## CONSTITUTION

(As Amended at 1933, 1943, 1948, 1950, 1951, 1953, 1954,  
1956 and 1957 Sessions)

### ARTICLE I—NAME

The name of this body shall be the Pulaski County Baptist Association, Incorporated.

### ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this Association shall be to awaken and stimulate among the churches of the Association, the greatest possible activity in Evangelism, Christian Education, Missions and Benevolences, throughout the bounds of the Association; to cultivate closer co-operation among the churches and to promote concert of action in advancing all the interest of the Kingdom of God.

### ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of Messengers from regular co-operating churches, which are in sympathy with the principles and purposes of this Constitution and desire to co-operate with this Association, who shall be entitled to seats upon presentation of letters from their churches or other satisfactory evidence of their appointment.

Section 2. Each church shall be entitled to a minimum of three messengers. One additional messenger shall be allowed for every 50 resident church members above 100. No church, however, may have more than 10 messengers.

Section 3. Messengers from churches desiring to affiliate with this Association shall present to the Association in Annual Meeting, Petitionary Letters or evidence, setting forth the Articles of Faith on which the church was organized, together with satisfactory evidence of the regularity of their organization. They shall be received into the Association by receiving two-thirds of the votes cast.

### ARTICLE IV—AUTHORITY

This Association shall never exercise any authority, legislative or ecclesiastical, over any church. Nor shall it in any way interfere with the rights and absolute independence of any church.

### ARTICLE V—OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be elected the first session of the second day and who shall take office the closing



session of the last day of the annual Associational meeting. Said officers to be elected by a majority vote cast at such meeting. The Moderator shall not be eligible to serve more than two successive terms. The Clerk and the Treasurer may be the same person.

Section 2. The Moderator shall preside at all sessions of the Association; or request the Vice-Moderator to preside. The Vice-Moderator will also preside in the absence of the Moderator. The Moderator shall exercise the same privilege of discussion as any other member of the body.

Section 3. The Clerk shall keep a correct record of the Proceedings of the Association in annual meeting, the Executive Board in regular or called meetings, and the Missions Committee in regular or called meetings. He shall be responsible for the printing and distribution of the proceedings of the annual meeting; the taking and preserving of the minutes of all Executive Board and Missions Committee meetings as the Association may direct.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of every kind entrusted to him and shall disburse the same upon the order of the Executive Board and shall make an itemized statement of receipts and disbursements monthly to the Executive Board and an annual statement to the Association in annual session. The Treasurer shall be bonded by the Association, at the Association's expense. An annual audit shall be made of his books by a reputable accountant. This fee shall be paid by the Association.

#### ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of one lay member, elected by each co-operating church, together with the pastor of each co-operating church and the officers of the Association. FIFTEEN members of said Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall meet one time each month in regular meeting, time and place to be determined by the Board. In case of special meetings written notice must be given to each Board member. The Moderator and Clerk of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Board.

Section 3. The Executive Board shall receive reports, in the monthly meetings, from the following:

Treasurer's Report.

Associational Missionary.

Superintendent of Associational Sunday School.

Director of Associational Training Union.

Chairman of Evangelism.

President of the Associational Brotherhood.  
Superintendent of the Associational W.M.U.  
Director of Associational Music Program.  
Director of Student Union Work in the Association.  
Library Committee.  
Recommendations of the Missions Committee.

Section 4. The Executive Board shall be constituted and empowered by the Association as its legal agent to administer all business committed to it by the Association and to employ such paid agents as it may deem necessary in carrying on the Missionary, Education, Benevolent and Financial work of the Association.

Section 5. The Executive Board shall render to the Association in Annual meeting a summary statement of all the business for the year. Same to be printed in the minutes.

## ARTICLE VII—STANDING COMMITTEES

### I. Missions Committee

Section 1. The Association in Annual meeting, through the Nominating Committee, shall elect a standing committee known as the Missions Committee. This committee shall be composed of twelve members. Members of the Missions Committee shall serve for a term of three years. Each year four members shall complete their terms and shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of at least one year.

