The Big Fork, United Baptist Association, met with Big Fork, Church, Sept. 16th. 1893. The Introductory sermon was preached by Eld. B. G. Wilcox, text romans 9th chapt. 33 ver.

After recess the Association was called to order by reading, Singing and prayer, by the Moderator. Called for the letters and appointed, Bro's, A. J. Strickland, and J. K. Wilcox, to read the letters. The letters were read, and delegates names enrolled, and by propper organization the Association proceded to election of officers, and elected Eld A. A. Bates, as Moderator, and S. M. Kemp, Clerk and Treasurer, the moderator appointed Committies to wit: 1st. On preaching, 2d. On obituary, 3d. Finance, 4th. arrangement, 5th. prayer meeting, 6th. Sabbath Schools and singing.

Called for petitionary lettets and received 2 Churches to wit:—Christian-Home, and Cainey, on their Delegates subscribing to our articles of faith, their delegates were seated. Called for Corresponding Messengers and received 2 from Caddo—River Association, to wit:—Eld's. J. J. Hughes, A. Nelson, who was recognized and seated. By motion adjourned until Monday morning 90'clock.

Met pursuant to adjournment, prayer by the Moderator.

By motion limited the time of debating to 10 minutes. The rules of Decorum was read by the Clerk. Read and adopted the minutes of satuadays proceedings.

By motion heared the report of committies. First on preaching,

CONSTITUTION .

*BIG FORK ASSOCIATION OF UNITED BAPTIST

Article 1. This union of churches shall be known, and distinguished, by the name and title, of the Big Fork, United Baptist Association.

Art. 2- This Association shall be composed of Delegates from Churches in union. Each church shall be entitled to three delegates, who shall be required to furnish satisfactory evidence of their appointment by their church, before taking their seats-

Art. 3- The Delegates, when convened, shall organize themselves into a deliberate body, by the appointment of a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be chosen by ballot, at each annual Association. and continue in office until their successor is chosen.

- Art. 4. This Association, shall not interfere with the rights of the churches of which it is composed, it shall regard them as independent bedies in all matters of internal government, and shall only act as an advising council, assuming no authority except what is expressly delegated to it by the churches, or evidently implyes by the very nature of compact. It nevertheless, claims authority over its own members, and delegates from the churches, and in justice and propriety, must have power to withdraw from, and disown, all churches which depart from the principles of the compact by becoming heterodox in faith, or disorderly in practice. It should therefore-regard all churches united under this Constitution with a vigilant eye for good. Its business shall be to declare, and promote the declarative glory of God, by extending the Kingdom of Grace on earth, through the medium of preaching the Gospel, to cultivate union and fellowship with all the Churches of Christ, especially, with these united under this constitution.
- Art. 5. Newly constituted churches, or churches dismissed from other Associations of same faith, and order, may be admitted into this union, on their sending up three delegates to the annual meeting of this Association, with a petition for admission, and by their Delegates agreeing to the abstract of principles herewith published.
- Art. 6. The Churches in this union shall transmit to every annual session of this Association, a written communication, specifying the names of their Delegates their number in full Fellowship, number Baptized, 'Received, Excommunicated, Restored or Dismissed, since last session, and all other information which the church may deem important; which will be read and min—uted accordingly.
- Art. 7. The Association, shall have a fund supplied by voluntary contribution of the churches, and all money thus contributed shall be transmitted from the Churches and payed over through the Committee on finance to the Treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot, and hold his office during the pleasure of the Association, and manage the funds agreeably. He shall return to the order of the Association, and present annually for insertion in the minutes, a clear and sufficient statement of all the receipts and expenditures.

- Art. 8, This Association shall take cognizance of no query sent up from the churches, unless they have endevored to solve the same and have failed, nor of any difficulty between Churches, unless they have pursued the dictations of the 18th, chapter of Mathew, and have not been able to settle them; then, this Association shall take such matters under consideration and act upon them at its discretion.
- Art. 9. It shall be the duty of the Clerk, of the Association to keep a regular file of the printed minutes of this body, and deliver over the same, to his successor in office.
- Art. 10. This Constitution may be altered, or amended, at regular meetings of this Association, by the concurring voice of two-thirds of the members present, provided such alterations or amendments be approved by the churches of the Association.
- Art. 11. There are to be no Sunday collections taken up in this Association, nor men appointed to preach what are known as missionary sermons, but to choose their own subject.



- 1. The Association shall be opened, and closed by prayer.
- 1. The Moderator and Clerk, shall be chosen by the sufferage of the members present.
- 3. The Moderator shall be considered a Judge of order, and shall have a right to call to order at any time.
- 4. A member not satisfied with his decision, may appeal to the Association the same day but not thereafter.
- 5. But one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise to their feet, address the Moderator, obtain permission, and then proceed to speak.
- 6- The Moderator, when addressed by a member for permission to speak, shall signify the same by naming the person, or otherwise.

- 7. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, unless he departs from the subject, or is guilty of personal reflection. Every motion made and seconded, shall come under the consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by him that made it.
- 8. Every case taken up by the association, shall be decided or withdrawn, before another is approved.
- 9. When any question is taken up, after allowing time for debate, the Moderator, may take the voice of the association on all subjects, in any way he may think best.
- 10. Any member wishing to retire, shall obtain permission of the Moderator.
- 11. No member shall speak more than twice, on the same subject, without permission of the association, nor more than once until every member wishing to speak shall have spoken; nor shall any proposition be made to close the subject, until the debate is carried through.
- 12. The appellation "Brother" shall be used in the Association by members to their address to each-other.
- 13. The names of the members shall be called as often as the Association shall direct.
- 14. No member shall be tolerated in any practice, which tends to interrupt public speech.
- 15. The Moderator, shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech, as any other member, provided, he appoint another to fill his seat during that time, but shall not be entitled vote, unless the Association be evenly divided, when he may cast the deciding vote.
- 16. Any member violating these rules may be reproved by the Moderator, at his discretion, but only on the day the breech shall be committed.



e Carticles of Christian Faith.

Article. 1. We believe in only one true, and living God, and that there is a trinity of persons in the God-Head- the Father. Son and Holy-Ghost, and that these three are one.

Art. 2. We believe, the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, are the word of God, and the only rule of faith and practice

Art. 3 We believe in the fall of Adam, and that the depravity of his fallen nature was entailed up in his posterity, and in the impactory of man to rocover himself by his own free-will or ability.

Art. 4 We believe in Election through sanctification of the

spirit, and belief of the truth.

Art. 5 We believe in the final Preservation of the Saints, and

that they will never finally fall away and be lost.

Art. 6 We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God, by the Righteousness of Christ, imputed unto them, and that it pleased God, by the fooblishess of preaching to save them that Believed.

Art. 7 We believe that good works are fruits of faith, and follows after justification, and are evidence of our own gracious

state.

Art. 8 We believe the visible church of Christ, is a congregation of faithful persons, baptized—who have gained christian fellowship with each other, and give unto the Lord, and one another and have agreed to keep up a Godly, deciplin agreeable to the aules of the Gospel.

Art. 9 We believe there will be a Resursction of the dead, and a general Judgement, and that the happeness of the righteous, and

the pueishment of the wicked will be never ending

Art. 10. We believe that Jesus—Christ, is the great head of the Church, and the only law-giver, and the deciplin is with the body, and should be faithfully kept up for the glory of God, and the prosperity of his people.

Art. 11 We believe that baptism by immersion, is the apost of-

ic mode, and true believers are the only fit oubjects thereof.

Art. 12 We believe that the Lord's Supper is an ordinance of the church, and should be continued til Christ's, second-coming.
