Constitution

(Adopted October 17, 1961)

(Section 8 (a) Amended October 15, 1963)

(Section 5 Amended October 14, 1968)

1. NAME

The name of this association shall be the North Pulaski Baptist Association, cooperating with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this association shall be to promote Christian fellowship and cooperation among the churches affiliated with the association to uphold the doctrines and principles of our Baptist faith and to encourage the churches to be loyal to and practice these doctrines and principles; to promote the preaching and teaching of God's Word, the enlisting and training of all Christians for service; to promote missions, benevolence, stewardship, Christian education, and the winning of all men to Christ to the ends of the earth. To co-operate with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention in a world mission program.

3. MEMBERSHIP

The body shall be composed of messengers elected from the churches and missions affiliated with the body. When such messengers are approved by the association they shall be seated and entitled to participate in the affairs of the body. Each church shall be entitled to three messengers for the first fifty members, and one additional messenger for each fifty members above the first fifty, provided that no church shall be entitled to more than ten messengers.

4. ARTICLES OF FAITH

The Articles of Faith set forth in New Hampshire Confession as the doctrinal beliefs of the churches shall be the doctrines adopted by this body.

5. OFFICERS

The officers of the Association shall be moderator, moderator-elect, clerk, treasurer and historian. These officers shall be nominated and elected by the association, preferably before the last session of the annual meeting. They shall serve until the close of the following annual session of the association or until their

successors shall be elected and installed. Election shall be by secret ballot unless another plan is adopted by unanimous consent. The term of moderator shall be for one year. The moderator-elect shall serve as assistant to the moderator for one year and shall at the time of the annual association meeting assume the office of moderator. The association will at that time elect a new moderator-elect. The duties of these officers shall be those usually incumbent upon such officers.

If the association employs a superintendent of missions and/or an educational director, these workers shall be considered as officers of the association. Such additional officers shall be elected as the association shall deem necessary to its most effective work.

6. AUTHORITY

The association is an autonomous body and therefore reserves the right to determine its own policies and direct its own business; it may refuse to seat messengers who are not in fellowship or doctrinal agreement with the body, or whose churches are not. However, this body shall never exercise any authority over, or give direction to, any church or churches which are affiliated with it or which may have been affiliated with it; but the association will stand ready to lend any assistance or counsel to any church making request for such help.

7. ORGANIZATIONS

This body shall encourage and promote such associational organizations as Sunday School, Training Union, Woman's Missionary Union, Brotherhood, music, library, and other organizations which are in keeping with the purpose of the association, with their full staffs of officers and programs necessary for the promotion of the work. The chief officer of each organization shall be elected, or approved by the association and shall function as an officer of the association.

8. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Association shall have an executive committee consisting of the pastor of each church (where he is a member of the church) and one lay member from each church. Nominations for membership in the executive committee may be made by the church, but members must be elected by the association. The officers of the association, namely moderator, moderator-elect, clerk, treasurer, and historian, shall be ex officio members of the executive committee and should serve as respective officers of the committee, unless the association directs otherwise. All other officers and chairmen of standing committees are to become ex officio members of the executive committee. Ex officio members will not have the rights to vote unless they are also members of the executive committee elected as representatives of their respective churches.

The executive committee shall attend to all matters of the association between sessions; promote all progress authorized by the association; and carry out all directives given by the association. It shall make an annual report to the association of all work carried on and all finances handled. The executive committee shall not have the power to create or initiate any new work or project not contained in the reports and recommendations of the previous meeting of the association.

The executive committee shall hold regular monthly or quarterly meetings.

The executive committee shall not have power to entitle a church to affiliation with the association or have representation on the executive committee, but may invite a church to sit with it in counsel without vote, pending the seating of the messengers of that church by the association.

8. (a.) The legal title to all property owned by this Association, both real and personal, shall be held in the name of the designated trustees, which shall be vested in them by virtue of their office and which shall be transmitted to their successors. The Trustees shall be three in number and shall be named by the Association to

serve for a term of one year or until their successors shall have been named and qualified. In the event a vacancy should occur by reason of the failure of the Association to make such selection, by death, by disability, by removal from the community or otherwise, the Executive Committee may fill the vacancy. By direction of the Association, or of the Executive Committee the trustees shall be clothed with authority to act on behalf of the Association in the acquisition and disposition of Associational property, and specifically shall have authority to execute notes, bonds, debentures, deeds of conveyance, mortgages, pledges and other security instruments and any and all related documents incidental thereto; and to represent the Association in all legal matters. All persons dealing with said trustees may rely upon any written resolution duly adopted by the Association or the Executive Committee, directing and authorizing the trustee to act in its behalf, and a certified copy of any such resolution duly executed by the Associational moderator and the clerk shall be conclusive evidence thereof.