Section 2. The Officers of the Association and the elected Associational Organization leaders, shall be ex-officio members of the Committee with all rights of discussion and voting.

Section 3. The Missions Committee shall have the responsibility of selecting and nominating the Associational Missionary or any other paid agents of the Association, and to recommend their employment to the Executive Board in regular meetings, or properly called special meetings.

Section 4. The duties of the Missions Committee shall be as follows:

- (1.) To serve as a nominating committee for any paid officer or worker of the Association. These nominations are to be brought to the Executive Board.
- (2.) To plan a program of mission work for the Association. This is to be an active and aggressive program of planning. This committee should present a challenging and progressive program of work.



- (3.) To see that the plans for Associational work are promoted effectively.
- (4.) To plan a program of benevolences. This should be a well thought out program including all such needs. Plans for promoting the activities should be initiated by this committee.
- (5.) To plan a comprehensive program with regard to Christian Education. This committee should ascertain the needed projects, set the emphases, and actively promote the work.
- (6.) To correlate the activities and projects of the Association with the adopted cooperative program. This committee should actively work toward the end of keeping all of our Baptist program under direct supervision in co-operation with the cooperative program plan. These projects should be clearly thought through and planned in connection with the budget committee each year.
- (7.) To work toward the establishment of new units of mission work in the Association. To facilitate this phase of the work the Chairman of the Missions Committee shall appoint a special committee of three from the membership of the Missions Committee. This shall be known as the Missions and Survey Committee. The duties of the committee shall be:
  - (a) To survey the entire Association to determine the areas where new churches or missions should be established, and to locate property in such areas suitable for building sites.
  - (b) To recommend to the Missions Committee expenditures from the Missions Expansion Fund toward securing such property. The Mission Committee will then study their findings and recommendations and bring to the Executive Board for final action those projects they endorse.
  - (c) To solicit the assistance of sponsoring churches in establishing work in areas which have been approved by the Executive Board.
  - (d) To assist and advise all groups desiring to establish Baptist Churches and Missions in the territorial limits of Pulaski County to the end that all such works may secure the most desirable and strategic locations to serve the people of this association.
  - (e) To survey the areas to be served by each proposed new work and recommend to the Missions Committee the nature and extent of any assistance that the Association should provide in each case. The Missions Committee would in turn study their recommendation and

submit to the Executive Board a final recommendation in each instance.

- (f) To recommend to the Missions Committee all salary supplements to pastor's of missions and needy churches. Commitments for supplements shall be made for periods not to exceed one year. They may be renewed by recommendation of the Committee in deserving cases.
- (8.) This Committee shall never exercise any authority over the churches. Its sole function shall be that of advising the local congregation, desiring to establish a new work, in the matter of securing the most strategic location and assist them in securing the sponsorship of a mother church, if desirable. Any group desiring associational assistance in securing property and for pastor's salary supplements would be expected to counsel with this committee in locating their work. If a church forms spontaneously or a local church establishes a new mission without counselling with the Missions and Survey Committee, no attempt will be made to tell them they cannot do so. The Association must then decide whether or not to welcome the new church into the fellowship.
- (9.) The Missions Committee should correlate the activity of the Associational organizations. Plans should be made together so as to avoid conflicts.
- (10.) The Chairman of the Missions Committee will appoint committees within the committee when such are needed to carry out the duties of the Missions Committee with regard to the above items.

## **II. Committee on Order of Business**

- 1. The Committee on Order of Business shall consist of the Moderator and Clerk of the Association, Host Pastor, Associational Missionary and the elected leaders of the Associational Organizations.
- 2. This committee shall be charged with making the Annual meetings as spiritual, inspirational and informational, as is possible to do so. Preaching shall have a prominent place in the meetings.
- 3. This committee shall publish a tentative order of business for distribution at the first session of the Annual meeting.

