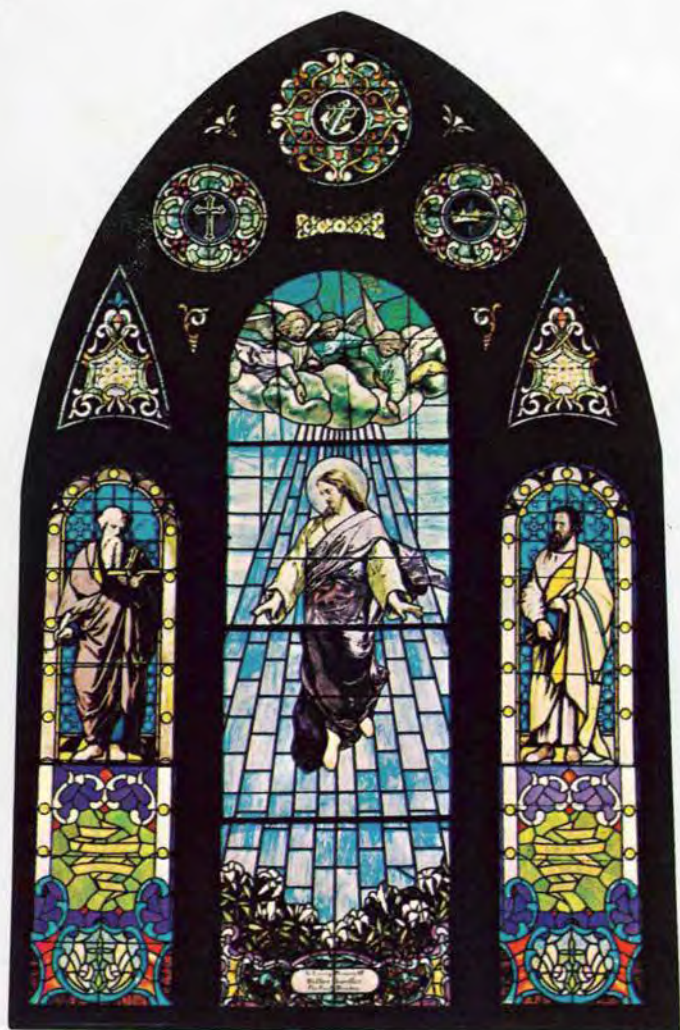

Constitution

(Adopted October 17, 1961)

(Section 8 (a) Amended October 15, 1963)

(Section 5 Amended October 14, 1968)

1. NAME

The name of this association shall be the North Pulaski Baptist Association, cooperating with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this association shall be to promote Christian fellowship and cooperation among the churches affiliated with the association to uphold the doctrines and principles of our Baptist faith and to encourage the churches to be loyal to and practice these doctrines and principles; to promote the preaching and teaching of God's Word, the enlisting and training of all Christians for service; to promote missions, benevolence, stewardship, Christian education, and the winning of all men to Christ to the ends of the earth. To co-operate with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention in a world mission program.

3. MEMBERSHIP

The body shall be composed of messengers elected from the churches and missions affiliated with the body. When such messengers are approved by the association they shall be seated and entitled to participate in the affairs of the body. Each church shall be entitled to three messengers for the first fifty members, and one additional messenger for each fifty members above the first fifty, provided that no church shall be entitled to more than ten messengers.

4. ARTICLES OF FAITH

The Articles of Faith set forth in New Hampshire Confession as the doctrinal beliefs of the churches shall be the doctrines adopted by this body.

5. OFFICERS

The officers of the Association shall be moderator, moderator-elect, clerk, treasurer and historian. These officers shall be nominated and elected by the association, preferably before the last session of the annual meeting. They shall serve until the close of the following annual session of the association or until their successors shall be elected and installed. Election shall be by secret ballot unless another plan is adopted by unanimous consent. The term of moderator shall be for one year. The moderator-elect shall serve as assistant to the moderator for one year and shall at the time of the annual association meeting assume the office of moderator. The association will at that time elect a new moderator-elect. The duties of these officers shall be those usually incumbent upon such officers.

If the association employs a superintendent of missions and/or an educational director, these workers shall be considered as officers of the association. Such additional officers shall be elected as the association shall deem necessary to its most effective work.

