### MORNING SESSION

The Current River Baptist Association met with Reyno Baptist Church 10 o'clock a.m. Thursday before the third Sunday in October 1905. The body was called to order by the Moderator.

### AFTERNOON SESSION

An investigating committee composed of J. L. Jones, W. F. Bridges and T. J. Evans was appointed to investigate the organization of this church. Committee reposed favorable and church was received.

#### MORNING SESSION OCTOBER 13

Called together by singing. Scripture lesson read by the Moderator,—Psa. 133. Prayer by S. K. Dungan.

Bridges who moved its adoption. Report received.

#### TEMPERANCE

Knowing the evils of strong drink, we cannot fully state them in this report, for the wise man tells us that "Strong drink is raging and wine is a mocker, and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise." It makes widows and orphans and sends its victims to hell. It bribes Jurors, witnesses and Judges. It corrupts the political world. It is God's worst enemy and the devil's best friend. We recommend that our churches use all their influence against the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors in all form, and that our churches ought to discipline their members who drink. We should urge our ministers to preach against whisky and urge every church member to use his influence to suppress the whisky traffic.

It was moved to take a recess till 2:30 p. m. Preaching at 11 o'clock by Eld. D. K. Foster, subject—"Paul's Estimate of Life," At the close of sermon a collection was taken for Orphans' Home which amounted to \$9.05.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

Called together by singing. Prayer by T. J. Evans.

Call for report on States Missions. Report was read by Eld. E. H. C. Kenner who moved its adoption. Report received and a collection was taken for Eld, S. W. Abernathy who is traveling as state Missionary. Amount collected \$7.30.

#### STATE MISSIONS

We find that there has been a growing interest in State Missions in our Bastist Zion, during the past year. The Lord has wonderfully blessed the laborers on the field. There has been several missionaries devoting their entire time to this work. The field is white for harvest, yet the laborers are few. We recommended that our churches take a collection for state missions and do all in their power to help in this great work Also that our pastors take a more active part in stimulating the churches to help in the work of state missions.

#### FOREIGN MISSIONS

Call for report on Foreign Missions. Report was read by Eld. W. F. Bridges who moved its adoption. Report received.

Inasmuch as we are commanded to go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature and we believe the commission was given to the local congregations and that the responsibility rests upon each congregation. As such we recommend that the churches composing the Association co-operate with the churches composing the General Associations in the great work of Foreign Missions. The General Association has at work on the Foreign Fields Eld. S. M. Jureidini and wife in Beirut, Syria, and Eld. A. J. Diaz in Havanna, Cuba. These missionaries need our prayers and our financial support-Money for them should be sent to Z. T. Izard. Forrest City, Arkansas. While we recommend the General Association as the channel through which to do our work, we cheerfully recognize the right of any brother or church to contribute or work through the board of the convention if he choose. Let us pray the Lord of the harvest to send forth more laborers into the harvest.

Eld. D. K. Foster read Report on Education and moved its adoption. Report received.

#### **EDUCATION**

We believe that to the Baptists was given the marching orders by the Son of God as recorded in Matt. 28, and so they should take their place in the fore front of every laudable enterprise. We would recommend to the brotherhood that they do all in their power to advance the interest of all our schools.

We recommend that Arkansas Baptists patronize our schools within the state. We especially recommend our own Ouchita Maynard Academy, built at a sacrifice by this and State Line Associations.

Eld. S. W. Brumfield read the Report on Sunday Schools and moved its adoption. Report received.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOLS

We find that only eight out of the fourteen churches represented in this association have Sunday Schools, and only a few of them report the average attendance or contribution.

Your committee believes that whenever a church or public school can be maintained. a Sunday School can also be maintained. And realizing the necessity and importance of the Sunday School we urge that every church strive to keep up a lively school. We would if possible eliminate the idea that the Sunday School is an institution seperate and apart from the church, and without special scriptural authority for its existance. But, on the other hand it is the teaching service of the church, wherein the best opportunity is offered for the study of the Word, and for teaching all classes, both young and old, "to observe all things, whatsoever the Lord has commanded."

We cannot over estimate the importance of the Sunday School. Carefully prepared statistics show that more than 80 per cent of our church increase comes through or from the Sunday School.

In order to promote this work, your committee recommends the appointment of a committee of five, the moderator to be chairman, whose business it shall be to prepare a program and arrange for a Sunday School rally for each fifth Sunday meeting.
