Proceedings.

The Buckville Baptist Association met with the Pleasant. Hill Baptist church, Montgomery county, Arkansas, in its eleventh annual session, September 22, 1900.

Called to order at 10 o'clock by Bro. Shepard. Devotional exercises were led by Bro. J. A. Chitwood. Eld. M. C. Melton preached the annual introductory sermon. Text, Phil. 2:0. Followed by Eld. E. P. Chitwood.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Bro. Shepard called the body to order and read first chapter of Hebrews. Prayer was led by Bro. E. P. Chitwood.

The moderator appointed Eld. E. P. Chitwood and Bro. J. T. Ryan as a committee on credentials; and letters from the following churches were readand messengers' names enrolled, towit:

On motion the rules were suspended and petitionary letters were called for.

Macedonia and Shady Grove presented petitionary letters, which were read, and the churches received into the association.

The body went into the election of officers. H. C. Lackey and D. P. Fowler acted as tellers. Eld. M. C. Melton was elected moderator; J. T. Blakely, clerk, and G. W. Thompson, treasurer.

The moderator appointed the deacons of Pleasant Hill church and Bro. Ryan as a Committee on Divine Service.

A call was made for correspondents from other associations, but none received.

The moderator appointed Eld. W. A. Neighbors and Bro. J. D. Neighbors correspondents to the Saline Association.

Eld. E. P. Chitwood and Eld. J. G. Roy were appointed correspondents to the Caddo River Association.

Eld. H. W. Melton and Eld. W. G. J. Young, correspondents to the Dardanelle Association.

Eld. J. W. Shepard and Eld. E. P. Chitwood, correspondents to the Ouachita Association.

Committee on Divine Service reported as follows: Eld. E. P. Chitwood preached Saturday night; Eld. H. W. Melton preached Sunday at 9:30 o'clock a. m.; Eld. J. W. Shepard preached the annual missionary sermón Sunday at 11 o'clock a. m.; Eld. W. A. Neighbors preached Sunday at 3

o'clock p. m.; Eld. W. G. J. Young preached Sunday night; Eld. W. A. Neighbors preached at Sulphur Springs Sunday night and Monday night; Eld. J. G. Roy preached Wonday at 11 o'clock a. m.; Eld. H. W. Melton preached Monday night.

On motion the body adjourned until 8 s. m., Monday, after prayer by Bro. Williamson.

MONDAY MORNING.

Called to ordor at 8 o'clock, by the moderator. The moderator read the 183 Psalm. Prayer by Bro. J. P. Emery. The clerk being absent, the moderator appointed Eld. J. W. Shepard, clerk pro tem. Roll was called.

A motion prevailed that the names of all messengers who left the association without a legal excuse or permission from the moderator, should be dropped from the roll, and not appear in the minutes.

W. T. Blakely was elected a member of the State Board. Eld. W. A. Neighbors was elected delegate to the Southern Baptist Convention, the association to defray his expenses. The moderator appointed Eld. H. W. Melton delegate to the State Convention, the association to bear his expenses. Eld. J. W. Shepard was appointed alternate delegate to State Convention.

On motion the body voted that in case the delegate to Southern Baptist Convention failed to go, the money subscribed to pay his expenses should be used for associational purposes.

Reports of committees read and adopted. (See reports.) Adjourned till 1:30 o'clock p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Called to order by the moderator. Prayer by Bro. Henry Melton. Four dollars was raised for associational missions; \$1.30 was collected for foreign missions; \$2.50 was collected for state missions; \$1 was contributed to the Orphans" Home.

The following brethren were elected members of the board for the ensuing year: G. W. Thompson, chairman, A. C. Roper and F. M. Ratliff. On motion the body made a request that each church should elect one member to assist the board in raising funds.

On motion the clerk was instructed to have 250 copies of the minutes printed, and to distribute them in proportion to the minute fund of each church. The clerk was also instructed to keep twenty copies of the minutes and send one copy to the clerk of each church not represented.

() The body voted to hold its next district meeting with Glassier Poe church, fifth Sunday in December, 1900.

The body voted to hold the next session of the association with Shady Grove church, Hollis postoffice, Perry county, Saturday before the fourth Sunday in September, 1901.

"God Be With You," was sung, the parting hand extended, Bro. E. P. Chitwood led the closing prayer and after a few parting words by Bro. Lum Melton, the association adjourned. M. C. MELTON, Moderator.