## **III. Nominating Committee**

- 1. This committee shall be composed of five members elected by the messengers during the first day's session of the annual Associational meeting. This committee shall be elected as follows:



- a. The chairman of the Executive Board of the Association shall appoint a committee of five executive board members to serve as a special nominating committee to nominate members of the Standing Nominating Committee.
  - b. This duly appointed special nominating committee will present nominations for the five members of the standing nominating committee during the first day's session of the annual Associational meeting.
  - c. The right of nominations from the floor shall not be abridged.
2. The duties of the Standing Nominating Committee shall be as follows:
- a. They shall name the standing committees of the Association, except those otherwise provided for in this Constitution, and they shall nominate the membership of such committees which shall report at the Annual meeting.
  - b. They shall nominate the leaders of the Associational Organizations.
  - c. They shall nominate the members of the Missions Committee as provided in Article VII, Section 1, paragraph 1.
  - d. This committee shall make any necessary nominations to fill vacancies which occur during the year in these committees or offices. These nominations shall be submitted to the Executive Board in regular or called meetings.

## ARTICLE VIII—MEETINGS

Section 1. The Association shall meet annually on a date designated at each Annual meeting. If no date is set, the Executive Board will designate one.

## ARTICLE IX—ASSOCIATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

Section 1. The Associational Organizations shall be: Sunday School, Training Union, Woman's Missionary Union, Baptist Brotherhood, Music, Library, Student Work and Evangelism.

Section 2. Leaders of these organizations shall be elected as provided in Article VII, Section 3 (paragraph (2) b.).

Section 3. The Associational Organizations shall correlate their activities through the Missions Committee. A Calendar of Activities shall be planned and followed. Said organizations, through their

leaders, will make monthly reports to the Executive Board of work done and work proposed.

#### ARTICLE X—HOW AMENDED

This Constitution may be amended at any Annual meeting of the Association by a TWO-THIRDS VOTE of the Messengers present and voting, provided that the substance of Article IV shall not be abrogated.

#### RULES OF ORDER

Roberts Rules of Order shall be the standard in deciding questions of parliamentary practice.

### INTER-RACIAL REPORT

The work of the Race Relations Department is jointly sponsored by the Arkansas Baptist State Convention and the Home Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention. The State Convention pays 60% of the cost and the Home Mission Board, 40%.

The purpose of the department is to help the Negro Baptists of Arkansas help themselves in developing better churches. This is being done by sharing with them materials and techniques in Sunday School, Training Union, W.M.S., and Brotherhood organization and promotion.

Workshops and clinics are held on "How to Plan and Promote a Unified Church Budget," Stewardship and Missions, Vacation Bible School Work, Evangelism, and Literacy.

Night Extension School classes for in-service preachers are held in six communities in the state.

A part-time chaplain serves the Negro T. B. Hospital. Sunday School literature is provided by Pulaski County Association.

Your Race Relations Department conducts a camp for Negro Baptist boys and a camp for Negro Baptist girls each summer. These

two camps are the only ones conducted for Negro children and young people by any Christian group in the state. This year 132 boys and girls attended these camps and 17 teen-age boys surrendered to God's call to full-time service as preachers or missionaries. This is very significant in view of the fact that perhaps the number one problem facing Negro Baptists of America today is that so very few Negro youth of high school and college age are entering the ministry.

We hope, in the near future, to make a real contribution on the college level through a Baptist Student Union and Chair-of-Bible program.

We held a two-day Literacy Workshop, March 11-12, Little Rock, sponsored by the Race Relations Department. Seventy-eight attended from twenty communities. A number of those who have taken this training have been able to put it to a practical use.

A Literacy Workshop was conducted at Fort Roots VA Hospital by Mrs. S. A. Whitlow and Mrs. Melvin Thrash. Fourteen members of the hospital personnel received the training. We plan to have a similar workshop at the McRae Tuberculosis Hospital in the near future.

We sincerely try to conduct our entire program in the spirit of Christ. Our work is encouraged and strengthened by the prayers and assistance of our pastors, associational missionaries, local churches, and denominational workers. The wonderful cooperation of our Negro Baptist friends in this program of work is producing better churches, and making a real contribution to inter-racial goodwill and understanding.