6. AUTHORITY

The association is an autonomous body and therefore reserves the right to determine its own policies and direct its own business; it may refuse to seat messengers who are not in fellowship or doctrinal agreement with the body, or whose

churches are not. However, this body shall never exercise any authority over, or give direction to, any church or churches which are affiliated with it or which may have been affiliated with it; but the association will stand ready to lend any assistance or counsel to any church making request for such help.

7. ORGANIZATIONS

This body shall encourage and promote such associational organizations as Sunday School, Training Union, Woman's Missionary Union, Brotherhood, music, library, and other organizations which are in keeping with the purpose of the association, with their full staffs of officers and programs necessary for the promotion of the work. The chief officer of each organization shall be elected, or approved by the association and shall function as an officer of the association.

8. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Association shall have an executive committee consisting of the pastor of each church (where he is a member of the church) and one lay member from each church. Nominations for membership in the executive committee may be made by the church, but members must be elected by the association. The officers of the association, namely moderator, moderator-elect, clerk, treasurer, and historian, shall be ex officio members of the executive committee and should serve as respective officers of the committee, unless the association directs otherwise. All other officers and chairmen of standing committees are to become ex officio members of the executive committee. Ex officio members will not have the rights to vote unless they are also members of the executive committee elected as representatives of their respective churches.

The executive committee shall attend to all matters of the association between sessions; promote all progress authorized by the association; and carry out all directives given by the association. It shall make an annual report to the association of all work carried on and all finances handled. The executive committee shall not have the power to create or initiate any new work or project not contained in the reports and recommendations of the previous meeting of the association.

The executive committee shall hold regular monthly or quarterly meetings.

The executive committee shall not have power to entitle a church to affiliation with the association or have representation on the executive committee, but may invite a church to sit with it in counsel without vote, pending the seating of the messengers of that church by the association.

8. (a.) The legal title to all property owned by this Association, both real and personal, shall be held in the name of the designated trustees, which shall be vested in them by virtue of their office and which shall be transmitted to their successors. The Trustees shall be three in number and shall be named by the Association to serve for a term of one year or until their successors shall have been named and qualified. In the event a vacancy should occur by reason of the failure of the Association to make such selection, by death, by disability, by removal from the community or otherwise, the Executive Committee may fill the vacancy. By direction of the Association, or of the Executive Committee the trustees shall be clothed with authority to act on behalf of the Association in the acquisition and disposition of Associational property, and specifically shall have authority to execute notes, bonds, debentures, deeds of conveyance, mortgages, pledges and other security instruments and any and all related documents incidental thereto; and to represent the Association in all legal matters. All persons dealing with said trustees may rely upon any written resolution duly adopted by the Association or the Executive Committee, directing and authorizing the trustee to act in its behalf, and a certified copy of any such resolution duly executed by the Associational moderator and the clerk shall be conclusive evidence thereof.

9. MEETINGS

The association shall hold annual meetings of the body at such time and place as it may determine. The executive committee may have power to change the stated time and/or place of the annual meeting in case of emergency or necessity. The association may hold such quarterly meetings as are deemed wise for the promotion of its work. It shall promote such regular meetings of its worker's council, its promotional organizations, and its standing committees as shall prove most effective for carrying out the total purpose of the association.

10. COMMITTEES

The association shall have the following standing committees named by the moderator and his officers before the close of the annual session to serve until the close of the next annual session, namely, program committee, nominating committee, credentials committee, budget committee, and such additional standing committees as seem needed. All organizations of the association shall name their own committees.

11. AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any regular annual session of the association by a two-thirds majority of the messengers present, provided notice of such change has been given at the previous annual meeting and provided it is read in the first session of the annual meeting and voted on before the last session.

By-Laws

(Section 2 amended October 11, 1971)

1. In parliamentary procedure the body shall be governed by ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER or Kerfoot's PARLIAMENTARY LAW.

2. The fiscal year for the association shall be from the first day of October to the last day of September inclusive. Annual reports to the association shall cover this period.

