### MINUTES.

The messengers from the churches comprising the Ouachita United Baptist Association met with Concord Baptist Church, Polk county, Ark., Saturday, Sept. 20th, A. D., 1884.

The introductory sermon was preached at 11 o'clock, A M., by Eld. William Lawrence.

The Association was called to order by Eld. H. Ellison, former Moderator, and prayer was offered by Eld. J. M. Green.

The letters from the churches composing the association were read and the messenger's names enrolled.

The Association was organized by electing Eld. Wm. Lawrence, Moderator; Thomas Wright, Clerk, and John J. Egger, assistant Clerk.

On motion, the Moderator was authorized to appoint all the committees from time to time.

Whereupon he announced the appointment of the following committee on Divine Services: Brethren J. Standrige, W. J. Nelghbors, B. P. Strickland and E. G. Embrey.

Prayer was offered and the association adjourned until Monday morning at 8 1-2 o'clock.

#### MONDAY MORNING.

8:30 O'CLOCK, SEPT. 22.

Met pursuant to adjournment.

The Moderator called the Association to order and offered prayer.

The Roll of Messengers called and absentees noted, and the

Rules of Decorum read by the Clerk.

On motion, Eld. Isaac McGlamery and D. E. McGlamery were received as messengers from Antioch Church, Scott county, and Jordan Simmons from Sulphur Springs Church, Montgomery county.

Bro. W. R. Moore, messeng from the newly constituted

"Buffalo Baptist Church," presented a petitionary letter from said church, which was received and the right hand of fellowship extended to him by the Moderator.

On motion, Eld. T. B. Phelps was allowed to present a statistical letter from New Hope Baptist Church No. 2.

The Moderator announced the appointment of the following committees:

On Finance—Eld. Isaac McGlamery and Bros. J. Scott and A. J. Ausbern.

On Destriction—Eld. John Dilbeck and Bros. James Jeffry and A. J. Robins.

ON TEMPERANCE—Eld. Levi Johnson and Bros. Jordan Simmons and John P. Faith.

ON PUBLICATION—Eld. J. M. Green, John S. Robinson and H. P. Coffman.

ON SABBATH-SCHOOLS—Eld. T. B. Phelps, J. W., Smith, T. W. Pierce and W. R. Moore.

ON OBITUARIES—Elds. J. M. Green, N. C. Ridling, H. Ellison and Bro. E. R. Box.

On motion, the Moderator appointed the following committee to draft and report an order of business: Elds. T. B. Phelps, H. Ellison, John Dilbeck and Bro. James Standrige.

The following committees presented their reports which were received and adopted:

On Finance, see appendix A.

On Sabbath-schools, see appendix B.

On Order of Business, see appendix C.

On Publications, see appendix D.

On Obituaries, see appendix E.

The Committee on Destitution made their report and on motion it was referred back to said committee with instructions to amend said report.

Bro. E. R. Box offered the following, which was adopted:

Whereas our constitution requires each church to select its own messengers to meet with this body.

Resolved that we will receive none hereafter chosen in any other way.

The following offered by T. B. Phelps was adopted.

Resolved that this body recommend to the churches comprising this Association to represent their Sabbath-schools in their statistical letters.

Prayer was offered by Eld. J. M. Green. Adjourned until tomorrow morning, 8 1-2 o'clock.

#### TUESDAY MORNING.

8:30 O'CLOCK,

Met pursuant to adjournment. The Moderator called the Association to order, and prayer was offered by Eld. T. B. Phelps.

The Committee on Destitution presented their annual report, which was received. Bro. Box offered to amend the report so as to authorize the Executive Committee to select the missionary or missionaries which was not agreed to, and the report was then on motion adopted, see appendix "I."

On motion, Elder E. L. Compere was invited to preach at 11 o'clock on the subject of ministerial support.

A collection was taken up for Home Missions, and the sum of \$5.50 was contributed in cash and \$55.55 in pledges.

Elds. H. C. Ridling and T. B. Phelps, as missionaries appointed by this body at its last annual session, presented their reports, which were received, see appendices L and M.

Eld. Levi Johnson was chosen to labor as missionary in the bounds of this Association for the ensuing associational year.

On motion, the Moderator appointed the following committee to report on the boundary of the Association: Elds. H. C. Ridling, J. M. Green, Isaac McGlamery and Bros. J. W. Smith and E. R. Box who submitted their report, which was adopted, see appendix "G."

Eld. J. M. Green was appointed to preach the introductory sermon at the next meeting of this body and Eld. H. Ellison alternate, and Eld. Levi Johnson to preach the missionary sermon at 11 o'clock, A. M., and Elder Isaac McGlamery alternate.

On motion, the Clerk was instructed to have 600 Minutes printed by the St. Louis Baptist Publishing Company.

The Association took recess to attend Divine service, and after listening to an able sermon delivered by Eld. E. L. Compere,

setting forth the Scriptural authority for ministerial support from the text "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they who preach the Gospel should live by the Gospel," came together and were called to order by the Moderator.

The Moderator appointed the following Executive Committee to conduct the missionary work of this Association, as per plan reported by the Committee on Destitution: Thomas Wright, J. M. Green, W. J. Neighbors, T. B. Phelps and A. J. Robins.

The next session of the Association was appointed to be held with the Union Grove Church, Sevier county, Ark., commencing on Saturday before the 3d Sunday in September, A. D., 1885.

The following offered by J. M. Green was adopted:

Whereas the town of Dallas is a very destitute, and very im-

portant point in our boundary, and

WHEREAS the General Association of Western Arkansas and Indian Territory has been able to aid us somewhat in our work

Therefore, Resolved, that the gratitude of this Association is expressed for any aid that has been given, and that this body will be very grateful if further help can be given us, either from the General Association of Western Arkansas and Indian Territory or the Board of Home Missions of the Southern Baptist Convention, and especially in the establishment of our cause in Dallas.

To General Association of Western Arkansas and Indian Territory, Elds. Isaac McGlamery, II. C. Ridling, J. M. Green, T. B. Phelps and Bro. W. F. Ridling. The first named person on each list of messengers to write letters of correspondence.

The report of the Treasurer was read and adapted, see ap-

pendix "K."

The Treasurer was directed to pay over to Eld. T. B. Phelps the sum of one dollar (\$1.80) and eighty cents. the amount in his hands of last year's contribution of Home Missions.

On motion, the clerks of this body were allowed \$5.00 for

their services.

Resolved that the thanks of this body are due Concord Church and the brethren and friends in this vicinity for the kindness and hospitality shown this Association.

Adjourned to meet with Union Baptist Church, Sevier county, Ark., on Saturday before the 3d Sunday in September, A. D., 1885.

Prayer was offered by Eld. T. B. Phelps, and while a hymn was sung the parting hand was given.
