Orphans' Home.

J. F. Brice read the report on Orphans' Home:

We, your committee on Orphans' Home. report the following:

Whereas the Baptist of Arkansas owe it to our people and to our God to care for the orphans of our State. We have an Orphans' Home at Monticello in which are 58 children. Said home consists of 12 rooms, completed, furnished and paid for. It is a combination of conveniences as is required for the the nursing and training the orphans and educating them, physically, morally, intellectually and religiously.

We therefore urge our people to contribute liberally for its support.

As there seems to be some dissatisfaction among the churches as to plan of work, we recommend that this body elect the Board for the ensuing year, and this Board meet at once, cultivate the fields already worked, and send missionaries to as many destitute points as possible.

We further recommend that pastors take collections regularly to support this

work.

We find that there are about 300 Baptist Sunday Schools in the State, and only about 14 in the bounds of our association, with an enrollment of 916 pupils who meet on the Lord's day to study the Bible. We should do much better than this with a membership of 1995 Baptists. We would urge the churches of this association to push this important work.

Foreign Missions.

The report on Foreign Missions was read by W. E. Kim-

brough.

It is an apparent fact of Scripture that through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, provision was made for the salvation of the entire race and that it is the will of our Lord that the gospel of salvation be preached "in all the world" and "to every creature."

It is also plain that the duty of publishing the gospel rests upon the Lord's churches and people; that the commission of Christ, His spirit and example, the acts of the apostles and early disciples, and our possession of the gospel demand of us the speedy and complete discharge of this obligation "among all nations."

The cause of missions is one inseparable work whether conducted at home or abroad. The duty is as binding to go to the "uttermost part of the earth," as the "beginning at Jerusalem."

Baptists may well feel proud that they were among the leaders in instituting the modern missionary enterprise, and should feel that they, with sufficient reasons, are called upon to maintain

distinct as well as world-wide missionary effort.

Southern Baptists have made reasonable advances in this work during the few years past, and each year witnesses a creditable increase in contributions and happy spiritual results in the several fields; but the great needs and opportunities for the enlargement of the work should awaken us to more united, liberal and prayerful effort.

For statistics and general information concerning the work, we recommend that our people read the Foreign Mission Journal and the various tracts published by the Foreign Mission Board.

2—They should try to prevent others from using it and thus save them from its awful effects.

3—Our preachers should preach against it and our people pray for the time to come when it shall be driven from our land.

4—All voters should be very careful to vote for those men who are in sympathy with the temperance cause and under no circumstances to vote for drunkards.

We advise our churches to discipline the drunkards, dram drinkers and whiskey sellers and exhort our pastors to instruct the people on this important subject and seek to advance the great cause of temperance.

The Executive Board met at Havana in November and or ganized by electing J. W. Richardson, Chairman and J. I. Cowger, Secretary. Other meetings were held, the last of which was at Belleville in February.

At the first meeting it was decided to employ four missionaries, one in each district and pay each a salary of \$125 00 for his

entire time till the association.

It was the last of February before men could be found to take the work.

Eld. E. H. Gray and Eld. W. N. Womack were employed for the first district, Eld. W. N. Dodd in the 4th and Eld G. W. Hunnicutt was tendered the work at Havana and Belleville but did not accept.

Eld. L. A. Robertson was sent to Zion and Eld. R. R. Elmore to Baker's Creek. The Board also supplemented the salary

of Eld. J. D. Stringfellow at Mt. Zion \$25.00.

Articles of Faith.

I. We believe in one only true and living God, the Father,

Son and Holy Spirit.

2. We believe that the scriptures of the Old and New Testament are a revelation from God, and that the New Testament is our only rule of faith and practice.

3. We believe in the doctrine of election as founded in the fore-knowledge of God, through sanctification of the Spirit unto obedience, and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ.

4. We believe in original sin by the fall of Adam.

- 5. We believe in man's incapacity by his own free will and ability, to rescue himself from a fallen state in, which he is by nature.
- 6. We believe that the saints are justified in the sight of God by the imputed righteousness of Christ only.

7. We believe that the saints will be preserved in grace, and

never fall finally away.

8. We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ; that believers are the only proper subjects of Baptism, and that immersion is the apostolic mode.

9. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, and a general judgment: and that the felicity of the righteous and the punish-

ment of the wicked will be eternal.

ro. We believe no minister has a right to administer the ordinances of the Gospel but one who has been regularly immersed, and that is called and comes under the imposition of the hands of a Scriptural Presbytery.

11. We believe that none but regularly immersed believers

have a right to come to the Lord's Supper.

12. We believe that the Lord's day should be kept as a day of rest and devotional exercises.
