MINUTES

OF THE

ELEVENTH ANNUAL SESSION

OF THE

Concord Association of Western Arkansas,

CONVENED WITH

Cedar Grove Baptist Church, Scott County, Arkansas,

On Saturday, the 24th day of September, and continued until the 27th of September, 1881.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by Elder J. J. Holland, from 1st Corinthians, 6th chapter, 19th and 20th verses.

REPORT "B."

We believe all men should be educated; that education qualifies men to be useful and more skillful in the word of truth; we feel great need of education. We recommend that further steps be taken to advance the interest of education in our midst. We recommend that a school be commenced in Saline City, in the interest of Buckner College, and that this body advise or request the Board of Trustees to employ a teacher, and begin the school, and we begin to raise means to pay the teacher, and appropriate the tuition to the completion of the eollege, and

WHEREAS, D. B. Ray, of the Amity Baptist Flag, Dr. H. F. Buckner, of Creek Nation, and Elder Wesly Smith, Missionary to Wild Tribes, and Elder William McCombs, of Creek Nation, (the last two being native Creek Indian preachers), expect to be in attendance on the next General Association, to meet sixteen miles west of Salem, on November 12, and as we believe a visit from these brethren would result in good to the college we are trying to build; therefore,

Resolved, That this Association most earnestly invite the above named brethren to come to Salem City and hold a meeting in the college building, and in the interest of the college, on the 16th of November, and that this action be forwarded to these brethren, and if they accept, that notice of their acception be published in the papers.