9. MEETINGS

The association shall hold annual meetings of the body at such time and place as it may determine. The executive committee may have power to change the stated time and/or place of the annual meeting in case of emergency or necessity. The association may hold such quarterly meetings as are deemed wise for the promotion of its work. It shall promote such regular meetings of its worker's council, its promotional organizations, and its standing committees as shall prove most effective for carrying out the total purpose of the association.

10. COMMITTEES

The association shall have the following standing committees named by the moderator and his officers before the close of the annual session to serve until the close of the next annual session, namely, program committee, nominating committee, credentials committee, budget committee, and such additional standing committees as seem needed. All organizations of the association shall name their own committees.

11. AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any regular annual session of the association by a two-thirds majority of the messengers present, provided notice of such change has been given at the previous annual meeting and provided it is read in the first session of the annual meeting and voted on before the last session.

By-Laws

(Section 2 amended October 11, 1971)

1. In parliamentary procedure the body shall be governed by ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER or Kerfoot's PARLIAMENTARY LAW.

2. The fiscal year for the association shall be from the first day of October to the last day of September inclusive. Annual reports to the association shall cover this period.

3. The annual meeting of the association shall be in the month of Oct. The exact days and place shall be recommended by the nominating committee, or other committee authorized by the association, and approved by the body. The executive committee may be authorized to make such adjustments in the time and place of the annual meeting as may become necessary because of circumstances which develop after the close of the annual meeting of the whole body.

4. All officers of the association must be members of churches within the

association, in good standing, and recognized for their knowledge of and loyalty to Southern Baptist doctrines and programs.

5. Duties of the officers shall be as follows:

The MODERATOR shall call to order and preside over the meetings of the association and the executive committee, and direct the affairs of the association in an orderly manner and Christian spirit. (He may for good reason ask other officers or members of the body to preside at times.)

The MODERATOR-ELECT may, if the moderator so directs, preside over the sessions of the association council. He shall preside over other meetings in the absence of the moderator and shall assist the moderator in such ways as he may direct. The moderator-elect will have the privilege of attending the assembly of his choice as preparation for the office of moderator.

The CLERK shall keep a full and accurate record of all business of the association and the executive committee, and of all recommendations of the associational council. At each meeting he shall be prepared to read all minutes of the previous meeting. All records for at least one year shall be on hand at each meeting. They shall be kept in a fireproof safe between meetings.

The TREASURER shall receive all funds of and for the association, not otherwise designated, shall disburse all funds in accordance with the adopted associational budget or the specific instructions of the association and upon receipt of a bill or voucher properly authorized. He shall keep accurate records of all monies received, with sources and designations of same. He shall make reports to the regular meetings of the executive committee and annual meeting of the association and have the same approved. The executive committee shall have the treasurer's reports audited at the close of the fiscal year, and reports the same to the annual association, for approval.

The HISTORIAN shall write in orderly form the events of the association, beginning with its organization. The association should request the churches and individuals who may possess historical information about the association to make it accessible to the historian. He shall make record of current events of each fiscal year and read his annual chapter to the annual meeting of the association for adoption. These records shall be kept in a fireproof safe or vault.

6. The following associational organizations shall be maintained and promoted by the association for the benefit of the work in the churches; associational Sunday School organization, associational Training Union, associational Woman's Missionary Union, associational Brotherhood, associational music organization, associational Church Library Council, and such other as may be deemed wise for the attainment of the objectives of the association. All officers of these organizations shall be members of churches affiliated with the association and in good standing.

Unless the association shall direct otherwise, the chief officers of the organizations shall be chosen by their respective organizations, submitted to the nominating committee of the association, and elected or approved by the association. Their duties shall be understood to be in line with the functions set forth in the promotional literature for their respective organizations, as produced or approved by the state or Convention-wide agencies functioning in a like area.

