Proceedings,

Forest Hill Church, Montgomery Co., Sept. 12, 1897.
The Fortieth Annual Session of the Caddo River Missionary Baptist Association convened with Forest Hill Church, Montgomery county, Ark., Saturday, September 11, 1897, at 11 o'clock a.m. In harmony with its adjournment in 1896, the introductory sermon was preached by Elds H. T. Howell and H. L. Wesson. Text: "Will a Man Rob God?" Malachit 3: 8 Closing prayer by Eld. J. J. Hughes.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Body met promptly at 2 o'clock, and after prayer by the moderator, H. L. Wasson, the association was declared ready for business. The clerk being absent, A. J. Newcomb was appointed clerk pro tem until a clerk be elected.

Called for letters from the churches. Bros. Isaac Welch, T. B. Buck and J. N. Wasson were appointed to read letters, and after the reading of the letters, petitionary letters were called for, and three churches received: Sulphur Springs, Longview and Big Fork, with the delegates, Bros. W. M. Edwards, T. P. Edwards, Elds. J. D. Bats, J. E. Long, J. H. Bowen, J. W. Mayes, J. W. Dilbeck, J. D. Homes and Robert Speer.

Went into the election of officers, resulting as follows: Eld. A. J. Nelson, moderator; A. P. Newcomb, clerk, and W. F. Willis, treasurer. The ballot was taken by Elds. I. F. Welch, J. J. Holland and Bro. J. N. Wasson.

Committee on Divine Services appointed, with A. R. Chitwood, chairman,

Called for correspondence, when Eld. Isaac F. Welch was received from Red River Association.

The moderator and clerk were authorized to appoint the various committees at night. Closed with prayer by W. F. Willis.

MONDAY MORNING SESSION.

The association met promptly at 8 o'clock, and after some

good singing, the moderator read the 1st Psalm, and the congretion engaged in singing hymn No. 6, from Evergreen Hymn Book. Prayer was offered by Eld. T. A. Valentine. The moderator then declared the body ready for the transaction of business.

The minutes of Saturday were read and adopted. Roll call. By motion speeches were limited to five minutes. The various committees then reported. [See report.]

It was then agreed by the body, that we continue our Missionary Board and the funds on hands be turned over to our treasurer, subject to order of the body, it was further inacted that a Building Committee be appointed to select suitable grounds and to construct a building for the Baptist camp-grounds. Committee, J. N. Wasson, J. H. Peel, M. D. Robins, A. J. Newcomb and Z. M. Nicholson.

By order of the association the clerk was to receive from the treasurer \$10 for his services, and means to pay for printing and postage of minutes. It was then agreed to hold the next session with the church at Mt. Pleasant, in what is known as the Flatwoods, Pike county, Ark., beginning on Saturday before the 2nd Sunday in September, 1898, at 11 o'clock a. m., the introductory sermon to be preached by J. A. Shackelford and T. B. Burk.

By action of the body Elds. H. T. Howell was appointed as correspondent delegate to Red River Association, and J. D. Bats to Buckville Association, and T. A. Valentine to Saline.

Closing with prayer by Bro. D T. Brunson, the parting hand was then taken amid tears of joy, hoping to meet again.

Took up annual program on subjects and essays. Bro. D. T. Brunson delivered his on "Qualifications of Sunday school Superintendents and Teachers," which was endorsed. Adjourned

till 3 o'clock p. m.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION.

After devotional exercises by Eld. J. J. Hawkins, the convention proceeded to business. The annual program on subjects and essays was continued. Sister Julia Matthews' essay, "Life," was endorsed and requested sent to the Arkansas Baptist for publication. Others responded with essays, which were endorsed by the convention. Sunday.

# Articles of Faith.

#### WITH THE SCRIPTURAL REFERENCES.

ARTICLE 1. We believe in one true and living God, the Word and Holy Ghost 1 John 5: 7; John 1: 1, 2, 3; 1 Tim. 3: 16.

ART. 2. We believe that the Scriptures comprising the Old and the New Testaments are the word of God, and the only rule of our faithful practice. 11 Tim. 2: 15, 16; 1 Peter, 1: 2.

ART. 3. We believe in the doctrine of election according to the fore-knowledge of God the Father, through sanctification of the Spirit unto obedience, and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ. 1 Peter 1: 2.

ART. 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin by the fall of Adam-

Gen. 3: 6, 7; Psalms 57: 6; Rom 5; 12-14.

ART. 5. We believe in man's incapacity, by his own free will and ability, to recover himself from the fallen state in which he is by nature. Isaiah 1: 5-7; John 6: 44; Eph. 2: 1.

ART. 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God by the imputed righteousness of Christ only. Jer. 23: 6; Rom 4: 22-24; 1 Cor. 1: 30.

ART, 7. We believe that the saints shall be preserved in grace and never

fall finally away. Psalms 89: 31-35; Heb. 8: 10, 11; John 10: 28.

ART. 8. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only subjects for baptism; and that immersion is the Apostolic mode. Mark 16: 15,16; 1 Cor 11: 22-26; Acts 8: 38.39; Rom. 6: 3,4; Acts 2: 42.

ART. 9. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, and in a general judgment; and that the felicity of the righteous and the punishment of the

wicked will be eternal. John 3: 28,29; 1 Cor. 15; 22,23; Rev. 20: 12,15.

ART. 10 We believe that no minister has the right to administer the ordinances of the gospel but one who is regularly baptized; called, and comes under the imposition of the hands of a presbytery. Matt. 28: 19,20; 1 Tim. 3: 14; Titus 5: 10.

ART. 11. We believe that none but regularly baptized members have a right to commune at the Lord's table. Acts 2: 41; 1 Cor. 11: 23,24; Acts 18: 8-11.

ART. 12. We believe that the Lord's Day should be observed as a day of rest and religious devotion. Ex. 20: 8; Acts 20: 7; Rev. 1: 10.
