The adequate and liberal support of the Ministry of the Gospel is the simple and positive duty of the churches of Jesus Christ. As Histrants, and as His poor, He throws them upon His people as their

special care. He tells His laborers to go forth, bearing the word of life, preaching the Gospel to a lost world, and their peace is to come upon all by whom they may be received, and, as His laborers, they are worthy of their hire. God has ordained that they who preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel, hence, all other conditions or modifications of this rule, are positive violations of the Law of Christ, and, in practical results, hurtful to the interests and in the way of the success of His cause.

We, therefore, call upon the churches of the Association to ponder the question, whether or not our present leanness, or the low state of our Zion, is not mainly attributable to the neglect and failure to comply with this Law of our Lord and Master? We further commend to their notice and attention, the suggestions embraced in the following

resolutions:

Resolved, That, in order to secure a fair and reliable support of the Ministry of the Word among us, we recommend to the churches, each and severally: 1st. To secure a pastoral home in its midst. 2d. To adopt some plan by which every member of the church shall become a contributor to the support of its Pastor, and see that that plan is carried out.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE 1. This Association shall be known as the Concord Association of Western Arkansas.

ART. 2. It shall be composed of Messengers from Baptist churches known to be in good standing. Each church with fifty members or less shall de entitled to three messengers. Each additional fifty members shall entitle the church to one additional messenger.

ART. 3. The officers shall be a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be chosen by ballot, at each annual session, and shall contin-

ue in office 'till their successors are chosen.

ART. 4. SEC. 1.—It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the body according to parliamentary usage. SEC. 2.—The Clerk shall keep a correct record of the proceedings, attend to the publication and distribution of the minutes, keep a regular file of the printed minutes of the sessions of the body, and deliver the same to his successor in office. SEC. 3.—The Treasurer shall take charge of the funds of the Association, holding them subject to an order from the Association or its Executive Committee, and render an account of the same to the annual session of this body.

ART. 5. The objects of this Association shall be, to promote fellowship among the churches; to secure unanimity of faith; to encourage concert in operation, and especially to cultivate the piety of the churches, and to aid in this last object, several days of each session

shall be spent in devotional exercises.

ART. 6. SEC. 1.—This Association shall in no case interfere with the internal regulations of the churches, but will act as an advisory whenever it shall be necessary. SEC. 2.—It however claims over its own members, the messengers from the churches; withdraw from and disown churches that depart from the of this compact, by becoming heterodox in faith or disordermactice.

7. Newly organized churches, or churches dismissed from associations, may be admitted into this body upon application by and messengers, at our annual meetings, and by their messengers,

to the abstract of principles herewith published.

8. Churches may be dismissed from this Association upon apon at an annual meeting, for the purpose of joining any body a new Association; but wurch departing from us without being regularly dismissed, shall arded as disorderly.

9. There shall be an executive committee consisting of one er from each church, and the officers of the Association shall be Ecio officers of this committee. This committee shall have direcof the missionary opperations of the Association, subject to its and make an annual report of its proceedings at each session Association. Besides the special objects entrusted to the comit shall also have authority to represent the Association in all requiring attention while the Association is not in session. committee shall hold regular meetings on the Saturday preceding fifth Lord's day of the year, at such places as may be designated the committee. The committee shall meet for organization immeafter the adjournment of the Association. Three members shall titute a quorum.

BRT. 10. It shall be the privilege of this Association, in addition powers already granted, to conduct missionary opperations withwithout its limits, and for this purpose to choose a missionary, or conaries, as means may allow, designate the fields of labor, and pay quarterly through their treasury, out of funds to be sent up along the fund for publishing the minutes, to every annual meeting.

BRT. 11. The annual meetings of the Association shall embrace Lord's-day, and shall begin at 11 o'clock, on Saturday before the with Lord's-day of September, at which time the introductory sershall be preached. On each succeeding day the Association shall o'clock, A. M., for preaching.

BRT. 12. This Constitution may be altered or amended, except as trt. 6, Sec. 1, at any regular meting of the Association, by the thirds vote of the members who are in attendance.