7. The following committees, other than the standing and special committees, shall be maintained by the association as needed for promotion of its work among the churches; committee on evangelism, missions committee, and such other committees as may be needed. The chairman of these committees shall be elected or appointed by the association, and other committee members shall be chosen in number and manner designated by the association and in accord with the needs of

the work. The qualifications required for members of such committees shall be the same as for all other officers, and their duties shall be prescribed by the association.

8. All associational organizations and regular committees shall make reports to the regular meetings of the executive committee and/or to the association. The executive committee shall exercise authority over these organizations and committees only to the extent of determining whether they are working within the bounds of the organizational programs as approved by the association.

9. A place shall be made on the order of business of the association for miscellaneous business at each session of the association.

10. A sermon on doctrines and one on missions shall be provided at each annual meeting. Addresses on assigned topics relating to phases of our Baptist work shall be provided for by the program committee.

11. Messengers to the association shall be accorded equal rights and privileges of the floor, provided each messenger who desires to speak shall rise, address the moderator, and be recognized before he begins to speak. No messenger shall be entitled to speak on any one subject more than twice until other messengers desiring to speak have been heard. Upon request of a messenger, or by consent of the body, the moderator may invite a visitor to speak during a discussion.

12. The by-laws may be amended at any regular session of the association by a majority vote of messengers present, provided such amendment has been read to the body not later than the second session, and is voted on before the last session.

COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF THE ASSOCIATIONAL MISSIONS COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Association in Annual meeting, through the Nominating Committee, shall elect a standing committee, known as the Missions Committee. This committee shall be composed of NINE members. Members of the Missions Committee shall serve for a term of THREE years. Each year THREE members shall complete their terms and shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of at least one year.

Section 2. The Officers of the Association and the elected Associational Organization leaders, shall be ex-officio members of the Committee with all rights of discussion and voting.

Section 3. The Missions Committee shall have the responsibility of selecting and nominating any paid agents of the Association, and to recommend their employment to the Executive Board in regular meetings, or properly called special meetings.

Section 4. The duties of the Missions Committee shall be as follows:

(a) To plan a program of mission work for the Association. This is to be an active and aggressive program of planning. This committee should present a challenging and progressive program of work.

(2) To see that the plans for Associational work are promoted effectively.

(3) To plan a program of benevolences. This should be a well thought out program including all such needs. Plans for promoting the activities should be initiated by this committee.

(4) To plan a comprehensive program with regard to Christian Education. This committee should ascertain the needed projects, set the emphases, and actively promote the work.

(5) To correlate the activities and projects of the Association with the adopted

cooperative program. This committee should actively work toward the end of keeping all our Baptist program under direct supervision in co-operation with the cooperative program plan. These projects should be clearly thought through and planned in connection with the budget committee each year.

(6) To work toward the establishment of new units of mission work in the Association. To facilitate this phase of the work the Chairman of the Missions Committee shall appoint a special committee of THREE from the membership of the Missions Committee. This shall be known as the Missions and Survey Committee. The duties of the committee shall be:

- (a) To survey the entire Association to determine the areas where new churches or missions should be established, and to locate property in such areas suitable for building sites.
- (b) To recommend to the Missions Committee expenditures toward securing such property. The Missions Committee will then study their findings and recommendations and bring to the Executive Board for final action those projects they endorse.
- (c) To solicit the assistance of sponsoring churches in establishing work in areas which have been approved by the Executive Board.
- (d) To assist and advise all groups desiring to establish Baptist Churches and Missions in the territorial limits of North Pulaski Baptist Association to the end that all such works may secure the most desirable and strategic locations to serve the people of this association.
- (e) To survey any areas to be served by each proposed new work and recommend to the Missions Committee the nature and extent of any assistance that the Association should provide in each case. The Missions Committee would in turn study their recommendation and submit to the Executive Board a final recommendation in each instance.
- (f) To recommend to the Missions Committee all salary supplements to pastors of missions and needy churches. Requests shall be made in writing on a standard form. Commitments for supplements shall be made for periods not to exceed one year. They may be renewed by recommendation of the Committee in deserving cases. Maximum aid will be limited to three years. After the first year the aid shall be reduced 25% of the original amount for each following year.
- (g) That all recommendations of the missions committee concerning pastoral aid and disposition of property be published one month prior to presentation to the Executive Board on the Associational page of the Arkansas Baptist State Paper.
- (h) Regarding Pioneer Mission Work, it is recommended that any approval of aid to Pioneer Missions also have the approval of the Home Mission Board.
- (7) This Committee shall never exercise any authority over the churches. Its sole function shall be that of advising the local congregation, desiring to establish a new work, in the matter of securing the most strategic location and assist them in securing the sponsorship of a mother church, if desirable. Any group desiring association assistance in securing property and for pastor's salary supplements would be expected to counsel with this committee in locating their work. If a church forms spontaneously or a local church establishes a new mission without counselling with the Missions and Survey Committee, no attempt will be made to tell them they cannot do so. The Association must then decide whether or not to welcome the new church into the fellowship.

