

-* Board Camp Church, Polk Co., Ark. ** COMMENCING SEPTEMBER 14TH. 1895.

THE Introductory sermon was preached by Eld. A. A BATES, A Text-St. Luke, 16 chapt, and 16 verse. After recess the Association was called to order by reading, singing and prayer, by the Moderator.

1st. Called for the letters, and appointed Bro's, J. M. Hilton, and S. M. Kemp, to read them. The letters were read, and Dele-

gates names enrolled.

2d. By proper organization the Association proceeded to elect officers and elected; Bro. S. M. Keinp, as Moderator, J. K. Wilcox, as Clerk, and A. J. Strickland, as Treasurer. The Moderator appointed Committees to wit:—1st. On preaching, 2d. on Obituary, 3rd. Finance: 4th. Arrangements. 5th. Prayer-meetings and Sabbath schools. 6th. Destitution and mission. 7th. Pastors to Churches and Churches to Pastors.

Called for petitionary letters, and received none. Called for Corresponding Messengers, and received one from Caddo River association to wir. J. A. Collum, who was recognized and seated.

On motion Adjourned untill Monday morning 8 o'clock.

MONDAY MORNING 8 O'CLOCK

Met pursuant to adjournment, prayer by the Moderator.

1st. Called the role and marked absentees.

2nd. Called for the reading of the minutes of the first days proceedings, which was read, and adopted. On motion the speeches

were limited to 15 minutes.

By motion heared the report of Committees. 1st- On preaching Appendix A. 2nd. On obitnary Appendix B. 3rd. On prayer meetings and Sabbath schools Appendix C. 4th On finance Apendix D. Pastors to churches, and churches to pastors Appendix E.

On arrangements Appendix F. On destitution G.

Motion in order that Bro. G. Jones, be released from this body on account of sickness, and Bro. R. G. Brown, take his seat both in the body and as committeeman on preaching. On motion adjourned untill. 2 o'clock p. m.

Met pursuant to adjournment. Called to order by the Moder-

ron. Then taken up the general order of business-

Called for the report of the committee that this association appointed one year ago to meet a committee from the Ouchita association,

which was read and received, and committee discharged, and their proposition was rejected by this body. By motion adjourned untill Tuesday marning half past 8 o'clock.

Met pursaant to adjournment, singing and praver by Eld. J. E.-Long. Then the body was called to order by the Moderator, then called the role and marked absentees. Then called for the reading of the minutes of Mondays proceedings, which was read and adopted.

Called for resolutions, No's, 1, 2 and 3, were read and adopted;

Resolution No 4 was discussed and lost.

Motion and carried that Long View Church, of Scott Co., Ark. have a letter of dssmission from the Big Fork, United Baptest Association

Mo ion in order that the Clerk have 200 copies of the minutes printed.

Called for the Treasurers report which was read, and adopted.

Called for the minutes of the body, which was read and adopted. On motion adjourned to meet with Brushy Creek church, Montgomery Co., Ark. commencing Sat. before the third Sun. in Sept. 1896.

*BIG FORK*INITED BAPTIST*ASSOCIATION. > Annote 1. This union of Churches, shall be known and distinguish-

ed, by the name of the Big Fork, United Baptist Association.

Arr. 2. This Association, shall-be composed of Delegates from

Churches in union. Each church shall be entitled to three Delegates, who shall be required to furnish satisfactory evidence of their appointments by their absorbase before their actions their statements.

ment by their churches, before taking their seats.

ART. 3. The Delegates, when convened, shall organize themselvs into a deliberate body, by the appointment of a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be chosen by ballot, at each annual Association, and continue in office until their successor is chosen.

Arr. 4. This Association shall not interfere with the rights of the Churches of which it is composed; it shall regard then as independent bodies in all matters of internal government; and shall only act as an advising council, assumsig no authority except, what is expressly delegated to it by the churches, or evidently implyes by the very nature of compact. It nevertheless, clains authority over its own members, and delegates from the churches; and in justice and

propriety must have power to withdraw from, and disown, all Churches which depart from the principle of the compact by becoming hetro lox in faith, or disorderly in practice. It should therefore regard all churches united under this. Constitution with a vigilant eye for good: Its business shall be to declair, and promote the declarative glocy of God, by extending the Kingdom of Grace on earth, through the medium of preaching the Gospel, to cultivate union and fellowship, with all the churches of Christ. Especially those united under this constitution.