### MISSIONARY'S REPORT

The past twelve months have been most rewarding in many areas of our work. We had the opportunity to help several of our churches to build new facilities and saw several others complete new facilities for their growing work. Our Group Training Schools in February for the Sunday School leadership were the best in the history of the Association. There are many areas which we have not yet begun to touch, but we believe that the program has begun to move and the next five years should see us well on the road toward utilizing the areas of service which are ours.

The following is a brief summary of the past twelve months' activities :

1. The missionary traveled approximately 38,000 miles during these 12 months. (These includes 2,500 miles to Southern Baptist Convention, Miami Beach; 450 miles to Sunday School Convention, Fort Worth; and 1,800 miles to Glorieta for Home Mission Week.) He has preached 111 sermons and conducted 38 prayer meetings. The missionary has also visited every church field in the Association sometime during the year. Many of these visits were necessarily made during the week and not during a church service.



2. The Association has aided the following churches in the amounts indicated:  
 Roland Baptist—\$1,500.00 on a new building.  
 First Baptist, Jacksonville—\$500.00 on a new building for their mission.  
 Holly Springs Baptist—\$500.00 on a new Sunday School addition.  
 Markham Street Baptist—\$400.00 on bond sinking fund\*  
 \* The Associational Executive Board voted to aid the Markham Street Baptist Church in a bond program in the amount of up to \$200.00 per month for one year, with the specific understanding that it might be necessary to continue this aid for a longer period.
3. Additional expenditures of Expansion and Special Funds were:  
 \$2,440.85—BSU Property at Little Rock University\*  
 \$15,000.00—on BSU Center at Medical Center\*\*  
 \* There was an additional \$6,000.00 borrowed from the Worthen Bank and Trust Company for a six-month period at 6% interest which was used to complete the purchase of the property adjacent to LRU.  
 \*\* This money was borrowed from Worthen Bank and Trust Company with a five-year payment plan of \$286.22 per month.
4. Two college girls were employed for a period of ten weeks to work with Vacation Bible Schools in the Association. These two girls conducted and worked in nine different schools.
5. There were 8,104 Training Awards during the past year.

### BAPTIST BOOK STORE

Our report is presented this year from the developments of the various programs fostered by the Sunday School Board. As the Board seeks to accomplish its objective through the Book Store, we are happy to have available lesson courses and materials, promotional and leadership guidance materials, books, and supplies to foster education and service programs which will help churches to establish, enlarge, and improve their ministries of Bible teaching and Christian training. ### BAPTIST STUDENT UNION REPORT

The Baptist Student Union is the ministry that has been set up to help meet the spiritual needs of our student population. We seek to fill these needs by enlisting the students in the program of some local Baptist church and by providing a spiritual program on the campus. There are many facets to the work of B. S. U. We are concerned with the total student: his evangelism, churchmanship, enlistment, citizenship, devotional life, missions, and his social life.

In Pulaski County there is an organized B. S. U. at Arkansas Baptist Hospital School of Nursing, Little Rock University, and at the University of Arkansas Medical Center with its five different schools: medicine, nursing, pharmacy, X-ray technology, and medical technology.

On September 29, Arkansas Baptist Hospital School of Nursing had 144 students enrolled. (A new class of 54 arrived October 2, after the close of the Associational year). Of the 144 students, 95 are Baptists. Seventy-four are enlisted in a local Baptist church. Of the 47 students of other denominations, 23 are enlisted in a local church. (During the year four students made professions of faith and joined local churches).

Some of the highlights of the BSU year of ABH were:

1. Missions Emphasis in December, 1959, with missionary Bill Dyal as speaker.
2. "Tell the Campus Week" — a week of emphasis on personal evangelism, held in January and sponsored by the State Student Department.
3. Cooperation with Immanuel Baptist Church of daily services with Angel Martinez as speaker in March.
4. Miss Dell Christy, a student, served as a student summer missionary for the State BSU.

A special week of emphasis was held in March at Little Rock University in cooperation with the State Department. The response to this week was very good. Many people were reached for participation who had not been enlisted before.