(8) The Missions Committee should correlate the activity of the Associational organizations. Plans should be made together so as to avoid conflicts.

(9) The Chairman of the Missions Committee will appoint committees within the committee when such are needed to carry out the duties of the Missions Committee with regard to the above items.

FIFTEENTH ANNUAL SESSION
NORTH PULASKI BAPTIST ASSOCIATION
October 18, 1976

AFTERNOON SESSION

1. Moderator, Mason Bondurant, declared the Fifteenth Annual Session of North Pulaski Baptist Association meeting in the Pike Avenue Baptist Church, North Little Rock, officially in session at 2:45 p.m. on October 18, 1976, and introduced the Association Music Director, Dennis Scudder, who directed congregational singing.

2. Mr. Scudder introduced the accompanists for the sessions, Mrs. Roseann Kennedy, organist and Mrs. Verda Resch, pianist. The messengers sang, "How Firm a Foundation," "Now, I Belong to Jesus," "There Is a Name I Love to Hear," and "How Great Thou Art."

3. T. J. Richardson, Jr., pastor of Bethany Baptist Church, read from the Scripture, I Peter 1:13, Philippians 3:8-15 and Colossians 1:18-19 and offered prayer.

4. Lex H. Eaker, pastor of the host church, welcomed the messengers.

5. The moderator declared that those who knew themselves to be duly elected messengers of the respective churches constitute the body of this Annual Session with full voting privileges.

6. The program as printed was adopted as the order of business.

7. Robert McDaniel, pastor of Calvary Baptist Church, and Randal Woodfield, Minister of Music and Education at Central Baptist Church, were recognized as new men in the Association.

8. Mason Bondurant moved the adoption of the Executive Board report. The report was adopted as printed. He then spoke to the report. (All reports can be found in the report section of this annual.)

9. Mrs. Geneva Sauls moved the adoption of the treasurer's report as printed. Motion carried.

10. Freddie Pike, Sunday School Director, moved the adoption of the Sunday School report as printed. Motion carried. He spoke to the report and emphasized the Family Bible Conference to be held in February, 1977. He also brought greetings from the Baptist Building thanking those in the Association for their support and cooperation during the past year and reporting gains in many areas.

11. Mr. Pike also moved the adoption of the Associational Church Library Organization report. He spoke to the report which was adopted as printed.

12. Mrs. Alyce Polos, W. M. U. Director, spoke to the W. M. U. report which was adopted as printed.

13. A. Kay Mansell, Church Training Director, spoke to the Church Training report following its adoption.

14. Youth Director, Luke Flesher, moved the adoption of the Youth report as printed. Report was adopted and he spoke to the report.

15. Dennis Scudder moved the adoption of the Music report as printed. Motion carried. He then spoke to the report.

16. The Baptist Student Union report was adopted as printed. James Smalley, Little Rock B. S. U. Director and Alan Rankin, B. S. U. Director of the University

of Arkansas at Little Rock, spoke to the report.

17. J. C. Myers, Missions Committee Chairman, moved the adoption of the report as printed and introduced a filmstrip on "Bold Mission Thrust" a program of Southern Baptist to "evangelize" and "congregationalize" our nation.

18. Lex Eaker brought the nominating committee report and moved its adoption. Motion carried.

19. Joe Sullivan, a member of the Board of the Arkansas Baptist Foundation, brought a report from the Foundation.

20. Dennis Scudder led the messengers in singing "At Calvary" and "Showers of Blessing."

21. Dr. Ben Elrod, O. B. U. Vice-President for Development, brought the Ouachita Baptist University report.

22. Harold Wilson, pastor of Cedar Heights church, brought the memorial thought and led in prayer remembering the 125 who had died in the Lord.