3. The annual meeting of the association shall be in the month of Oct. The exact days and place shall be recommended by the nominating committee, or other committee authorized by the association, and approved by the body. The executive committee may be authorized to make such adjustments in the time and place of the annual meeting as may become necessary because of circumstances which develop after the close of the annual meeting of the whole body.

4. All officers of the association must be members of churches within the association, in good standing, and recognized for their knowledge of and loyalty to Southern Baptist doctrines and programs.

5. Duties of the officers shall be as follows:

The MODERATOR shall call to order and preside over the meetings of the association and the executive committee, and direct the affairs of the association in an orderly manner and Christian spirit. (He may for good reason ask other officers or members of the body to preside at times.)

The MODERATOR-ELECT may, if the moderator so directs, preside over the sessions of the association council. He shall preside over other meetings in the absence of the moderator and shall assist the moderator in such ways as he may direct. The moderator-elect will have the privilege of attending the assembly of his choice as preparation for the office of moderator.

The CLERK shall keep a full and accurate record of all business of the association and the executive committee, and of all recommendations of the associational

council. At each meeting he shall be prepared to read all minutes of the previous meeting. All records for at least one year shall be on hand at each meeting. They shall be kept in a fireproof safe between meetings.

The TREASURER shall receive all funds of and for the association, not otherwise designated, shall disburse all funds in accordance with the adopted associational budget or the specific instructions of the association and upon receipt of a bill or voucher properly authorized. He shall keep accurate records of all monies received, with sources and designations of same. He shall make reports to the regular meetings of the executive committee and annual meeting of the association and have the same approved. The executive committee shall have the treasurer's reports audited at the close of the fiscal year, and reports the same to the annual association, for approval.

The HISTORIAN shall write in orderly form the events of the association, beginning with its organization. The association should request the churches and individuals who may possess historical information about the association to make it accessible to the historian. He shall make record of current events of each fiscal year and read his annual chapter to the annual meeting of the association for adoption. These records shall be kept in a fireproof safe or vault.

6. The following associational organizations shall be maintained and promoted by the association for the benefit of the work in the churches; associational Sunday School organization, associational Training Union, associational Woman's Missionary Union, associational Brotherhood, associational music organization, associational Church Library Council, and such other as may be deemed wise for the attainment of the objectives of the association. All officers of these organizations shall be members of churches affiliated with the association and in good standing.

Unless the association shall direct otherwise, the chief officers of the organizations shall be chosen by their respective organizations, submitted to the nominating committee of the association, and elected or approved by the association. Their duties shall be understood to be in line with the functions set forth in the promotional literature for their respective organizations, as produced or approved by the state or Convention-wide agencies functioning in a like area.

7. The following committees, other than the standing and special committees, shall be maintained by the association as needed for promotion of its work among the churches; committee on evangelism, missions committee, and such other committees as may be needed. The chairman of these committees shall be elected or appointed by the association, and other committee members shall be chosen in number and manner designated by the association and in accord with the needs of the work. The qualifications required for members of such committees shall be the same as for all other officers, and their duties shall be prescribed by the association.

8. All associational organizations and regular committees shall make reports to the regular meetings of the executive committee and/or to the association. The executive committee shall exercise authority over these organizations and committees only to the extent of determining whether they are working within the bounds of the organizational programs as approved by the association.

9. A place shall be made on the order of business of the association for miscellaneous business at each session of the association.

10. A sermon on doctrines and one on missions shall be provided at each annual meeting. Addresses on assigned topics relating to phases of our Baptist work shall be provided for by the program committee.

11. Messengers to the association shall be accorded equal rights and privileges

of the floor, provided each messenger who desires to speak shall rise, address the moderator, and be recognized before he begins to speak. No messenger shall be entitled to speak on any one subject more than twice until other messengers desiring to speak have been heard. Upon request of a messenger, or by consent of the body, the moderator may invite a visitor to speak during a discussion.

12. The by-laws may be amended at any regular session of the association by a majority vote of messengers present, provided such amendment has been read to the body not later than the second session, and is voted on before the last session.

COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF THE ASSOCIATIONAL MISSIONS COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Association in Annual meeting, through the Nominating Committee, shall elect a standing committee, known as the Missions Committee. This committee shall be composed of NINE members. Members of the Missions Committee shall serve for a term of THREE years. Each year THREE members shall complete their terms and shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of at least one year.

