CONSTITUTION

(As Amended at 1933, 1943, 1948, 1950, 1951, 1953, 1954,
1956 and 1957 Sessions)

ARTICLE I—NAME

The name of this body shall be the Pulaski County Baptist Association, Incorporated.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this Association shall be to awaken and stimulate among the churches of the Association, the greatest possible activity in Evangelism, Christian Education, Missions and Benevolences, throughout the bounds of the Association; to cultivate closer co-operation among the churches and to promote concert of action in advancing all the interest of the Kingdom of God.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of Messengers from regular co-operating churches, which are in sympathy with the principles and purposes of this Constitution and desire to co-operate with this Association, who shall be entitled to seats upon presentation of letters from their churches or other satisfactory evidence of their appointment.

Section 2. Each church shall be entitled to a minimum of three messengers. One additional messenger shall be allowed for every 50 resident church members above 100. No church, however, may have more than 10 messengers.

Section 3. Messengers from churches desiring to affiliate with this Association shall present to the Association in Annual Meeting, Petitionary Letters or evidence, setting forth the Articles of Faith on which the church was organized, together with satisfactory evidence of the regularity of their organization. They shall be received into the Association by receiving two-thirds of the votes cast.

ARTICLE IV—AUTHORITY

This Association shall never exercise any authority, legislative or ecclesiastical, over any church. Nor shall it in any way interfere with the rights and absolute independence of any church.

ARTICLE V—OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be elected the first session of the second day and who shall take office the closing

session of the last day of the annual Associational meeting. Said officers to be elected by a majority vote cast at such meeting. The Moderator shall not be eligible to serve more than two successive terms. The Clerk and the Treasurer may be the same person.

Section 2. The Moderator shall preside at all sessions of the Association; or request the Vice-Moderator to preside. The Vice-Moderator will also preside in the absence of the Moderator. The Moderator shall exercise the same privilege of discussion as any other member of the body.

Section 3. The Clerk shall keep a correct record of the Proceedings of the Association in annual meeting, the Executive Board in regular or called meetings, and the Missions Committee in regular or called meetings. He shall be responsible for the printing and distribution of the proceedings of the annual meeting; the taking and preserving of the minutes of all Executive Board and Missions Committee meetings as the Association may direct.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of every kind entrusted to him and shall disburse the same upon the order of the Executive Board and shall make an itemized statement of receipts and disbursements monthly to the Executive Board and an annual statement to the Association in annual session. The Treasurer shall be bonded by the Association, at the Association's expense. An annual audit shall be made of his books by a reputable accountant. This fee shall be paid by the Association.

ARTICLE VI—EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of one lay member, elected by each co-operating church, together with the pastor of each co-operating church and the officers of the Association. FIFTEEN members of said Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall meet one time each month in regular meeting, time and place to be determined by the Board. In case of special meetings written notice must be given to each Board member. The Moderator and Clerk of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Board.

Section 3. The Executive Board shall receive reports, in the monthly meetings, from the following:

Treasurer's Report.

Associational Missionary.

Superintendent of Associational Sunday School.

Director of Associational Training Union.

Chairman of Evangelism.

President of the Associational Brotherhood.
Superintendent of the Associational W.M.U.
Director of Associational Music Program.
Director of Student Union Work in the Association.
Library Committee.
Recommendations of the Missions Committee.

Section 4. The Executive Board shall be constituted and empowered by the Association as its legal agent to administer all business committed to it by the Association and to employ such paid agents as it may deem necessary in carrying on the Missionary, Education, Benevolent and Financial work of the Association.

Section 5. The Executive Board shall render to the Association in Annual meeting a summary statement of all the business for the year. Same to be printed in the minutes.

ARTICLE VII—STANDING COMMITTEES

I. Missions Committee

Section 1. The Association in Annual meeting, through the Nominating Committee, shall elect a standing committee known as the Missions Committee. This committee shall be composed of twelve members. Members of the Missions Committee shall serve for a term of three years. Each year four members shall complete their terms and shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of at least one year.

Section 2. The Officers of the Association and the elected Associational Organization leaders, shall be ex-officio members of the Committee with all rights of discussion and voting.

