## PROCEEDINGS.

FORREST CITY, Sr. FRANCIS Co., ARK., Friday October 2, 1880.

The Mt. Vernon Baptist Association met according to adjournment with the Forrest City Baptist Church at 10 o'clock A. M. The Association was called to order by the Moderator, Deacon H. P. ### REPORT ON TEMPERANCE.

Resolved. That we hold that true Bible temperance is the restraint and control of all the appetites, passions, Justs and habits in obedience to the will of Christ; that it is a Christian grace, as affirmed by Paul in Gal. 5:22-23 and by Peter in 11 Peter 1:5-6, and must depend for its existence and support on the washing of regeneration and the renewing of the Holy Ghost.

Reserved. That in view of the terrible prevalence of drunkenness we recognize the necessity of special earnestness in the application of the great Gospel remedy for this sin with all its

concomitants.

Resolved, That we recognize the right of civil government to prohibit the importation, manufacture and sale of intoxicants, and that we pledge our co-operation in all legitimate efforts to suppress the great evil of intemperance.