ART, 5. Newly constituted Churches, or Churches dismissed from ther Associations of same faith and order, may be admitted into this union, on their sending up three delegates to the annual meeting of this Association, with a patition for admission, and by their delegates agreeing to the abstract of principles herewith published,

ART, 6. THE CHURCHES in this usion shall transmit to every annual session of this Association, a written communication specifying the names of their delegates, their number in full fellowship. No. baptized received, excommunicated, restored or dismissed since last session; and all other information which the church may deem important; which will be read, and minuted accordingly.

Agr. 7. The Association shall have a fund supplied by voluntary contribution of the churches and and all money thus contributed shall be payed over through the committee of finance to the Treasurer, (who shall be elected by ballot and hold his office during the pleasure of the Association, and manage the funds agreeably.) He shall return to the order of the Association a clear and sufficient statement of all the receipts and expenditures.

ART. 8. This Association shall take cognizance of on querry sent up from the churches, unless they have endevoted to solve the same, and have failed, our of any difficulty between churches, unless they have pursued the dictations to the 18th, clisps, of Matthew, and have not been able to settle them. Then, this Association will take on homether; under consideration and act upon them at its discretion.

ART. 9. IT Shall BE THE DUTY OF THE CLERK, OF THE ASSOCIATION, to keep a regular file of THE PRINTED MIN—UTES OF THIS BODY, and deliver THE SAME TO HIS SUCCESSOR IN OFFICE.

Att = 10. THIS Constitution may be altered, or amended, at regular meetings of this Association, by the concurring voice of two-thirds of the members procent, provided SUCH ALTERATIONS OR A-ENDMENTS be approved by the CHURCHES OF THE ASSO-LATION.

ART. 11. THERE are to be no Sunday collections taken up in this Association, nor men appointed to preach what are known as Missi macy sermons, but to choose their own subject.

RULES OF DECORUM.

The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

1. The Moderator and Clerk, shall be chosen by the sufferage of the members present.

3 The Moderator shall be e-asidered a Judge of order, and

shall have a right to call to order at any time.

4. A member not sinisfied with his decision, may appeal to the As ociation the same day, but not thereafter.

5. Buy one in inher shall speak at a time, who shall rise to their feet, address the moderator, obtain permission, and then proceed to speak

6. The Moderator when addressed by a member for permission to weak, shall signify the same by naming the person, or otherwise.

- 7. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, unless he depart from the subject, or is guilty of personal reflection. Every motion made and seconded, shall come under the consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by him that made it.
- 8. Every case taken up by the Association, shall be decided or wi-ladrawn, before another is approved
- 9. When any question is taken up, after allowing time for debate, the Moderator, may take the voice of the Association, on all suejects in any way he may think best.

10. Any member wishing to retire shall obtain permission of the

Moderator,

- 14. No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject, without permission of the Association, nor more than once until every member wishing to speak, shall have spoken; nor shall any proposition be made to close the subject until the debate is carded through.
- 12. The appellation "Brother" shall be used in the Association, by members in their address to each other.
- 13. The names of the Churches shall be called as often as the association shall direct.
- 14. No member shall be tolerated in any practice which tends to interrupt public speech.

15. The Modernton, shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech, as any other member provided, he appioint another to fill his

seat during the time, but shall not be allowed to vote, unless the Association be equally divided, then he may cast the deciding votd.

16. Any member violating these rules may be reproved by the Molerator at his discretion, but only on the day the breech shall be committed.

ARTICLE 1. We believe in one only true and living God, and that there is a trinity of persons in the God-head, the Father, Sone Holy Ghost, and that these three are one

Arr. 6. We believe that samers are justified in the sight of God. by the righteousness of Christ, imputed unto them, and that it pleased God, by the foolishness of preaching, to save them that believe.

Arr. 7- WE believe that good works are fruits of faith, and fol lows after justification, and are evidence of our own gracious state.

Art. 8. WE believe the visible Church of Christ, is a congregation of faithful pers us baptized, who have gained christian fellowship with each-other, and give unto the Lord, and one-an-other, and have agreed to keep up a Godly, deciplin agreeable to the rules of the gospel.

Art. 9. We believe there will be a Resurcction of the dead, and a general Judgement, and that the happiness of the rightcous, and the

punishment of the wicked, will be never-ending

Art, 10. WE believe that "Jesus Christ, is the great head of the Church, and the only law-giver, and the decipling is with the body. and should be exemptedly kept up for the glory of God, and the prosperity of HIS people.

Vet 1. We believe that kaptism by immersion, is the Apostolic mode, and true believers are the only in sections of
