# UNION ASSOCIATION NO. 2. OF MISSIONARY BAPTIST.

Campbell, Searcy County, Ark., Sept. 18, 1903.

Rose, \$1, E. N. Martin, \$1; James Mabrey, \$1; Mount Zion church, \$2; Timbo \$2. Total, \$9.00. Motion carried that the clerk be paid \$5 for his work.

sionaries for the next year.