Section 2. The Officers of the Association and the elected Associational Organization leaders, shall be ex-officio members of the Committee with all rights of discussion and voting.

Section 3. The Missions Committee shall have the responsibility of selecting and nominating any paid agents of the Association, and to recommend their employment to the Executive Board in regular meetings, or properly called special meetings.

Section 4. The duties of the Missions Committee shall be as follows:

(a) To plan a program of mission work for the Association. This is to be an active and aggressive program of planning. This committee should present a challenging and progressive program of work.

(2) To see that the plans for Associational work are promoted effectively.

(3) To plan a program of benevolences. This should be a well thought out program including all such needs. Plans for promoting the activities should be initiated by this committee.

(4) To plan a comprehensive program with regard to Christian Education. This committee should ascertain the needed projects, set the emphases, and actively promote the work.

(5) To correlate the activities and projects of the Association with the adopted cooperative program. This committee should actively work toward the end of keeping all our Baptist program under direct supervision in co-operation with the cooperative program plan. These projects should be clearly thought through and planned in connection with the budget committee each year.

(6) To work toward the establishment of new units of mission work in the Association. To facilitate this phase of the work the Chairman of the Missions Committee shall appoint a special committee of THREE from the membership of the Missions Committee. This shall be known as the Missions and Survey Committee. The duties of the committee shall be:

(a) To survey the entire Association to determine the areas where new churches or missions should be established, and to locate property in such areas suitable for building sites.

(b) To recommend to the Missions Committee expenditures toward securing such property. The Missions Committee will then study their findings and recommendations and bring to the Executive Board for final action those projects they endorse.

- (c) To solicit the assistance of sponsoring churches in establishing work in areas which have been approved by the Executive Board.
- (d) To assist and advise all groups desiring to establish Baptist Churches and Missions in the territorial limits of North Pulaski Baptist Association to the end that all such works may secure the most desirable and strategic locations to serve the people of this association.
- (e) To survey any areas to be served by each proposed new work and recommend to the Missions Committee the nature and extent of any assistance that the Association should provide in each case. The Missions Committee would in turn study their recommendation and submit to the Executive Board a final recommendation in each instance.
- (f) To recommend to the Missions Committee all salary supplements to pastors of missions and needy churches. Requests shall be made in writing on a standard form. Commitments for supplements shall be made for periods not to exceed one year. They may be renewed by recommendation of the Committee in deserving cases. Maximum aid will be limited to three years. After the first year the aid shall be reduced 25% of the original amount for each following year.
- (g) That all recommendations of the missions committee concerning pastoral aid and disposition of property be published one month prior to presentation to the Executive Board on the Associational page of the Arkansas Baptist State Paper.
- (h) Regarding Pioneer Mission Work, it is recommended that any approval of aid to Pioneer Missions also have the approval of the Home Mission Board.
- (7) This Committee shall never exercise any authority over the churches. Its sole function shall be that of advising the local congregation, desiring to establish a new work, in the matter of securing the most strategic location and assist them in securing the sponsorship of a mother church, if desirable. Any group desiring association assistance in securing property and for pastor's salary supplements would be expected to counsel with this committee in locating their work. If a church forms spontaneously or a local church establishes a new mission without counselling with the Missions and Survey Committee, no attempt will be made to tell them they cannot do so. The Association must then decide whether or not to welcome the new church into the fellowship.
- (8) The Missions Committee should correlate the activity of the Associational organizations. Plans should be made together so as to avoid conflicts.
- (9) The Chairman of the Missions Committee will appoint committees within the committee when such are needed to carry out the duties of the Missions Committee with regard to the above items.

THIRTEENTH ANNUAL SESSION NORTH PULASKI BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

October 14, 1974

Afternoon Session

1. Dennis Scudder, Minister of Music, Pike Avenue Baptist Church, directed the messengers in singing "On Jordan's Stormy Banks" and "He Keeps Me Singing", accompanied by Bill Canary, Minister of Music, Baring Cross Baptist Church.

19. Johnny Biggs, Executive Director of the Family and Child Care Services of the Arkansas Baptist State Convention, spoke concerning that work.