23. Raymond Jackson, pastor of Morrison Chapel church, brought the Time, Place, Preacher report moving that the Annual Meeting of 1977 be held at Bethany Baptist Church, North Little Rock, on October 17, with an afternoon and evening session. Rev. Mason Bondurant, First Baptist Church, Jacksonville, to preach the annual sermon with Rev. John Colbert, Sherwood, First Baptist Church, as alternate.

24. Brother Scudder led the messengers as they sang "To God Be the Glory," "Trust and Obey" and "Alleluia."

25. Fred Helms, Minister of Music at First Baptist Church, North Little Rock, sang "Amazing Grace" accompanied at the piano by Archie McMillan, Minister of Music at First Baptist Church, Jacksonville.

26. Lecil Lawson, pastor of Chapel Hill church, brought the message "The Kind of Person God Wants Us To Be" using as a text, Matthew 5:48.

27. We were adjourned with prayer by Robert McDaniel, pastor of Calvary church, for the meal following in the church dining room.

EVENING SESSION

28. The evening session was called to order at 6:30 with the messengers singing "The Solid Rock," "In Times Like These," "On Jordan's Stormy Banks," "Just A Closer Walk With Thee" and "Sweet, Sweet Spirit."

29. Replacing Rev. Bill Brown of Bayou Meto church, (who was called away because of illness in the family), Paul Press, pastor of the Amboy Mission at Daisy, Arkansas, read Philippians 4:4-14 and offered prayer.

30. Archie McMillan, First Church, Jacksonville, brought the message in song, "Don't Spare Me."

31. In the period for election of officers, Ronald M. Ford, pastor of Central Baptist Church, North Little Rock, was elected Moderator-Elect by acclamation.

32. Andy Kerr, chairman of the Mill Valley Retreat Committee, moved the adoption of the report as printed. Motion carried. He then read the following recommendation from the committee: That the North Pulaski Baptist Association construct a tri-level lodge at the Mill Valley Retreat site consisting of the following features: dormitory space for 50 people with restrooms and shower facilities, kitchen and dining facilities, recreation and conference space with fireplaces, and central heat and air. The approximate cost to be \$125,000. We further recommend that the Retreat Committee be given authority to make the necessary financial arrangements for the monies. Harold Wilson moved the adoption of the recommendation, Ted Richardson, seconded. There was a standing vote which was unanimous

for approval.

33. Billy Kimbrough, chairman of the Budget committee, moved the adoption of the 1976-77 Budget of \$50,000. which included funds for anticipated retirement of debt on the Retreat Lodge. Motion was seconded and carried to approve the budget.

34. In the period of miscellaneous business announcements were made concerning future revivals at Grace church and Calvary church,

35. Ted Richardson, chairman of the Resolutions Committee, read the report which was adopted as read. (See Resolutions in the Report section of this Annual.)

36. Sam Lewis, Minister of Music at Levy church, directed the Levy choir as they sang "Come, Holy Spirit," "The King is Coming," and "Blessed Assurance." They were accompanied at the organ by Mrs. Violet Ray and pianist, Bobbilyn Dell.

37. Ronald Ford read the 15th chapter of First Samuel for the scripture and offered prayer.

38. Alfred Sparkman, pastor of Levy church, brought the annual sermon on the Samuel text, entitled "Our Supreme Obligation to God" stating that this obligation is to obey Him.

39. Mason Bondurant passed the gavel to the new moderator, Lex H. Eaker, pastor of Pike Avenue church, who made the appointment of the standing committees.

40. Following a motion to adjourn, Brother Eaker called on the Moderator-Elect to adjourn the fifteenth annual session with prayer.

Report Section

EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Executive Board met in 5 regular meetings during the year with an average attendance of 16.

The Board:

Approved a motion to proceed with the building of a pavilion and fire slab at the Mill Valley Baptist Retreat.

Approved a request from the Association Youth Director that he be allowed to attend the Recreation Lab in Florida in lieu of Glorieta or Ridgecrest.

Approved a motion to change the insurance coverage on the Association building to Preferred Risk Insurance Company.

Approved a Christmas gift to the secretary.

