (ten months) there were 27,950 awards granted to the people of Arkansas. In our association, 51 churches have reported at least one study course, with 4,030 awards earned during that ten months period.

4. By September 1, 325 churches in Arkansas participated in the Honor Church Program by receiving the Honor Church Diploma. There were 12 churches to complete the diploma and become honor churches.

In our association 15 churches earned one or more seals. They were: Cedar Heights, Highway, Gravel Ridge, First Church, Alexander, Second Church, Jacksonville, Trinity, First Church, Little Rock, Central, North Little Rock, Zion Hill, First Church, Jacksonville, Immanuel, Martindale, Longview, Baring Cross, and Second Church, Little Rock.

5. The following Training Union meetings (regular meetings and special meetings, such as central schools) were held:

6. During March, 1959, eight district Training Union conventions were conducted. The convention for our district was held at First Baptist Church, Little Rock.

7. Many of our churches and associations are promoting the Junior Memory-Sword Drill, the Intermediate Sword Drill, and Better Speakers' Tournament.

This year our association had three entrants in these tournaments. Our Speakers were Dell Cristy of Immanuel and Larry Taylor of First Little Rock.

8. **Youth Week.** One hundred and twenty-four churches in thirty associations observed Youth Week. Twenty-nine churches in our association reported Youth Week to the Training Union Department this year. They were, Alexander, First; Baring Cross; Bayou Meto; Cedar Heights; Central, North Little Rock; Crystal Valley; Douglassville; Forty-Seventh Street; Gaines Street; Gravel Ridge; Hebron; Highway; Immanuel; Jacksonville, First; Jacksonville, Second; Levy; Life Line; Little Rock, First; Little Rock, Second; Longview; Martindale; Park Hill; Reynolds Memorial; Rosedale; Sheridan, First; South Highland; Trinity; Woodson; Zion Hill.

### Our Future

The goal in Arkansas is 100,000 enrolled in Training Union work. The goal is to reduce the number of churches without Training Unions from 191 to 101. In our association, our goal is to reduce the number from 1 church without Training Union to 0. We hope to increase our Training Union enrolment in our association from 11,840 to 12,500.

### Our State Training Union Department

Rev. Ralph W. Davis is State Training Union Secretary and Rev. R. V. Haygood is the Associate. Their work is to promote Training Union work in all of the churches and associations of Arkansas.

#### CIVIC MORALITY REPORT

The Southern Baptist Convention has taken the following action concerning the beverage alcoholic traffic:

"Whereas, this convention is concerned for the sanctity of the American home and the spiritual growth of the nation, and is convinced that no good can come from the moderate or excessive use of alcoholic beverages, be it therefore resolved that we urge the churches:

"1. To educate all members concerning the effects of alcohol on health, personality and behavior, and on home and society.

"2. To continue to promote personal abstinence from all alcoholic beverages as the Christian way.

"3. To support wise legislation at local, state and national levels to eliminate the traffic in alcoholic beverages.

"4. To support wise national legislation to ban liquor advertising and beercasting, to ban the serving of alcoholic beverages on airlines, to call for an investigation of the results of the sale and use of alcoholic beverages in the armed services at home and overseas, to seek studies by the U. S. Public Health Service looking toward prevention of alcoholism and rehabilitation of alcoholics."

In keeping with this adopted policy, the battle against liquor and all other moral evils plaguing our present society, the Christian Civic Foundation has been organized. Subsidiary organizations have been established in almost every county in Arkansas. It demands the very best from all Pulaski County Baptists.



The major evangelical denominations of Arkansas are cooperating in this endeavour through the media of (1) organization, (2) legislation, (3) rehabilitation, and (4) education.

Under present Arkansas law, properly trained teachers have the right to go into junior high schools and high schools with a program of alcohol-narcotic education. This is to be done in conjunction with properly constituted school officials.

To carry out the program locally, an all day clinic will be held starting at 9:30, October 22 at the Winfield Methodist Church. Dr. A. C. Miller of our own Christian Life Commission will help in the leading of this clinic. We invite every pastor, parent, and teacher to this clinic.

To further project the arm of this effective foundation, we must support with our prayers and our money. The need for monthly allotments from every church is urgent. It should be sent to the Christian Civic Foundation of Arkansas, Inc., 333-34 Waldon Building, Little Rock, Arkansas.

### CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT

Ouachita Baptist College continued to be one of the fastest growing senior colleges in the United States during the 1958-59 session with a total enrollment of 1,069 which was the largest in Ouachita history.

Such tremendous growth has posed some very great problems; for the physical facilities of the college are rapidly being outgrown.

To meet the demands, a new dining hall was completed, a frame dormitory to house about 40 boys was constructed, and work begun on a frame dormitory to house a like number of girls. Applications have been made to construct two permanent dormitories, one each for men and women.

An addition is being made to the Riley Memorial Library through the generous contribution of Miss Emma Riley.

Efforts are now being made to secure \$75,000.00 to match a gift of \$75,000.00 for construction of a Bible Building. This much needed building will be erected in the heart of the campus where the President's home stood.

Beginning with this fall term . . . a major academic program was added to the college schedule. This was the granting of Master of Arts degree through a graduate program in both Religion and American Civilization.

Ouachita College now offers a major course of study in 26 different departments with over 500 courses in the curriculum. Approximately one fourth of all students enrolled are preparing for some phase of Christian service.

From reports received, Ouachita is operating on a sound financial basis and within her income. The budget for the coming year will be slightly over one million dollars.

Southern Baptist College at Walnut Ridge reports 1958-59 to be one of the finest years in its history. The college continues to enjoy wide acceptance and prestige in the family of colleges of our nation. Within the past year, Southern has made substantial progress toward full accreditation by the North Central Association and expects to receive full accreditation within a short time.

Expenses at Southern have been kept to a minimum and are within reach of young people from both farm and salaried homes.

It is worth noting that total expense for one year is only \$572.00 whereas the average cost of a year's training in colleges of America runs better than \$1,350.00.

This is an era in which the Christian college becomes even more important to our denomination and our nation.

We believe that our Baptist Colleges are our greatest contribution to the freedom of the American mind in our generation. We also believe that the work of Baptists and Christianity as a whole would suffer irreparable loss if Christian education were curtailed or limited in any way. Therefore, we encourage our churches and our people to give every assistance to the further promotion of



Christian Education through both Ouachita College and Southern College in the coming years.

### RACE RELATIONS REPORT

First of all I would like to thank this association for your wonderful support, your prayers and cooperation from the very beginning of our Department's work in 1954 until the present time.

This has been by far our best year's work in our program to help the Negro Baptists help themselves in developing stronger churches. This we are doing by assisting them in training church leadership, sharing with them organizational techniques, promotional literature, and in many other ways. We are also assisting them through Leadership Conferences, Clinics, Extension Schools and Institutional services.

Three years ago many of our lives were strengthened spiritually when over 40 white Baptist Churches and 14 Negro Baptist Churches were in revival meetings simultaneously here in Pulaski County Association. Again we see it in the services of our Chaplain at the Tubercular Hospital at Alexandria. There under the direction of Rev. Arlis Sims we have a Baptist Sunday School throughout the 367 bed institution using Southern Baptist literature made possible by the support of the Pulaski Association and your Department of Race Relations. Another example is the Baptist Camp for Negro Boys and Girls, though state-wide in scope, this camp is located in Pulaski County. This year 151 Negro children were blessed by the ministry of the encampment program and 10 boys found Christ as their personal saviour. This is the only encampment for Negro children conducted by any Christian group. We also have here in Little Rock an Extension Class for in-service pastors taught by Rev. M. W. Williams, who is a Seminary graduate and has had seven years experience teaching Bible in College. This class has 39 enrolled.

Our latest cooperative project here in Pulaski Association is the transportation of the children from the Negro Blind and Deaf School into two of the best Negro Baptist Churches for Sunday School and Sunday morning worship. The two Negro churches, Pulaski Association, and your Race Relations Department are jointly bearing the expense of transportation and an interpreter.

Bethel, was constituted as a church in May, formerly a mission of Second Church. Rev. Harold Taylor is pastor.

Green Memorial, was constituted in September, formerly a mission of Immanuel. Rev. Charles A. Sewell is pastor.

Highway, the first unit of a four-unit church plant was built and was dedicated on October 11, 1959.

Holly Springs called W. L. Peppers as pastor in July.