Section 3. The Missions Committee shall have the responsibility of selecting and nominating the Associational Missionary or any other paid agents of the Association, and to recommend their employment to the Executive Board in regular meetings, or properly called special meetings.

Section 4. The duties of the Missions Committee shall be as follows:

- (1.) To serve as a nominating committee for any paid officer or worker of the Association. These nominations are to be brought to the Executive Board.
- (2.) To plan a program of mission work for the Association. This is to be an active and aggressive program of planning. This committee should present a challenging and progressive program of work.

- (3.) To see that the plans for Associational work are promoted effectively.
- (4.) To plan a program of benevolences. This should be a well thought out program including all such needs. Plans for promoting the activities should be initiated by this committee.
- (5.) To plan a comprehensive program with regard to Christian Education. This committee should ascertain the needed projects, set the emphases, and actively promote the work.
- (6.) To correlate the activities and projects of the Association with the adopted cooperative program. This committee should actively work toward the end of keeping all of our Baptist program under direct supervision in co-operation with the cooperative program plan. These projects should be clearly thought through and planned in connection with the budget committee each year.
- (7.) To work toward the establishment of new units of mission work in the Association. To facilitate this phase of the work the Chairman of the Missions Committee shall appoint a special committee of three from the membership of the Missions Committee. This shall be known as the Missions and Survey Committee. The duties of the committee shall be:
 - (a) To survey the entire Association to determine the areas where new churches or missions should be established, and to locate property in such areas suitable for building sites.
 - (b) To recommend to the Missions Committee expenditures from the Missions Expansion Fund toward securing such property. The Mission Committee will then study their findings and recommendations and bring to the Executive Board for final action those projects they endorse.
 - (c) To solicit the assistance of sponsoring churches in establishing work in areas which have been approved by the Executive Board.
 - (d) To assist and advise all groups desiring to establish Baptist Churches and Missions in the territorial limits of Pulaski County to the end that all such works may secure the most desirable and strategic locations to serve the people of this association.
 - (e) To survey the areas to be served by each proposed new work and recommend to the Missions Committee the nature and extent of any assistance that the Association should provide in each case. The Missions Committee would in turn study their recommendation and

submit to the Executive Board a final recommendation in each instance.

- (f) To recommend to the Missions Committee all salary supplements to pastor's of missions and needy churches. Commitments for supplements shall be made for periods not to exceed one year. They may be renewed by recommendation of the Committee in deserving cases.
- (8.) This Committee shall never exercise any authority over the churches. Its sole function shall be that of advising the local congregation, desiring to establish a new work, in the matter of securing the most strategic location and assist them in securing the sponsorship of a mother church, if desirable. Any group desiring associational assistance in securing property and for pastor's salary supplements would be expected to counsel with this committee in locating their work. If a church forms spontaneously or a local church establishes a new mission without counselling with the Missions and Survey Committee, no attempt will be made to tell them they cannot do so. The Association must then decide whether or not to welcome the new church into the fellowship.
- (9.) The Missions Committee should correlate the activity of the Associational organizations. Plans should be made together so as to avoid conflicts.
- (10.) The Chairman of the Missions Committee will appoint committees within the committee when such are needed to carry out the duties of the Missions Committee with regard to the above items.

II. Committee on Order of Business

1. The Committee on Order of Business shall consist of the Moderator and Clerk of the Association, Host Pastor, Associational Missionary and the elected leaders of the Associational Organizations.
2. This committee shall be charged with making the Annual meetings as spiritual, inspirational and informational, as is possible to do so. Preaching shall have a prominent place in the meetings.
3. This committee shall publish a tentative order of business for distribution at the first session of the Annual meeting.

III. Nominating Committee

1. This committee shall be composed of five members elected by the messengers during the first day's session of the annual Associational meeting. This committee shall be elected as follows:

- a. The chairman of the Executive Board of the Association shall appoint a committee of five executive board members to serve as a special nominating committee to nominate members of the Standing Nominating Committee.
 - b. This duly appointed special nominating committee will present nominations for the five members of the standing nominating committee during the first day's session of the annual Associational meeting.
 - c. The right of nominations from the floor shall not be abridged.
2. The duties of the Standing Nominating Committee shall be as follows:
- a. They shall name the standing committees of the Association, except those otherwise provided for in this Constitution, and they shall nominate the membership of such committees which shall report at the Annual meeting.
 - b. They shall nominate the leaders of the Associational Organizations.
 - c. They shall nominate the members of the Missions Committee as provided in Article VII, Section 1, paragraph 1.
 - d. This committee shall make any necessary nominations to fill vacancies which occur during the year in these committees or offices. These nominations shall be submitted to the Executive Board in regular or called meetings.

