#### PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday, October 20, 1915.

The Benton County Baptist Association met, according to previous arrangement, with the church at Bethlehem on Wednesday before the fourth Sunday in October, 1915. Song, "He Leadeth Me." Reading of Psa. 62 by the Moderator, Eld. J. W. West. Prayer by Eld. G. W. Setser. Song, "I Love to Tell the Story." Prayer by Eld. E. J. Adams. Song, "Glory to His Name." Prayer by Eld. A. N. Sanders. Song, "What a Friend." Song, "O Think of the Home Over There." Song, "O Happy Day." Reading of lesson from the 6th chapter of 2nd Corinthians by Eld. T. F. Jones. Song, "Yield Not to Temptation."

Introductory Sermon was then preached by Eld. T. F. Jones. Text, 2 Cor. 6:18. Prayer by Eld. J. L. Chastain.

Motion prevailed to take recess till 1:30 p. m.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

Song, "I'm Anchored in Love." Song, "Jesus Leads and All is Well." Reading of 1 Cor. 13 by the Moderator, and prayer by Eld: E. F. Rice. Song, "That City Beyond."

Letters were read and messengers enrolled, Eld. E. F. Rice and Bro. Kit Phillips having been appointed as reading clerks.

Motion prevailed that any messengers present by appointment of their churches, their letters not having yet arrived, be enrolled.

J. N. Hamby and Eld. J. N. B. Hepler were appointed tellers and permanent organization was effected by the election of Eld. J. W. West as Moderator, and Eld. J. L. Chastain as Clerk.

Petitionary letter from the church at Pleasant Hill in Carroli County was presented. On motion and unanimous vote the letter was accepted and the Moderator extended the hand of fellowship to their messenger, Bro. C. D. Plumlee.

The courtesies of the body were extended visiting preachers and brethren. Responded to by Eld. J. N. B. Hepler, Eld. G. W. Setser, Eld. John Setser, Eld. E. F. Rice, Bro. C. M. Rice and Eld. W. B. Collins.

Committee on Divine Service was appointed, consisting of E. C. Brooks, L. C. Moon and the pastor and messengers of Bethlehem Church. Committee reported that Eld. J. N. B. Hepler will preach tonight.

A resolution adopted by the other body calling itself the Benton County Baptist Association was presented by C. M. Rice. On motion same was set for consideration immediately after noon tomorrow.

Mot'on prevailed to adjourn to 9 a. m. tomorrow.

#### THURSDAY-MORNING SESSION

Singing by the congregation, reading of scripture and prayer by the Moderator. Song, "Revive Us Again."

Committeees were appointed. (See list.)

The Associational Missionary, Eld. G. W. Setser, submitted report, which was discussed by Eld. G. W. Setser, J. L. Chastain, A. N. Sanders, and the report was adopted.

Motion prevailed to select place of next meeting, and preacher of introductory sermon, resulting in the choice of Maysville as the place of next meeting.

Motion prevailed that all names other than messengers on committees be eliminated, those remaining to constitute the committees and select such help as they may desire among the messengers.

Motion prevailed to take recess for preaching, after which stand adjourned till 1 p. m.

#### THURSDAY-AFTERNOON SESSION

After singing by the congregation and reading of scripture lesson and prayer by Bro. Geo. W. Birkes, the Association resumed business.

No one having a majority of votes in the ballot taken before neon for preacher of the introductory sermon at next session, a notion prevailed to elect Eld. T. F. Jones by acclamation, he having the largest number of votes in the ballot.

A motion prevailed that Eld. L. L. Johnson be the alternate, he having the next highest number.

Taking up the consideration of the resolution set for this hour, a motion and second that the same be adopted was made. After some discussion a substitute was offered and further discussed, after which the substitute was adopted. (Resolution No. 1.)

A motion prevailed to adjourn till 9 a. m. tomorrow.

Committee on Sunday Schools submitted report, which was discussed by Eld. E. F. Rice, Eld. John Setser, E. J. Adams, T. B. Pruitt, Sister Effie E. Thorne, J. B. Burgin, Frank Billman, Sister Corum, and report was adopted.

The Committee on Foreign Missions submitted report, which

was discussed by Eld. G. W. Setser, E. C. Brooks, A. N. Sanders, W. B. Collins, J. N. B. Hepler, and the report was amended and adopted.

The Committee on Ministerial Support submitted report, which was discussed by Bro. Flavey DeWitt, and report was adopted.

The Committee on Associational Missions submitted report, which was discussed by E. C. Brooks, T. B. Pruitt, E. J. Adams, G. W. Birkes, E. F. Rice, E. M. Bagby, G. W. Setser, and report was adopted.

