We, the Big Fork United Baptist, Association, met with Brushy Creek Church, on September 10th, 1892. The Introductory sermon was preached by Eld. A. A. Bates, text Epherians. 2 chapt. 21-22 verses. After recess, the Association, was called to order by Moderator, singing and prayer by the Moderator, J. E. Long. On motion, Bro. James. Wilcox, was chosen Clerk, Protein, the letters were then called for, and and Bro's S. M. Kemp, and A. J. Strickland, was appointed to read the letters from the different Churches, the letters were read, and Delegates names enrolled, and by proper organisation the Association proceded to election of Officers. 2d, extended an invitation for Petitionary letters, and received one, from Massedona Ind' Territory, and the Moderator extended the right hand of Fellewship to her Delegater. Then the Clerk read the Minutes of first days work, which was adopted. By motion, read, received, and adopted the minutes.

-{ CONSTITUTION. }-

BIG FORK ASSOCIATION OF UNITED BAPTIST.

Article 1. This union of Churches shall be known, and distinguished, by the name and title of the Big Fork United Baptise Association.

Art. 2. This Association shall be composed of Delegates from churches in union. Every church shall be entitled to three delegates, who shall be required to furnish satisfactory evidence of the appointment by their churches, before taking their sea of

Art. 2. The *Delegates*, when convened, organize them—selves into a deliberate body, by the appointment of a *Moderator* and *Clerk*, who shall be chosen by ballot, at each Annual Asiociation, and continue in office until their successor is chosen.

Art. 4. This Association, shall not interefere with the right of the churches of which it is composed. It shall regard them as independent bodies in all matters of internal government, and shall only act as an advising council, assuming no authority except what is expressly delegated to it by the churches, or evidently implys by the very nature of compact. It, nevertheless, claims authority over its own members, and delegates from the churches, and in justice, and propriety, must have power to withdraw from, and disown, all churches which dipart from the principles of the compact by becoming heterotics in faith, or disorderly in practice. It should therefore report all churches united under this Constitution with a vigilant of for good. Its business shall be to declare, and promote, the Archaetive glory of God. by extending the Kimplom of Circles on earth, through the medium of preacting the Gos-

j l; to cultivate union, and fellwoship with all the churches of Christ, especially, with those united under this Constitution.

Art. 5. Newly constituted churches, or churches dismissed from other Associations, of same faith, and order, may be admitted into this union, on their sending up three delegates to the annual meeting of this Association, with a petiton for admission, and by their delegates agreeing to the abstract of principles herewith published.

Art. 6. The churches in this union, shall transmit to every annual session of this Association, a written communication, specifying the names of their delegates, their number in full fellowship, number haptized, received or excommunicated, restored, or dismissed since last session, and all other information which the church may deem important, which will be read,

and minuted accordingly.

Art. 7. The Association, shall have a fund, supplied by contribution of the churches, and all money thus contributed, shall be transmitted from the churches, and payed over through the Committe on Finance to the Treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot, and hold his office during the pleasure of the Association, and manage the fuds agreeably. He shall return to the order of the Association, and present annually for insertion in the Minutes, a clear, and sufficient statement of all the receipts, and expenditures.

Art. 8. This Association shall take cognizance of no query sent up from the Churches, unless they have endevored to solve the rame and have failed; nor of any difficulty between churches unless they have I unsued the dictations of the 18th chapter Mathew, and have not been able to settle THEM; THEN, THIS Association, SHALL take SUCH matters into consideration, and

act upon them at its descretion.

At 10. It shall be the duty of CLERK OF THE Association, to keep a legular file of THE printed Minutes, of THIS body, and deliver over THE SAME 10 HIS SUCCESSOR IN OFFICE.

Art. 11. This Constitution may be altered, or amen led at regular meetings of the Associations, by the concurring voice of two-thirds of the members present; provided, such alterations or amendments be approved by the churches of the Association.

Art. 12. There are to be no Sunday collections taken up in this Association, nor men appointed to preach what are known.

₹ RULES OF DECORUM. }

1. The Association shall be opened, and closed, by prayer.

2. The Mobinator and Clerk, shall be chosen by the sufferage of the members present.

3. The Moderator, shall be considered a judge of order, and shall have a right to call to order at any time.

4. A member not satisfied with his decision may appeal to

the Association the same day, but not thereafter.

5. But one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise to his feet, address the Moderator, obtain permission, and then proceed to speak.

6. The Moderator, when addressed by a member for permission to speak, shall signify the same by naming the person,

or otherwise.

- 7. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, unless, he departs from the *subject*, or is guilty of personal reflection. Every motion made, and seconded, shall come under the consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by him that made it.
- 8. Every case taken up by the Association, shall be decided, or withdrawn, before another is approved.
- 9. When any question is taken up, after allowing time for debate, the Moderator may take the voice of the Association on all subjects in any way he may think best.

10. Any member wishing to retire, shall obtain permission of

the Moderator.

11. No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject, without permission of the Association, nor more than once, until every member wishing to speak shall have spoken;

nor shall any proposition be made to close the subject until the debate is carried through.

12. The appollation "Brother" shall be used in the Associ-

ation, by members in their address to each other

13. The names of the members, shall be called as often as the Association shall direct.

14. No member shall be tolerated in any practice, which

tends to interrupt public speech.

15. The Moderator, shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as any other member, provided, he appoint another to fill his seat during that time, but shall not be entitled to vote, unless, the Association be evenly divided, when he may east the deciding vote.

16. Any member violating these rules may be reproved by the Moderator, at his discretion, but only on the day the breach

⟨ ARTICLES OF CHRISTIAN FAITH ⟩

Art. 4. We believe in Election through sanctfication of the

Art. 5 We believe in the final Preservation of the Saints.

Art. 6. We believe sinners are justified in the sight of God, by the rightenorness of Christ imputed unto them, and that it pleased God, by the foolishness of preaching, to save them that beleaved.

Art. 7. We believe that good works are fruits of faith, and follows after justification, and are evidence of our own gracious state.

Art. 8. We believe the visible Church of Christ, is a congregation of faithful persons, baptized, who have gained Christian tellowship with each other, and give unto the Lord, and one another, and have agreed to keep up a Godly, deciplin, agree—ably to the rules of the Gospel.

Art. 9. We believe there will be a Resurrection of the dead and a general judgement, and that the happiness of the right—cous, and the punishment of the wicked, will be never ending.

Art. 10. We believe that Jesus-Christ is the great head of the Church, and the only Law-Giver, and the deciplin si with the body, and should be faithfuly kept up for the glory of Gol, and the prosperity of His people

Art 11. We believe that baptism by immersion, is the apostolle mode, and true believers the only fit subjects thereof.

Art. 12. We believe that the Lord's Supper is an ordinance of the Church, and should be continued until Christ's second coming.
