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MINUTES

OF THE

BIG CREEK BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

Big Creek Baptist Association met with the Baptist church of Viola, Arkansas, September 19, 1912, and was called to order by Elder W. H. Bowling the moderator of the preceding Association.

After a song service, devotional exercises were conducted by Elder R. K. Pope.

The former clerk being absent, E. F. Armstrong was appointed clerk pro tem.

Elder R. F. Hiner being absent, Bro. Bowling preached the introductory sermon. Subject, "The Reward of Faithfulness." A motion to adjourn until 2 p. m. was carried. Dismissed with prayer by Rev. J. K. Powell

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

After devotional services, led by Bro. Hiner, the regular work of the Association was taken up. R. K. Pope and J. W. Carroll were appointed reading clerks

FRIDAY MORNING

After a beautiful song service Bro. S. W. King Ied in prayer.

Call for non-represented churches renewed. None reported.

The committee on home missions made their report and after discussion by Bros. Pope and Bowling, was adopted.

Your committee on home missions submit the following: We realize the need of Gospel preaching in this home land of ours, we recommend that the churches make contributions and that each individual member give his means to support the work that is being carried on in spreading the gospel in the destitue portions of the country.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON.

Devotional exercises led by Bro. Wise. Association called to order by the moderator.

Letters from Shady Grove, Liberty, Spring River and Elizabeth churches were read and names of messengers enrolled.

Lost Spring church presented a letter asking for membership in our body. On motion they were received and the right hand of fellowship extended the messengers.

Rev. M. C. Burton was recognized as a visitor from Rocky Bayou Association, and invited to a seat in council with us.

The report of the committee on associational missions was read in connection with the report of Bro. Pope, the missionary, and the missionary board. Discussed by Bros. Burton, Holloway, Hiner, Bowling, Armstrong and on motion was adopted.

Your committee on associational missions report the following: Very few of us realize the great destitution that prevails in our county. All of the county east of Salem is without effective preaching. Brethren, what are we going to do about it?

The report of the missionary is as follows:

I desire to make the following report of work as your missionary: Days of labor, 29, at the following places: Spring River, Pleasant Grove and Big Rock. The results were not as great as I desired but I do not believe the work was in vain, conversions, 2.

Report of missionary board: We employed Bro. R.K. Pope to do our mission work at \$1.25 per day. Bro. Pope has received for his services \$12.95. As our treasurer is not present, we do not know the condition of our treasury. There are some pledges yet unpaid. We have done the best we could under the circumstances.

We earnestly urge that the work be carried forward on a larger scale next year.

The following pledges were paid for the new year: C. A. Rogers, \$1.00; R. K. Pope, \$1.00 (paid); County Line \$5.00; Sister May Gray \$1.00; Sister P. G. Kieth, 50 cents; A. P. Stone, 50 cents (paid).

The following were elected members of the board for the next year: W. H. Bowling, Isaac Allen, J. W. Carroll, Fred Walker, J. D. Cochran and E. F. Armstrong.

· By motion the Association decided to select a missionary. A motion to make the selection of a missionary the first order of business Saturday morning was carried. On motion the association adjourned until Saturday morning at 9 o'clock.

EVENING SESSION

After a beautiful song service by the Viola class, led by Bro. Hiner, Bro. M. C. Williams preached from Phil. 1, 9-11.

SATURDAY MORNING

After devotional exercises led by Bro. Carner, the Association was called to order by the moderator.

A motion to rescind the act placing the election of a missionary in the hands of the Association was carried, and the work was left with the board.

The report of the temperance committee was read and after discussion by Bros. Carroll and Rogers was adopted. The report follows:

We rejoice that the people of Fulton county have decided to have no more alcoholic liquors sold in our midst and we want to urge the members of Big Creek Association to encourage the officers of our county to enforce the law, and thereby prevent our boys and young men from becoming victims of this great evil.

The following report was made by the Sunday School committee and a thorough discussion by Bros. Hiner, Pope, Powell, Briscoe, Armstrong, Bowling and Rogers was on motion adopted: Your committee on Sunday Schools submit the following report. We believe the Bible teaches that all of God's children should work in his vineyard, and the Sunday School is one of the most promising fields. Therefore, we urge the organization and maintenance of a Sunday School in every church in Big Creek Association. Also, we recommend the use of Baptist literature to supplement the study of God's word.

A motion to continue the fifth Sunday meeting as a Sunday School convention and that the next meeting be held with Flora church, was carried.

R. K. Pope was elected president of the convention; Fred Walker, vice president, and Otho Ivester, secretary.

Motion carried that the next convention be held beginning on Friday night before the fifth Sunday in September.

The religious literature commmittee made the following report, and after being spoken to by Bros. Carroll and Bowling, was adopted: We recommend that each Baptist's home should not only be supplied with the Holy Bible (the Baptist discipline) but should contain a safe and sound periodical of our faith and order. We recommend the Baptist Advance, our own state paper, as one of the best papers of our denomination.

The committee on Christian education made the following report, which was adopted after discussion by Bros. Hiner and Bowling.

As education is the training of our youths for duties of life, and parents are responsible for the early training of the children, we recommend the schools of Arkansas that are controlled

by the Baptists, and we urge our young preachers to attend one of our schools. We also recommend that our preachers preach one sermon on this year and take a collection for the work.

Highland Park was chosen as the next place of meeting. Elder R. K. Pope was selected to preach the introductory sermon and Elder Shelby King, alternate.

The finance committee made their report which was adopted: We have received from the churches \$14.60 for printing minutes.

CONSTITUTION

Article 1.—This Association shall be known by the name of Big Creek Missionary Baptist Association, and shall be for the purpose of creating a stronger bond of love and fellowship among the members of the churches composing it. (as amended in 1910).

Article 2—The members composing the annual meeting of the Association shall consist of messengers esnt by the churches

Article 3—The messengers sent by the churches to the annual meeting shall not exceed four from each church.

Article 4—The Association shall meet annually at such time and place as shall have previously been appointed.

Article 5—The officers of this Association shall consist of a moderator, clerk and treasurer, who shall be chosen by a majority of the messengers annually at the annual meeting of the body.

Article 6—This Association shall have no power to control or regulate the internal affairs or discipline of any church, but it may adopt or recommend all such measures as shall be considered best calculated to produce the harmony and prosperity of the churches, and advise and consult upon the matter as the churches may at any time present for their consideration and advice. It may receiv churches into this Association or dismiss churches from the body, inquire into religion in its bounds, and suggest measures for its advancement, and be a common bond of union among the churches, but shall not exercise any ligislative power over the churches.

Article 7—This constitution may be amended at any regular meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, provided notice has been given at a previous meeting.