ARTICLE VIII—MEETINGS

Section 1. The Association shall meet annually on a date designated at each Annual meeting. If no date is set, the Executive Board will designate one.

ARTICLE IX—ASSOCIATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

Section 1. The Associational Organizations shall be: Sunday School, Training Union, Woman's Missionary Union, Baptist Brotherhood, Music, Library, Student Work and Evangelism.

Section 2. Leaders of these organizations shall be elected as provided in Article VII, Section 3 (paragraph (2) b.).

Section 3. The Associational Organizations shall correlate their activities through the Missions Committee. A Calendar of Activities shall be planned and followed. Said organizations, through their

leaders, will make monthly reports to the Executive Board of work done and work proposed.

ARTICLE X—HOW AMENDED

This Constitution may be amended at any Annual meeting of the Association by a TWO-THIRDS VOTE of the Messengers present and voting, provided that the substance of Article IV shall not be abrogated.

RULES OF ORDER

Roberts Rules of Order shall be the standard in deciding questions of parliamentary practice.

Note 1: BSU Center Property—Little Rock University, is subject to first mortgage to secure Note Payable of \$6,000.00 to Worthen Bank and Trust Company due October 27, 1961. This property is being rented out pending removal of frame dwelling and construction of Center.

Note 2: BSU Center Building at the University of Arkansas Medical School was built jointly by the Association and the Arkansas Baptist State Convention. The Association's share of the building cost was financed by a \$15,000.00 loan from the Worthen Bank and Trust Company, which is guaranteed by the following churches of the Association in the percentages as indicated:

Little Rock, Second	33 1/3%
Little Rock, First	16 2/3%
Pulaski Heights	16 2/3%
Park Hill, North Little Rock	16 2/3%
Baring Cross, North Little Rock	16 2/3%

The loan is repayable at \$286.22 per month over a 5 year period from September 1960. Title to this property has been transferred to the State Convention.

Note 3: On March 2, 1959 a promissory note of \$7,075.00 was executed by Trustees of the Second Baptist Church, Little Rock, Arkansas, to the Association for its equity in the Longview Baptist Church property to be collectible only in the event this property is used for purposes other than a Southern Baptist Church. A value of \$1.00 has been assigned to this note for financial statement presentation.

Note 4: By agreement executed in January 1959, the Association and as agent for other parties, has an option to buy the fixed properties of the Forest Highlands Baptist Church, Little Rock, Arkansas, in return for church aid in the event only that Forest Highlands ceases to be a cooperating Southern Baptist Church or desires to relocate. A value of \$1.00 has been assigned to this agreement for financial statement presentation.

Note 5: As of May 1, 1961 the Association authorized an issue totalling \$18,500.00 of Serial Coupon Debenture Bonds, Series A. At September 30, 1961 \$12,900.00 of these bonds had been issued and were outstanding. The monthly sinking fund payments are \$250.00.

BROTHERHOOD REPORT

The Brotherhood movement has made good progress during the past year under the new plan of Brotherhood organization and work which became effective on October 1, 1960. The new plan includes a greatly simplified organizational structure, and a streamlined program of work. The work program challenges the best that men have to offer in four great areas of activity. These areas are:

1. Royal Ambassadors (work with boys)
2. Christian Witnessing (evangelism on the personal level)
3. Personal Stewardship (stewardship on the personal level)
4. World Missions (missions everywhere in the world)

The new plan is more readily understood by the men of our churches; and the work program is so comprehensive that any willing Christian man can grow in knowledge of God's work and develop into a well-rounded and effective servant of God and a productive member of his church.

Arkansas Baptist churches with brotherhoods baptized 59% of the baptismal total in Arkansas in 1960; and gave through the Co-operative Program 75% of the total of such gifts.

