PROCEEDINGS OF THE GRAND PRAIRIE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

The Grand Prairie Baptist Association convened with the Oak Grove church, October 17, 1902, at 7 p. m.

The body was called to order by the Moderator, R. H. Parker. R. L. Davis, being absent, H. B. Dudley was elected to the chair.

Humbrough, who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, being absent, and D. D. Willis, alternate, asking to be excused, which was granted, R. M. Best was elected in his place.

The Association convened at 9 a. m. Prayer by D. S. Cannon. Letters from churches called for and the following responded:—

By vote of the body, the Association dispensed with the committees on State Missions and Home Missions.

Corresponding messengers from sister Associations and visiting brethren next called for; and Bro. H. H. Street, representing the State Sunday School and Colportage work, gladly received.

Motion and Seconded, That this Association do not elect messengers to the State Convention. Carried.

Motion and Seconded, That we take a recess for the Executive Board to prepare their report. Carried.

Reassembled 11 a. m., by singing:

Motion and Seconded, That we have preaching at 11 a.m. Carried. The committee announced that H. H. Street will preach at this hour.

Prayer by R. M. Parker, after which Bro. Street delivered an earnest and instructive discourse from John 16:7; appealing to God's children to lead consecrated lives. Closed with prayer by D. D. Willis. Adjourned to 1:30 p. m.

Eld. R. C. Medaris, General Missionary of the State Convention and member of Mt. Zion Association received as a visiting brother.

Report on Education read, and ably discussed by R. C. Medaris. Report adopted and marked "A."

Report on Sunday-Schools postponed until 10 a.m. Sunday.

Report of Executive Board read; and the Associational work discussed by R. M. Best, R. F. Routh, D. S. Cannon, Sister Dudley, H. Y. Morris, S. K. Downs, F. C. Robinson, R. H. Parker, H. H. Street. Report adopted and marked "B."

Motion and seconded: That a committee of three be appointed to collect the balance due the Association by former Treasurer, E. J. McCuin. Carried. R. L. Davis, F. C. Robinson and J. R. Sanders appointed, who were ordered to report to the first session of the Executive Board.

Report on Obituaries read, adopted and marked "C."

Report on Foreign Missions deferred until after preaching to-night.

Report on Publications read and commented upon by R. M. Best. Adopted and marked "D."

Report on Temperance read, and discussed by H. B. Dudley, H. H. Street, F. C. Robinson, R. F. Routh, T. H. Jackson, R. H. Parker, D. S. Cannon. Report adopted and marked "E."

RECESS TO 6:30 P. M.

Convened by singing: "Crown Him Lord of all."

Time and place of next meeting in order. By a vote of the Association, it was decided that our next meeting be held with the New Hope church, beginning on Saturday before the third Sunday in October, 1903.

After singing and reading, was led in prayer by H. Y. Morris. Then the congregation listened to a feeling sermon by R. C. Medaris from Rom. 1:16; at the close of which several persons came for prayer.

Report on Foreign Missions read, and commented on by R. C. Medaris. Report adopted and marked "F"; and a collection of \$11.20 was taken for Foreign Missions.

Our Moderator, R. M. Parker, was elected as our messenger to the Southern Baptist Convention.

H. Y. Morris selected to preach the next introductory sermon, and B. F. House, alternate; also, R. F. Routh to preach the annual missionary sermon, and R. M. Best, alternate. Adjourned to meet 10 a.m. Sunday.

We, the Executive Board of the Grand Prairie Baptist Association, submit the following: At the first two meetings of the Board, it was thought best not to make any appropriations. At our meeting at Fairmount, June 28, 1902, appropriated \$3.25 to Fairmount church. On the 30th of August, 1902, at Haven, we made the following appropriations, viz: Fairmount church, \$1.75; Hurricane, \$7.50; St. Charles, \$7.50; Total appropriations, \$20.00 Of this amount, \$6.57 has been paid, leaving a balance unpaid of \$13.43