20. The Time, Place and Preacher Committee report was presented by Bill Kreis as follows:

22. Larry Williams, Minister of Music at Calvary Baptist Church, led the messengers in singing "He Lives", and "Draw Me Nearer".

23. During the period for miscellaneous business, the moderator read a letter of appreciation from Morrison Chapel Church concerning the financial aid given to them to alleviate flooding problems.

24. Curtis Bryant who retired as pastor of Graves Memorial Baptist Church this year brought the scripture reading from Ephesians 2:1-10 and led in prayer.

25. Miss Donna Jo Connelley sang "Because He Lives".

26. The Moderator introduced Dr. J. C. Myers, pastor of First Baptist Church, North Little Rock as the preacher of the Annual Sermon. Dr. Myers message was "What Am I Doing Here" using scripture from Luke 15 and urging us to show concern for those who have drifted away from the church.

37. A. L. Sparkman, chairman of the Budget Committee, moved the adoption of the 1974-75 budget totaling \$37,500. The budget was adopted as printed.

38. Paul Barrington turned the gavel to the new moderator, Andy A. Kerr, pastor of Second Baptist Church, Jacksonville, who presented Brother Barrington a plaque commemorating his service as moderator.

39. Brother Kerr appointed the Standing Committees (as printed in the Annual).

40. Dennis Scudder led in congregational singing of "How Firm a Foundation", and "Redeemed, How I Love to Proclaim It."

41. Ivan Crossno, pastor of Berea Baptist Church, read from Philippians 2 and led in prayer.

42. The Ladies Trio (Jackie Edwards, Judy Simmons, and Beth Moore) from Pike Avenue Baptist Church brought the special music, "Jesus Himself."

43. William L. Kreis, chairman of the Missions Committee, showed slides of the

Reports

EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Executive Board met in seven regular meetings with an average attendance of fourteen.

The Board:

Approved a motion to participate in the Spirit of '76 Life and Liberty program of the Arkansas Baptist State Convention.

Approved a recommendation from the missions committee to contribute \$200 to the building fund of the Baptist church at Summit, Arkansas.

Approved a recommendation from the missions committee that we accept the gift of 5 lots from the McCulloch Corporation in the Holiday Island resort town north of Eureka Springs and that we purchase an additional lot for the amount of \$5500—these to be used as a future church site.

Approved a recommendation from the missions committee that we make a grant of \$6000 to the Morrison Chapel Baptist Church to assist them with the flood control project at that church.

Approved the gift of \$50 to the Dennis Blackmon family (pastor of Berea Baptist Church) for expenses they incur as they prepare for the mission field in Brazil.

Approved the purchase of a 60 acre tract lying on Mills Valley Road, Pulaski County, to be used as a camp and retreat site. Total cost, \$48,000.

Approved a recommendation from the budget committee that the monies currently in a savings certificate at Pulaski Federal Savings and Loan (\$11,060) be earmarked for camp site purchase and development to be used as needed.

Approved a recommendation from the Missions Committee that we ask the ANNUAL MEETING to approve the sale of the Jacksonville property and use the monies to complete payment and begin development on the camp and retreat property.

Approved the 1974-75 budget in the amount of \$37,500 for recommendation to the Annual Meeting.

Approved appointment of a committee to investigate the possibilities available in the religious programming channel of Cable TV.

RECOMMENDATION: That we sell the 5 acres in Jacksonville and the proceeds be used to complete payment and begin development on the camp and retreat property.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

The State Sunday School department assisted 27 associations and 41 churches in a total of 88 projects in 1973-74. These included training schools, workers' conferences, planning meetings, Reach Out rallies, orientation meetings with

Directors of Missions and Sunday School directors, curriculum conferences and Vacation Bible School Clinics. In addition, the state department gave architectural assistance to 47 churches in the state.

The department has responsibility for programming and directing the Arkansas Baptist Assembly at Siloam Springs. Five assemblies were held with 4896 campers registered. This is an increase of 715 over last year. There were 192 professions of faith and 52 decisions for church related vocations.

In North Pulaski Association the Sunday School organization conducted or assisted in seven projects in 1973-74.

On April 16 we conducted twin Vacation Bible School Clinics at Amboy Baptist Church. We had an attendance of 201 with 22 churches represented at the two clinics.

