On motion, Bro. McKay and Bro. Singleton were received as correspondents from Caddo River Association. The Moderator appinted Eld. E. P. Chitwood and A. R. Chitwood corresponding messengers to the Caddo River Association.

On motion, the body adjourned business hours till Monday at 8 o'clock a. m.

The people met at the church house at 7:30 o'clock. Bro. Chitwood, and Bro. Wood preached interesting sermons to a large congregation.

SUNDAY MORNING.

Bro. A. R. Chitwood conducted the devotional exercises.

Bro. Shepard and Bro. Melton being absent, Eld. A. H. Armstrong preached the Annual Missionary Sermon, followed by Eld. J. P. Emery. Text: John 17:18.

After the sermons, which were very instructive, and enjoyed by the large congregation, a collection of \$22.32 was made, which was divided, equally, between Foreign and Associational Missions.

At 3 o'clock p. m., Eld. Turner and Eld. D. H. Smith preached. At 7:30 o'clock, Eld. Ashley Wood and Eld. W. L. Cockrell preached interesting sermons.

Refuge Church, through Bro. Cockrell, offered an opportunity for membership. One sister was received by letter.

MONDAY MORNING.

Called to order by the Moderator, who read a chapter, and Bro. Armstrong led in prayer.

The roll was called, with 59 messengers present.

Committee on Associational Missions made their report, and after being discussed by Bro. Armstrong, Bro. E. P. Chitwood, and Bro. Wood, was adopted.

Committee on Foreign Missions reported and after being discussed by Bro. E. P. Chitwood and Bro. Armstrong, was adopted; also, \$5.25 was contributed to Foreign Missions.

Committee on Ministerial Support made their report, and, after much discussion, was adopted.

Committee on Obituaries and Condolence made their report, which was adopted.

Committee on Home Missions made their report, which was adopted.

On motion, Eld. E. P. Chitwood was selected as corresponding messenger from the Buckville Association to the State Association.

The missionary, Eld. W. L. Cockrell made his report, which was adopted.

On motion, the body instructed the Board to pay the missionary \$1.50 per day for his labors.

Committee on Nominations made their report, which was adopted.

The missionary, Eld. M. C. Melton, made his report, which was adopted.

On motion, the Clerk was instructed to have blank associational letters printed, and send a copy to each church. \$2.40 was raised for this purpose, and, on motion, the balance left was donated to the Clerk.

At 11 o'clock, Eld. E. B. Laughter preached.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Report of the Finance Committee read and adopted.

Committee on Temperance made their report, which was adopted, after being discussed by Bro. Cockrell, Bro. Wood, Bro. Genrin, Bro. Fowler, and Bro. J. L. Blakely.

Committee on Sunday-schools made their report, and after

being discussed by Bro. Daniel Smith and Bro. Laughter, was adopted.

Report of the Treasurer read and adopted.

Report of the Missionary Board read and adopted.

On motion, the Missionary Board for the ensuing year was elected by ballot. Bro. Collum, Bro. T. P. Breashears, and Bro. A. L. Adamson acted as tellers. J. T. Blakely, J. L. Blakely, and J. G. McLane were elected.

Resolution No. 1 read and adopted.

Resolution No. 2 read and adopted.

Resolution No. 3 failed to be adopted.

Harvey's Chapel, Marble, Concord, White Plains, and Mt. Zion were placed in nomination as a place to hold the next session of the Association. Harvey's Chapel was selected. The Clerk was instructed to have 500 copies of the Minutes printed and distribute them to each church in proportion to their Minute fund, the Clerk to retain balance of Minute fund for his services.

On motion, the Clerk was instructed to have the Constitution and Articles of Faith printed in the Minutes.

Pledges for Associational Missions, amounting to \$39.50 were made.

The Minutes were read and adopted.

On motion the body adjourned to meet with Harvey's Chapel, near Haws, Garland County, Ark., Saturday before the Fourth Sunday in September, 1908, at 10 o'clock a. m.

A song was sung, the parting hand extended, and Eld. E. P. Chitwood led the closing prayer.