The Associational Brotherhood held only one meeting in the course of the year. They sponsored the Junior and Intermediate Royal Ambassador Baseball Games for Pulaski County. Plans for next year include election of a full slate of officers and holding the quarterly meetings for both Brotherhood and Royal Ambassadors. There will be three sections for Royal Ambassadors. They are included in the new RA program: Crusaders for boys 9, 10, and 11 years of age; Pioneers for boys 12, 13, and 14 years of age; and Ambassadors for boys 15, 16, and 17.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT

Pulaski County Baptists have a responsibility to our Baptist College and the institution of higher learning that are operated by the Southern Baptist Convention. Two other institutions claim our interest because of the support that is given to them. Southern Baptist College receives some money from the State Convention each year. The Southern Baptist Convention supports the American Baptist Theological Seminary jointly with the National Baptist Convention.

In general, 1960-61 was a year of record growth for Southern Baptist educational institutions. Enrollments showed a gain of about 4,000 students over 1959-60. The 71 schools operated by the Baptist groups reported 10,336 graduates from September, 1959 to August, 1960. Total gifts for the institutions amounted to \$14,880,879.00. An additional \$9,022,464 was received in grants and donations.

Here in our own state Ouachita Baptist College will benefit from a proposed recommendation from the Convention's Executive Board. The substance of the recommendation is that the convention give Ouachita permission to conduct a campaign to raise \$1,286,000.00 for her endowment principal which will give her a total of \$2,000,000.00. With an average yield of 4.75% this would give her \$95,000.00 per year for operational expense. It should be noted that Ouachita Baptist College's endowment fund principal, at its inception in 1927, totaled \$521,076.00. In 1961, 34 years later, it had increased to \$714,524, or a total of \$193,448 had been added. Of this increase, the Ford Foundation contributed \$188,000.00 in 1957-58 leaving a total of \$5,448.00 added to the fund from all other sources over the 34-year period.

Southern Baptist College, which is not owned nor administered by our State Convention, reported "noteworthy gains . . . in all areas of service . . ." Enrollment was up 26% and a new dormitory for men was completed and a new unit was added to the Women's Dormitory. The college, not now accredited by the N. C. A., expects to be examined within a year for accreditation.

Golden Gate Seminary reported a graduating class of 90 for this year. Four degrees — B. D. and Th. M in Theology and the M. R. E. in Religious Education and B. C. M. in Church Music — may now be enrolled for.

Midwestern Seminary reports a "gradual but certain growth." Her first commencement was scheduled for May 12, 1961, with 57 degree candidates. Dr. Herschel Hobbs was the scheduled speaker.

New Orleans Seminary, with three schools, reports a total of 38 faculty members and 314 of her student body of 900 are enrolled in the School of Theology.

In 1960 Southeastern reported 200 graduates. The enrollment for 1961 was 790. In 1961 she began her tenth year of operation and special recognition services were held. Strong emphasis has been placed on building up the library and endowing it. The total number of mission volunteers exceeds 40.

Southern is "not only 'the mother seminary' but it is also a pioneer seminary." Her pioneering has been in the development of a department of missions, in the field of missions, religious education, and in the field of psychology of religion. She has 45 faculty members, 23 instructors, and 47 fellows and teaching assistants. The 1960-61 enrollment was 1,170. There were 294 degrees awarded in 1961.

Southwestern, now in her 53rd year, awarded 498 degrees to 490 people during 1960-61. This is the largest number ever awarded by any of our seminaries in a single year. Total enrollment reached 2,280 — 1,361 in the School of Theology, 772 in Religious Education, and 147 in Church Music. New students numbered 667 and mission volunteers, 400. Seven new faculty members were added during 1960-61, and Edwin McNeely, a faculty member of the School of Church Music retired July 31, 1961 after 40 years of service. Three books were written by faculty members. Dr. Frank Segler completed "A Theology of Church Ministry," Dr. H. C. Brown had published "Messages for Men," and C. W. Scudder completed "Danger Ahead." Jo Ann Shelton produced a new Word record entitled "When I Kneel Down to Pray," and two new records were released by the Southwestern Singers.

Carver School of Missions and Social Work has 67 students enrolled. Of this number 13 are men. Carver School has sought accreditation as a School of Social Work. A team from the Southern Association of Colleges visited the school during April 16-19, 1961. A report is not expected until the group conducts its meeting in December of 1961.