In May, we conducted our Reach Out rally at Pike Avenue Baptist Church. This meeting, for pastors and Sunday School directors, had an attendance of 47 with 21 churches represented.

In July, the Sunday School cooperated and participated in the Associational Fair at Gravel Ridge First Baptist.

In August, in cooperation with Pulaski County Association, we conducted a mission Vacation Bible School at Lake Nixon for the Girl's Training School. Our enrollment was 51.

On September 10, we conducted Sunday School Leadership Night at Central Baptist Church. We had age group conferences for all ages. Our attendance was 80 with 10 churches represented.

We conducted or assisted in training schools for two of our local churches in 1973-74.

Most churches participated in the statewide high attendance day in October. On "Great Day in the Morning" we had 7,304 in Sunday School in North Pulaski churches. This is an increase of 901 over our average attendance.

Our hope and prayer is that we can show an increase in Sunday School enrollment in our churches in North Pulaski Association this year.

The purposes of Church: the Sunday Night Place are:

To lead church members to love their church, and to find joy and fulfillment in visible support of it on Sunday night;

To help build the church, and to lead church workers to a deeper commitment to the total church program;

To bring about a new awareness about worship, training, and fellowship; and

To bring about increased participation in worship, training, and fellowship.

During our 1973-74 associational year the following Church Training events were planned and conducted.

"M" Night was observed in 37 associations in November of 1973. The total attendance was 7,241 which was an increase over the previous year. There were 562 churches represented at "M" Night. Our association conducted "M" Night and had a total attendance of 282, 22 churches were represented, 16 pastors were present and 12 church training directors attended.

Associational CHURCH: the Sunday Night Place Rallies have been conducted in 25 associations in our state between April 1 and May 23 of this year. Over 1100 leaders attended from 244 churches. Church: the Sunday Night Place Rallies were held in seven other associations in September. The attendance report for these rallies was not available when this report was prepared. The Rally for our association was held on April 25 at Park Hill Baptist Church with a total attendance of 38.

Eight District Bible Drills and Speakers' Tournaments were conducted this year. Twenty-five churches from fifteen associations were represented. The state Youth Bible Drill and Speakers' Tournament were conducted during the Youth Convention on April 12. The State Youth Bible Drill winner was Nora Ruth Justice from Second Baptist Church, West Helena, in Arkansas Valley Association. The State Speakers' Tournament winner was Susan Gray from First Baptist Church, West Memphis, in Tri-County Association. They represented our state in the SBC Youth Bible Drill and Speakers' Tournament at Ridgecrest. Our association had three participants in the district Bible Exploring Drill at Benton who were declared state winners. They were Elizabeth Kreis, Susan Lassiter and Mike Patton from Calvary Church.

Our Association plans to conduct the following projects for 1974-75: October 28, 1974 at Levy Baptist Church, a Clinic for Church Councils, Church Officers and Church Committees. And on November 25, "M" Night will be observed at First Baptist Church, Jacksonville.

WOMANS' MISSIONARY UNION

The Associational Womans' Missionary Union this year participated in the Association Fair with booths representing each age level. Special emphasis rallies with a Giant Step party and a Hawaiian (Enlistment) theme were the highlights of the year.

Dr. Thomas Starkes of the Home Mission Board and a leader in SCAN were two of our speakers.

The WMU was represented at the State and SBC conferences. New work was started in several of our churches this year.

Sunday School material was furnished to Cummins Prison and Open Windows to the Girls' Training School.

Mission study books were taught in the churches of the association by the association officers. Mission films were purchased for the association film strip library.

TACLO

(The Associational Church Library Organization)

The Associational Church Library Organization met four times with an average attendance of 16. There are 25 churches in the association reporting libraries.

The portable library was used by 2 churches. Any church which does not have a library may use the portable library of 200 volumes. Following are the rules for use of the library.

1. The church must authorize its use at a business meeting.
2. The church must select and approve a person to be librarian while the portable library is at the church.
3. The church may keep the portable library for a period of four months after which an inventory will be made and the church will be responsible for all losses.