Approved the following recommendations from the Missions committee:

- (1) to have an official appraisal made of the property at Jacksonville before offering it for sale.
- (2) to request McCulloch Corporation to refund the money paid on the lot purchased in Holiday Island due to the prohibitive cost of the improvement taxes.
- (3) that we supplement the cost up to \$300 to furnish Bibles in their own language to International students in the Little Rock area.
- (4) that we approve the request of Highway church to seek a grant from the Arkansas Baptist State Convention to aid their mission in Jacksonville.
- (5) that the moderator appoint a committee to study an association program for older adults.

- (6) that the association involve itself in "Bold Mission Thrust," a program to evangelize and congregationalize the nation, and recognize the Moderator, the chairman of the Missions committee and the chairman of Evangelism as the Team for planning "Bold Mission Thrust."

Adopted the new organization chart for the Baptist Student Union area committee.

Approved the nominating committee report for 1976-77.

Approved a recommendation that the monies returned with McCulloch Corp. be used for Mill Valley Baptist Retreat development.

Approved a motion to reimburse expenses incurred by the moderator-elect, missions committee chairman, evangelism chairman to attend the area evangelism meeting at Mt. Ida.

Approved a motion to recommend to the State nominating committee the reelection of Andy Kerr to the State Executive Board.

Approved a motion that the \$3000 overage in gifts to the budget be transferred to the Retreat development account.

Adopted the 1976-77 Calendar for presentation to the Annual Meeting.

Adopted the 1976-77 budget of \$50,000 for presentation to the Annual Meeting.

Approved a motion to sod the front yard of the Association building, and trim two trees that are touching the roof.

Approved a motion to set a promotion banquet in the spring of 1977 for the proposed Church Training Growth Project in February, 1978 and invite someone from Nashville to be the speaker.

Organizations

SUNDAY SCHOOL

The State Sunday School Department reported the following activities for this past year: 30 Training and planning projects in 22 associations, 68 projects in 55 churches, 149,750 (69% of enrollment) in Sunday School on "Great Day in the Morning," 20 state projects, and 111 new Life and Liberty Adult Bible Classes started.

The department also conducted five weeks at the Arkansas Baptist Assembly registering around 5400 campers with 254 professions of faith.

In NORTH PULASKI this year we conducted five associational events and assisted five local churches directly in their Sunday School work.

On February 2-4 we conducted a Bible Conference with 325 registered attendance.

We conducted two group training schools for small churches in February and March with a total of 60 persons being trained in the two meetings.

Twin Vacation Bible School Clinics were held in March. We enrolled 229 in the two clinics.

Sunday School Leadership Preparation Night was conducted in September with conferences in each age group led by Associational team members.

Our association had approximately 250 people present on the first night of the State Sunday School Convention.

Thanks are in order for the members of our associational team who serve and lead conferences. These fine folks donate their services to the association and we are grateful for their dedication.

Thanks are also in order for every member of this association who has so faithfully supported the associational Sunday School program these past few years. My sincere thanks to all of you for your prayers and support.

CHURCH TRAINING

Assisting churches to either establish or strengthen their Church Training Program has been a priority for the Church Training Department of your State Convention during the year 1975-76. Every Church Training project conducted by the Church Training Department is designed to help churches develop the kind of training program that will lead church members to grow in Christian discipleship and equip them for the work of Christian service, to build up the body of Christ. This is what Church Training is all about.

In our association, we have 34 churches with 31 of these churches reporting a Church Training organization.

"M" Night was observed on November 24 at Baring Cross church with a total attendance of 269. There were 19 churches represented: 13 pastors, and 10 Church Training directors attended. Trophies were awarded to Baring Cross for the highest attendance and to Runyan, First church for the highest percentage of enrollment present.

In an effort to help churches conserve the results of the evangelistic thrust of the Life and Liberty Campaign, New Member Training Conferences were conducted in ten areas of the state during the week of January 26-29, 1976. These were attended by 240 leaders from 128 churches representing 33 Associations. A conference on New Member Training was also conducted at the State Evangelism Conference.

The State Youth Convention was held at Little Rock's Robinson Auditorium on April 16 with over 4,000 youth participating.

Arkansas' first Associational Church Training Leadership Conference was held August 20-21 for all associational Church Training leaders in the state.

