#### Saturday's Proceedings.

The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. S. M. Oliver, of Shady Grove church. Text Acts 7th chapter and 28th verse. Subject "Paul's charge to the church of Ephesus."

The meeting adjourned until 2 o'clock p. m.

After devotional exercises by Elder McQuistian the 35th annual session of Big Creek Association met with Liberty Baptist church, Viola, Ark., September 25, 1909, at 2 o'clock p. m.

On home missions—Elders E. R. Treadaway, W. M. Cooper and W. H. McChristian.

On Sunday schools—Elders R. E. Richardson, N. T. Chadwick and Bro. G. C. Jones.

On church letters-Eiders R. K. Pope, E. R. Treadway and Bro. E. F. Armstrong.

The association adjourned to meet at 7 o'clock Saturday night.

At 7 o clock the association met and selected Oak Grove church 6 miles north of Viola, Ark., for the next association.

The association agreed to take up Sunday school work at 9:30 o'clock Sunday morning.

Preaching Saturday night by Elders W. M. Cooper and George Sanders, subject "Preciousness of Jesus."

## Sunday's Proceedings.

The association met at 9:30 o'clock and after religious exer cises led by Elder S. M. Oliver the committee on Sunday school made their report (see reports of committees) Elders S. M. Oliver, R. K. Pope, T. F. Cargill. E. R. Treadaway and W. H. Bolwing spoke to the report.

The association adjourned until 2:30 p. m.

Preaching at 11 o'clock by Elders W. H. McChristian and W. H. Bowling, subjects "Preaching of the Gospel." Text Acts 1st chapter and 8th verse.

At 2:30 p. m. the association met and after religious exercises led by Elder W. T. Chadwick, the discussion on report of Sunday school was resumed. Elder W. T. Chadwick and Bro. E. F. Armstrong spoke to the report, and by motion it was adopted.

By motion the association agreed to organize and maintain a Sunday school convention. Bro. E. F. Armstrong, of County Line church was elected president, G. C. Jones, of Oak Grove, vice president and Miss Saraphine Pope, of Vidette, Ark., corresponding secretary. It was decided by the officers to hold the first convention with Viola church, Viola, Ark., beginning on Friday night before the 5th Sunday in November.