A major accomplishment during the year has been the construction of a \$30,000.00 Baptist Student Center at the corner of Fourth and South Elm. The Association furnished one-half the money for the construction of this building.

Another major accomplishment of the year was the buying of property adjacent to the campus of Little Rock University for the eventful construction of a Baptist Student Center. This is one of the areas of great need in our BSU work and this is a step in the right direction to meet that need.

Jim Boyd, BSU Director, since January 1, 1958, resigned September 1 to go back to school. Walter Smiley has been employed by the State BSU Department to work with the BSU for this school year. Miss Juanita Straubie works with the BSU at Arkansas Baptist Hospital.

## TRAINING UNION REPORT

### Our Training Union Progress

Realizing that the church member is in need of training because he is a new citizen in a new Kingdom, and in keeping with the Baptist Jubilee Advance with special emphasis on teaching and training, we present the following brief statistical report of the Training Union activities of the 1960 Associational year.

75 of total 76 churches with an active Training Union.

4,061 book awards earned in Categories one-fifteen (Bible, Doctrine, Stewardship, etc.)

380 book awards earned in Category eighteen (T. U. principles and methods.)

14 churches reported outstanding youth week programs.

269 in attendance from our Association at Training Union State Assembly Week at Siloam Spring, July 11-16.

620 attended "M" Night on south side of river. This meeting was held at Tabernacle Baptist Church with Rev. Walter Warmath from El Dorado, speaking.

514 attended "M" Night services on north side of river. This meeting was held at Baring Cross Baptist Church, with Dr. Leo Eddleman from New Orleans, speaking.

1,134 total attendance reported for "M" Night.

We had 2 quarterly mass meetings and 1 officers' and leaders' conference.

Our State Office directed 3 enlargement campaigns. (Woodlawn, Gaines Street, and First Church, Little Rock.

Our Association was host to a state-wide leadership workshop on September 27th with 421 present.

12 churches were represented at our Associational Junior Memory Work-Sword Drills tournament.

3 churches for the Intermediate Sword Drill.

2 churches represented at the Speaker's Tournament. (All held at Pike Avenue Baptist Church, North Little Rock.)

The District Drills at Benton, Arkansas were well attended and we were represented in all three categories.

\$420.00 total budget for 1959 Associational year.

\$14.05 expended in 1960.

39 churches received Honor Church Diplomas from State Training Union Office.

23 churches received one or more seals for Honor Church Diploma. Highway, Gaines Street, and Life Line Baptist Churches received all but one seal for Honor Church Diploma.

First Church, Little Rock, Walter Dickinson, Training Union Director, has received the Honor Church Diploma with all five seals.

### OUACHITA BAPTIST COLLEGE

In many ways the 1959-60 school year was the greatest in the history of Ouachita Baptist College. The school enjoyed the largest enrollment in her history, there being 1,026 regular students enrolled and a total enrollment of 1,069 for the fall semester. This represented an increase of approximately 14% over the year before and an increase of 109.8% since 1953 when the school regained accreditation. The total non-duplicating enrollment for the regular terms and the summer session was 1,191.

Of the total number of students enrolled, 98% were Baptists, and 87.9% were from Arkansas. Of the 12.1% not from Arkansas, many were from states without Southern Baptist Colleges (Illinois, Wisconsin, Ohio, Michigan, etc.) and from our mission fields. Ouachita's major ministry is to the Baptist young people of Arkansas.

Ouachita is in the budget of the Arkansas Baptist State Convention for \$256,905 for 1960. This amount represents about one-fourth of the school's annual budget, and Ouachita is deeply indebted to the Cooperative Program since the school could not operate without support from this source. However, the extremely rapid growth of the student body during the past several years has far outstripped Convention support of the college. While the enrollment since 1953 has increased 109.8%, Ouachita's allocation from the convention has increased 28.4%. Whereas Ouachita received 18.66% of the state budget in 1953, she will receive only 15.57% in 1960 although she has more than doubled in size during this period.