Persons from our association also benefited from the following conferences conducted by the Church Training Department:

A regional Conflict Management Workshop conducted at the Baptist Building on July 8.

A Church Secretaries Seminar held at Park Hill Church, on August 23-27.

A Church Communications Conference conducted at the Baptist Building, September 13-14.

A Family Enrichment Conference held May 6-7 at First Church, Little Rock with approximately 70 participants from 18 churches and nine associations.

A Regional Library Conference held at First Church, NLR, February 27-28, with 34 participants from 23 churches in 14 associations.

We had 13 churches represented with 25 in attendance. This is an excellent opportunity for those who have never worked with children's choir to come and learn how it is done. Also, this fills the need for those who have worked before to get some fresh ideas in leading children's choirs.

A School of Music was held August 16, 17, 19, 20 at First Baptist Church, Jacksonville with 15 churches represented and 49 attending. I want to take this opportunity to say "thank you" for those attending the workshop and school and to those who came and led the conferences.

Another children's choir workshop and dinner is being planned for January, 1977. Instead of a School of Music in 1977 we are concentrating our efforts with those of the state in supporting a Materials and Methods Workshop to be held August 22, 23. Several personnel from the Music Department in Nashville will be here to lead the conferences.

As a result the committee recommended to the executive board that we request McCulloch Corp. to refund the purchase price of the property. (The request was granted.)

BAPTIST STUDENT UNION AREA COMMITTEE

Colleges in Arkansas experienced another increase in enrollment in 1975-76. The total number of students in the state is 62,391. Five years ago this was 49,745. Over 20,000 of these are Baptist, with 90% in non-Baptist institutions. The community college phenomena is upon us, with over 9,000 students enrolled in these colleges this year. We are beginning BSU programs in most of these.

Don Norrington, state associate, has resigned to become Baptist Student Director at Southwest State Missouri University, his alma mater.

Missions and evangelism. Over 34 summer missionaries reported 654 professions of faith. There were 133 student professions of faith on the campuses of the state and many of the cities in which the school are located.

Our ministry to over 500 Internationals in the state continues. Baptist families in several college communities are involved in a host family ministry. Our largest International Student Conference ever was held this past year. A summer missionary has been appointed to work with Internationals in Fayetteville this summer.

Thanks to Arkansas Baptists for their continuing support of our Christian witness on the campuses of the state.

We now have some ministry on 27 different campuses. On half of these campuses we are the only religious group at work.

MILL VALLEY RETREAT

1976 has been a year of progress for us in preparation of our Mill Valley Retreat grounds. The committee has been working toward getting the grounds in usable condition for all our churches. New chain link fence sections have been built to prevent the coming and going of unauthorized people. Trash barrels have been provided on the grounds. A beautiful 25' x 40' steel pavilion has been constructed for meetings and picnic uses. Also, a concrete slab for an open fire has been provided. Rules have been sent to all churches so that they might know how to gain access to the camp. Sani-cans are on the grounds as temporary restrooms. Lights have been installed in the pavilion so that the grounds may be used at night.

Perhaps the most significant achievements have been the retaining of an engineer and an architect for the further development of our camp grounds and the designing of our retreat lodge. The architectural design will be presented to the Association in our Annual Meeting with the hopes that it will be approved by the Association so that construction might begin in 1977.

Steps are being taken for the provision of a caretaker on the grounds who will be provided his utilities and a place for his trailer in exchange for his looking after the associational property.

Some of the goals for 1977 are:

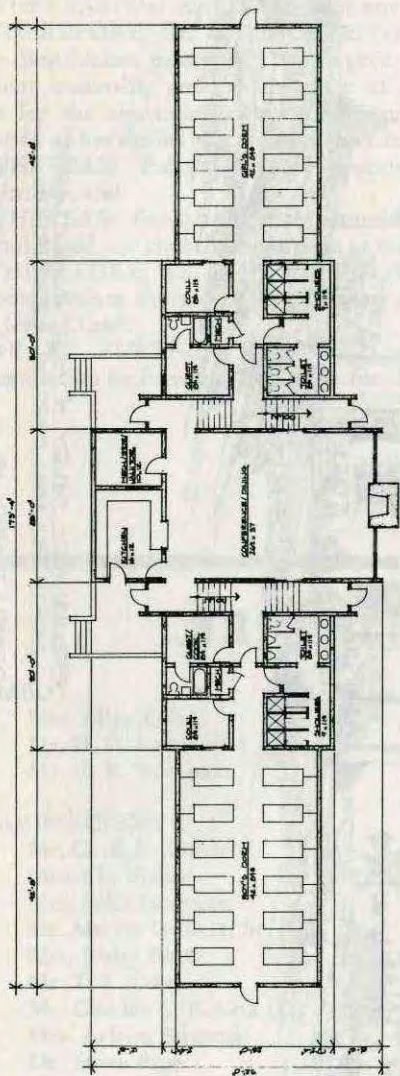
To have a caretaker on the site.

