FIRST DAY.

MORNING SESSION.

The several churches composing the Trace Ridge association of Missionary Baptist met with Hopewell church Searcy county, Ark., on September 26, 1891.

The introductory sermon was preached by Elder John Kim-

On motion the temperance committee was changed to read Prohibition instead of Temperance.