4. If the church wishes to keep the library more than four months it must have the approval of TACLO.

The audio visual library, which is housed at the associational office, reports 50 new filmstrips added for a total of 330. 191 filmstrips and 42 pieces of equipment were checked out to the churches this past year.

Officers for 1974-75 are: Mr. E. C. Horn, president; Mrs. H. J. Vines, vice-president; Mrs. Bertie Jones, program chairman; Mrs. E. W. Sylvester, secretary; and Mrs. Geneva Sauls, audio-visual director. Quarterly meetings will be held on the 4th Sunday in January, April, July and October. Plans for the new year include a Workshop for all library personnel in April.

MUSIC

North Pulaski Association sponsored a Music Leadership Workshop for Children's and Preschool Choirs on September 17 at Pike Avenue Baptist Church. Two identical sessions were made available in the afternoon and evening. There were 10 churches represented with 30 in attendance. We feel this was a great accomplishment and plans are for a similar workshop for next year. Also, planned for next year in August is an Associational School of Music with conferences in every phase of church music plus a choral workshop.

YOUTH

On Saturday evening, May 25, the Association Youth Rally was held at the Sherwood First Baptist Church. Dick King was speaker and Gregg Greenway was in charge of the music. One hundred fifty young people from across the association were present.

BAPTIST STUDENT UNION

PERSONNEL CHANGES AND NEW ASSIGNMENTS

Jerry Bass is our new BSU Director at Southern State College at Magnolia and is also working with the Southwest Technical Institute at Camden. A graduate of Southwestern Seminary, he and his wife worked as Journeymen in South America with the FMB.

Three Student-To-Student workers have been hired for the 1974-75 school year. This was made possible by the Cooperative Program overage from last year. They are Alana Fletcher at Henderson State College, Becky Ward at Ouachita Baptist University and Linda Fisher at Little Rock. Their work will be primarily in the area of campus evangelism, visitation and Bible study.

Several directors have assumed responsibility for new colleges or at colleges where no work has been conducted in the past. This will bring to 27 the number of campuses with the ministry of Baptist Student Union.

MISSIONS AND EVANGELISM

1. Our 1973 summer missionaries reported over 900 professions of faith.
2. The life of Christ in scripture was given to students of University of Arkansas and at Southern State College, as a part of Project 76.
3. Students made a door-to-door visit and gift of scripture to each residence in Fayetteville.
4. Ten students and student directors visited Utah State University at Logan, Utah, and attempted to give each of 600 international students a Bible in his language. The Bibles were gifts of various individuals and groups in southeast Arkansas.
5. BSU's and campus churches reported a record number of student baptisms: 197.
6. Thirty-four summer missionaries served this summer with their expenses being paid by their fellow students.

PROPERTY

The new Baptist Student Center at UALR is moving toward a Fall completion date.

The house and lot adjacent to the house used as a Baptist Student Center at Westark Community College in Fort Smith has been purchased.

LOCAL PROGRAM

Four students were involved in ministries this summer from Little Rock BSU's; Ted Mettetal—Philippines, Alice Walser—New Mexico, Tommy Callahan—Michigan and Joe Bradley—Youth Director in Fort Smith.

The Bible distribution program for Internationals continues as we will be placing a new order this fall for the students who are new or were not reached last year. We appreciate the response of the Brotherhoods who have sent in \$130.50 to help with this project. We still owe \$16.19 for Bibles ordered and anticipate a need of about \$100 to \$150 more for the new order.

Mrs. Charles Ashcraft has led us in a program of conversational English for Internationals. A workshop for some interested in this work will be held the third week in October.

PROGRAM

Even though not in our building at UALR, we are having three regular activities a week and will move to five when we enter the new building. A recent Fall Retreat reached over 30 students. Our Medical Center supper-seminar has started with unusual interest and involvement. We appreciate the response of our churches so far to our supper seminar meal preparation. We have only one opening before Christmas.

OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST

Four people from Little Rock were among the over 100 attending Student Week at Glorieta. Our new building is moving toward a completion date in the fall and the formal dedication will be scheduled early next year.

We want to thank all Arkansas Baptists and especially North Pulaski Baptist Association for their continuing prayer and ministry to the mission field of the college campus.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that each church on the local level give serious and prayerful consideration to an alternate home ownership plan.