The work of Southern Baptists has advanced in accordance with our program of formal training. This is one of our resources that should be strengthened and expanded.

The Co-Operative Program report for this Book of Reports will necessarily include the contributions by churches for the first eleven months of the Associational year only. This is necessitated by the fact that the state does not close their books until the 7th of the month and this report was submitted prior to that time. The total contributions during these first eleven months was \$290,956.12.

It is to be noted that many of our churches did not increase their Co-Operative Program participation even though the receipts in the local church increased. This would indicate that some of us are increasing our local church program at the expense of our worldwide mission program. The population of our world is exploding and we need to be conscious of the fact that most of these will never have the opportunity of knowing Christ as Saviour and Lord unless we, as Baptists, become more concerned. The program which challenges the local church to increase their world mission giving by 2% per year is designed to help the local church feel and share the responsibility for the lost millions around the world.

This committee urgently requests that every church restudy their mission giving and make every possible effort to see that the present percentage is increased by at least 2% for the year 1962.

4. That all churches make full use of the Revival Plan Book for 1962, 1964, supplied free to all pastors by the Division of Evangelism, Home Mission Board and is available from the State Secretary of Evangelism.

5. That our association have an Evangelism Clinic following the suggested program supplied by the Division of Evangelism, Home Mission Board.

6. That our association recognize the elected associational officers as the evangelism committee, the Chairman of Evangelism to be the Chairman of this committee, and that we pledge our whole hearted cooperation to this committee.

7. That our association send the Chairmen of Evangelism to Glorieta or to Ridgecrest for the annual conferences during Home Mission Week.

8. That we commit ourselves to the following outline of achievement for 1962:

- I. CHAIRMAN OF EVANGELISM — An evangelistic pastor elected to serve during associational year. Promotes perennial soul-winning in all churches. Serves as Chairman of Baptist Jubilee Revival Committee.
- II. ASSOCIATIONAL EVANGELISM CLINIC — Annual clinic devoting two sessions exclusively to evangelism. Seventy-five percent of churches represented by pastors. Seventy-five percent of churches with at least three members of their church councils present.
- III. ANNUAL BAPTIST JUBILEE REVIVAL — Eighty percent of churches participating. Eighty percent of churches observing same dates. Eighty percent of churches with two consecutive weeks of evangelistic preaching.
- IV. ALL CHURCHES CONDUCTING REVIVALS—Each church conducting a minimum of one revival annually. Fifty percent of churches conducting two revivals annually. Churches sponsoring missions revivals were needed.
- V. EACH CHURCH WINNING AND BAPTIZING NEW MEMBERS — Churches endeavoring to increase previous year's baptismal record. Seventy-five percent of churches using the church council. Churches sustaining perennial evangelism programs.

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

November 22, 1960, the Missions Committee elected the following officers: W. Harry Hunt, Chairman; Paul Fox, Vice Chairman; Betty O'Pry, Secretary.

Voted to offer the Fourche Dam Pike property to Reynolds Memorial Baptist Church for development.

Voted to loan the Harmony Baptist Church \$500.00 with which to paint their building.

Voted to buy the property on Baseline Road.
December 20, 1960, voted to finance the February Group Training Schools out of the surplus remaining from the last Group Schools and unexpended balance of the operating budget for 1960. The total not to exceed \$1200.00

Voted to "loan" the Missionary to the Christian Civic Foundation for the months of January and February in order that he could sit in on the legislative sessions at the Capitol Building.

January 17, 1961, voted to renew the \$6,000.00 note at Worthen Bank for a period of 90 days to give us time in which to effect our Bond Issue.

February 21, 1961, elected the following committee to work with Dr. T. K. Rucker, Representative of the Annuity Board: Ray Branscum, Chairman; Jerre Hassell; and James O'Cain.

March 21, 1961, voted to invite the churches north of the river to join in the Schools of Missions in February, 1962, and in the "M" Night program, December 4, 1961.

Voted to ask the churches north of the river to participate in the county-wide census and Simultaneous Revivals in 1964.

April 4, 1961, (special meeting) voted to have bonds printed in denominations of \$100.00 each and offer them for sale to the membership of our churches and others.