The Committee on Ministerial Education submitted report, which was discussed by Eld. T. B. Pruitt, L. C. Moon, Eld. John Setser, E. C. Brooks, after which the report was amended and adopted.

Motion prevailed to take recess for preaching, after which stand anyourned till 1:30 p. m.

Committee on Obituaries submitted report, which was discussed by Sister M. J. Rodgers, E. C. Brooks, Eld. L. L. Johnson, Eld. E. F. Rice, Eld. J. W. West, and report was adopted.

Committee on Resolutions submitted three resolutions, which were severally adopted.

Committee on State Missions submitted report, which was ciscussed by E. C. Brooks and Eld. L. L. Johnson, and report was adopted.

Committee on Finance submitted report, which was adopted.

Committee on Orphans' Home submitted report, which was discussed briefly and adopted.

Committee on Publications submitted report, which was adopted after discussion.

Committee on Temperance submitted report, which was adopted.

Motion prevailed that the Clerk be allowed ten dollars out of the minute fund for his services, the minutes to be printed after enough money is furnished to pay for them.

Your missionary begs leave to report the following:

#### RESOLUTION NO. 1

Whereas, a resolution adopted by the other body calling itself the Benton County Baptist Association comes to us for consideraron; and

Whereas, the said resolution expresses the desire that all Baptists in Benton County should be in accord; and

Whereas, the churches that originated that organization did withdraw from this Association, and by their messengers assembled did effectually declare non-fellowship for this body by organtring another Association, and assuming our name; therefore be it

Resolved, That we deplore the divided state as it is today among the Baptists of Benton Couny, and elsewhere, and strongly desire a reconciliation along Bible lines. Be it further

Resolved, That such churches as desire to return to us are invited to rescind their action in departing and come back. Be it further

Resolved, That the Association that adopted that resolution, having expressed their desire to be reunited with us, should dissolve their organization, repudiate their record, and advise their churches to represent in this body next year.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOLS

We your Committee on Sunday Schools beg leave to report:
We urge and insist that each church have and maintain a regular Sunday School for the teaching of God's word, as we are admonished in God's word to train up a child in the way he should
go: and when he is old he will not depart from it. Therefore we
should not neglect the duty that we owe to our children. Therefore we should not be slack in giving our prayers and support to
the Sunday School.

#### FOREIGN MISSIONS

We your Committee on Foreign Missions submit the following: The command is, "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned." "How shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how shall trey hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach except they be sent?" Obedience to these commands is enjoined upon

the churches, whose mission it is to evangelize the world; and if we, as individual members of the churches, prove recreant to the trust committed to our care, and derelict to the duty enjoined upon us, how can we expect the blessings of God upon us? We are not to be concerned about results; for it is written that His word shall not return unto Him void, but shall accomplish that whereunto it was sent.

We wear the name of Missionary Baptists; are we proving worthy of the name? Jesus Christ said, "If ye love me, ye will keep my words." Then let us be more earnest to extend our Mascer's kingdom, lest it be said of us, "Ye knew your duty and did it not." We are told, "In the morning sow thy seed, and in the evening withhold not thine hand: for thou knowest not whether shall prosper either this or that, or whether they both shall be alike good."

Therefore we urge upon the pastors to lay this duty before their churches, and that the churches wake up to a greater activity along this line of missions: and we recommend the churches to send their contributions to the Treasurer of the General Association, or direct to the workers on the field, and report to the said Treasurer as being the most economical and productive of the best results.

We do not believe that we support our ministers as we should. We further believe that the work of a great many ministers is hindered because they are not supported as they should be.

Therefore we recommend and urge that the churches hold upthe hands of their pastors by supporting them liberally.

We would therefore recommend that we try to get each member to help some, even though it be only a small amount, believing that it will be a benefit to them as well as to the pastor.

#### PUBLICATIONS .

We your Committee on Publications beg leave to make the following report:

We find that our people as a whole neglect the reading of the Pible to their hurt, as individuals and as a body. Therefore we would recommend a more diligent study and prayerful study of the Bible. We would recommend the following plan for reading the Bible through: Read three chapters per day through all the books to and including Esther, four chapters per day through Job, Psalms and Proverbs, and three chapters per day through the rest of the books, reading the odd chapters at the end of books of which the number is not divisible by three (or four in the case of Job,

Psalms and Proverbs) on the same day with the previous group, and all books having less than three chapters to be read as one day's reading, which plan, it is said, will carry one through the Bible in exactly one year.

We would also recommend that our people take and read our cenominational papers as a means of informing themselves of the work being done. We also recommend that the fathers and mothers of Benton County be very careful about the literature that they allow to come into their homes, some, as we see it, teaching damnable heresies, as Russellism and such like.

We also recommend a liberal distribution of sound Baptist literature to counterbalance the effects of bad literature.