The steady growth of the College is reflected in the fall term enrollment of regular students (i.e., those carrying 12 or more hours of work) since 1953: 1953, 489; 1954, 622; 1955, 675; 1956, 748; 1957, 875; 1958, 926; 1959, 1,026.

During the past fiscal year ending May 31, 1960, several important additions were made to the college's physical plant and were paid for completely. These included a new wing on Riley Library, erected at a cost of \$40,693.45 and increasing the reading room area by 50 per cent; Blake Hall, a frame dormitory housing 48 girls and built at a cost of \$32,189.48; R. C. Daily Hall remodeling, the transformation of the old dining hall into a classroom building with seven classes and six offices added, at a cost of \$11,564.13; the addition of a wing to Lakeside Dormitory, which wing will accommodate 40 men, at a cost of \$15,232.39; and the addition of an annex to Flenniken Memorial Student Center at a cost of \$2,789.73.

Under construction at the present time are four major projects. The first of these is the Bible Building, long hoped and prayed for. While the building is being built by faith as the money comes in and work is progressing slowly, but the first floor has been poured, and the structural steel is soon to be delivered. The prospect that we may in the foreseeable future have a decent building to house the Bible Department and to provide a small chapel for use in teaching preaching is enough to cause us to shout "Hallelujah!"

The two additional major projects under construction are permanent dormitories. The one to house 100 men is being built where the football bleachers formerly stood. The women's dormitory, to house 72 women, will be built south and west of Terral-Moore Hall. The two will cost a total of \$625,000 and are being built on 100% loans from the Housing and Home Finance Agency. Borrowing this money was



unanimously authorized by the Arkansas Baptist State Convention in session. The dormitories are to be ready for occupancy in January of 1961.

Because the student body has grown far more rapidly than the financial support of the College has increased, Ouachita has had increasing difficulty in meeting accreditation standards and salary competition of other schools for faculty members. A student who pays cash for his entire school bill lacks approximately \$260.00 per year paying the total cost of his schooling at the present time. Since a number of scholarships are given to ministerial students and others and since about one-third of the students work at student employment to defray a part of their expenses, the actual deficit per student is greater than this. In order to operate, the school must make up this deficit from gifts and the operation of auxiliary enterprises.

Total assets at the end of the fiscal year were \$4,777,086.01, including \$4,375,564.60 in properties. The Endowment Fund totalled \$714,524.73 and yielded revenue in the amount of \$125,235.38.

Two developments of special note in the academic realm occurred during the year. The first was the full accreditation of the school's Department of Music by the National Association of Schools of Music. This means that the work in music at Ouachita is recognized as being on a par with that offered anywhere in the country.

The second is the addition of graduate work leading to the degree Master of Arts. Begun in September of 1959 after more than a year of careful planning in conjunction with the accrediting association, the program offers majors in religion and American civilization to start with. Other areas of study will be added as circumstances warrant.

Other significant academic steps were the addition of a Department of German and the division of the Music Department into four separate departments: Church Music, Music Education, Applied Music, and Theory and Composition.

While many schools have dropped chapel services, Ouachita has required chapel for every member of the student body and faculty. On the Ouachita Campus Christianity is the main business, not just a sideline. Daily vespers, the Baptist Student Union, the Mission Band, and the Volunteer Band are other formal means of spiritual growth and development. But the strongest factor conducive to spirituality is, as it always has been, a faculty dedicated to Jesus Christ and His kingdom's expansion the world around.

The real answer as to what the future holds lies with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention. If Baptists of this state will make available more money to Ouachita through the Cooperative Program, then the College will continue to educate those who knock at her doors. If the money is not provided, then the doors will have to be closed to some. The decision is yours to make.

### SOUTHERN BAPTIST COLLEGE

The 1959-60 academic year of Southern Baptist College was one of the best in her history of nineteen years. The quality of work done in the college and ministerial training departments of the institution met with the highest standards. The faculty and administration felt that the year was marked with many academic advances of note.