April 18, 1961, voted to authorize the officers of the Association to renew the \$6,000.00 note at Worthen Bank for six months.

Voted that the proposed budget be presented to the Annual Meeting in October.

May 16, 1961, voted to give the missionary permission to participate in a Schools of Missions in Clinton, Tennessee, September 25-29.

June 20, 1961, voted to hold \$5,600.00 worth of bonds in reserve until October to save the interest for four months on these bonds.

July 18, 1961, voted that the property at the intersection of Remount and Camp Robinson Roads be returned to the State Convention.

Voted that there be no August Missions Committee or Executive Board Meetings.

Voted that the Secretarial Assistant be permitted to join the National Secretaries Association and that the Association pay her membership fee and annual dues.

September 19, 1961, voted that a strong appeal be made to our churches for a more substantial participation in the financial program of the Association.

*Voted to recommend to the Annual Meeting in October, 1961, that the name of the Association be changed from Pulaski County Baptist Association to Pulaski Baptist Association.

INTER-RACIAL REPORT

The Race Relations Department is jointly sponsored by the Home Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention and the Arkansas Baptist State Convention. The purpose of the department is to help Negro Baptists help themselves in developing better churches, church related institutions and organizations.

It has been all but impossible for Negro churches to get financial assistance in building programs at a reasonable rate of interest and in sufficient amounts to meet their needs. We have just succeeded in getting a large church financing company to agree to extend their services to qualified Negro churches.

We realize that many of these churches cannot qualify because of the poor system of financing their church program. In trying to meet this need we have been promoting the Unified Plan. One Negro Baptist State Convention has adopted this plan, and many of their churches are turning to it. The results are amazing! Churches that are using the Unified Budget Plan have seen their church income double and triple.

Another difficulty lies in the fact that about 75 per cent of the Negro Baptist churches in our state are part time, and their pastors do not live in the church field.

Third, they need better church organizations such as Sunday Schools, Training Unions, Brotherhoods, Missionary Societies, etc.

However, there is a bright and encouraging side: (1) The sincere desire on the part of many pastors and church leaders to remedy the needs and meet the challenge of christian service through their churches. (2) The dedication of Negro Baptist young people and children is most encouraging. If given a chance for proper christian development, there is no limit to the progress this coming generation will make in kingdom building. We are offering every possible encouragement to this fine christian group.

Each summer the Race Relations Department provides the only encampment or assembly for Negro children conducted by any church group in the state. There is no way of estimating the value of these encampments in the development of the Negro Baptist leadership of tomorrow. This year we had our best and largest enrollment, 82 girls and 90 boys. Our goal was for a total of 150, we had 172. In these camps many have found Christ as their personal saviour, and others have answered God's call to special service. Eighteen of these children were able to attend camp this year because some white Baptist church organization or individual paid part, or all, of their way. For this we say "thank you and God bless you." We desperately need a camp

ground we can use all summer. We rent Aldersgate at \$12.00 per camper per week, our department pays \$3.50 of this and each camper pays \$8.50.

Our best way to help the Negro Baptists is by helping them to help themselves. Whatever we do should challenge them to do more themselves. This we can do, and are doing, by providing Baptist literature, study course books, tracts, etc., by sharing with them our church organization "know how" in Sunday School, Training Union, Vacation Bible School, Women's Missionary Union, etc., by suggesting materials, programs, and techniques, by helping them train their church leadership, by conducting Vacation Bible Schools or Clinics, in church finance, budgets, and stewardship training, by leading them to

feel a missionary challenge, and responsibility, by assisting them in church building programs, in youth assemblies, encampments, and in training Baptist leadership on the college level.

Almost every church and association, where there is a large Negro population, could find some way to serve in the name and spirit of Jesus Christ, in this part of your Jerusalem. And I am happy to report that many churches and associations are doing a most effective work in this field. The numbers of churches and associations meeting this challenge has greatly increased this year. How we live and witness in Our Jerusalem, as Southern Baptists, will determine the effectiveness of our witness "Unto the uttermost part of the earth." Foreign Missions begin at home! Christ is the Answer at Home and Abroad.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

At the Southern Baptist Convention meeting in Miami, Florida, in May, 1960, a Stewardship Commission was created, and became fully operative January 1, 1961. It was charged with the responsibility for stewardship promotion heretofore conducted by the Executive Committee.

