SEPTEMBER 8th and 10th, 1888.

September 8th, A. D. 1888, the C. R. R. B. A. met as agreed, with Pleasant Valley Church, in Montgomery County, Ark.

The introductory sermon was preached by Elders A. Nelson and E. P. Chitwood. Text: "What is Truth," John 18 ch., second clause of the 38th verse. The closing prayer was offered by Elder D. D. Corban.

Adjourned until 3 p.m.

The body met according to adjournment, and opened by reading the 8th Psalm and sung, "Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone," and prayer by the Moderator.

Five new churches—twenty-eight in all represented—the Second Hot Springs Missionary Baptist Church not being represented.

Elder N. H. Harley, Elder W. W. Carson and Willie Peoples read the letters (being appointed).

The body then went into the election of officers, which resulted in the choice of Elder W. W. Carson for Moderator; Elder E. Wright for Clerk, and John Welch for Treasurer.

Next appointed a Preaching Committee, viz.: G. B. Willis, W. Crepps, Bro. — Estes, and the messengers of Pleasant Valley Church.

Visiting members were then invited to take seats with the body.

Correspondence was called for and received as follows: From Red River Association, Elder J. F. Welch. This correspondence was full of love, encouraging and inviting.

On Obituaries—A. F. Wilson, J. F. Wisener and R. W. Payne.

The preaching committee was called on to report the appointees to preach, which was as follows: Elder J. P. Welch and Elder J. J. Hughes Saturday night. Elders D. D. Corban and J. H. West, Sunday, 9 a.m. Elders J. F. Welch and O. C. Miller, 11 a.m. Elders N. H. Harley and T. J. Welch, 3 p.m. Elders W. W. Carson and H. L. Wasson, Sunday night. Sung, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name." Prayer by Elder H. L. Wasson.

Close of first day. Adjourned to meet on Monday, at 8 a.m.

THE PREACHING.

Elder J. R. Hardy, of Red River Association, filled the appointment made for Elder J. P. Welch, with Elder J. J. Hughes, Saturday night, (Elder J. P. Welch being absent).

Text: "The wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Prov. 6 c., 23 v. A good interest was manifested. Sunday morning prayer meeting was opened by Bro. James White, near the hour of 8 a.m., reading the 4th chapter of the Gospel by St. John. After prayers and singing there were a few minutes intermission. The congregation then came together by singing; when Elder D. D. Corban read a portion of the 24th chapter of Matthew; offered prayer, and then preached from the 14th verse of the 24th chapter of Matthew: "And this Gospel of the Kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come." Elder J. H. West followed, giving out the hymn beginning: "O! for a heart to praise my God;" then read the 27th division of the Psalms, and took for a text, 4th v., "One thing have I desired of the Lord; that will I seek after;" ("That I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the Lord, and to inquire in His temple.")

There was much interest manifested in these discourses. After an intermission of a few minutes and at 11 a.m., Elder J. F. Welch gave out the hymn: "How happy's every child of grace," which was sung. He also read the 16th chapter of John and offered prayer. His text was the first and second clauses of the 7th verse of the 16th chapter of John: "Nevertheless I tell you the truth; it is expedient for you that I go away."

Elder O. C. Miller followed and said: I am truly glad that we have had the privilege of listening to the gone-by discourse. (It was grand—CLERK). Interest great. Intermission until 3 p.m.

Came together by singing. Elder N. H. Harley read the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles and gave out the hymn: "Behold what pity touched the heart,"—(77, Evergreen), and offered prayer. Text: 1st chapter and 8th verse of Acts. "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you; and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost parts of the earth," from which a good feeling discourse was delivered, and he was followed by Elder T. J. Welch, giving some good remarks. Adjourned until night.

Re-assembled at night. This was Sunday night. Elder W. W. Carson read the hymn, "And canst thou sinner slight," which was sung. Prayer by W. H. Caldwell. Text: Ez. 33 ch., 11 v. "Say unto them, as I live, saith the Lord God, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked; but that the wicked turn from his way and live; turn ye, turn ye from your evil ways; for why will ye die, O house of Israel?"

Elder W. W. Carson preached and was followed by Elder H. L. Wasson. "We know the tree by its fruit." We had a good time, many were interested, some professions, and one addition to the church, by experience. Adjourned.

Preaching on Monday, Sept. 10th, 1888, 9 a.m. Elder D. Bright and Bro. W. S. Gamble. Text: 6th chapter and latter clause of 19th v. and 20th v. of 1st Corinthians. "And ye are not your own, for ye are bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's."

11 a.m., Elder J. P. Welch. Hebrews: 4th chap., 6 v. "Seeing therefore it remaineth that some must enter therein, and they to whom it was first preached entered not in because of an unbelief."

The Association came together by singing. Elder W. H. Caldwell opened by reading and inviting all to sing Hymn No. 7 (Evergreen), and by offering prayer.

The list of the names of the delegates chosen by the different churches was then called and the absentees marked, that only those present might be enrolled in this book.

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION.

The Sunday School Convention of the Caddo River Regular Baptist Association met pursuant to adjournment with the church at Caney Valley, Pike county, Ark., on Friday, 11 o'clock a.m., before the first Lord's Day in August, A. D. 1888. The introductory sermon was preached by Elders T. J. Welch and J. J. Hughes. Text: Matt. 20th ch. and 19 v.

After some appropriate remarks by the president, the body adjourned until 3 o'clock p.m.

In the evening, at 3 o'clock, the Convention opened for business by reading the 32d Psalm and prayer by the president.

Adjourned until early candle-light.

At early candle-light the Convention convened.

An interesting sermon was preached by Elders J. E. Kennedy and J. P. Welch. Text: First Kings, 8th ch. and 21st verse.
Adjourned until 9 o'clock a.m. on Sunday.

SUNDAY MORNING, 9 A. M.

The Convention opened by hearing the 53d chapter of Isaiah read by the president. Prayer by Elder J. M. Smith. We then enjoyed a Sunday School lesson with our worthy president and D. J. Kennedy, teacher. A collection for printing the minutes of this Convention was taken to the amount of \$2.80.

Dear Brethren: We had a harmonious time. We were made to feel glad, enjoying the presence of each other, old and young, in this convention. Oh! that God may incline our hearts to be more faithful in trying to bring up the rising generation in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The Convention adjourned to meet with the Mountain Home Church, Montgomery county, Ark., on Friday, 11 o'clock a.m., before the second Lord's Day, in August, A. D. 1889.
