

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RULES OF DECORUM,

- Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
 - The officers of this Association shall be chosen by the suffrages of the members present.
 - The Moderator shall be considered a judge of order, and shall have the right to call to order at any time.
 - A member not satisfied with his decision may appeal to the Association on the same day, but at no other time.
 - Not one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise to his foot and address the Moderator; on obtaining leave, shall proceed.
 - The Moderator, when addressed by a member for permission to speak, shall signify the same by naming the person, or otherwise.
 - No person shall be interrupted while speaking, unless he depart from the subject or uses words of personal reflection, and then by the Moderator. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Ampociation, unless withdrawn by him that made it.
 - Ivery case taken up by the Association shall be decided or withdrawn before another is introduced.
 - When a question is taken up, after allowing time for debate, the Moderator shall take the voice of the Association by yeas and nays, or otherwise.
 - A member wishing to retire shall obtain permission from the Moderator.
 - without permission of the Association, nor more than once initial every member wishing to speak shall have poken; nor shall any proposition be made to close the ubject until the debate has been carried through.
 - The appellation of Brother shall be used in the Association by members in their addresses one to another.
 - The names of the members shall be called as often as the Ausociation may direct.
 - No member shall be tolerated in any practice which tends to interrupt public speaking.
 - The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of peaking as any other member, provided he appoint another to his seat during the time, but shall not vote on any question unless the Association be equally divided.
 - Inv member violating these rules may be reproved by the Moderator, at discretion, but only on the day the breach hall have been made.
 - These rules may be amended at a regular meeting of this lody by the concurring voice of two-thirds of the members present, provided the proposed change has been submitted to the body the day previous.

ARTICLES OF FAITH,

- We believe in one only true and living God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are a revelation from God, and that the New Testament is our only rule of faith and practice.
- We believe in the doctrine of election as founded in the foreknowledge of God, through sanctification of the spirit unto belience, and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ.

We believe in original sin by the fall of Adam.

- We believe in man's incapacity, by his own free will and bility, to rescue himself from the fallen state in which he by nature.

- We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinunces of Jesus Christ; that believers are the only proper ubjects of Baptism; and that immersion is the apostolic mode.
- We believe in the resurrection of the dead. and a general judgment; and that the felicity of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal.
 - We believe no minister has a right to administer the ordinuces of the Gospel but one who has been regularly imnuces of the the time of tim
 - We believe that none but regularly immersed believers have a right to come to the Lord's Supper.
 - We believe that the Lord's Day should be kept as a day of test and devotional exercise.