This commission was concerned with information of a composite program of (1) Cooperative Program promotion, (2) Stewardship development, and (3) Endowment and Capital Giving promotion. Arkansas was one of the first of twenty states to hold such a state stewardship conference.

The basic principles of current Cooperative Program promotion are (1) give more attention to planning on a long-range basis, (2) the percentage plan of giving being more emphatically stressed and receiving wider emphasis, (3) more thorough promotion of "2 plus" as a planned escalator for annual increase, and (4) the fuller utilization of organizations, programs, personnel, and communication media in cooperative program promotion.

Attention is called (1) to the work of the Audio-Visual Department of the Sunday School Board which has produced four new 12-minute stewardship "vignette" films: "What First?," "What Direction?," "What's Important?," and "What's Left?," (2) a new series of "Thank you" tracts for insertion in the churches' mailings of members' records of contributions, and (3) the new 1961 edition of Forward Program materials which furnish ample stepping-stones to more successful stewardship.

In the first annual report of the Stewardship Commission at the Southern Baptist Convention in St. Louis, May 1961, a program of Endowment and Capital Giving promotion was presented. The emphasis and objective of this particular phase is the development of attitudes of Christian Stewardship in making wills. A film is made available through our State Foundation Secretary, "Treasures in Heaven," and a new tract "Before It's Too Late." Both we heartily recommend.

During Baptist Jubilee Advance 1961, with emphasis on Stewardship and Enlistment, the theme of the year's emphasis has been "I Will be Faithful." We believe it is the conviction of every informed Baptist that the Stewardship Program of Southern Baptists is the fundamental, effective, and indispensable channel of providing for the needs of all our work, and we urge all Baptists to join in giving it their loyal and undivided support.

The Associational Rally was held on May 15, at the Park Hill Baptist Church in North Little Rock. There were only 127 people present. The next Rally will be November 20, 1961 at the Gaines Street Baptist Church in Little Rock at 7:15 P. M.

III. SUNDAY SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF MISSIONS

Our Association has had an eventful year with some progress being made in some of our areas of work to which we had looked forward. The missionary traveled approximately 32,000 miles on the church field during the past twelve months, preached 104 sermons, conducted two revivals, conducted two decision services in two of our Vacation Bible Schools with 32 professions of faith, conducted 27 prayer meetings in various churches in the Association, met with numerous church committees, assisted several churches in their business meetings, participated in various other related Associational and church activities, and attended Home Mission Week at Ridgecrest during August, 1961. Below is a brief summary of major events during the year.

1. Group Schools for Training Union were conducted during February in which there were approximately 1,250 enrolled. This is apparently the largest enrollment that a school of this nature has had in our Association.

2. The group of our churches located north of the Arkansas River presented a resolution to the Executive Board stating their intention to form an Association consisting of the Southern Baptist churches north of the river.

3. Two pieces of real estate were purchased for the purpose of establishing new work. One is located on the Fourche Dam Pike east of the Little Rock Airport, and in the area of the Hermitage Homes and Richland additions. The other is located on Baseline Road adjacent to the Christian Church and across the street from the Baseline Road Elementary School. Purchase price of the Fourche Dam Pike property was \$8,300.00 and the Baseline Road property, \$15,000.00

4. A \$50,000.00 Bond Program for the purpose of purchasing church and mission sites was authorized at the last Annual Associational Meeting. This program was launched in May by issuing \$18,500.00 in 6% interest bearing bonds. The proceeds of this Series "A" issue were for the purpose of completing the payment on the property on Fourche Dam Pike and Baseline Road.

5. The Superintendent of Missions' services were loaned to the Arkansas Christian Civic Foundation during January and February for the purpose of working with the legislature on moral issues which confront our state.

6. The Southwest Baptist Church was formed from among the membership of one of the churches in our Association. This church is meeting in a building located at 5420 West 35th, Little Rock.

7. The Chapel Hill Baptist Mission of the First Baptist Church, Jacksonville, was opened for services on the first Sunday in October, 1960.

8. A mission was begun by one of the ministers in our Association in the College Station area and became a mission of the McKay Baptist Mission. McKay is sponsored by the Second Baptist Church.