Students from Southern continue to make good in other colleges and universities over the nation. Their credits are accepted without reduction and many of them take top honors in the senior institutions. Often reports from these colleges indicate that students from Southern are the best transfer students they receive.

The faculty was engaged in an intensive self-study in connection with application to North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools for regional accreditation. The survey revealed several improvements over the one submitted in 1958. Such a self-survey is calculated to do two major things: (1) provide the college with information about its program by which it can determine changes and improvements; (2) provide a survey team with data about the college by which it can determine whether or not to make a survey for possible accreditation. In view of the data submitted on July 1, it is hoped that negotiations may be entered into with North Central Association officials for examination and possible accreditation.

Total income for the college was \$162,263.53 according to the report of the auditor. The Arkansas Baptist State Convention contributed \$32,010.00 and the remaining \$130,253.53 came from other sources. The college is indeed grateful for the aid received from the State Convention and attempts to make every dollar serve the Lord in the finest possible fashion for the advancement of the Kingdom of the Lord.

The net gain in the enrollment for the regular session was slightly above that of the previous year. Prospects for the coming session are much better with more reservations paid than in any previous year for several years.

The college is now completing her third dormitory which will be occupied this fall. It is a large brick dormitory for men. The arrangements are the very latest with a bath between each two rooms and plenty of recreational facilities. It is two-story construction of latest modernistic architectural design. The front is trimmed with cut-stone of a very nice peach blend. A nice apartment is provided for the matron.

Southern Baptist College remains the only Baptist institution within easy reach of a population of over 2,000,000 people. Her immediate parish is her area, but her service area is the world.

### CO-OPERATIVE PROGRAM

The Cooperative Program has served Southern Baptists and the world for thirty-five years. The Convention meeting in Memphis, Tennessee, on May 13, 1925, created the Cooperative Program of Southern Baptists. That means that for thirty-five years it has been helping Southern Baptists to share Christ with the whole world. The Cooperative Program does this through our missionary, educational, and benevolent work.

Again this year the messengers to the Convention adopted the following resolutions: "It is our conviction that the Cooperative Program of Southern Baptists is the fundamental, effective, and indispensable channel of providing for the needs of all our work; and that we urge all Baptists to join in giving the Cooperative Program their loyal and undivided support."



The proof that Southern Baptists believe this is borne out by the following facts. Since the inception of the Cooperative Program in 1925, Southern Baptists have given a total of approximately \$483,354,000 through this primary channel. The total Cooperative Program receipts reported by all our states in the year of 1959 amounted to approximately \$47 million. Of this amount \$17 million was given to SBC causes, such as home and foreign missions, our six seminaries, etc., and nearly \$30,000,000 was given for state causes in all the states.

The Forward Program and its Three Applications. Now in its fourth year of use, the Forward Program of Church Finance continues to render wide service to Southern Baptist churches in planning, promoting, and pledging their annual budgets. Its effectiveness has been shared by a number of English-speaking churches in other countries. Recently a Spanish edition was released for use in Latin America by the Spanish Baptist Publishing House in El Paso, Texas.

Recognizing that a large number of churches need elementary help in budget planning and pledging before attempting the entire Forward Program, steps are underway to provide various applications for churches of varying needs. This emphasis, known as Application A, B, and C of the Forward Program, has been approved by the Convention and will be available in 1961.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

We recommend:

1. That every church in the association include the Cooperative Program in its budget.
2. That each church give careful study to the advantages of the 2 Plus plan, and vote to follow this plan: Adopt for the Cooperative Program a definite percentage of the total budget receipts of the church; focus on Cooperative Program gifts in the percentage promotion, compute the Cooperative Program percentage on the basis of all budgeted gifts; increase percentage of total budget given to world missions through the Cooperative Program by at least 2% each year.
3. That in planning its budget each church undertake to set the percentage of its budget to be given through the Cooperative Program before, rather than after, the other items in the budget are determined, thus implementing the conviction that missions is first rather than last in the responsibility of a Baptist church.
4. That primary attention be given in our association in 1961 to lead our smaller churches to study and utilize one of the three applications of the Forward Program.