To repair the dam where washing has taken place.

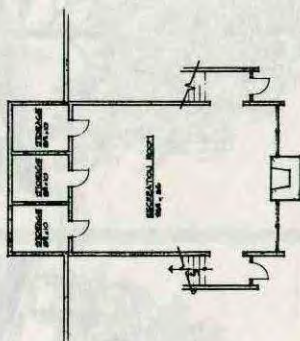
To begin construction of the retreat lodge.

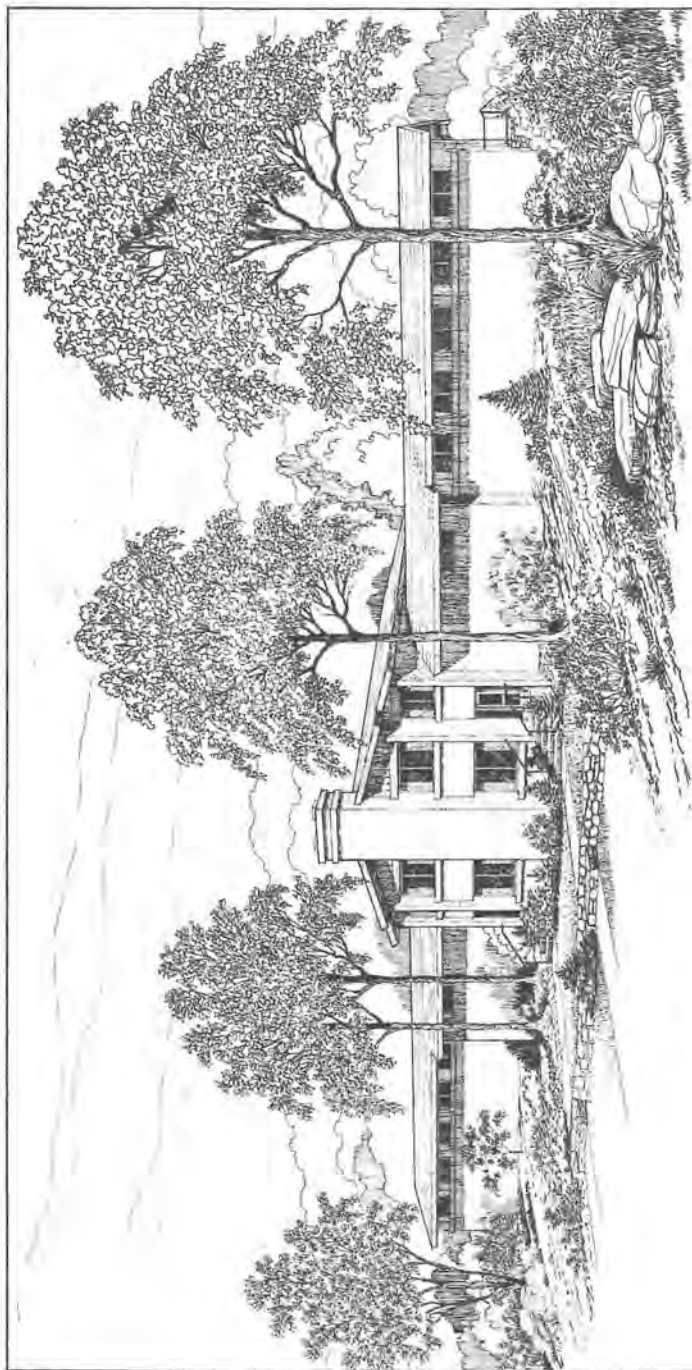


FLOOR PLAN - MIDDLE & UPPER LEVELS