9. There were 5,991 training awards earned during the past year.

TRAINING UNION ANNUAL REPORT

Realizing that the church member is in need of training because he is a new citizen in a new kingdom, and in keeping with the Baptist Jubilee Advance with special emphasis on teaching and training for world-wide evangelism, we present the following brief report of the Training Union program of activities of the 1961 associational year.

The purpose of the Associational Training Union is (1) to magnify the New Testament Doctrine of Christian service. It is composed of churches in the association which have Training Unions and which cooperate with the state Baptist convention. The associational Training Union, then, by virtue of its closeness to the needs in the association has an opportunity to promote a program of Christian education which had its beginning in the New Testament. It should magnify Paul's admonition in II Timothy 2:15 where he writes, "study to shew

thy self approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of Truth." This same thought is expressed in II Peter 3:18, "But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

Activities and events such as the book awards earned and awarded in categories one to fifteen (Bible, Doctrine, Stewardship, etc.) and in category eighteen (Training Union principles and methods) produce trained workmen through our church study course program for teaching and training.

(2) It provides a channel through which the strong churches can help the weak churches. The associational Training Union is a service organization. It exists only to help the churches. Our strong churches need to be confronted with this challenge. They have been called upon to help organize new Training Unions, to teach study courses, and lead conferences at the State Training Union Assembly Week at Siloam Springs. Leaders were asked and gave of their time to lead discussion groups and conferences at the mass meetings and the quarterly officers and leaders conferences. These strong churches play a great part in the financing of our total association budget for promotion and training expenditures.

(3) It provides a denominational organization through which state and convention workers can help churches. Our Associational program makes it possible for these state and convention leaders to help through the state-wide clinics and workshops, summer assemblies, and enlargement campaigns.

(4) It provides opportunities to bring to all the churches the best in materials, methods and techniques. When Training Union leaders get together in associational meetings, they exchange plans they have found workable. They learn from one another. They trade ideas. They help one another in many ways.

(5) It promotes the evangelistic, educational, and mission program of the denomination. Its program includes "M" Night or Mobilization Night annually. This service has as its main purpose, the mobilizing of the Training Union forces to a greater zeal in evangelism and a world-wide mission program. It includes the promotion of the church, association, district, and state-wide Junior Memory Work-Sword Drill Tournaments, Intermediate Sword Drill, and Young Peoples' Speaker's Tournaments. It promotes the associational youth night, youth week, and state youth convention.

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION ANNUAL REPORT

It has been said it has always been costly to be different from other people. For 2,721 women in one association to belong to an organization to serve is truly different, but these women were able to say with Paul, "For the love of Christ constraineth us," and thus the secret of that difference becomes evident.

The purpose of the Woman's Missionary Union is to promote Christian missions through a program of mission study, prayer, community missions, and stewardship. In missionary societies in 62 churches this program was promoted as well as a program for educating our youth in missions. There are Sunbeam Bands, Girls' Auxiliaries, Young Women's Auxiliaries, and Women's Missionary Societies that totaled 396 organizations for Pulaski County Association, with 5,212 enrolled in all reported organizations.

The purpose of the Associational Woman's Missionary Union is to assist these 62 churches in enlistment for missionary education and to provide a program of leadership training. To accomplish this, four quarterly rallies were held with conferences for instruction of each local officer and a guest speaker for inspiration. In addition to these opportunities, a two-day Woman's Missionary Society Leadership Course was taught by the President, a two-day Sunbeam Workshop under the direction of the Sunbeam Director, and a Mission Study Institute planned by the Mission Study Director.

In addition to these rallies there were four quarterly YWA Council Meetings and four quarterly GA Rallies. At one of these GA Rallies over 225 girls participated in a Coronation Service magnifying the Bible study and work the girls have accomplished as they strive to train themselves for queenly service in His Kingdom.

The Associational WMU has directed a program of community service serving the Girls' Training School, State Hospital, County Hospital, Fort Roots Hospital, McRae Sanatorium, University Hospital, and Arkansas Baptist Hospital.

Each woman of us has humbly taken the chorus of our hymn for this year as our challenge:

"We will give, We will pray,
We will witness every day
That the missions of the whole wide world
May know our Saviour's love."
